



### REPORT OF THE ROAD AGENT

1976 started out with a washout on the Cold River Road, which required stone and gravel fill.

The wood bridge rails on the bridge by William Kemp's were replaced by heavy pipe rails welded to metal posts.

The Cold River Road was graveled from the Walpole line to the Walpole line. A distance of 1.3 miles.

The Header on the Long Road bridge washed out which required digging out and relaying with stone.

We had 1071 cubic yards of gravel crushed for finish work in various places in town. Gravel is beginning to be a scarce commodity and it should be of concern to the voters. In fact good gravel without crushing it is a thing of the past. What gravel supplies there are, are being crushed and hauled to other towns, which indicates the tight supply.

Another washout on Egerton Road below the Dole Place caused by a blown over clump of trees required considerable expense for equipment, stone and gravel.

All roads that needed it were graded and raked, some of them twice. Culverts were replaced on the Winch Hill Road, Holden Hill Road and Tory Hill Road. Brush was cut and chipped on Holden Hill and Walker Hill black tops, Tory Hill Road from 12-A to Drewsville Road. Also Winch Hill Road to Chester Mason's, Kelly Road and Cross Road from 12-A to village and sections of Lawrence Road.

Ten tons of calcuim chloride was purchased and applied on gravel roads in front of residences to keep down the dust. All asphalt roads were patched and 2.2 miles were swept and resurfaced.

All of the roadsides were mowed for the second year in a row. This helps very much to keep the brush down.

We still have our problems with our friends the beavers on Crane Brook Road. They continue to harrass us by plugging up the culvert.

We also took down many dead trees and there seems to be more and more dying all the time.

The TRA money was expended on Holden Hill Road for culverts and excavating. The gas money or Duncan money was expended on The Hemlock Road for culverts, underdrain, some gravel and finished cutting trees and chipping brush.

For the winter season we used 109.355 tons of salt and had 1000 cubic yards of sand screened. 1976 was a bad year for ice with approximately 72 inches of snow thrown in. We also had an ice jam on Cold River at McDermott Bridge. This makes the second ice jam since the new bridge was put in.

At this time I would like to point out how the cost of things have increased these past few years. Calcium chloride \$60.00 per ton in 1972 to \$87.00 per ton in 1975, \$106.00 per ton in 1976. Cold Patch \$8.00 per ton 1972, \$13.00 per ton in 1974 and \$14.50 per ton in 1976. Asphalt \$62.37 per ton 1972, \$107.74 per ton in 1974 and \$115.10 per ton in 1976. Washed sand .90 per ton 1972, \$1.00 per ton 1974, it then went to \$1.15 per ton and then back to \$1.00 per ton. Gravel has increased from .10 per cubic yard to .20 per cubic yard and we are lucky to get it for that. Salt \$14.60 per ton 1972, \$16.45 per ton 1974, \$18.39 per ton 1975 and \$20.28 per ton 1976.

Labor and equipment has also gone up and I'm sure we all know how gas, diesel fuel and steel has gone up. For instance, one set of grader cutting edges \$116.00.

I would like to thank everyone who helped me in any way during 1976.

The Langdon Fire Department placed it's tanker in service in October. This truck, though still requiring some finish work, greatly increases our fire suppression ability. The truck carries 1700 gallons of water, a portable pump and a forced entry saw. The loss of two buildings in town this year stressed the need of the tanker as there was no water supply near Dana Merrell's barn or Harold Germon's house. I would like to encourage all those who do not have a home fire alarm to consider purchasing one. This relatively cheap device could save your life and even give The Fire Department time to save your house.

The members of the Department continue to attend Fire Schools when time and money permit. The 12 members on the active roll all have at least 50 hours of New Hampshire State Approved Instruction, some have much more. More members are urgently needed in the Department. Any citizen of Langdon is eligible for membership and needs only attend a minimum of 12 meetings a year.

On behalf of The Fire Department I wish to thank the State Highway Department for providing an access to Cold River from Rte. 123. This gives us a year round place to refill tankers.

I wish to thank those people who helped and supported the Department last year. We will continue to try and provide the best fire protection possible at the lowest possible cost.

### REPORT OF THE FALL MOUNTAIN VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

The Fall Mountain V.N.A. provided a total of 3302 units of service to the five-town area of Langdon, Acworth, Alstead, Charlestown and North Walpole, in 1976.

Langdon received a total of 152 units of service: 98 nursing and occupational therapy visits were made by professional staff; 54 Langdon residents were seen in clinics.

A large percentage of the V.N.A.'s services include evaluation visits, visits made to patients who are unable to pay, visits to new mothers and newborn infants, health promotion-disease prevention work and clinic services, none of which are reimbursable.

Although Langdon received fewer services in 1976 than the 263 received in 1975, experience from year to year shows the proportionate number of services varies from town to town and balances for each over a period of several years. Also, actual non-reimbursed Langdon patient service costs in 1976 totaled \$1,258. Of that amount only \$637.50 was met by the tax appropriation, leaving a balance of \$620. This indebtedness contributed to a deficit that the Agency was forced to meet by using up capital reserves and obtaining a loan that must be repaid in 1977.

Increased costs, plus the need to cover non-reimbursable services, make it necessary for the Agency to request \$2.50 per capita in 1977. Without this amount the V.N.A. may be forced to reduce its number of otherwise non-reimbursable services, a course that ultimately would be more costly both to the patients and to the community.
