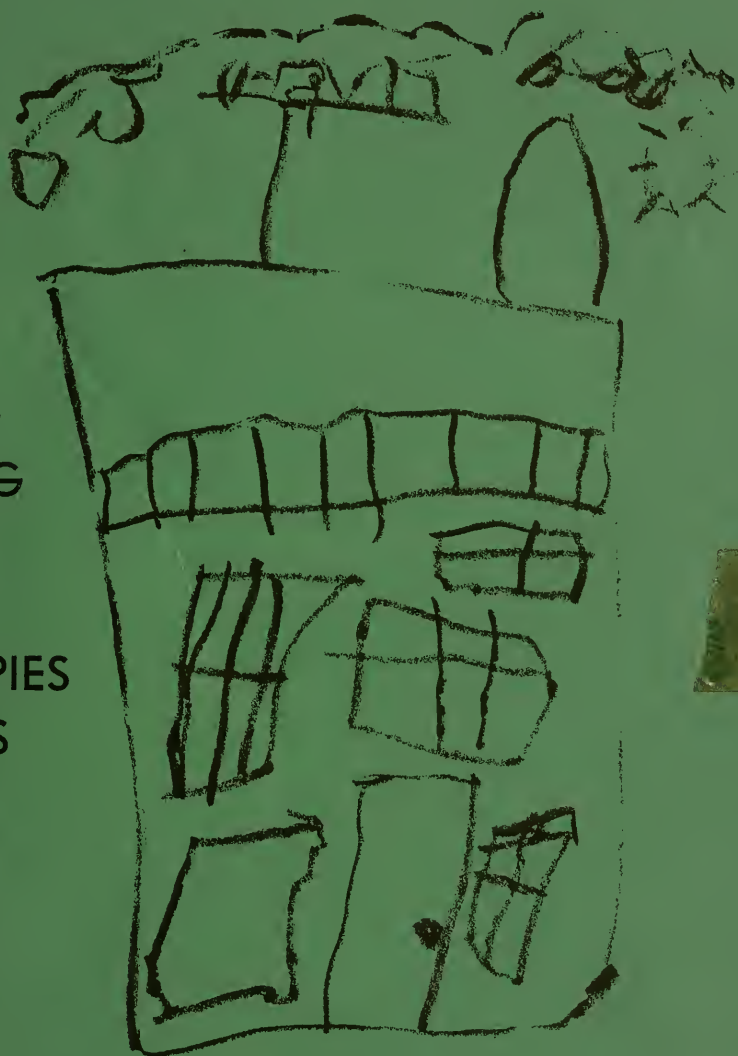

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Town History Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 for the Water Reserve Fund, or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one hundred dollars) \$100 for the Fire Hose Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand, one hundred thirty dollars and ninety-five cents) \$1,130.95 as our share of the T.R.A. program, or take any other action relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will appropriate the Principal and Interest in the High School Heating System Fund for the purpose of installing a heating system in the High School Building, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000; this sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended for the purposes of the Conservation Commission or added to by gifts of money.

9. To see if the Town will vote to establish an Ordinance to regulate the use of snowmobiles within the Town of Hancock, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the changes in the Zoning Ordinance adopted March 12, 1962, recommended by the Hancock Planning Board. As follows: Article XV paragraph G, amend to read by adding "or bordering on public waters, or both." "Frontage, means the length of the lot bordering the public right of way, or bordering on public water, or both."

11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the plowing of driveways by the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate (six hundred and fifty dollars) \$650 for the purpose of establishing a Hillside Cemetery General Improvement and Beautification Fund or take any other action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept Lodge Road and Juniper Circle Road in the Prospect Hill Development when the Selectmen determine that these roads conform to the Hancock Subdivision Ordinance.

14. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of painting the Town Hall and to raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 for the purpose, or take any other action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

17. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m., and after 5:00 p.m.

Exception

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY, 1969

Smooth-running is the word for the Hancock Town Library, thanks to the efficient management of our librarians. Mrs. William Rockhill continues to arrange excellent monthly art exhibits.

We are grateful to our many friends who gave us money for the purchase of books, notably "Interpretation of American History" by the Woman's Club, in memory of Virginia Pond, and "Rufus Porter" by the Men's Club in memory of William Weston.

We celebrated National Library Week, April 20-26, by holding an open meeting in the Vestry at which we showed films supplied by the Canadian Travel Bureau of Ottawa. The three films and a display of books about Canada were enjoyed by an audience of about sixty children and adults.

Mrs. Elinor Scott was appointed to serve as children's librarian in the summer of 1967 and served until ill health forced her to retire, and we regret her death on June 7th. Mrs. George Hampson is continuing to serve as children's librarian and has weeded out the books in the children's room and recommended new books to replace some of the old.

The State Library has notified us that, because its income from Federal funds has been cut, the number of new Bookmobile books from which we may select will be severely reduced. Likewise, centralized book ordering has been eliminated and printed catalogue cards are only available for every current non-fiction. Our librarians believe they can handle the additional work without difficulty.

We held our usual book sale on Old Home Day with receipts of \$51.50. After the parade there were many visitors to the library and we received many compliments.

On the advice of the Bellows-Nichols Insurance Agency we increased our valuation of the library building from \$34,000 to \$45,000, increasing our premium from \$268.00 to \$301.00.

Mrs. Howard Rogers began in September to read or tell stories to the pre-school group once a week and the children seem to enjoy it. They like it so much that she is now also reading each Tuesday to the first four grades.

Our circulating record collection continues to grow

and is another service offered by the library. Mr. Anthony Brown has built a handsome, convenient browsing unit in which to shelve the records in the middle room.

HANCOCK 1969

Once again the weight on the metronome lowers and the beat in 1969 continues to quicken. No longer is Hancock even partly shielded, for over everyone's television come pictures of the incredible events of Neil Armstrong on July 20th taking man's first step on the moon. National and International events arrive in Hancock as quickly as in New York City. Over the media come phrases referring, it appears, to a blurry new future "dawn of aquarius."

On a large farm in Woodstock, New York, during the summer 400,000 teenagers screamed off and on for three days as rock music filled the air. No one knew what this might portend. Maybe Sandy Higgins could tell you, maybe not . . . She was there.

Nor did anyone have an acceptable solution to what really happened to Mary Jo Kopechne and her escort, Senator Edward Kennedy, at the Bridge at Chappaquiddick.

Bringing the focus back on our Town and fading out the distant scene we have lots to see. To start with let's turn to Willard Pond. On the shore Jerry/Marie Cutlip watched as the Fish and Game people rotenoned the waters to prepare for the stocking of fingerling Seneca trout. Jerry, with his connections with the Audubon Society, has made the younger generation in Town more conscious of conservation and of ecology.

His efforts are supplemented by the Recreation Committee composed of Midge Buck, Joan Watson, Peg Brown, Bud Adams, Otis Wilder, Sr. and Bob Stewart. And, of course the Conservation Committee is still active under the leadership of Les Fogg. In fact this year the group acquired an interesting bit of land between the by-pass and the Contocook River.

"Bobcats Before Breakfast," a book by Hancock's best known man-of-the-woods John Kulish spotlights our outdoor traditions. Fran/Lou Kolb as well as Marge/Warren Owler with their camping sites make it easier for visitors from afar to enjoy our antidote to city smog. Come winter the inter-town Hancock Snowshoers disappear with forty or more into the tall timber. There were colossal snowstorms on the 9th and 25th of February to delight their hearts.

Let anyone think the Sportsman's Club is inactive, let it be said that among other activities their annual September clambake by the trout pond is a chance for those interested to see Foster Avery, Tony Brown, Perley

and Louella Dunbar, Bob Fish and Dorothy Avery in action. Roger Terrill whose father not so many years ago used to see 27 trains a day arrive at Elmwood Junction, has assembled for the past fifteen years enthusiasts for an annual skeet shoot.

One last note on activities in the great outdoors must include the regretted decision by Boston University to divest itself of Sargent Camp. On November 7th some 3,000 people were at the camp for a public auction. The camp's future . . . the future of 865 much enjoyed acres . . . Half Moon Pond . . . remains in doubt.

Let it be added that one of the successes of the year was the appearance of some of our leading citizens – including our moderator – in the Old Home Day Parade claiming to be a Jug Band. Attired a la Basin Street they – let us say – attracted favorable attention. They even received some outside engagements.

Scratch almost anyone in Hancock and there is the heart of an artist. Some years ago Lilla Cabot Perry (1848-1933) painted pictures of Hancock which are appreciated increasingly. This year her paintings were the feature of an exhibit at the Hirschl and Adler Galleries in New York. The Dillons this year created some interesting work, "Fabulous Foils," Gladys Rockhill exhibited her water colors and oils and Wallace Tripp, who has illustrated a dozen books, was using pen and ink. In the field of music Elsie Lyon, a descendant of Lilla Cabot Perry, commanded attention when she played to a hushed audience of admirers.

Just in case anyone should wonder years from now . . . it should be recorded that the Historical Society under the leadership of Sam/Ruth Lessey is flourishing as is the Men's Club, of course, the Woman's Club of which Frances Tripp is the current president with the officers being Lois Daloz, Estella Casler, Lee Harding and Ruth Gay. Of the many fine programs was one of Helen Troesch.

Reverend J. Lincoln Thomas succeeded Alden Blake as pastor in the Meeting House. He and his wife, Mabel, were quickly right at home. Activity in the church parallels activities elsewhere. Earl Otis and Ernest Cass see to the collection while music is provided by the senior choir composed, among others, of Barbara Caverly, Barbara Williams, Doris Rogers, Catherine Moore, Sylvia St. John, Edith Bainton, June Chandler, Louella Dunbar, Joan Kunhardt, Bob Strombeck, Arthur Trembley and Lester Fogg.

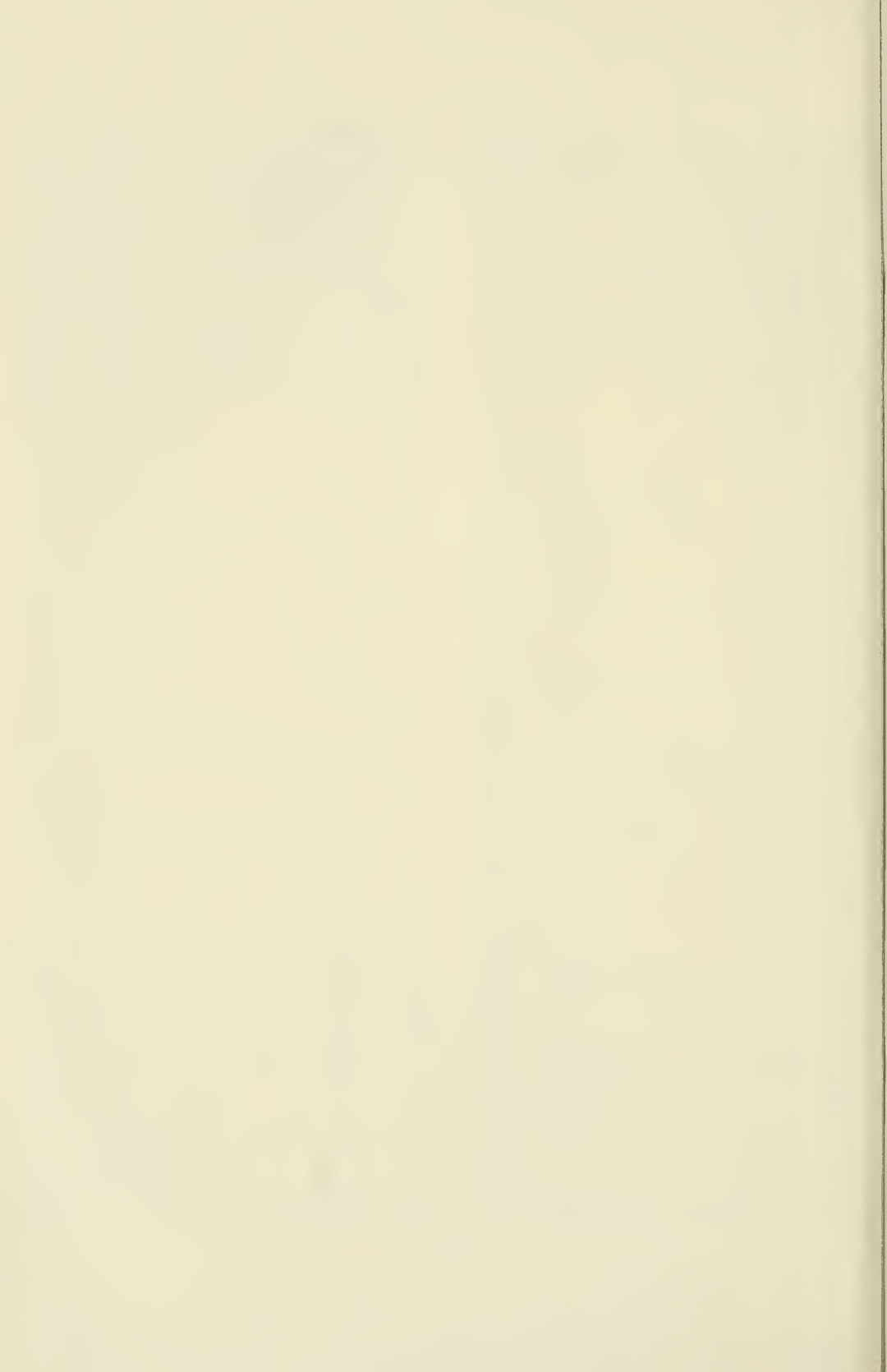
