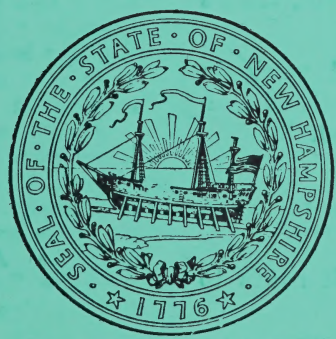


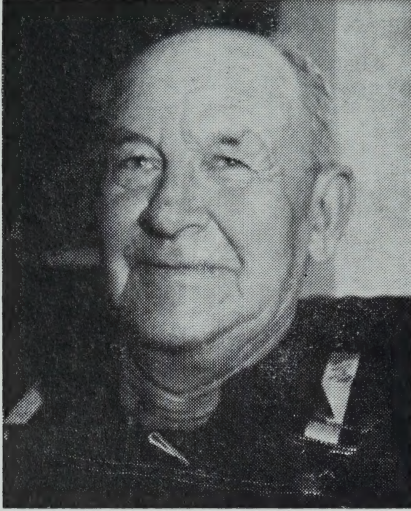

TOWN WARRANT**The State of New Hampshire**

To the inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

The polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M. Business meeting at 8:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Maintenance and Repair of Highways and Bridges.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$991.64 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,610.91.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for tarring of Class V roads.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate for land for highway department use, and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new truck applying the 1966 truck towards the purchase of the same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new grader, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00, \$8,000.00 to be raised this year and to be applied with the old grader as down payment, the balance to be defrayed in two annual payments, plus accrued interest.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,100.00 for the principal and interest on the new Fire Station Note.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the repair of sidewalks.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.

17. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for a new Fire Truck.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of new Highway Equipment.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for widening and repairing a section of the Sky Pond Road.

22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Pemigewasset Valley Conservation Council.

24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the New Hampshire Humane Society.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

26. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the preparation and tarring of a portion of the Coolidge Woods Road beginning at the junction of the Blake Hill Road and proceeding in a northerly direction.

27. To see what position the Town wishes to take relative to an ordinance concerning the positioning of mobile homes and/or trailers in the Town of New Hampton.

28. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

NEW HAMPTON POLICE DEPARTMENT

1971 Annual Report

New Hampton started its first full-time police department July 1, 1971, with Chester W. Butcher, Jr. as Chief of Police, William Connell and Bernard Lowell appointed special police officers. The New Hampton Police Dept. telephone number is 744-8585, if no answer at this number, they can be contacted via radio by calling the Belknap Sheriff Dept. at telephone no. 524-3830. The new 1971 Ford cruiser was equipped and put in service the first of August. The police dept. was able to get a reimbursement from the N.H. Highway Safety Agency in the amount of \$1,289.13 for the purchase of the police cruiser. In conjunction with the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency, the police dept. has a new communication system installed in the cruiser whereby they have radio contact with Belknap Sheriff Dept., State Police Headquarters in Concord and all of the surrounding town cruisers. In the six month period the dept. has been in operation we have received 197 complaints, 27 requests for house checks, made 37 arrests, and worked 1,612 man hours. It is hoped that the police dept. has added to the public service of you, the citizens of the Town of New Hampton.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Lest We Forget—It Can Happen Here

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947. Nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand—a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them **dead out** when leaving.
4. **Most important**—Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year—1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

NEWFOUND AREA NURSING ASSOCIATION

January 1 through December 31, 1971

The full time visiting nurse service of NANA has continued to grow. We were recertified with Medicare in October for another year. The organization is supported by contributions from the four town area which it covers: Bristol, Bridgewater, New Hampton and Alexandria. The offices are located in the Medical Building next to the First National. Twenty-four hour coverage is available in the event of emergencies. The phone is also covered by an answering service located in the Community Service office from 9:00 A.M.-3:00 P.M. The NANA black jade maverick is easily identified by the NANA seal and NANA 1 license plate. The staff now consists of two Registered Nurses and two LPNs, and an office secretary.
