## Warrant for the Annual Meeting.

---

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston qualified to vote in Town affairs :*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house, in said town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing roads and bridges, for lighting streets, for Memorial day, for payment of watchman and for all other necessary town charges.
3. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and other officers heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To see if the town will vote that "it is inexpedient to establish a library" as provided in section eight, chapter one hundred and eighteen, laws of 1895.
6. To see if the town will vote to return to the "town system," for repairing highways, as provided in section thirteen, chapter twenty-nine, laws of 1899, or vote to make any change in the number of highway districts, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to have the reports of the town officers printed, or act in relation thereto.

8. To see if the town will vote to enlarge the town house and raise and appropriate money for the same, or pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the town will vote to build a new bridge in place of the one known as the "Gage bridge" near D. N. Butterfield's, and raise and appropriate money for the same, or pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see what action the town will take in regard to the claim of Jennie E. Osborne for damage from alleged defective highway, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to lighting streets.

#### EXTRACT OF CHAPTER 118, LAWS OF 1895.

SEC. 1. The selectmen in each town shall assess annually upon the polls and ratable estate taxable therein, a sum to be computed at the rate of thirty dollars for every dollar of the public taxes apportioned to such town and so for a greater or less sum.

SEC. 8. Any town or library official violating any of the provisions of the preceding sections shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars.

Whenever a town having no town library, and having made no assessment under the provisions of this act, shall vote that it is inexpedient to establish a library, such action having been taken under a special article inserted in the warrant for the annual town meeting, then the officials of such town shall be exempt from the provisions of this section for one year, thereafter.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF THE NEW  
BOSTON CEMETERY,  
FEB. 15, 1902.

---

We submit herewith the superintendent's report to us, showing in detail the interments and removals in the cemetery for the past twelve months, and, while we have, in years past, felt constrained to call attention to the general exemption from death that our Heavenly Father has kindly vouchsafed to us, certainly this report calls for renewed thanksgiving to Him for His providential care and thought of us. Considering that the outside burial places have, to so large an extent, been abandoned for the cemetery of the town, the annual report of this cemetery covers practically the mortality of the town; and it is worthy of attention, that, with a census of a thousand or more, such an exceedingly low percentage of deaths can be reported. The list contains those who saw for a brief time the faces of loved ones; those in the maturity of years and usefulness; those who had lived long and waited their summons; and those who, in the strength of manhood and womanhood, had gone to other places to fill up life's measure, and in death had been tenderly brought to the home of their childhood; "gathered with their fathers," and all to rest in our beautiful hillside cemetery.

We have few suggestions to offer. The cemetery has had good care from the superintendent; the fallen leaves were gathered early; the grass was mown in season; the lots and lawns that were his especial care on account of funds left in our hands, have received proper attention; and we thank the many who have attended to their own family lots. May we once more urge a more general interest in the cemetery, and suggest that

the resolve be made by many that before another Decoration day they will, in spite of pressure of work at their homes and farms, devote one day in caring for their own family lot, and bestow a little care beside on those lots which have received all the members of the family for whom they were designed, and no one left to have an especial care and thought of them.

## Report of School Board.

---

During the past year we have maintained 30 weeks of school in Nos. 2, 4, 5, 6, 13 and 16, also in the primary and grammar schools, while the high school has had its usual year of 33 weeks. No. 3 had a winter term only, its scholars being provided elsewhere during the remainder of the year. We believe the average quality of our teachers has been unusually good, and our schools were never in better working condition than now.

We have found a very serious drawback to their usefulness, however, in the irregular attendance of the scholars. There are some sections where this is especially demoralizing. Parents do not realize the damage to our schools and the loss inflicted on the individual scholars by poor attendance.

We earnestly ask you to consider this and in the coming year see to it that your children are never absent from school unless it is really necessary.

We also urge parents to visit schools, make yourselves acquainted with your teachers, come to them and to us freely with anything which you feel ought to be changed. We all desire to improve our schools, but the teachers and the school board cannot do it all. We must have your interest and your loyal co-operation. Every parent and citizen can help us in this work, so important to us all.

We have adopted Cyr's Reader in place of the old Harper's and Montgomery's History in place of Barnes's, changes which seemed to us necessary.

Our school buildings are a credit to us and without exception are suitable for their purpose. To make

needed repairs in painting and shingling we ask for an appropriation of \$150.

The school in No. 2 should have a well. One half the insurance on the village school house expires in a short time and should be renewed. We ask appropriations for both these objects. To maintain our schools at their present standard will require in our judgment an appropriation of \$200 above the amount required by law.
