# WARRANT.

---

## STATE OF NEW HAMSHIRE.

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, N. H., qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet in the town hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose three Selectmen and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
4. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways, and direct how the same shall be paid and expended the ensuing year.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
7. To hear the report of the Auditors and of the School Board of the town school district.
8. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.
9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding fifty dollars for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to construct sewers in said town where it may be necessary, and provide for the payment thereof, or act thereon.

11. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway leading from Foundry street to Daniel Driscoll's barn.

12. To see what disposition the town will make of the balance of the bequest of Thomas Eastman to said town, or act thereon.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to employ night Police Officers.

The schools of this year have been mostly successful, and good progress has been made. The liberal policy of our district in voting money for our schools has enabled your committee to hire the best teachers to be found in our larger schools. Of course some mistakes

have been made. Who can avoid them? Most of the school-houses are in good repair, and no large amount will be needed to keep them so for the next year.

The apportionment of school property of the district, made by the Selectmen, shows a balance due the West Lebanon High School district of \$478.57, which is ordered paid on or before June 1, 1892. It will, therefore, be necessary to raise the money either by a tax or a loan, which can be decided at the annual meeting of the district.

The same amount as raised last year will be necessary for school purposes, as the reduced valuation of much of our farm property renders the amount allowed us by law much too small to keep our schools up to the present standard.

The free text book law has lightened the burdens of many of the parents who have scholars, although it has been quite a task for your committee to keep them supplied.

We would urge upon the parents the importance of their taking more interest in our schools, and by our united efforts we may raise the schools of our district to a degree of perfection now unknown.

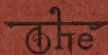
