TENTATIVE WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Madison in the County of Carroll in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, March 9, 1971 at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same, as follows:

- Town Officers' Salaries
- Town Officers' Expenses
- Election and Registration Expenses
- Expenses Town Hall and other Town Buildings
- Employees' Retirement and Social Security
- Police Department
- Fire Department
- Insurance
- Damages and Legal Expenses
- Running Town Lines
- Health Department, including Hospitals
- Vital Statistics
- Town Dump and Garbage Removal

3. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$974.74 which is the town's share of Town Road Aid. The State's share is \$6,498.29.
4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum, or sums, not exceeding in the aggregate of \$35,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the Town, negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected within said current municipal year.
5. To see if the town wishes to vote a discount for prompt payment of taxes according to state law. This must be voted each year.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$275.00 to help the Carroll County Mental Health Service, Inc.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$100.00 for the Home Health Agency.
8. To see if the town will vote to restrict the use of Town Beaches as per petition signed by John Currier and others.
9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon the adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Carroll a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19, 20-29 inclusive.
10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$1750.00 for a new ceiling and lighting in the Silver Lake Town Hall.
11. To see if the town should have a Conservation Commission, as permitted under the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 36-A (Supp.), Vol. I. Agreeable to a petition signed by Richard Hocking and others.
12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$331.94 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of your town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follow.

FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (SUCH BURNING IS RESTRICTED BY REGULATION TO BE PRIOR TO 9:00 A. M. and AFTER 5:00 P. M.).

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

SCHOOL NURSE REPORT

School Year 1969-70

This year saw another step forward in control and prevention of Communicable Diseases. Eligible pupils participated in the Rubella Clinic held on March 20, 1970 sponsored by State of New Hampshire Division of Public Health and local Medical Services in cooperation with the Board of Education. Forty-eight school children received the Rubella (German Measles) Vaccine at that time.

As in the past all fourth graders, also the first graders who had not received a physical at Project Headstart, received health examinations through Supervisory Union No. 9 health appraisal program at Memorial Hospital early in the school year.

The Tine Test was administered to the first grade in cooperation with the New Hampshire TB and Health Association. All tests were normal.

One pupil attended the Orthopedic Clinic sponsored by the State Department of Health's Crippled Children's Services and Memorial Hospital on November 13, 1969, and two attended the clinic on June 18, 1970.

A certification of a successful Smallpox Vaccination and the birth certificate of the incoming first grader was presented on Orientation Day in the Spring preceeding the September entrance into school. This is very much appreciated by all concerned.
