TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. (Polls to close at 6 p. m.)

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for interest on same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 as asked for by Recreation Committee for recreation purposes.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for care of cemeteries.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$565.46 for the purpose of Town Road Aid the state share to be \$3,769.70.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 in addition to the joint T. R. A. fund.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$512.00 for Concord Hospital.

11. To see if the Town will vote to install a blinker light at the intersection of Routes No. 9, No. 202, No. 4 and Route No. 107, and vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for installation of same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.

13. To see if the Town will vote to acquire land at Northwood Lake in and about the vicinity of North Shore Park in the Town of Northwood and to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to take land within the municipal limits, in fee by gift, purchase, or right of eminent domain for the purpose of establishment of a public playground in accordance with the provisions of New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 31:44.

14. To see what action the Town will take regarding the time and day or date of future business meetings.

15. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

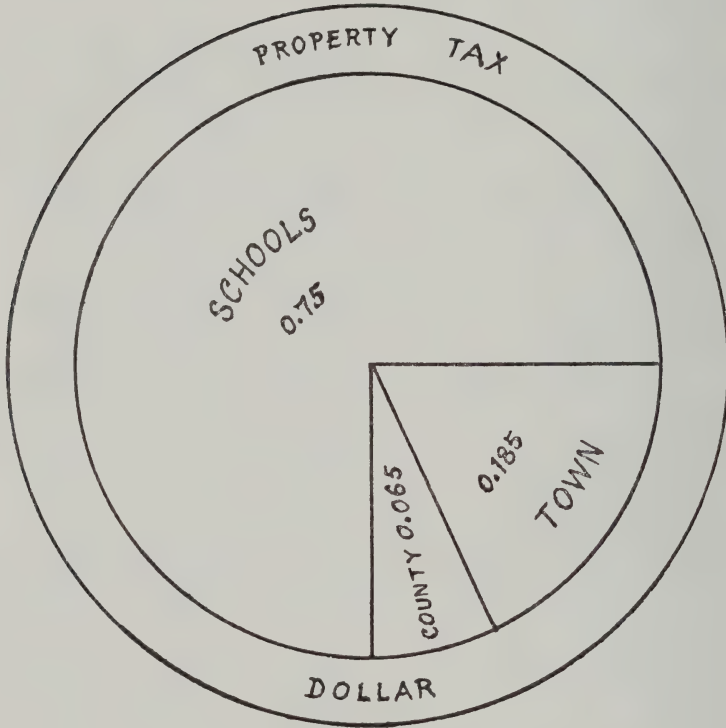

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Northwood which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, and the period from January 1st to November 12th, 1960. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report. Also included is a Statistical Table presenting a Ten Year Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1958- December 31, 1959: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1958 and December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Surplus increased by \$3,594.23 during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959.

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$4,019.81, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,799.67, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$5,819.48.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:
(Exhibit B)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts,

is included in Exhibit B. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of November 12, 1960, is indicated in Exhibit G.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes:

Table I presents a Ten Year Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes. It will be noted that during the period from December 31, 1949 to December 31, 1959, the Surplus increased from \$3,196.21 to \$10,787.90. There were no outstanding notes or bonds at any time during these years.

During the same period the assessed valuation of taxable property increased from \$982,555.00 to \$1,498,845.00 or 53%. The amount of the annual tax levy increased from \$55,023.00 to \$80,937.00, or 47%.

The local tax rate **decreased** from \$5.60 to \$5.40 per hundred, compared to the average rate for the State which **increased** from \$4.31 to \$5.37 during this period.

Inasmuch as the two year period in which redemptions may be made has expired in all of these cases, it is recommended that the Tax Collector deed to the Town the properties represented by the unredeemed Taxes.

In case the legality of the tax sale, on the basis of which a deed is to be given, is questionable; or for some other reason it does not seem to be feasible to take a deed, the unredeemed tax pertaining thereto should be abated and the tax sale record thereby cleared.

Municipal Court:

All funds of the Municipal Court should be deposited in a separate bank account designated for this purpose. Checks issued by the Justice for court expenses should be drawn against this account.

Trust Funds:

The accounts of the Trustees of Trust Funds should be kept open long enough after the close of the fiscal year to record and reflect all activities of the year.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955 require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thank to the officials of the Town of Northwood for their assistance during the course of the audit.

Each year it is necessary to reiterate the need to keep our well qualified teachers in our system, consequently, it is necessary to increase teachers' salaries to retain them and to meet the competition of surrounding communities. Therefore, you are encouraged to retain good teachers whenever it is possible.

Progress in the construction of your new elementary school was excellent until the first of the year, although most of the masonry is completed and the building is closed in, the extreme cold during the month of January has slowed construction and at this writing it seems unlikely that the new school will be occupied before next September.

The education of our children and the financial support of our schools is largely the responsibility of the local community, therefore, your school board and superintendent are making every effort to hold the line. However, increased cost of scholar supplies, the demand for higher salaries by teachers, higher tuition rates and increased enrollments make our position a difficult one.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The following is the report for the year ending December 31, 1960 for the Schools of Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford.

There were 856 children inspected during the year for height, weight, teeth, tonsils, and eyes. Of these 96 were done at the Pre-school Clinics in May.

41 cases of dental cavities were reported, 13 of enlarged tonsils and 16 of defective vision. The parents have been most cooperative in having these children checked by their family physicians and dentists and in correcting them according to their advice.

4 children obtained glasses through the State Sight Conservation program and there are 2 children attending Speech Correction Classes at Portsmouth Rehabilitation Center.

During the year 73 home visits were made.

May I extend my appreciation for the fine cooperation of the Superintendent, Board Members, Teachers and Parents who have all helped make the past year pleasant, and, I hope, successful.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Northwood School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1959 and June 30, 1960, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the financial condition of the School District changed from a Surplus of \$6,622.87, to a Net Debt of \$174,602.25 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues:

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$781.62, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$525.17, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$256.45.

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960, made up in

accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1960, is indicated in Exhibit F.

Elementary School Building Fund: (Exhibit G)

A statement showing the activity in the Elementary School Building Fund during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960, is presented in Exhibit G.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1960, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the School Tax account with the Town of Northwood is included in Exhibit I. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1960, there was a balance of \$10.00 due the School District on account of the 1959-60 School Tax. This is shown as an asset account in the balance sheet of June 30, 1960.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955 require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District.
