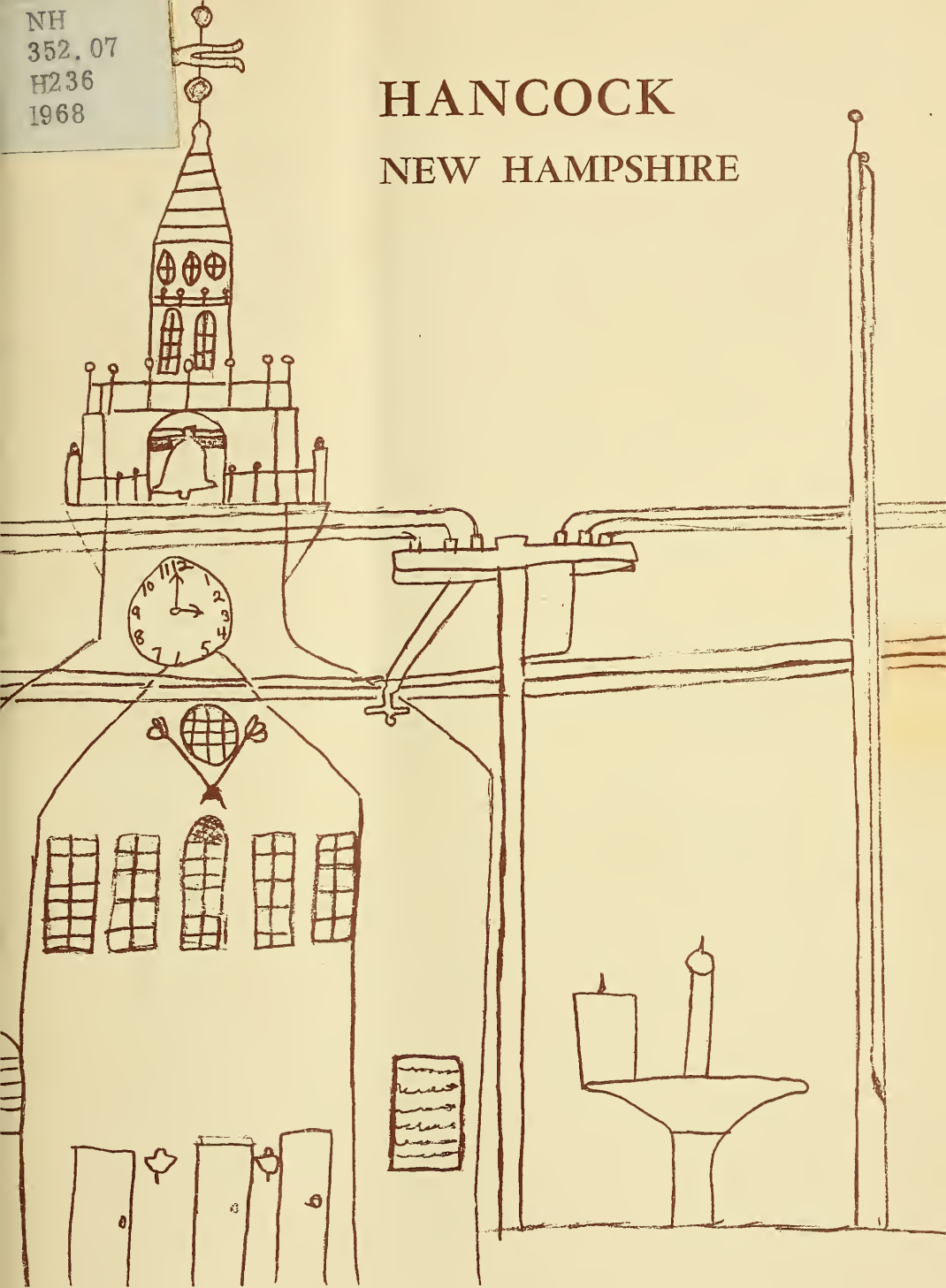

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Town History Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 for the Water Reserve Fund, or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (four hundred dollars) \$400 to buy 3 radio monitors for the Fire Department, or take any other action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 to repair the roof of the High School Building, or take any other action relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (nine hundred ninety-four dollars and six cents) \$994.06 as our share of the T.R.A. program, and to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to (twenty-one thousand dollars) \$21,000 for a four year program and to raise and appropriate the necessary interest money, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept a strip of land 50 feet wide by approximately 800 feet long and roadway constructed thereon built to town specifications from Eleanor Lewis as a relocation of the town road by the Felch property or take any other action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the present road by the Felch property at the time of acceptance of the relocated road, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two thousand two hundred dollars) \$2,200 to replace the present docks at the Town Beach with aluminum docks, or take any other action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of installing a heating system in the High School Building and to raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2,000 for the purpose, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (five hundred dollars) \$500.00; this sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended for the purposes of the Conservation Commission or added to by gifts of money.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Hancock Building Ordinance as submitted by the Hancock Planning Board, or take any other action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to appoint the Selectmen to act as the Building Inspector.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent instead of being elected, or take any other action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on property taxes if paid 30 days after date of bill, or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted match is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cook-out, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following section will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn —
 - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
 - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
 - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

HANCOCK CONSERVATION COMMISSION
Second Annual Report

After organizational beginnings of the first year there have not been as many formal meetings, However:

The Commission has arranged for professional guidance in the management of the Town Forest surrounding the Juggernaut Pond Reservoir.

This fall the Commission was represented at a two day Seminar on Community Development and Planning.

The Commission was reasonably active in promoting favorable action on Question Seven, with reference to taxation of farm, forest, and open lands.

The Commission accepted a gift of several acres from the Whiton Corporation in the center of their development on Prospect Hill. This was done in cooperation with the Town Subdivision Ordinance, which specifies that some land be kept open for recreational purposes.

The Commission is continuing its program of Conservation in the Elementary School.

Also work is continuing on an inventory and map of wet lands, forest lands, open lands, and recreational possibilities.

The annual Roadside Cleanup was even more successful this year. The idea is catching on, and it is planned to continue the practice.

Work is continuing to augment the Town Conservation Fund. Contributions will be most welcome.

NORWAY POND DOCK COMMITTEE REPORT

The purpose of this committee is to consider the problem of continuing to provide adequate dock facilities for the Norway Pond bathing beach and to make appropriate recommendations.

The dock facilities now provided, consisting of a 56' x 3' outer section with two 40' x 3' shore legs, is of heavy timber construction supported by steel pipes set in large concrete blocks. This equipment has seen at least twelve years of service and is now subject to rapid deterioration;

replacement of special steel parts in the assembly will be especially difficult and expensive. Normal wear and tear costs are increasing annually and are estimated at \$150 for 1968-9. With increasing scarcity and cost of labor, plus need for use of power equipment, the cost of removal and replacement of the dock is estimated at \$250 for the current year.

We are in agreement with the opinion of the men who have been responsible for the maintenance and operation of the dock that it should be replaced and that replacement with modern equipment can be justified by reduction of annual costs alone.

We have investigated the features and cost of modern dock equipment and have inspected installations of such equipment located in this area. We have considered that the essential specifications for equipment to meet our replacement needs should include safety, low maintenance costs, sectional unit construction and minimum weight consistent with solid structural quality.

On this basis we are in agreement in recommending for replacement an assembly offered by the Tuay-Bridge Co. of Keene, N. H., comprising 16-4' x 8' aluminum docking sections with non-skid plastic covered decks, all necessary aluminum supporting standards and 4 aluminum ladders. These units assemble to form a dock equivalent to the existing set-up having shore projections 40' long and a front section 56' long but with deck width increased from 3' to 4'. The section units of this assembly are of weight and size to permit handling by one man. The total cost of this dock assembly is quoted at \$2,200 including initial installation.

We have had information to indicate that the present off-shore float equipment should be replaced. Our inquiries into recent experience with the present float leads to the opinion that replacement is not now justified. In the event of such replacement being considered we have quotation from Tuay-Bridge Co. of \$675 for a 10' by 10' aluminum frame, styrofoam float, wood deck unit.

It is our recommendation that our next Town Meeting Warrant should include an article covering the expenditure of \$2,200 for the purchase and initial installation of the dock equipment discussed above and as offered by the Tuay-Bridge Company.

HANCOCK 1968

One reason the flower boxes at the Post Office bloomed brightly in 1968 was the periodic watering by Helen Stewart. The sign over the door was re-lettered and from time to time there was a parking problem.

After 26 years Dorothy Devens Clark reached retirement; on a provisional basis Norman Phelps took over. In June a reception at the Inn honored the outgoing Postmaster who had served us so well for so long.

Through a cold windy January, through a lingering wet spring and the early heavy snows of November and December the changes so evident in recent years continued relentlessly. New houses, new people and changing ideas marked the sweep of change into Southern New Hampshire.

One of the changes had to do with politics. After many years with a Democrat as Governor of the State, Hancock lined up with the majority to elect our neighbor Republican Walter Peterson of Peterborough to the seat of honor in Concord. Hancock helped significantly. Currently we have 423 Republicans to 79 Democrats registered. Nixon was chosen to occupy the White House and the people of Hancock and Greenfield came up with Al Daloz as their State Representative. He replaced Don Davis of our neighboring Town who held the seat effectively for the two preceding sessions. Hancock made it eight in a row by holding the State Senate seat for this district.

Each September we come to expect some rural art from Joe Quinn down at his vegetable and fruit stand. The natural glow of large and small ripe pumpkins is dressed up by a loaded wagon drawn by a life-like straw horse and driven by an impressive straw man in costume. Across the way our Town fountain spouts surrounded by flower beds. From here the few hundred yards of our main street to the Grange Hall are recorded and rerecorded on film never to be forgotten. Each year a thousand or more photos are taken; some of these should survive a hundred years from now to show how we look today.

One of the interesting events of the year took place in Peterborough when Becky Hill, Dorothee English, Eleanor Amidon, Ginny Gleason and others put on a Ball at the Peterborough Armory for the benefit of the Hospital. Never in memory had such an event taken place and several hundred wives were able somehow to get their re-

spective husbands into evening clothes. One description of the happening: "Culture flowers in the Monadnock Region."

Our ties with Peterborough are ever closer. Thayer Linsley who had a place in Hancock for more than 50 years helped the MacDowell Colony with a gift of \$230,000.

The war in Vietnam drags on. We are deeply conscious of it. Lt. Bayard Russ, United States Marine Corps, will not again be walking the shady lanes of Hancock. The service for him was on January 29th at the Meeting House.

To give the best possible training for our youth, Hancock joined the other eight Towns to vote overwhelmingly the bond issue for Conval, the new Coop School. It seemed like a lot . . . but for parents this is an unusually difficult age to bring up the young. A word much in vogue, "psychedelic," may come to describe our era; older citizens may come to know what the word means some years from now. Perhaps we should ask Barry Cass, Wayne Hanson, Ed Burt, Phyllis Garand or Sandy Higgins. Maybe one of them will voyage to the moon. This, by the way, was the year Astronauts Borman, Lovell, Anders circled the moon in Apollo 8.

Many of our somewhat older citizens are up to interesting things. At random here are a few: John F. Rollins who was transferred by his oil company to England flew there in his own Beechcraft Bonanza D-50E. Leslie/Mary Wright were honored on their 40th wedding anniversary. And without fanfare, Ed/Laura Richardson tucked away the famous saw rig whose history would almost be a history of the last 50 years of our Town.

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HANCOCK SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

Hancock, New Hampshire

March 9, 1968

On March 9, 1968 the annual School District Meeting was opened at 4 P.M. by Robert English, Moderator. The polls were declared open for voting on Article 1 of the Warrant, namely to elect a Moderator, Clerk and a Member of the School Board to serve until June 30, 1968.

After the Moderator read Article 1 of the Warrant, it was moved "that the polls be now opened and remain open until 8 P.M. to consider Article 1 of the Warrant and that Articles 2 through 7 be taken up at 8 P.M." The motion carried, the Moderator declared the meeting recessed until 8 P.M. and voting began.

At 8 P.M. the Moderator reopened the Meeting and declared the polls closed. He then read Articles 2 through 7 of the Warrant and the certification. Voting was as follows:

Article 2. Motion by Mr. Charles Robinson, Member of the School Board: "I move that the salaries of the district officers for the period March 9 through such time as the business of the district is concluded be as follows: Chairman of the School Board, \$25.00; each other Member, \$15.00; Clerk, \$10.00; Moderator, \$10.00; Ballot Clerks, \$1.50 per hour each; Auditors, \$1.50 per hour each."

The motion carried.

Article 3. Motion by Mr. Arthur Tremblay, Chairman of the School Board: "I move that the reports as printed be accepted and placed on file with the clerk."

The motion carried.

Article 4. Motion by Mrs. Garland, Member of the School Board: "I move that the two auditors be appointed to serve as long as may be necessary to transact the business of the school district for the school year 1967-68." It was moved and seconded that Mr. William Brown and Mr. Frank MacFarlane serve as auditors.

The motion carried.

Article 5. Motion by Mr. Arthur Tremblay, Chairman of the School Board: "I move that the school board be authorized to convey to the Contoocook Valley School District, by Quitclaim Deed, the present Hancock Elementary School, together with the contents thereof, and all land owned by the District."

There was some discussion during which Mrs. Nancy West questioned whether a two-thirds vote were required for this motion to pass. Mr. Edwards explained that only when money is borrowed is a two-thirds vote needed.

It was moved and seconded to vote on this motion by secret ballot. The motion lost.

The motion was read again by Mr. Tremblay, was seconded, and after more discussion it was voted and the motion carried.

Article 6. Motion by Mrs. Mary Garland, Member of the School Board: "I move that the school board be authorized to direct the Treasurer to pay over to the Treasurer of the Contoocook Valley School District any cash balance in his hands or money due the District as of July 1, 1968, less any outstanding bills or debts; any sum so transferred to be used as a credit against the Contoocook Valley School District assessment to be raised by the pre-existing Hancock District to defray its share of the cost of operation of the Contoocook Valley School District, during the first year of operation."

The motion carried.
