THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at 10 a.m. in the forenoon for the election of Town officials elected by ballot, and the Troy Elementary School on the same day at 8 p.m. in the afternoon for the meeting on the remainder of the articles in the following Warrant.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town treasurer, tax collector and all other officers chosen by ballot.

Article 2. To see what action the town wishes to take upon the figures submitted by the budget committee with their recommendations.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:

- a. Town officers salaries
- b. Town officers expenses
- c. Election & registration
- d. Town Hall and other buildings
- e. Parks & Playgrounds
- f. Legal fees and vital statistics
- g. Insurance
- h. Social Security

- i. Interest-temporary loans
- j. Memorial Day
- k. Town dump
- l. Street lighting
- m. Civil defense
- n. Pine blister control

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for winter highway maintenance.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway oiling and general summer maintenance.

Article 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$377.66 to which the State will contribute \$2,517.72 if voted and accepted, for the construction and maintenance of Class 5 roads.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the construction of a tanker body on the truck secured through civil defense.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of the so-called Nattila Garage building for Town use.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the police department.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance and operation of the water department.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for an extension of the water main on South Street approximately 400 feet.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$392.28 (six cents per \$1,000.00 of the

towns equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Regional Association.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the installation of a fence at the entrance to the town dump.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse or take any action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as its share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the War Memorial Program.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the installation of combination windows at the library.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges in anticipation of taxes.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the installation of two street lights on Longmeadow Drive, and one at the South end of the common.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of the tax collector from \$1,200.00 to \$1,500.00 per year.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the payment of water bonds and interest on same.

Article 26. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

GAY-KIMBALL LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Gay-Kimball Library is now one of the member libraries in the statewide library development program. Upon joining, we were presented a set of Americana Encyclopedias.

Our librarian, Mrs. Dorothy Lagrenade, has availed herself of several opportunities offered by the program. She attends state library book-buying meetings regularly and has completed **Principles of Book Selection**, one in a series of courses offered by the state library. She expects to take **Cataloging and Classification** in the spring.

An unused room in the basement now houses our children's library. The Howe-Haskell Children's Room was made possible by the use of trust funds. The room was painted, equipped with children's chairs, book shelves, tables, a permanent movie screen, and adequate heating facilities. In order to make our children's book collection more adequate 204 books in this category were purchased.

The library welcomed over 350 people to the Art and Historical Exhibit on display during the Sesquicentennial. Over 100 people attended the Helen Eeles Prario Art Exhibit. Both events were held in the Children's Room.

Children's Story Hours are now a regular part of the library every other Thursday afternoon. Attendance ranges from 20 to over 100 on special programs. During the summer the Story Hour was integrated into the War Memorial Program. Story Hours are made possible by volunteer readers from the Friends of the Library.

Through the generosity of 29 families who contributed to the Gay-Kimball Library Magazine Fund, 24 new magazine subscriptions have been added to our library selection.

57 fiction and 81 non-fiction books have been added to our adult section. Approximately \$990.00 has been spent to purchase books which were used by 5,309 people.

The library is now open on Monday nights from 6-8 in addition to other regular library hours. Two substitute librarians and a library aide in the children's section have been added to the library staff.

The trustees thank everyone, who by their support, enthusiasm, and use have contributed to make the Gay-Kimball Library the active living library which it is.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD ESTABLISHED AT TOWN MEETING MARCH 1965

During this past year the Planning Board has attempted to analyze the needs of the town and evaluate the function of a Planning Board in a town such as ours.

In the first place, it should be clearly pointed out what a Planning Board is supposed to do. Its objectives can be outlined as follows:

1. **Economic.** Are we making the best use of our lands and streets? Are we planning for future industrial expansion? Can we plan for better balance in the character of our community by improving residential attractiveness?

2. **Social.** Do we have a sound, efficient educational system? What improvements or innovations should be considered in recreational opportunities?

3. **Physical.** In planning for land use, do we give proper regard to health, safety and fire hazards? Do we encourage the development of our scenic and rural areas for residential purposes?

Many subjects have been discussed during this past year, such as:

- (a) the development of the necessary land use maps,
- (b) the need for a survey of our water utility and the future requirement of a sewer system,
- (c) the need for future planning of public facilities, such as a fire station and a garage for road equipment and for the Water Department,
- (d) the need for a reasonable, sensible zoning ordinance in order to preserve and enhance property values and improve the attractiveness of our community. This type of

program is deemed essential for residential and industrial growth in the future,

- (e) reviewing our present very worthwhile summer recreational program in terms of future requirements,
- (f) the existing hazardous condition to pedestrians at the Village Pond bridge and the possible future relocation of Route 12 was reviewed with representatives of the State Highway Department.

The scope of a Planning Board's activities is evident from the above. A major proposal, such as Zoning, takes a great deal of time for development and presentation to the townspeople through public hearings. Such a Zoning Ordinance has been prepared, and following review by the town's attorney, it is planned to be presented at public hearings to the townspeople.

It is the recommendation of the present Planning Board that a continuance of a Planning Board is in the best interest of the community.
