Article 2: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following amounts which shall be paid to the Town Officers for their services, or take any action relative thereto:

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$760.00 as the Town's share of the operating expenses of the Peterborough Library, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$518.00 for the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$149.00 for the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Services, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the oiling of Town roads as needed, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 8: To see if the Town will vote to accept from the State of New Hampshire, a block grant in the amount of \$8,087.00, use of which will be restricted to the construction and reconstruction of highways, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Summer maintenance of Town roads and the sum of \$5,000.00 for Winter maintenance, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 10: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the William Leroy Young Trust Fund, the sum of \$300.00 from interest accrued, for the maintenance of the Brick Schoolhouse, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provision of the State and Local Assistance of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amounts indicated and further authorize the Selectmen to make prorated reductions in the amounts if the estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any action relative thereto:

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept on behalf of the Town any gifts, grants or legacies to the Town, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 17: To see if the Town will transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and account groups of the Town of Sharon, New Hampshire, for the year ended December 31, 1985; and have issued our report dated January 20, 1986. As part of our examination, we made a study and evaluation of the Town's system of internal accounting control to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. Under these standards, the purpose of such an evaluation is to establish a basis for reliance on the system of internal accounting control in determining the nature, timing, and extent of auditing procedures that are necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements.

The objective of internal accounting control is to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance as to the safeguarding of assets against loss from unauthorized use or disposition and the reliability of financial records for preparing financial statements and maintaining accountability for assets. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a system of internal accounting control should not exceed derived benefits and that evaluation of these factors necessarily requires estimates and judgments.

There are inherent limitations that should be recognized in considering the potential effectiveness of any system of internal accounting control. In the performance of most control procedures, errors can result from misunderstanding of instructions, mistakes of judgment, carelessness or other personal factors. Control procedures whose effectiveness depends upon segregation of duties can be circumvented by collusion. Similarly, control procedures can be circumvented intentionally with respect to the estimates and judgments required in the preparation of the financial statements. Further, projection of any evaluation of internal accounting control to future periods is subject to the risk that the procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions and that the degree of compliance with the procedures may deteriorate.

Our study of the system of internal accounting control for the year ending December 31, 1985, would not necessarily disclose all weaknesses in the system because it was based on selective tests of accounting records and related data. The study and evaluation disclosed the no weaknesses which we consider to be material. The following recommendation was developed from our

observation of the Town's operations and is not the result of any special study.

HIGHWAY BLOCK GRANT BUDGETING

It was the intent of the 1985 Town Meeting to spend its State Highway Block Grant in addition to its regular highway appropriations. Unfortunately no separate appropriation was made and the Highway Block Grant revenue was applied against the voted appropriations causing an overdraft of the Town Maintenance budget.

We recommend that the Town appropriate all monies that it intends to spend for any purpose in a given year. Estimated income would then be used to offset the appropriation so that additional tax revenue would not be raised. Should income be less than planned the Board of Selectmen has sufficient flexibility under State law to reduce the related expenditure.

We wish to express our thanks to the officials of the Town for their assistance during the course of our audit.

REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

We feel that the most important issue to appear this year is the possibility of some legal action relating to the Henry Lord Scholarship Trust. The Selectmen have asked counsel to make the Town a party to the suit. We cannot say much about the possible suit but note, to date, there have been two executive sessions held.

Our liability insurance has taken quite a jump this year. The figures do not show it yet but we have an explanation.

The public official liability coverage was written and paid under the budget of the 1985 Town Meeting. It amounted to \$1,392.00 prepaid over a 3 year term. We are happy it did not come up this year. The insurance problem this year came in the so-called package policy covering many areas of liability. It will cost \$1,050 per year and reflects some large settlements and general unrest in the insurance industry. We have been in touch with legislative representatives to see what they can do.

The Selectmen wish to appoint the members of the Board of Adjustment as is done in other towns. The Planning Board has been appointed for many years.

The progress of the Town Forest Plan is on course. All the boundaries have been marked by Bill Bean with yellow paint. The cost for this came in under budget. The Department of Resources has a program for helping the towns manage their town forests. We are the next in line for their help. They hope to have our plan complete by July 1. Our Town Forest Fund now stands at \$58,000.00.

We are asking that the voters authorize us to withdraw \$300.00 to help in the painting of the trim on the Schoolhouse. The Young Fund was set up for this purpose. The proposed withdrawal last year never was made.

Sara Little has resigned as Tax Collector. We have appointed Sheron Derby to hold the office until Town Meeting. We wish to thank Sara for her excellent service.

We are asking for the power to appoint the Highway Agent. This is necessary as the present agent, Walter Somero, has moved to New Ipswich. We wish to have him continue and will need this vote of the Town.

We are not including the Financial Report in the Town Report due to its length but will make it available to any interested person. Call a Selectman to arrange to see the report.

Upon advice of the Department of Revenue we have decided to discontinue the article relating to accepting the budget as printed. The possible conflict could come after an amended figure was voted and after a vote to accept the budget as printed. The minutes would then show two different figures for the same proposal.

We would like to inform the residents that there have been several dog complaints in the past year. The Selectmen are somewhat reluctant to recommend the adoption of a dog control measure inasmuch as there is a comprehensive state law already on the books. If a resident has a dog-related problem they should call a Selectman and the problem will be acted upon.

The Selectmen note with much regret the passing of Mrs. James B. Perry of Jaffrey. She was one of the Wilson family and did much to help the Town. She was a native and also held the honor of being the first woman Selectman in the State of New Hampshire. She accomplished this as well as being Town Clerk in 1928. She also was in the Legislature at the same time. She always had the best interests of the Town in mind and was always available to answer questions relating to the past. Her mind was always clear and she was extremely sharp witted. She was a good friend of the Town and will be greatly missed.

REPORT OF THE HIGHWAY AGENT

The year 1985 saw some of the projects completed that had been started in 1984.

The Nashua Road's narrow and blind spot has been eliminated.

The water problem on McCoy Road has been taken care of by installing an underdrain.

The Cross Road bridge has been widened and a new guard rail installed. I hope to install the other rail this year.

The McCoy Road and Jarmany Hill cemeteries have been mowed regularly and are starting to look better. The brush around the walls has been cut and this project will continue this year.

This coming year I plan to clean ditches and shoulders or edges of blacktop roads so that they can be sealed (oiled) to prevent them from breaking and cracking up.

The Mountain Road as far as Morse's will be getting some more crushed gravel put on it. This gravel is donated by Tom Cabot. Swamp Road and South Road will need some gravel.

One problem with being a small town and trying to stay within the budget is to get men and equipment when I would like to get the work done. They usually work on larger projects and help us out when they have time.

I want to thank the Selectmen and citizens of Sharon for being patient.

REPORT OF THE FIRE WARDEN

While, for the most part, the entire year was uneventful, the Town experienced its first major forest fire in some years. 10-15 acres on the north side of Rte. 124, located deeply off the road, were involved. With the help of Mutual Aid, 7 towns helped to bring the fire under control in less than eight hours. However, due to the exceptionally dry weather, the fire area was surveyed every 4 hours for three days, until a rainfall occurred.

We were lucky.

Had the fire not been spotted and allowed to build for another few hours, it is more than likely that at least 100 acres would have been involved, and possibly a great deal more. The fire was located such that it had ample fuel from wildland for miles. The area was heavily laden with "blowdown" from the 1938 Hurricane. The potential for disaster was very great.

It is important to note that, officially, I have determined that the cause of this fire was from a lightning strike. While we often stress the importance of care and responsibility in the woods by individuals to prevent wildfires, we must recognize that natural causes also pose a great threat. Sharon has a great deal of forested land, much of it unmaintained and inaccessible. It is my opinion that we are at great risk from forest fires, no matter how careful we are.

The cost of suppressing this fire was \$5,500.00. Even though the State reimbursed the Town for about half, there are no bargains in forest fire control.

As the person ultimately responsible for the suppression of forest fires in town, I am also the one most keenly concerned with the prevention. While snow lies upon the ground you may burn legally. When bare ground shows, call for a permit. If you suspect a woodlands fire call Mutual Aid at 1-352-1100. They will contact the Warden.

The fire this summer, started by Nature, was spotted by citizens, who took their time to call it in.
