THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Marlow in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall in said Marlow on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Poor.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Library.
- 5. To see if the Town will apply for Class V money, known as TRA, and raise the sum \$582.72 matched with \$3,884.82 contributed by the State.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise \$125.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise such sums of money as may be necessary to improve Town Cemeteries.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$99.00 to Monadnock Region Association, an agency to advertise, promote and preserve the natural resources of the town in co-operation with the other 37 towns of the Monadnock Region.
- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for brush removal on back roads, of which \$25.00 will be reimbursed by the State.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust Program.

- 12. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$343.00 for the year 1970 in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1970.
- 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and administer all real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector deeds.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the tax collector to give two percent cash discount on all property and personal taxes, for the payment made within thirty days after date of bill and empower the collector to appoint a deputy collector.
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for temporary loans, in anticipation of taxes.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$500.00 for the purchase of a lot on which to construct a fire station.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be paid into the capital reserve fund for new highway equipment.
- 18. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to remodel and insulate the lower portion of Jones Hall, and authorize the Selectmen to contract for the work by bid or by negotiation; all work to be done under the supervision of the Selectmen.
- 19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for payment of Federal witholding taxes and Social Security taxes for all elected officers and Town Librarian.
- 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for a contigency fund.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board. (written ballot required)
- 23. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any classes of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.

- 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept all Trust Funds left to it during the ensuing year.
- 25. To hear reports of officers, agents and committees, theretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may be legally come before said meeting.

NORTH CHESHIRE COUNTY HOME HEALTH SERVICE

A new health service is now available to the townspeople of Gilsum, Marlow, Stoddard, Sullivan and Surry. This service has in its employ a registered professional nurse, Mrs. Edith Hasbrouck, and on a part-time basis, Miss Adelaide Berdeen, a qualified physical therapist.

The purpose of the Health Service is to provide nursing care ordered by your physician and to teach a member of the family to carry out the needed care after the nurse has left. The nurse will visit mothers of new babies, to aid and assist in the instruction of care for the new-born.

Other services supplied will be free clinics held throughout the year such as the measles clinic held November 6, 1969 at the Gilsum Elementary School.

People insured under the Medicare Program will be eligible for the nursing care under that program, others will be charged a fee of \$3.00 which can be scaled downward in case of need. NO ONE will be refused care because of inability to pay. To help support this service a membership drive was held in the five towns and will be done annually.

The North Cheshire County Home Health Service office is housed in the Gilsum Fire Station and the nurse is available to you from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The phone number of the service office is 357-0969 and calls should be made between 9:00 and 9:30 a.m.

If you should have any questions about the service, contact your physician, Department of Public Health & Welfare, or your local board member.

To the inhabitants of the school district of the Town of Marlow qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Jones Hall, in said district on the 9th day of March, 1970 at 7:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer and fix compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, committees, or other officers in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Title I, II, and III, Public Law 89-10 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into a tuition contract not to exceed twenty years with the Fall Mountain Regional School District.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to enter into a three-year transportation contract with the Cheshire Transportation Company of Keene to transport its 7-12

grand students to Keene or to the Fall Mountain Regional School

- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any and all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any federal, state, or private agency.
- 12. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district.
- 13. To see if the voters will vote to determine the interest of the Marlow District in pursuing further discussions on the question of annexation to Monadnock or Fall Mountain and to authorize the Marlow School Board and the Study Committee to pursue such discussions with a report to be made to the voters at the next annual meeting.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

MONADNOCK CHILDREN'S SPECIAL SERVICES CENTER

In July of 1969, the Monadnock Children's Special Services Center was incorporated as a non-profit organization to serve four school supervisory unions - Con-Val, Fall Mountain, Keene and Monadnock. An eight-memaer board of directors was established, representing the four unions. Mr. Newell E. Bishop of Charlestown, N. H. represents our union on the board, and Mr. Robert Bellavance serves with the superintendents on the executive committee.

With voted financial support through the school districts, the Center was enabled to continue services to the schools this year, with a staff of eight and three medical consultants.

In this respect, based on a combination school population and financial support, the Fall Mountain area is receiving 8% of the service capacity of the Center during the year.

In board action taken by the Center at its December meeting, a budget was approved representing Center needs for continuance of services at a slightly increased level. The total budget of \$120,000 generates a requirement of per pupil support at the level of \$8.30. Support of the Center at this level, by Fall Mountain, would make possible an increase of service to that area of approximately 100% (15% of total Center services).

This year, in an effort to bring the Center services into closer liason with the schools, a consultation program was established which provides for a regular schedule of Center staff meeting in the union schools to discuss and provide evaluative services to children of concern to the teaching staff. The Center's direct evaluation service has continued both in this program and in direct in-Center evaluation of children. Of importance in the Center services, through consultations and school conferences, is follow-up service through which the results of consultation and evaluation recommendations can be reviewed by Center and school personnel.

THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

As I review the education in the Marlow School District for the past year, I am very appreciative of how the people in the district have responded to the problems that have come to their attention. The Marlow School Board has had the courage to present these problems fairly and accurately to the people. The people have formed their study committee which has worked hard at exploring avenues of possible solutions and has arrived at a good number of possible solutions. All have worked in a very harmonious and dedicated manner. I am sure that the children of the Marlow School District will profit from this great effort.

The minimum standards for elementary schools are to a large extent at the base of these problems, but I would like to point out at this time that these standards are minimum; they are not objectives to be strived for but rather a platform which we should not go below. They do not provide good education but rather only acceptable education. We should be making every effort to do much more than is required by minimums. It should be recognized that the application of any new standards are always expensive. Plans should be made to assure that the applications of these standards should be spread over the greatest number of years available to us. It would be almost a fiscal impossibility to try to accommodate the entire cost of implementation in one fiscal year.

I wish to express my appriciation to the staff at the Marlow School for the fine manner in which they have conducted themselves in the presentation of a good educational program to the children of Marlow. A special appreciation goes to Mr. Robert Bellavance, Assistant Superintendent of Schools, for his wide ranging efforts to open all avenues of possible solutions to the school board and study committee as they search for solutions.

The Marlow School Board deserves a very special commendation for the many hours of devoted service they have given to the community this past year. They deserve the full support of every citizen in the community.

REPORT OF THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Marlow:

The State Department of Education approved in June of 1969 new Minimum Standards for New Hampshire Elementary Schools effective July 1, 1969 for all new construction and July 1, 1972, for all school programs. Marlow as well as all New Hampshire elementary schools will be required to meet these standards and provide the necessary services in such areas as:

- (1) Library services through a certified librarian
- (2) Health education courses
- (3) Physical education
- (4) Art
- (5) Music
- (6) Guidance
- (7) Special education

These services are not currently being offered but will have to be provided either on the district level or on the Supervisory Union level. The latter would require approval of the Fall Mountain Regional School District as they represent over 80% of the voters in the Union.

Tuition Program

The tuition program involving our students in grades 7-12 represents the largest budget outlay for the district. Currently this item is budgeted at \$23,860.00. For the 1970-71 budget, the figure will rise to \$28,662.00 or an increase of some \$5,000. Part of this increase can be found in the tuition charged by Keene and the other in the number of students attending Keene Schools.

What does the future hold for Marlow should it continue its tuition program to Keene? Our projected figures indicate a 1974-75 tuition cost of \$61,860.00 and a total budget of \$106,768.00, or approximately a 100% increase over the current year.

What are the alternatives for Marlow in the future? A number of alternatives are available. They represent annexation to the Monadnock or Fall Mountain Regional School Districts, tuition to either of the regional schools, a cooperative with Stoddard and other area towns, or any combination of the above. In the final analysis,

none of these will save you a great deal of money but they will offer other advantages. These could be as follows:

- (1) The assurance of a place for our 7-12 students beyond the three years offered by Keene.
- (2) Implementation of the Minimum Standards.
- (3) A say in the operations and expenditures of the district to which Marlow would be annexed.
- (4) A small savings in the project costs for Marlow.

Though I have gone only in brief detail here, reports at the annual district meeting will more adequately present the question to you for your consideration.

Educational Program

The State Testing Program for grades 2, 4, and 6 have indicated some severe problems in Marlow. These may be attributed to excessively large classes, inadequate space, lack of support services for the classroom teacher, and the multi-graded nature of the school. If Marlow and its children are to benefit from education as a whole, changes will have to be made in the over-all concept of Marlow and its educational program.

Title I

Title I monies currently being given to the district are in the amount of \$3,200. These monies must be used to provide services beyond those being provided by the school to all its children. They must also represent services to those few children to be found in need. Therefore, as you can see, the use of these funds is limited in scope.

For the 1969-70 school year, the money has been used to employ a teacher aide to help Mrs. Evelyn Gill and Mr. William Hollis. Monies in excess of salaries have been set aside to buy services from the Monadnock Children's Center, from the guidance department of the Fall Mountain Regional School District, and to provide educational trips should the teachers wish to do so.

School Transportation

Our three-year contract with the Cheshire Transportation Co. of Keene expires this June. As you will note, an article appears in the school warrant to approve another three-year contract to handle our needs through June, 1973.

The increased cost of the transportation budget represents a base contract up \$300 over the current year and a factor of \$1,400 to purchase additional miles under the contract should our local bus no longer be able to service our needs.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE FOR MARLOW

During the school year 1968-69, fifty vision tests were done. No children were referred for further eye examination. Thirty-seven hearing tests were done and no referrals made. Fifty children were weighed, measured, and checked by the school nurse for noticeable health problems.

Tuberculin Heaf testing was done on the children in grade one, with no reactors.

Forty children had urine examinations for sugar and albumin, and no referrals were necessary this year.

Eight children attended the pre-registration for Grade One held in May. At that time, vision and hearing screening is done. Also the children are weighed and measured and checked for vaccination; a record of their health program from the parent up through entering the first grade is made. We also had the services of the State Dental Hygienist at the time of pre-registration.

The school nurse aided the State Health Department in a Measles Survey Program.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for the fine community support always given the School Health Program and for the continuing cooperation of the school personnel.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

FIRE PERMIT

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

PENALTIES

- For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
