TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the New Durham School on Tuesday, the tenth (10th) day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following: (Polls will close no earlier than 6:00 P.M.)

ARTICLE 1.a. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

b. To vote on proposed change to the Zoning and Land Use Ordinance.

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said New Durham School on Wednesday, the eleventh (11th) day of March, next at seven (7:00) o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to rescind action taken at 1980 Town Meeting in regards to Old Dump Lot and retain it as a wood lot for the town.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to accept the Dodge Pickup Truck purchased for \$50.00 from Surplus.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to accept for \$1.00 the 4-wheel drive International truck and sander leased until April.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Gannon lot on Merrymeeting Road to Addison S. Cate for \$8,900.00. By Request.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 to the Library Building Trust Fund, to be matched by donation of \$3,000.00.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to add siding to the Old Town Shed and use same for dead storage for Fire, Police and Highway Departments.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and authorize the withdrawal from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as setoffs against budgeted appropriations for the following specific purposes and in amounts indicated herewith or take any other action hereon:

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to have property taxes collected by the Tax Collector twice each year, in June and December. The June amount will represent one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the amount of total property tax collected the previous tax year and the December tax bill will be the final adjusted tax bill after the tax rates have been set for the current year. By Petition (RSA 39:3)

Not the prerogative of this Body (RSA 76:15b)

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to have the Tax Collector grant any tax payer a two percent (2%) discount on the amount due, if property taxes are paid in full within 30 days of the date posted on the tax bills. By Petition (RSA 39:3)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent. By Petition (RSA 39:3)

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 (One Thousand Dollars) to be paid to the University of New Hampshire for the Merrymeeting Lake baseline study, which the Merrymeeting Lake Association has engaged the University to accomplish in the summer of 1981, the said study being for the purpose of preserving and protecting the excellent water quality of Merrymeeting Lake which is a valuable tax resource for the Town of New Durham. By Petition (RSA 39:3)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of town government.

ARTICLE 15. To hear reports of any standing committees.

The Trustees are very pleased that the year 1980 has been one of progress and satisfaction in our Library.

It was a busy one for the Trustees who attended several meetings and workshops sponsored by the State Library, thus enabling them to bring back to the Library new and fresh ideas.

Mrs. Sylvia Markola, our new head Librarian, was hired in June to fill the gap left when Eileen Dennehy tendered her resignation as assistant Librarian.

At that time Mrs. Doris Rollins, our faithful Librarian for ten years, chose to graciously relinquish her responsibility to Mrs. Markola and stay on as assistant Librarian, working her usual post on Saturday.

The transition has been very smooth, with Doris giving many hours of her time showing Sylvia the many phases of Library work, which is so typical of her and we are very grateful.

Mrs. Markola has already completed and received credits for a 10 week course of Library Techniques, and will be taking more in 1981, a requisite in order for our Library to be accredited with the State Library.

The State Library Bookmobile called twice this year, leaving a total of 1,724 books, a service which helps make a greater variety of books available to our readers.

The Friends of the Library have continued to provide the Library during the year with five and sometimes six new books each month, and pay for the telephone. In July they held a very successful food sale and later on an auction in order to raise funds. The Trustees wish to take this opportunity to extend their appreciation.

We hope that this report will serve to show the dedication of all who serve in an effort to make the Library a successful and meaningful part of our community.

REPORT OF POLICE, HEALTH, AND WELFARE DEPARTMENTS

JANUARY 1, 1980 TO DECEMBER 1980

As in the past 25 years I have attempted to maintain a small, but highly trained and efficient Police Department to cope with the need in New Durham. I have always felt that the quality of personnel, rather than quantity, gave the best return for your tax dollar.

New Durham has experienced a good deal of controlled growth in the last 12 years. I feel that the excellent Recreation Program provided in New Durham, along with the Strafford County Sheriff Department Dispatch Center, has helped greatly in keeping the problems associated with growth down to a minimum, enabling your Police Department to respond to the needs of New Durham in Police, Health and Welfare matters in an orderly manner, without greatly increasing the work load, or any elimination of services.

The large number of burglaries that occurred this fall in a short period of time posed a problem bigger than I had seen in my 28 years of police service in New Durham. The Department was able to respond, slow

down the number of burglaries, and now have 10 subjects in the court systems charged with these burglaries, clearing well over the national average. I feel the quality and flexibility of our small Department meets the needs of the town.

We extend our thanks to the Board of Selectmen, Budget Committee, and townspeople for their continuing support. Also, to the Towns, Cities, County and State law enforcement agencies for providing prompt, professional assistance whenever needed.

NEW DURHAM FIRE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1980

The Fire Department responded to 78 Incidents this year. The following is a break down of those calls;

12-Dwelling Fires, 12-Chimney Fires, 3-Brush Fires, 4-Tree Fires, 23-Medical Emergencies, 4-Auto Accidents, 4-Assistance to Public, 13-Mutual Aid calls, and 3-False Alarms.

There has been a substantial increase in runs over the previous years. This is partially due to the newly formed rescue unit. This unit has proven to be a large asset to the townspeople in respect to prior care and comfort given before an ambulance arrives. The department has put many hours into training in Advanced First Aid, CPR, and Auto Extraction. Along with the training, the Fire Department and Fire Bells have donated many dollars into equipping this vehicle to handle almost all kinds of emergencies.

The new fire truck has now arrived and we have had many hours of training with it. We find that this vehicle will be of a great asset, for now we have the capacity of carrying another 1,500 gallons of water to the fire scene. In these remote areas we find that there comes the time too often when the water supplies are not readily available. Along with this additional water capacity, we have the pumping capacity of 750 gallons a minute.

The Fire Department would like to mention at this time to all residents of the Town, we have chimney brushes for you to borrow by contacting any of the firemen. Remember, if you keep your chimney clean, there will be less chance of a chimney fire.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Forest Fire Prevention: Your Business, Our Business, Good Business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE RURAL DISTRICT HEALTH COUNCIL

The Rural District Health Council offices are located in Farmington. The Council supplies visiting nurse service and other health field care to several towns including New Durham. They furnished 200 skilled nursing visits, 34 home health aide visits, and 54 therapy visits here this year. Twenty-nine home health visits were made to children and 97 children attended the Child Health Program.

The Health Council sponsors many programs other than their priority service which is the care of the sick. A Maternal and Child Health program is offered to all children from any of the member towns and includes physicals, immunizations, teaching and counseling for ages 0-6 years. It also provides home visits to the newborns on request and any follow-up care as requested by physicians. A Dental program is also provided and the Pre-School Dental Services is held for children 3-6 years of age, which includes cleaning, and flouride treatments twice a year with referrals to local dentists for follow-up care when needed.

Monthly adult health maintenance programs are provided the first and third Wednesday at 1 p.m. at the Farmington Town Hall and is available to New Durham residents. The program provides blood pressure checks, diabetic and anemia screenings, nutrition counseling and special diets and weight control.

The Council claims home health agencies are delivering relatively inexpensive care to rural residents who might otherwise have no access to such care and it often makes it possible for people to remain in their own homes.
