## WARRANT.

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, N. H., qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the town hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next; at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose three Selectmen, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways, and direct how the same shall be paid and expended the ensuing year.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
6. To hear the report of the Auditors and of the School Board of the town district.
7. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.
8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
9. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to keep the sidewalks in said town in good passable condition.
10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to construct sewers in said town where it may be necessary, and to raise money therefor, or act thereon.
11. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation the lands and other property now occupied by the creamery companies in said town, or act thereon.

12. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to light the town hall by electric lights, or act thereon.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a machine or machines for breaking roads in the winter season and for other work upon the highways, or act thereon.

14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to fit up the Public Library for the use of electric lights at an expense not exceeding ninety dollars, or act thereon.

15. To see if the town will vote to take any action to comply with the laws relating to the licensing of dogs.

16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell a portion of the Eldridge Estate, known as the Rix hill.

17. To see if the town will vote to annex that part of the town school district, formerly known as District No. 12, to Lebanon High School District, or act thereon.

18. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to provide for the sprinkling of the streets in said town and raise money therefor, or act thereon.

19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to purchase a hearse, not to exceed in cost five hundred dollars, and to furnish team and driver for use at funerals.
