TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sunapee in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall in said Sunapee on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Games of Beano be adopted in this Town.

Article 3. To hear the reports of Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors, and committees, or other officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 to pay Water Note, and \$450.00 for interest on its Notes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$3,000.00 for Town Officers Salaries, \$1,500.00 for Town Officers Expenses, \$200.00 for Election and Registration, \$100.00 for Municipal Court, \$700.00 for Repairs and Expenses of Town Property, \$2,500.00 for Police Department, \$50.00 for Vital Statistics, \$5,000.00 for the Fire Department, \$200.00 for the Health Department, \$1,500.00 for the District Nurse Association, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$13,000.00 for Highway Summer Maintenance, \$250.00 for the Town Dump, \$10,000.00 for Highway Winter Maintenance, \$5,000.00 for Road Oil, \$3,000.00 for machinery Maintenance, \$3,500.00 for Street Lights, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$700.00 for the Library, \$4,000.00 for Town Poor and Old Age Assistance, \$1,200.00 for the care of its Cemeteries, \$7,000.00 for the Water Department (including Debt and interest) and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for Civil Defense Program, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$150.00 for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes for the years 1951 and 1952, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2,000.00 for work on Play Ground, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 to assist the Fish and Game Club to advertise Lake Sunapee, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for Band Concerts at George's Mills and Sunapee Harbor during July and August, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for the Collection of Garbage for the entire year, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the observance of Memorial Day, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$450.00 to maintain Information Booth, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following Highway from a point opposite homestead of Edith Paul Harrison to a point opposite homestead known as Harding Hill Farm, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to extend the side walk from Ralph Alexander's to George Goff's driveway and raise money for the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 for the Recreational Committee, for maintenance of Recreational Activities, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to except the road around the so-called Dana Circle on Birch Point as deeded to the Town by Ethel W. Dana, Sept. 1950 and raise \$300.00 to improve the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to widen and improve the road opposite the Fire Station, distance of 150 feet, raise money for same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise, not to exceed \$300.00 for purchase of land opposite the Eastman Cemetery for Cemetery purposes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to rent or purchase a Combination Shovel (new or used), issue Short Term Notes to be paid within five years, to cover purchase price, The Selectmen and Road Agents serve as a Committee to buy said equipment, The Notes issued under this article shall not exceed \$15,000.00, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 25. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-first day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and fifty-one.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Sunapee School Board:

I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Enrollment

The enrollment for the school year 1950-51 is 201 divided as follows:

Elementary Grades—148

(1-8)

Senior High—53

(9-12)

In September the elementary grades were so divided that some rooms had between 35-40 pupils—too large a number for effective instruction—especially where there are two grades per room. An additional teacher was employed to alleviate this condition and provide a reasonable teaching load in the elementary grades where a good foundation is so important to later school success. This teacher handles the general subjects in Grade 7, English for Grade 8 and physical education classes starting in Grade 5. With this additional teacher the enrollment in Grades 1-6 is divided into four class rooms as follows:

Grades 1 & 2—24

Grades 2 & 3—27

Grades 3 & 4—27

Grades 5 & 6—31

In-Service Training

For the third successive year, an extension course was offered in this School Union. The course given was in Guidance and was conducted by Dr. Harold Hyde, Chief of the Division of Educational Research of the State Department of Education. Three of the Sunapee elementary teachers were enrolled. Five members of the staff attended summer school.

The high percentage of the faculty who either attended summer school or took an extension course during the year is commendable. It demonstrates a desire on their part for professional improvement.

Handwriting

This year we have added the Rinehart Functional Handwriting System in Grades 1-7. Trained handwriting supervisors visit each class room once a month, outline the work for the next month and check the work of each pupil for the previous month. A diagnostic report is given to the teacher indicating the items which are to be made the basis for remedial instruction. Indications point to a general improvement of pupils' handwriting.

Repairs

During the summer the entire building was given a thorough cleaning by the janitor.

The main repair items were as follows:

The stairwells and first and second floor corridors were painted.

The Home Economics laboratory and sewing room were painted, the floors sanded and re-finished.

The shop was pointed—this work was done by the students.

The attic was insulated.

The Principal's house was insulated.

Chimneys at the school and Principal's house were repaired and re-topped.

New Equipment

The major items of new equipment purchased were:

A new welding unit for the Shop

1 new typewriter

1 used long-carriage typewriter from Surplus Property

The school also benefited from Mr. Bartlett's generosity with

the construction of a new sidewalk from the Bartlett residence to the Central School. Ex-Governor Bartlett was present at the Dedication Exercises of the sidewalk on September 20. The school is indeed fortunate to have such a benefactor.

Conclusion

I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation received during the past year from the school staff, together with the loyal support of the School Board and the continued interest of the other citizens in the welfare of the schools.

SUNAPEE SCHOOL WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District of Sunapee qualified to vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the I. O. O. F. Hall in said District on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, 1951, at one-thirty o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear and act upon the reports of the School Board, Treasurers, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen.

Article 7. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate \$55,652.23, as recommended by the School Board in its annual report, for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officers, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district; and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income estimated at \$2,319.37; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,628.00 from unexpended funds allocated for teachers' salaries, janitor's salary, and teachers' retirement, and to pay to each full-time employee in said District therefrom the sum of \$200.00 as additional compensation in excess of contract for the school year 1950 through June, 1951.

Article 9. To see if the District will vote a deficiency appropriation in the amount of \$2,628.00 and instruct its clerk to issue a certificate therefor to the Selectmen of the Town.

Article 10. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to remodel and make alterations and improvements to the Central School Building; and to construct and equip a building for gymnasium and other purposes on property owned by the District; and authorize the School Board to make, execute and deliver any and all agreements and contracts incident thereto, and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the alterations, improvements and remodeling of the Central School Building and for the construction and equipping of a building for gymnasium and other purposes, and authorize the issue of bonds therefor; said bonds to be issued pursuant to Chapter 72 of the Revised Laws and amendments thereto, and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
