- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,025.00 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for hydrant rental.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the support of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the support of the Campton Volunteer Fire Department.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be set aside towards the trade-in of our road grader.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

The following is a report of the activities conducted for the benefit of the town of Campton, by the Bureau Public Health Nursing, Division of N. H. Public Health. Please have printed in your town report.

The residents of Campton, all age groups, were invited to attend the Sabin Oral Polio Vaccine Clinics held in Plymouth in the summer and fall. These were sponsored by the Plymouth Medical Society, with State Public Health Nurse assisting with the organization and conducting clinics. She was assisted by volunteer nurses, including nurses from Campton. Many took advantage of this opportunity. About 50 preschool age children completed the three Types of Sabin, 24 others received one or two doses. It is important that these and any others complete their series of three types. A record of preschool vaccines given have been turned over to family physicians as indicated on cards signed at clinics. Any who have not completed should contact their family physicians.

On September 21st a Tuberculin Sterneedle Interdremal Testing program was conducted in the school. A total of 140 were tested. The reactors to the tests were notified and requested to follow-through with Chest x-rays either with private physicians or at the Chest Clinic in Plymouth.

Chest Clinics are held in Plymouth in the Spring and Fall. These are conducted by the N. H. Tuberculosis & Health Association and State Department of Public Health. Many from Campton take advantage of this opportunity for chest x-rays. Notices are sent preceding the clinics to doctors, public health and school nurses and patients concerned. Reports follow the clinics.

In the Fall, the State Mobile X-ray Unit was in the town for x-rays available to the community and industries. A total of 267 x-rays were taken. Mr. Jenson, X-ray Survey Supervisor of the Division of Public Health was in charge. The Public Health Nurse follows up on x-ray reports as indicated.

Home visits have been made in the town and assistance given as necessary.

My sincerest thanks to the following for giving assistance in the Health Program the past year:

School Nurse, Mrs. Helen Fisher, R. N.

Local Registered Nurses who assisted at the Sabin Clinics and acted as telephone squads to remind people of the Sabin Clinics.

Plymouth Medical Association for making Sabin Clinics available to the town, and all others who assisted in any way to the success of the program.

Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.

2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.

3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning

late in the day.

4. Have something to keep the fire under control — pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.

5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.

6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

In 1962 we had 2 fires. We burned $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres. Permits issued - 76.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

1962

The school nurse made 58 visits to the Campton Schools during the school year.

Inspections were made frequently on all pupils. Individual conferences were held with pupils pertaining to their health.

First aid and advice were given when needed. Home visits were made when necessary. Weighing and measuring was done twice in the year.

Hearing and vision screening tests were done on each pupil, and notices sent home to parents on ones that did not satisfactorily pass the tests. Arrangements were made and the nurse assisted with Intradermal T. B. tests on all, and follow-up on chest clinic on ones that had a reaction.

Arrangements were made for some dental corrections.

Assistance was given toward eye glasses by Sight Conservation — 6.

Children taken home by nurse — 6

Home visits — 15

Health records kept on each pupil.

The School Nurse attended an all-day conference in Laconia with the Director of School Health Services; Speech and Hearing Workshop in Plymouth; State Nurses' Meeting in Conway (school nurses' section); Teachers Convention in Manchester (school nurses' section); and Plymouth Teachers College in Plymouth for three weeks in June on School Health Workshop.

SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

This year I shall try to confine my report mostly to educational philosophy and fact concerning your school. The report of your Principal, Mr. Twombly, is so interesting and complete that otherwise much that I would have to say would be duplication.

It is indeed a pleasure to visit your fine new school. The fact that the school was finished so that teachers and the Principal could start making plans for the Fall during the summer made a much easier transition from our one-room schools to the new building. Usually when moving from one school building to another it takes several months to arrange procedure and programs but in this particular instance, routines were established early and things going very smoothly only a few short weeks after school started. The advantages of all being together in a new building are too numerous to mention here and I think are self-evident to most, but two of the biggest advantages enjoyed by the children are that all are under the same roof where they can study and socialize together. This plus the fact that each teacher now has many fewer preparations to make should work on the plus side of better education. We also have strengthened our program by departmentalizing our work in the four upper grades. This is not an experiment as it had been done in other districts in the union and state very successfully before and we were able to take advantage of information gained from them. All of the teachers are much in favor of this and any observations I can make indicate this has been a success. We are now able to take advantage of teacher strengths and pass this advantage on to the children.

You have every reason to be proud of your building. I have heard nothing but favorable com-

ments. The state-wide feeling is that you have built a great deal of school for the money you have invested. Now that we have a good hot lunch program, we have a complete school.

You will notice that the school budget calls for a greater expenditure for textbooks than in the past, but I have tried to cut down in the other areas where I am financially responsible to compensate for this. The reason for this increase is to allow money to begin replacing various series of textbooks. Most of the ones we have are four to five years old which is considered the "wear out" period of a textbook and this is true in our case. Where we have filled in the replacements as needed over the past several years we will not have to replace whole sets. The publishers have replaced all the series we use with later editions which have improvements over the earlier ones. This, of course, can not be done all in one year. It should be accomplished within the next three-year period. testing programs remain as in the past and I recommend no change with the possible exception of adding an aptitude test in the 7th and 8th grades to aid in placement of pupils at the secondary school level. Test results and anecdotal records are now kept for all children and this file accompanies them from the eighth grade into high school.

Some time in the future I would like to see if a signal from the state educational T. V. channel can be obtained at the school. The educational T. V. programs now broadcast from Durham in the area of Science, Mathematics, Social Studies, Music and Art offer a great deal toward supplementing and implementing our school program.

People in the district should be continuing to think about the Cooperative high school idea. It is too bad that the votes taken by various districts last June turned out as they did but it was obvious that the type of program outlined by the committees that worked so hard was not favored by the majority.

Study will be picked up again no later than next Fall but it was deemed wise at this time to wait to see if the report of the Interim Commission was implemented by the Legislature to make it more financially desirable to cooperate. This time the study will probably be in the direction of a grades 9-12 school. I personally favor a 1-12 Cooperative for many reasons but primarily because it would be best in terms of education and cheapest in the terms of finances. However, most lay people would probably favor taking one step at a time.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent of schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1961-1962 received a salary of \$8,500 which was made up as follows: \$4,250 paid from the per capita tax and \$4,250 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,200.00 for travel within the union was also prorated as stated above.

The table shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I hereby submit my first annual report as Principal of the Campton Elementary School.

The doors of the Campton Elementary School were opened for classes for the first time on September 5, 1962. The school is a six-room plant with an activity room, kitchen and teachers' room. Grades one through four are organized as self contained classrooms while grades five through eight are departmentalized. Since it is a six-room school containing eight grades, it was necessary to combine several grades. Listed below you will find the teacher's names, their grades assignments and the number of children in each room:

The upper four grades use these rooms as homerooms. Spelling and Penmanship in these grades are taught by each homeroom teacher.

Each classroom in the building contains its own sink and water bubbler, and the first grade also has a bathroom.

The music program is under the direction of Mrs. Arline Wilson. I am sure the people of Campton will agree that the Christmas Program on December 18, 1962 demonstrates the fine work Mrs. Wilson is doing with our children. In addition to working with each grade, Mrs. Wilson has organized a school chorus.

Our hot lunch program, under the direction of Mrs. Harriet Sargeant, began January 10, 1963. The meals have been excellent and the children who are eating hot lunches are certainly receiving a nutritious, well-balanced meal. Approximately 95 per cent of the children are now taking part in the program. Halfpint bottles of milk are also provided for the children during recess.

May I take the opportunity to thank all those who contributed money to the program and the many who bought note cards to help. This money has all been deeply appreciated.

At present, I am in the midst of forming a boys' basketball team. This is one of the finest opportunities the boys will have to develop and understand teamwork to build the characteristics that will enable them to serve as good citizens in their community. I also hope to have a boys' baseball team in the spring.

We have added a class in conservation and health to the curriculum on the sixth grade level. The course is being taught by Mrs. Dole who organized and set up the course. It was felt that the children lack understanding of the plant and wild life found in the area and that this section of the course would help to build an appreciation of these things. The second half of the year is devoted to health, which not only helps to establish good health habits for the sixth grade, but also introduces them to a study of the human body, which they will receive in more detail in the seventh and eighth grades.

Much to our regret, Mrs. Stuart Currier has retired from teaching. She certainly served the community well for many years and certainly deserves a note of thanks from the people of Campton for her continued devotion and the help given the children in her classes.

Mr. Benjamin English, Jr. has replaced Mrs. Currier. Mr. English is a graduate of Nasson College in Springvale, Maine and is to be commended for the fine work he is doing during his first year of teaching.

Percy Still, the school janitor, has done an excellent job keeping the school neat and pleasant to work in, both for the teachers and the students. The appearance of the building both inside and out is something that Percy and the people of Campton should be very proud of.

We are very fortunate to have the continued service of the State Bookmobile. In addition, we also are most fortunate to have a science library. This library provides the children with a wealth of science information that would not otherwise be available to them.

This year we have also started a system of "room mothers." Three mothers offer their help to a teacher in each room in planning and preparing for parties and other room activities. The room mothers this year are:

As many of you know, the playground does not provide an adequate place to play when there has been a little rain. It becomes very muddy and remains in that condition for some time. We are very fortunate this fall to have Mr. and Mrs. Willis Merrill come to the rescue and allow the children to play in their field. However, this is certainly not the answer to the problem and I feel that we should all be considering ways to improve this situation.

May I ask your cooperation in one matter. If you have a problem involving the school, go to the teacher first; if the problem still remains unsolved, go to the Principal; if a satisfactory solution still is not reached, see the superintendent.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, Superintendent M. Wayne Bowie, the teachers, students, parents and citizens of Campton for their help and cooperation.

THE MUSIC PROGRAM IN CAMPTON

Just one year ago your music supervisor was calling at five different schools and teaching in seven classrooms.

Lower grade classrooms were engaged in activities of rote and reading songs, rhythms, listening, and autoharp accompaniments. In addition to the same activities, the upper grades were gaining experience in singing in harmony, analyzing songs and recorded music, and discussing elementary theory.

June graduation exercises were particularly memorable because they were held in the new school, with music provided by the students.

In September with all classes in the new school, it was possible for the first time to present a graded program of music instruction. Our Christmas Concert was an outstanding musical experience, since most of the children had never before participated in a program of this kind.

We now have all music books, records, record players, rhythm instruments and accompaniment instruments in one building and readily available to the entire staff. New books for grades five, six and seven were added this Fall in the same series as was recently purchased for grades two, three and four. One book for the first grade and a set of eighth grade books would complete the series. Additional rhythm instruments are also needed for the upper grades.
