## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3 To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.

Art. 4 To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 5 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 6 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Art. 7 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to give a discount on all taxes paid on or before such time as they may designate.

Art. 8 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.

Art. 9 To see how much the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Pine Blister Rust control.

Art. 10 To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. Jay Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist Church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia town line, from the former location of the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Arthur Hunt; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a. m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Homestead to the Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 11 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Art. 12 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 13 To see if the town will vote to accept State Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,086.30 for the same.

Art. 14 To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 15 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 16 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase a new truck to replace 1942 International, and appropriate necessary money for the same.

Art. 17 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for the purpose of building and tarring a suitable road from Lover's Lane to the entrance of the driveway of the residence of Mrs. Elsa D. Jameson.

Art. 18 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$280.00 to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.

Art. 19 To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

Art. 20 To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance and to appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 21 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of repairing and replacing some of the American Flags and Poles which are displayed on our streets on various occasions. The money raised and appropriated under this article to be expended by Dickinson-Sweet Post, No. 14, American Legion.

Art. 22 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 23 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Art. 24 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money to install a fire escape on the town hall in Sugar Hill.

Art. 25 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be given to and expended by the Franconia Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of bettering the resort business in the Franconia area which includes the resort section of the town of Lisbon. It shall be a condition of this appropriation, that the sum will not be paid out by the Lisbon Selectmen, even though approved at Town Meeting, unless the Town of Franconia votes a sum for the same purpose amounting to no less than \$1,000.00.

Art. 26 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of making repairs to Lisbon Town Hall.

Art. 27 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purpose of making repairs to the Village Bridge.

Art. 28 To see if the town will vote to approve the following ordinance adopted by the Selectmen under Chapter 448, Section 5 of the Revised Laws of the State of New Hampshire as amended by Chapter 49 of the Session Laws of 1943:

“Sunday Sports: The playing of baseball and softball shall be permitted in this town on Sunday, to be held not earlier than two o’clock in the afternoon. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than ten dollars for each offense.

“The foregoing ordinance shall become effective on May 1, 1948, upon approval by a majority vote of legal voters present and voting at the regular town meeting to be held on March 9, 1948, and after being posted in two public places in said Town, recorded in the records of the town clerk, and published for three successive weeks in the Lisbon Courier, a newspaper published in Littleton, New Hampshire; a certificate of such posting and publication and approval shall be recorded in said town clerk’s records.”

Art. 29 To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

I herewith submit my report of the financial doings in connection with my office for the fiscal year ended Dec. 31, 1947.

The amount of moneys collected for automobile tax permits has returned to a pre-war status, as the sum of \$3,283.35 was collected and turned over to the town treasurer.

The sum of \$460.80 was collected from the owners of 225 dogs and was turned over to the town treasurer.

March 11, 1947, was the first annual town meeting at which the Non-Partisan Ballot was used in Lisbon. This meant that candidates for town office must file or use nomination papers for the office of their choice. The sum of \$15.00 was collected for filing fees and was turned over to the town treasurer.

## LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY

### Report of the Librarian

The circulation for 1947 was 14,569, a slight increase over 1946. These figures do not include books asked for and used in the library itself, which would enlarge the number considerably. The most books taken out on any one day was 207, and the average for each library day in the year was a little over 140.

Because of quite an increase in the price of books and in other expenses it was impossible to buy as many books as usual. This was perhaps no great loss as far as adult fiction was concerned, for the year was poor in outstanding books of that type; but it did make it very difficult to meet that constant request for "something new." The junior and reference departments suffered considerably from the curtailment, and a number of books that very much needed to be replaced are still on the waiting list.

## FOREST FIRE PROBLEM SERIOUS

The year 1947 was one of the worst periods of drouth and forest fire occurrence in eastern United States history. Lack of water ruined crops, lowered water levels and dried up brooks everywhere. Three months of deficient rainfall and abnormally high temperatures resulted in many fires which were mostly well controlled and kept within bounds. Only the high winds beginning on October 23rd caused a few fires to escape beyond immediate control. These few fires resulted in burning some 15,000 acres and the loss of 63 or more buildings in four New Hampshire towns.

All October fires were costly. They burned deeply in the ground and required day and night patrol of large crews of men until the rains came late in October. Towns which escaped from serious fires might easily have been in the midst of the most serious conflagrations we had.

Governor Dale closed the woods effective at midnight of October 15th. With the blow-up of October 23rd, a second proclamation closed all back roads and authorized towns to inaugurate patrol. The effect of this was to cut down subsequent fires for the rest of the dry period.

Local fire warden forces performed an admirable job to hold the more than 200 fires that occurred during this October period. Many men were taxed to the utmost as the emergency continued. To them and all those who did their work, the people of New Hampshire owe a debt of gratitude. The state forest fire control agency based on local town wardens and town crews wherever adequately equipped rose to the occasion and met the test in whatever town their services were needed.

It is now time to take stock everywhere of our fire fighting facilities for the season ahead and to make them adequate where necessary. To this end town fire plans

and training programs for wardens, deputies and other key men in each district are being arranged or in progress. If equipment and tools are insufficient properly to equip the available manpower in each community with the right tools for the job, they should be provided for at once. The yearly addition of fire tools to the town supply will generally need to be built up. The state sells tools to the towns and shares one-half their cost. Good equipment is important and can help greatly to keep both damage and fire costs at a minimum.

For many years we have requested our wardens not to issue burning permits except on rainy days. This regulation will be in effect again this year as it is one of the best means of assuring such fires from getting out of control. Nine out of every ten fires can be prevented, 98 percent of all fires being due to human carelessness. Be sure to get a permit for any fire in or near woodland when the ground is free from snow. Be sure your fires are always out before you leave them. Help us in getting the traveling public to keep from throwing out lighted matches or cigarettes. Be careful of all fires in or near woodland.
