#### TENTATIVE WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, March 10, 1970 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same, as follows:

Town Officers Salaries Town Officers Expenses Election and Registration Expenses Expenses Town Hall and other Town Buildings Employees' Retirement and Social Security Police Department Fire Department Insurance Damages and Legal Expenses Running Town Lines Health Department, including Hospitals Vital Statistics Town Dump and Garbage Removal Highway-Maintenance-Summer Highway-Maintenance-Winter Street Lighting General Expenses of Highway Department Town Road Aid (See Article No. 4) Tarring Library

Town Poor and Surplus Commodities

- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$371.10 which is 1/2,000th of 1% of the equalized valuation of your town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 4. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$936.02 which is the town's share of Town Road Aid. The State's share is \$6,240.11.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum, or sums, not exceeding in the aggregate of \$35,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current

municipal year from taxes collected within said current municipal year.

- 6. To see if the town wishes to vote a discount for prompt payment of taxes according to state law. This must be voted each year.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$250.00 to help the Carroll County Mental Health Service, Inc.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to relocate the road past the Joseph Kaskell residence from its present location to the route as proposed by Mr. Kaskell through the field at the rear of the house.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$85.00 for the Home Health Agency.
- 10. To see if the town would authorize the Madison Committee of Highway Safety to work as a committee to adopt official names for all streets and roads in the town in co-operation with the state and federal departments of safety. To report at the next Town Meeting, 1971 with the recommended names of such streets and the cost of erecting street signs on each corner or intersection. Such signs to be placed only on accepted town roads and streets.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the yearly sum of \$8,016 for maintaining a full time police chief who will be on duty around the clock. This figure will include a spare policeman in the event the regular man is off duty and will also include gasoline mileage for car being used while on duty.

- 12. To see if the voters of the Town will allow the Town Hall to be used for the playing of basketball under strict supervision and regulations.
- 13. To see if the town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$8,300 for a JD No. 300 Loader with No. 92 Backhoe with 12' digging depth to be used for town work only.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to spend T. R. A. money on Colby Hill Road.

#### MADISON TOWN AND SCHOOL LIBRARY REPORT

For the year 1969

The year 1969 has seen several changes in the Madison Library, both in personnel and equipment. We trust that the turmoil attendant upon these alterations has now settled down, and that the year 1970 will run on quieter and more customary lines.

In June, Mrs. Randlett, who had been librarian for the past eight months, found it necessary to resign her position, due to pressure of other business. During the summer, the library was kept open with the help of volunteers, largely from the Philathea Class. In September, we were fortunate to obtain the services of Mrs. Rose Umberger, who is now full-time librarian. Mrs. Charlotte Hamilton resigned from the Board of Library Trustees, as she plans to spend a considerable portion of each year in Florida, and Mrs. Ruth Shackford has kindly agreed to serve in her place. Mrs. Rita Colcord will take over the work of Treasurer of the Library Funds, relieving Mrs. Alice Ward, who has handled these accounts for the past twenty years.

After the terrible winter of 1969, it was finally realized that the heating equipment of the library was long overdue for improvement. The town voted \$500 for a new heater. Upon examination, it was found that the chimney of the library building was in very poor condition, and that a gas heater was the only possible solution. We were fortunate to be able to purchase locally a 66,000 BTU heater. Mr. Remick, who installed it, said that it would be much more efficient if the attic floor could be fully insulated. The School Department, who retains jurisdiction over the building, agreed to do this, and six-inch fiberglass insulation has now been installed. The library is now a much more comfortable place to visit during the cold months. Since this is our first experience

with gas heat, and we have no way of knowing how severe the winter may be, or how much gas will be needed, six tanks of gas have been installed to start with. We are hoping that the remainder of the money appropriated will be sufficient for fuel this year, and possibly next year also.

The RCA Company most generously donated another collection of records to the library this year, so that we now have over 100 records for the use of our borrowers. These have been greatly appreciated, as will be shown in the circulation records.

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minumum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

#### Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a. m. and after 5:00 p. m.

#### **Exceptions**

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

#### **Penalties**

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.

- 2. For kindling a fire by any means willfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

# SCHOOL NURSE REPORT

### School Year 1968-1969

As in the past each incoming first-grader who had not already been checked on vision and hearing was screened on Orientation Day by the School Nurse. A check on Smallpox immunization was also made.

Each first grader received a physical examination either through the summer Headstart Project, the Supervisory Union No. 9 health appraisal program at Memorial Hospital, or a report of a medical examination by the family physician was furnished by the parents.

The Tine Test was administered March 10, 1969 to grade one in cooperation with the New Hampshire Tuberculosis and Health Association. All tests were normal.

During March a measles susceptibility survey was conducted among the school children. With one exception each child had received Measles (Rubella) vaccine or had already had measles.

Pupils through age eight years who had not finished their immunizations against Diphtheria, Whooping Cough, Tetanus, Poliomyelitis or Measles were transported by parents to Clinics held at Conway Elementary Auditorium in May and June 1969.

Two pupils attended the Orthopedic Clinic held at Memorial Hospital on May 8, 1969.

The splendid help from the Community, parents, school and health agencies accomplished much which withtheir help could not have been completed.
