

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, in said Belmont, on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for three years, and one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.

4. To see what the Town will vote to do with its Parsonage Funds.

5. To see if the Town will vote to build or buy a shed for Town machinery and appropriate money for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all Taxes paid on or before July 5th.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take such action as may be necessary to make available the necessary town funds, provided a proposal is submitted to the Works Progress Administration for a project.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$96 for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

10. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money for a children's playground, and if so how much.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to build a bridge at Tioga.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds to an amount not exceeding eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000) for the purpose of refunding outstanding indebtedness of the Town, including the indebtedness of the Town relative to the financing of the Works Progress Administration Project on the Tilton Road.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint one or more Road Agents.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to accept any Precinct funds made available to be used on Town sidewalks.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to re-open and repair the old highway leading from Mile Hill Road to Ladd Hill Road. 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to pay outstanding bills on the Tilton road.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SYNOPSIS OF FOREST FIRE PERMIT LAW

No person shall kindle a fire upon the land of another without permission from the owner, agent or caretaker thereof.

No person shall kindle a fire or burn any material in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste or cut over lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without the written permission of the Forest Fire Warden or the presence of the warden or person designated to superintend such burning.

Any person, firm or corporation causing or kindling a fire without a permit, when a permit is required, and also any person, by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, is liable to the town for all expenses incurred in attending or extinguishing such fire.

When permission has been obtained from the land owner, camp or cooking fires may be kindled without permission of the Forest Fire Warden (unless such permission is required by city or town), at suitable times and in suitable places where they will not endanger woodlands. Upon failure to totally extinguish such fires the parties responsible are subject to the same liabilities and penaties as are prescribed for other fires.

Penalty for kindling a fire without a permit, \$200, or imprisonment not more than thirty days.

Penalty for kindling a fire wilfully, or in a careless or imprudent manner, \$500, or imprisonment not more than one year.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER

To the Superintendent of Schools:

Time brings change and change, in educational systems no less than in other institutions, brings new opportunities and new problems. Since my last report three new teachers have been added to the Senior-Junior High School faculty. Miss Eleanor Arkell, New Hampshire University 1936, began the work of Miss Elizabeth Prime last April; Miss Lucille Marshall, Plymouth 1938, took up the commercial department duties of Miss Roselyn Gould in the latter part of November; Luther Preston, Keene 1938, assumed in September the vocational and science work formerly conducted by Daniel Sullivan. I am indebted to these teachers, present and past, for fine cooperation in all activities of the school.

The maximum enrollment this year has been, in the high school, sixty pupils; in the junior high, thirty-seven. The exceptionally large freshman class numbering at present twenty-one is a reflection, in part at least, of the increased interest in the "new" high schools by the young people of the town. This year there are nine students in the senior class, a number equal to the graduating groups of 1936 and 1938, the largest graduating classes in the history of the school.

A Class Night was presented in 1938, for the first time in the high school commencement activities. This program seemed to provide a pleasant setting for the informal class parts and has proven popular enough to warrant a similar presentation in 1939.

Seventeen of the twenty-two boys in high school are enrolled in the vocational course. These students have gained valuable skills and have taken home many useful pieces of house and farm equipment. The shop course this year is practical mechanics, a somewhat broader vocational course than the course in cabinet making previously given. Valuable units in sheet metal work, cold metal, plumbing, forging, and electricity are included in this course. Mr. Preston reports that shop equipment is adequate; a jigsaw would be a valuable addition.

Work in the commercial department continues to attract a good number of students. Four of the graduation class have taken the full amount of commercial work. The purchase of two new typewriters has aided this department greatly.

In the social science and English an attempt is being made to adapt, in a more effective way, the work to the needs of the pupils. Oral English has been stressed; the course in civics required of all freshmen should have a reflection in better citizenship among the young people.

Work in the sciences has been much facilitated by the fitting up of the science room with a large laboratory bench, running water, and gas burners. A good part of the work was done by the practical mechanics class. There is some need for more equipment in biology.

An important step in the adaptation of the school program to the needs of the pupils would be the introduction of work in home economics. The kitchen is now available for this purpose since it is no longer used as a science room.

There has been opportunity for more work in music this year; dramatics and basketball have provided outside activities of interest this winter period; it is hoped that work in prize speaking may be undertaken shortly; it has been possible, with National Youth Administration funds, to provide hot lunches for pupils of both schools, at a nominal price.

I am encouraged that work in landscaping the school grounds has already begun.

I am extremely grateful to the other members of the faculty, the School Board, the Superintendent, and all in the community who have worked with me this year.

#### FINANCES

The per pupil cost of maintaining our elementary schools during the last school year was \$67.47. The State Median was \$79.98. The per pupil cost of maintaining our high school was \$107.48. The State Median was \$105.33. These figures are based on average membership.

In July we received from the State the sum of \$550.83 as an adjustment for the year 1935-36 in State Aid. In December we received \$5,367.94 as our allotment of State Aid for this current year.

It is impossible to determine the exact amount of State Aid which we shall receive next year until after appropriations are made by the legislature. We may reasonably expect approximately \$5,400.00.

The School Board estimates that the cost of maintaining the schools during the next fiscal year will be \$20,107.45. Deducting an estimated income of \$5,500.00 leaves \$14,607.45, the assessment required to balance the School Board's budget.

I wish to express my appreciation for the co-operation

and assistance which I have received from many sources, including the children, during the last year.


