

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

For your Selectmen, the year of 1968 was the Year of the Adding Machine. State law and new State tax reporting forms made it necessary to re-assess and list separately every parcel of land in the Town, every building and then to express all assessment, at 100% of estimated true market value. A timeconsuming and difficult job, made bearable by the generally approving comments of the tax-payers. New assessment formulas were developed: so much for back-land per acre, so much for shore fronts, so much for buildings, so much for building lots. From these figures, total valuations made it possible to pay our Warrant-approved bills at a tax rate of \$2.40 per \$100. valuation. In the resulting tax bills, two-thirds turned out to be lower and one-third higher than in the preceding year. Most changes were moderate. There were exceptions. But heartening was the fact that tax-delinquency was very low on December 1.

Dismayed by the failure of Article 19 of last March's Warrant to gain a two-thirds majority (authorization to borrow \$15,000. for a new fire engine), the Town faced the threat of having no volunteer fire department. On petition of 10 qualified voters, your Selectmen sought Court permission for a special emergency meeting to consider the matter. With Court approval, such a meeting was held on July 6 and the Article passed with well more than the necessary two-thirds majority. We refer you to the report of the Volunteer Fire Department for details of the new engine now being built for the Town.

Each year our Annual Reports are so full of a number of things that we suspect that not every tax-payer does a coverto-cover job of reading them. But we urge you to read the Officers' reports and join us in thanking them for a year of hard, honest work, doing what the Warrant has called for, doing it well, doing it within the voted budget and meticulously reporting every penny spent.

NELSON TOWN WARRANT

NOTE: As was the case last year, Articles in the Warrant are grouped by subject. Article 1 is included on petition of 10 qualified voters, following action at the Town Caucus on January 4, 1969.

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet at the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 7:00 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following Articles:

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a person or persons to perform the duties prescribed for Road Agents. Such appointee(s) shall be directly responsible to the Selectmen, and they shall direct his work as well as control his expenditures within the Articles of this Warrant.

NOTE: State law permits Towns to decide between the election or appointment of a road agent. Reference: New Hampshire Revised Statutes 245:6 et seq. Under the law, at the Annual Meeting, each Town shall elect by ballot, or by major vote authorize the Selectmen to appoint one or more highway agents who, under the direction of the Selectmen, shall carry out the prescribed duties of an elected agent. A vote authorizing such appointment continues in effect until changed by major vote at an Annual or Special Town Meeting.

- 2. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$20,960.00 to defray Town charges for the year ensuing.

- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1969.
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by Tax Collector or other deeds, and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$50.00 as a trust fund from Yoshio Takio, and \$100.00 as a trust fund from Robert Forney. The interest therefrom to be used for perpetual care of their lots in the cemetery.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept any one of three alternate plans, submitted for the repair or replacement of the Town barn and will vote to raise the sum of money called for in the appropriate estimate.

NOTE: The above article was inserted in the Warrant after the 1969 Budget was completed. Any sum voted will therefore adjust the Budget upward in that amount. To pass, the Article requires a favorable 2/3 majority of persons present and voting.

ARTICLES IN SUPPORT OF VARIOUS OBLIGATIONS

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$278.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of Elliot Community Hospital.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day, the sum of \$60.00 for the same purpose for Memorial Day and the sum of \$100.00 for the care of the Town Common.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$177.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$125.00 for the support of the Town Library.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance of the Cemetery, this sum to be

paid to the Secretary of the Cemetery Board on or before: May 1, 1969.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PROTECTION

- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense purposes.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$65.00 to be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds for control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the Town.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the construction and maintenance of fire trails and water holes.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for maintenance of the Fire Department.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH MAINTENANCE AND PROTECTION OF TOWN ROADS

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$14,500.00 for the maintenance and repair of roads and bridges, of which sum \$6,500.00 shall be for summer work and \$8,000.00 for winter work.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000.00 for general highway expenses, repairs and supplies.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$510.81 as its share of T.R.A. construction costs, the State's share being \$3,405.40.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund, except by vote of the Town for purchase of road equipment.

22. To transact any other business or discuss other Warrant proposals as they may legally be brought before the meeting.

TOWN MEETING—MARCH 12, 1968

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Town of Nelson

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by the Moderator, Francis Tolman, who read the Town Warrant and the following articles were voted on.

ARTICLE 1.—Motion was made and seconded to temporarily pass over Articles 1, 2 and 3, and take up Articles 4, 5, 6 and 7. Motion prevailed.

ARTICLE 4.—It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1968.

ARTICLE 5.—It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by Tax Collectors or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

ARTICLE 6.—It was voted to authorize the disposition of municipal records in accordance with the provisions of "RSA, Chapter 33-A, Disposition of Municipal Records". Said Chapter approved May 11, 1967 and effective July 10, 1967.

ARTICLE 7.—It was voted for the Town to accept the sum of \$75.00 from Edgar and Charlotte Jones and the sum of \$25.00 from John H. Struthers as Trust Funds, the interest therefrom to be used toward the perpetual care of lots in the Cemetery.

At this time the Moderator declared recess for the completion of voting: 7:30 p.m.

The meeting resumed at 7:50 p.m.

ARTICLE 1.—To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a person or persons to perform the duties

prescribed for Road Agents. Such appointee (s) shall be directly responsible to the Selectmen, and they shall direct his work as well as control his expenditures within the Articles of this Warrant.

Article VII. The following were nominated for Auditor: Mr. Everett Martin, Mr. Edward Schillemat, Jr. Total of votes cast 23, necessary for choice 13. Everett Martin 13; Edward Schillemat, Jr. 10. Mr. Everett Martin was declared elected.

All duly elected officers who were present were sworn into office at this time by the Moderator.

Mr. James J. Cusick and Mr. John W. Day were intro-

duced by Mildred L. Huber. Motion was made and seconded to allow them to speak. Motion prevailed.

Article V. Motion was made and seconded to passover Article V. and take it up in Article VIII. Motion prevailed.

Motion prevailed.

Article XI. Motion was made and seconded to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire. Motion prevailed.

Article XII. Motion was made and seconded for the district to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed One Thousand nine hundred twenty dollars (\$1,920) to provide the school board with sufficient funds to pave the circular drive or play area at the front of the Munsonville School.

The Moderator asked for a show of hands.

In favor of the Article 8. Not in favor of the Article 10.

The motion was defeated.

Article XIII. Other business: Motion was made and seconded to call for a show of hands to see if the School District was interested in reopening Article 8 for the purpose of discussing transportation of the Murdough children.

In favor 7. Not in favor 7.

Moderator asked for a ballot vote: 21 votes cast.

In favor 9. Not in favor 12. The motion was defeated.

Motion was made to form a committee to investigate sources of transportation for school pupils, said committee shall report their findings to School Board at their discretion and at the next District School meeting. Motion was seconded and prevailed.

Motion was made that the School Board choose one of their members to serve on this committee and that the voters elect two members to serve on said committee. Motion was seconded and prevailed.

Mr. Claude Hutchins and Mr. Ethan Tolman were elected to serve on the committee.

The School Board stated they were in agreement that Mr. Pratt would be their spokesman.

Motion was made that the committee choose their own chairman and inform the School Board of their choice before the end of March. Motion was seconded and prevailed.

Motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 9:24 p.m.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF NELSON:

Another calendar year has passed, and many changes have taken place in the Munsonville School.

Mrs. Beard continues as the capable teaching principal, and our new upper grade teacher is Mrs. Marjorie McMahon, who is also doing a very, very fine job.

New fluorescent lighting has been installed in both classrooms. New bookcases, file cabinets, overhead projectors, record players, and tape recorders have been purchased, annul are in use. On a per pupil or per teacher basis, the Munsonville School is now as well equipped with audivisual equipment as most schools.

Textbooks in reading, math, and English are now up-todate, and present plans are to improve the social studies materials. We are, also, investigating the practicality and possible advantages which can result from use of educational television.

Mr. Larry Stone, music teacher, and Mrs. Dorothy Fitz-Gerald, school nurse, each visit the school every week for work in their area of specialization.

Study continues in the areas of pupil transportation and maintenance in an effort to continue to provide sound, equitable service to the children, teachers, and taxpayers.

Budgets everywhere in schools, towns, businesses, etc., are rising very rapidly. Six months of preparation, revision and review by many persons will have been performed on the 1969-1970 Nelson School District Budget before the voters act on it. We have no control over many budget items such as heat, utilities, tuition, Supervisory Union expenses, and fixed charges. Those items over which we do have control are in budget Series 200, Instruction.

Textbooks, scholar's supplies, etc., are used by children and teachers. Teachers salaries are increasing more rapidly than ever before. Many school districts are faced with the situation of matching the competing districts or losing their teachers. We feel that in Munsonville our boys and girls are definitely in good hands, and the money is, therefore, well spent. It is especially difficult to recruit people to teach in multigrade combinations.

Our thanks to staff members, board members, and citizens for their assistance, understanding, and cooperation, which make the Nelson School District an enjoyable one in which to work.

REPORT OF THE MUNSONVILLE PRE-SCHOOL ASSOCIATION

The Munsonville Pre-School held classes twice a week, Tuesdays and Fridays, from 9:45 to 11:45 with an average enrollment of fourteen. Classes began October 3rd and ended with the annual graduation program June 14th. Charlotte Pratt, our permanent teacher, was out for six weeks during February and March. Frances Rumrill and Barbara Bennett served as substitute teachers. During May and June an extra day of classes was instituted on Thursdays from 9:45 to 11:45.

The tuition, which is minimal, is based on the financial needs of the school and the number of days each child attends the school, four year olds attend one day, five year olds attend two days. The tuition has been supplemented by driveway paving, carried on by the fathers, food sales by the mothers, and a generous anonymous \$100.00 donation. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our unknown benefactor. The money is used for classroom activities, school and general supplies, and teacher salaries. The school is held in the Chapel By The Lake in Munsonville. The Association contributes to the Church, half of the heat and electrical costs.

The Munsonville Pre-School is open to any child of Nelson who will be entering elementary school within two years.
