#### TOWN WARRANT

#### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10:00 A.M. in the forenoon, the Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M. to act upon the following subjects:

#### Business meeting at 8:00 P.M.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42,000.00 for the Maintenance and Repair of Highways and Bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,145.59 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$7,637.25.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for tarring of Class V roads.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,650.00 for principal and interest on the new Fire Station Note.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100.00 to finish paying for the New Fire Station.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the construction of essential items at the New Fire Station.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks and upon the adoption of this article, it shail be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Belknap, a certificate or note showing that the 2nd Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19–29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town

Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36; Sections 19, 20–29 inclusive.

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for a new Fire Truck.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of new Highway Equipment.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for widening and repairing a section of the Sky Pond Road.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.
- 21. (Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be expended on the improvement of the roadway leading to Winona Lake Improvement Association Property; provided that Winona Lake Improvement Association likewise raises the sum of \$300.00.
- 22. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.
- 23. (Petition) To see if the Town will vote to establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36a "and that the Selectmen appoint said Commission within 60 days from the Annual Meeting and that a temporary chairman be appointed to call the first meeting of the Commission."

- 24. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Mental Health Center.
- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for "Refurbishing the Interior of the Town House."
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.
- 27. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to tar "Birchwood Drive."
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to join the Municipal Association and to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same.
- 29. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

It was with regret that the Fire Wards accepted the resignation of Bernard Lowell as Chief of the Fire Department. He felt that he could not do justice to two jobs with his increased duties as Police Chief. It was recommended by the Fire Wards that William Clement be appointed as Fire Chief. This was approved by all members of the Fire Department and he was sworn in on January 17, 1970, by the Town Clerk.

During the year 1969 we were very fortunate in having a reduced number of fires. The Department was called out several times by Mutual Aid which is a great asset to all communities belonging to this organization.

### REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows:

### Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

### Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

### Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly

that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.

- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smoke in 1970.
