The Langdon Fire Department has taken several important steps forward in 1975. The foundation for these steps was laid by George L. Porter, Chief Emeritus, who built The Department over the past 25 years. Chief Porter stepped down in March, but his influence will be felt for years to come.

After an inspection in June, The Langdon Fire Department obtained an "E" (fire protection available) rating from The Insurance Services Office in Concord. This new rating should save people in Langdon at least \$4,000 a year in lower fire insurance rates. The new truck, the Scott Air Packs, the training completed by members, The Mutual Aid System and the monitor radios purchased were instrumental in achieving this rating.

Our Department has grown to 12 regular members. Seven members completed a State Approved Fire Fighting Course of 40 hours at The Meadowood Training Center in Fitzwilliam, N.H. Six others also attended the 2 days Spring and Fall Mutual Aid Fire Fighters Courses. Several members went to one day forest fire fighting classes. We hope to continue to improve our capabilities by encouraging our members to go to these schools.

We have completed equipping our regular members with monitor radios which allow Keene Dispatch to tone our men direct. This saves valuable minutes and has contributed to the saving of several buildings. Surrounding fire departments are showing more confidence in calling on us for help.

I wish to thank the People of Langdon for their support this year and encourage anyone with a little spare time to come forward and join us. The Fire Department belongs to you and can only be as successful as the enthusiasm of its volunteers.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Every year seems to prove that the Langdon people are very careful to avoid serious forest fires. One of these fires that gets a bad start and develops into large acreage can be very costly to the tax payer. It, therefore, pays off for everyone to use every possible precaution. This they have done.

Only two very small woods fires were encountered this year; and in each of them astonishingly quick response was accomplished. This was largely because of the Fire Department monitors and two-way radios.

There was very good attendance at the forest fire schools. It was especially gratifying to have two of the junior groups attend the special deputy camp at Gilmanton. It is very important that new men be trained for this special service. These men are called on to serve as staff officers under the local Warden in the case of large project fires. There is a lot of hard work in this; and young, physically active men are needed to replace the older members.

One of the most encouraging occurrences of the 1975 season was the attendance from Langdon at the meetings of the Cheshire County Fire Warden's Association meetings. It shows their interest in this kind of fire suppression, especially since they go at their own expense and on their own time. The importance of this can not be overestimated; because when large project fires do occur, the men know each other by their first names. At Marlow, Grantham, Bald Peak in Berlin, Monadnock, Surry and Chesterfield, this fact alone, tended to minimize expense and confusion. Langdon men worked on all of those fires.

REPORT OF THE FALL MOUNTAIN VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

December 31, 1975

In 1975 the Fall Mountain V.N.A. made 2478 visits and, in addition, saw 216 patients in cancer prevention and blood pressure clinics. This is a total of 2694 patient services, 90% more than were provided in 1974. A total of 363 different individuals were serviced in 1975, which is 6% of the population of the four-town area.

Since activity far exceeded what was anticipated, the proposed budget of \$29,289 for 1975 proved unrealistic. Total expenditures by the Agency in 1975 were \$37,637.22, \$8,348.22 more than had been planned for. It was able to meet expenses through reimbursements by patients, government agencies, miscellaneous gifts and the \$2.00 per capita, contributions made by the four participating towns.

Contributions by the towns are a significant part of the V.N.A. budget, enabling the Agency, in particular, to serve those patients who are ineligible for reimbursement by Medicare, Medicaid and private insurance. A breakdown of the sources of income during 1975 follows:

For 1976 the participating towns are requested to contribute \$1.50 per capita, instead of the \$2.00 assessed in 1975. It is possible this will not totally underwrite the Association's non-reimbursed costs, but in that event the Board of Directors will seek other sources to fund the balance.

(North Walpole, in addition to Acworth, Alstead, Charlestown, and Langdon, will receive V.N.A. Services beginning January, 1976.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

Town of Langdon, N. H.

The Planning Board after last year's Town Meeting was increased in size from 5 to 7 members. At our organization meeting, Maurice Lacroix was chosen as Chairman and Mrs. Lynn Plonski as Secretary. A sub committee of three was appointed to further study possibilities and alternatives regarding solid waste disposal.

While there are many areas of interest to the Planning Board in Langdon it was felt that the town would be better served to allow 1975 to go without any proposals for consideration at the 1976 Town Meeting. Keeping in mind that the Board has its object of keeping Langdon as much as possible as it is. We adopted the policy of the less law as possible. Flexible interpretation of our code and service to the town.

One very positive application of our Zoning Laws resulted in bringing part of the Jewett Brook Road into the Town Highway system and up-grading that part of it to the State T.R.A. specifications at no cost to the town. This will permit use of State funds on that road without additional capital outlay by Langdon.

1975 also saw the first application for a small business that would fall under the Commercial-Industrial Section of our Zoning Ordinance.

The necessary public meetings were held and the Board of Adjustment granted to George Woodell permission to erect and operate a portable saw mill on land of Edward & Natalie Wilson.

I believe that the progress in 1975 was only possible because of the faith and backing you gave your elected and appointed officials. We are always open to suggestions and new ideas. Meetings are open to the public.
