THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the Fifth day of March, next at 10:00 a.m. in the forenoon for balloting upon matter specified in Article 1, listed below, and you are hereby further notified to meet at the Troy Elementary School on Wednesday, the 6th day of March next at 7:30 p.m. to act upon the remainder of the listed Warrant.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for one Selectman for three years, and all other town officers elected by ballot, as passed by Town Meeting or State Statute for the specified number of years.

Article 2. To see what action the voters wish to take upon the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:

- a. Town Officers salaries
- b. Town Officers expenses
- c. Election and Registration
- d. Town Hall
- e. Parks
- f. Vital Statistics
- g. Insurance
- h. Social Security
- i. Shade trees
- j. Interest-temporary loans
- k. Memorial Day
- l. Town dump
- m. Street lighting
- n. Dog Constable
- o. Humane Society
- p. Legal fees.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway summer maintenance.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway winter maintenance.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$408.01 to which the State will contribute \$2720.07 if voted and accepted, for the construction and maintenance of Class V roads.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the police department.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for the water department.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money to the District Nursing Association.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote a sum of money in support of the operating cost of the Cheshire Hospital.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1190.00 as the town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Gay-Kimball Library.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the care of the cemeteries.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for Old Age Assistance and public welfare.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Monadnock Regional Association.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the payment of the water bonds and interest thereon.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$12,000.00 for the purchase of a tax map, the funds to come from the Federal Revenue Sharing Act.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$20,000.00

for the enlargement of the present fire station, the funds to come from the Federal Revenue Sharing Act.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote the sum of \$12,000.00 for the re-appraisal of all town properties as recommended by the State Tax Commission.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to recind the action taken under Article 18 of the 1973 Town Warrant, to allow the money appropriated to be used at a site other than the Sand Dam.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following changes in the Town Mobile Home Ordinance:

- A. That section 1, Article E, Item 14 be deleted in its entirety.
- B. That section 2, Article A, be changed to read as follows: "No land shall be used for a travel trailer, house trailer or Mobile Home except in a mobile home.
- C. That Section 2, Article A, Item 2, be deleted in its entirety.

Article 24. (By Petition). To see if the town will vote and adopt the Rep. James Splain bill on home owners exemption.

Article 25. (By Petition). To see if the town will vote to reopen and maintain that section of road off of Route #12 leading to the residence of Chester E. Priest.

Article 26. (By Petition). To see if the town will vote to reopen and maintain that section of the Bigelow Hill road for a distance of 3/10ths of a mile from the Richard Pelto residence.

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Article 28. To see if the town will raise a sum of money for an accelerated TRA construction program on upper South Street.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money to a capital reserve fund for the fire department.

Article 30. To hear the reports of committees, agent or officers heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE GAY-KIMBALL LIBRARY

During the past year a re-organization of the Board of Trustees and Library staff was effected. Ms. Ann Scheid is the Librarian, and Mrs. Roger Smith, assistant librarian. Mrs. Marina Limoges and Mrs. Dolores Vose were appointed to fill the unexpired terms of Mrs. Marion Austin and Mrs. Shirley Lang. The board of trustees extend special thanks to Mrs. Austin, Mrs. Lang and Mrs. Harling, who has resigned as assistant librarian, for their continuing services to the library.

The library has been the recipient of several gifts. Donors include Mrs. Keith Kuningas, the Franklin Pierce College Library Resources Center, Mrs. Stuart M. Barrows and Mr. Roger Smith. Mr. and Mrs. George K. Ripley gave the balance of the Gay-Kimball building fund (Ripley Room) the sum of \$277.52, for general use of the library.

The McNaughton Book Service has been instituted. This service provides a basic collection of fifty current fiction and non-fiction titles for adults as well as five new titles each month with an option to purchase any of these books for the library's permanent collection at a substantial discount. New subscriptions for magazines for adults and children have been placed. These include Natural History, Scientific American, Cricket, and also the Readers Guide to Periodical Literature for reference to articles in current periodicals of which about a dozen are subscribed to by the library.

Several items of equipment were purchased for the library. A metal file cabinet for storage of historical and other special subject records; a de-humidifier to protect books stored in the basement; a record storage (also tapes) cabinet and other incidental items such as kick-stands etc.

All of the lighting in the main library building has been replaced. This project will be paid for from funds available under the Federal Revenue Sharing programs. It is the intention of the trustees to carry out a program of remodeling the basement in to a usable study/entertainment section for adults and children to be funded under Federal Revenue sharing as much as possible.

The trustees urge all the citizens of Troy to make use of the library's facilities and equipment-not only the books and magazines-but also the recordings, tapes, film strips, tape recorders and other items which can be made available from the N.H. State Library.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen, and the citizenry of Troy, New Hampshire. I hereby submit the annual Police Department Report for the year ending December 31, 1973.

The Town has experienced for the first year a full time officer in law enforcement and the department has experienced a great change. The first being the completion of a course in criminal investigation through the Mount Wachusett Community College, classes being held in Keene; a great deal of time in on the job training in order to acquire a working knowledge in regards to due process of law, the big change that came about that has affected the whole State as of November 1, 1973, the effective date for what became known as the Criminal Code which meant that the existing laws no longer were of any value. This meant a study of the construction of the Code, territorial jurisdiction, all offenses defined by the statute, application to offenses outside the Code, limitations, classification of crimes, general principles, and general definitions. This was promoted by the New Hampshire Police Standards, and Training Council through the New Hampshire Technical Institute and this department attended at the New Hampshire Vocational College in Nashua. A course in criminal law for policemen at Keene State College in regards to application of the criminal code was attended.

Developing a working relationship with State, County and other Various agencies within the area was part of our program.

TOWN MEETING -- MARCH 7, 1973

The Polls were opened at 10:00 AM on the 6th of March, 1973 by the Moderator, Edward Lang at the Troy Town Hall. The Polls remained opened until 6:00 PM.

The Town Meeting to take up the Warrant was held at the Auditorium of the School on School Street at 7:30 PM on March 7th 1973.

The meeting was opened by the Moderator, Edward Lang. The Prayer was given by the Catholic Priest, Father Authier. A Salute to the Flag was lead by Mr. Charles McGinness.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for one Selectman for 3 years, and all town officers elected by ballot each year. The results of the voting were as follows:

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway summer maintenance. The amount voted was \$16,000.00.

Article 5. To see if the twon will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway winter maintenance. The amount voted was \$12,000.00.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$404.74 to which the State will contribute \$2,698.24 if voted and accepted, for the construction and maintenance of Class V roads. This passed.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department. The amount voted was \$10,000.00

Article 8. to see if the town will vote the sum of \$15,000.00 for legal fees. This passed.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to hear the report of the committee chosen at the last Annual Meeting to look into the possibility of having a joint police department between the Towns of Troy and Fitzwilliam, and then take action on the two following articles of the warrant. This article was passed over.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into an agreement with the Town of Fitzwilliam under chapter 53-A of the Revised Statutes Annotated toform a joint police department for the Towns of Troy and Fitzwilliam. This also was passed over.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for the operation and maintenance of the joint police department of the Towns of Troy and Fitzwilliam provided that Article 10 above is adopted by the voters, or in the event that Article 10 above is not adopted by the voters or in the event that the Town of Fitzwilliam does not vote to adopt an article equivalent

to Article 10 above, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the operation of the police department or take any action thereon. The amount of \$12,000.00 passed.

Article 12. (By petition) To see if the Town will vote to have the Chief of Police elected by ballot at the annual meeting for a period of two years. If adopted the action will become effective at the annual meeting of 1974. This article was Downed by a majority.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to support the services of the Monadnock Humane Society of West Swanzey. This passed.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the water department. The amount voted was \$11,000.00. Mr. William Parker resigned as a member of the Troy Water Board and Superintendent of the Water Department after 53 years of service. Mr. Clarence Abare Presented to Mrs. Eca Parker as Mr. Parker was not present an Electric Desk Clock from the Town in appreciation for his long and devoted service.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to the Troy Visiting Nurse Association. The amount voted was for the sum of \$2,800.00.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money in support of the operating cost of the Cheshire Hospital. The amount voted was \$1,500.00

Article 17. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program. The amount voted was for \$3,300.00

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to be used at the Troy War Memorial (Sand Dam) for improvements, if and when the State of New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economics Development (a Federal Program) provides matching funds for such improvements. The amount voted was in the amount of \$2,500.00

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to direct the board of selectmen, and Conservation Commission to do any and all things necessary and desirable or advisable to preserve Gap Mountain in its present state, for the benefit of the entire community as permanent open space. This article was passed over.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate

riate the sum of \$1,221.28 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. The amount voted was for \$1,221.28

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to enter into an agreement with the town's of Marlborough, Swanzey, and the City of Keene, Pursuant to the authority granted by the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 53-A for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and operating main drains, common sewers, and or a sewerage disposal plant, or other devices necessary or convenient for compliance with any water pollution statute or regulation lawfully issued, and to authorize the selectmen to execute an agreement in such form as the selectmen deem advisable, and to take such other and any further action as the selectmen deem necessary or advisable to carry out the terms of the agreement. This passed.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Gay-Kimball Library. The amount voted was for the amount of \$3,160.00

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of cemeteries. The amount voted was for \$700.00

Article 24. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for Old Age Assistance and Public Welfare. The amount voted was \$6,500.00.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Mondanock Regional Association. The amount voted was \$575.00.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose at auction any and all properties acquired through tax collectors deeds. This passed.

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to spend funds received under the Federal Revenue Sharing Act, which will be most beneficial to the town, or take any action relating thereto. This passed. Public Hearing promised before purchasing any major purchase.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the payment of Water bonds and interest thereon. The amount of \$3,475.00 was passed.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the

Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the town charges. This was passed.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to pay the cost of a dog constable. The sum of \$500.00 was voted for this purposes.

Article 31. To hear the reports of committees, agents or officers heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto. There were none.
