Selectmen's Report

A good road connecting Upper and Lower Bay roads on the northerly end has been needed for some years, so 1966 saw the start of reconstruction on the road which we expect will be completed this year.

After due consideration of terrain available, right of way cost, it was the opinion of the road agent and selectmen that Collison Road was the road best suited to make this connection at the present time. It is now in use as a bus route.

T. R. A. funds are being used to do this work, also for work done on Black Brook Road. Part of Black Brook Road has been straightened, widened and graveled and in 1967 it will be a Black top road from Lower Bay Road to the Meredith line.

Duncan Fund money was used for gravel on several town roads. At present no major repairs are needed on any town buildings.

Mr. William Powers is now Town Hall custodian and Mr. Donald Sanville continues as sanitary engineer at the Town Dump.

During the year 1966 wood fires were at a minimum, with the exception of a small fire along Route 93.

We hope that the State will assume full responsibility for these fires in the near future. Continue to be fire conscious while in the woods, particularly during dry periods.

Again the Selectmen, and School Board Members call to the attention of all students who wish to apply for a Scholarship, that applications may be acquired from the School Principal and must be filed at his office on or before May 1st.

This is the year when the State Tax Commission will be in Sanbornton to revaluate all properties. The Selectmen ask that every taxpayer fill out and return their inventory completed as near accurate as possible. Each year there is a large exchange of property either sold in whole or in part and there is just no method by which the Selectmen can determine what some pieces of property contain unless an inventory is filed with a complete description. To save time and cut the cost of revaluation please return your complete inventory.

Now that Sanbornton is part of the Winnisquam Regional School District there is no report in your Town Report this year.

The Selectmen, Town Officers and Town Committees wish to thank all the Townspeople for their assistance and cooperation during the year 1966.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sanbornton on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14th) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To act upon the following subjects at 7:30 p. m., March 14, 1967.
- 1. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget as recommended by the Budget Committee.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums and amounts of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate at public auction acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$28,500) for maintenance of highways and bridges, eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) for summer maintenance, and seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500.00) for winter maintenance and equipment.

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept, raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand two hundred twenty three dollars and two cents (\$1,223.02) for the Town Road Aid (T.R.A.); the State's share, eight thousand one hundred fifty three dollars and forty five cents (\$8,153.45).
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand fifty dollars (\$1,050.00) for the Sanbornton Fire Department.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.00) for the Winnisquam Fire Department for the purpose of maintenance and equipment.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty five dollars (\$35.00) for Memorial Day.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy five dollars (\$75.00) for Old Home Day.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand and ninety dollars (\$1,090.00) and make the same available for the use of the Library Trustees.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for Band Concerts.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for culverts.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for oiling.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the Lakes Region General Hospital.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for Franklin Hospital.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for necessary expense of the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and forty one dollars and eleven cents (\$241.11) for partial participation to the Lakes Region Association, this money to be spent for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of Town, in cooperation with the other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for White Pine Blister Control.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for Civil Defense.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to withdraw from the capital reserve fund the sum of four hundred seventy five dollars (\$475.00) for the purchase of a Swensen tailgate road sander.
- 21. To see if the town will establish a town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36-A (by petition)
- 22. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to help finance the addition and modernization of the Lakes Region General Hospital.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the construction of a recreation pond for ice skating and fishing for children adjacent to the Town Office Building. Funds will be raised by private means and given to the Town for the aforesaid purpose. All funds for said purpose will be matched 50% by the Federal Land and Water Act, administered by the State of New Hampshire. Further, the Selectmen shall be authorized to act on behalf of the Town in the construction of the recreation pond.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred seventy five dollars (\$275.00) for the Lakes Region Mental Health Clinic.

25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Sanbornton for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1966, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library and Fire Department.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1965 - December 31, 1966: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1965 and December 31, 1966, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$3,592.44 in 1966.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures -Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1966, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,040.01, plus a revenue surplus of \$137.00, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,177.01.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1966, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1966, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1966, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are now therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$2,221.94, from \$18,006.69 to \$20,228.63 as shown herewith:

Surety Bond:

The surety bond of the Town Clerk should be increased from \$2,500.00 to \$4,000.00.

Inasmuch as the two year period provided by law for redemptions from tax sales has expired on all of these unredeemed taxes, the Tax Collector should give tax deeds to the Town forwith for all of the properties represented by these undischarged tax liens held by the Town.

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

Sanbornton Fire Department

Sanbornton has experienced its heaviest loss in fire damage in many years. Four sets of buildings were lost, all nearly consumed before help could be summoned. Mutual Aid was called in all cases and aided in the supervision of the fires as well as saving out buildings. In all instances water had to be hauled from quite some distance. The State Fire Marshall was called to investigate some of these fires.

We had many small fires on Route 93 during the summer, none with fire loss.

The Firemen are working to clean the lot west of the Fire Station for a pond. We are hoping that some means will be forthcoming to provide water available at all times of the year.

During December and January twenty Firemen took a twelve hour course on Smoke Masks. This was conducted by a state instructor at our station using our equipment and proved to be a very informative and worthwhile course. We are planning another course in the spring.

During 1966 the Department responded to twenty-six alarms — twenty-one in Sanbornton and five Mutual Aid calls.

We gratefully acknowledge all contributions received and the valuable assistance of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden and Your District Chief

Fire Record

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largly due to two factors:

- 1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
- 2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

- 1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.
- 2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
- 3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
- 4. Most important Instruct your children that matches are not play things.

Thanks to the efforts of Mrs. Robert Bodwell our summer swimming program went into full operation this past year. Fifty-five children enrolled in the program and out of this group twenty-nine were tested by the Red Cross reresentative. Seventeen passed the National Red Cross Acquatic Test and twelve received cards listing the skills they passed. To make the Town Beach as suitable as possible Robert Gilman brought in some fine sand, a safety line with floats was placed around the area and a diving float constructed.

The Little League teams, under the direction of Joseph Seymour, had another good season. Although the three teams have taken their names from the three areas of the town, with the boys in those areas making up the team, this will no longer be possible because of where most of the boys live and the players will be mixed up among the teams.

The Ski Area is in its third year of operation and is running smoothly thanks to William Powers and Haven Sanborn. The slope was cut down very close by Robert Bodwell using his new rotary unit. Instruction is being offered this year thanks to Mrs. Clayton Howe. Instructions are given an hour before the tow goes into operation at 1 P. M. The Area may soon be faced with a major expense, the replacement of the tow rope.

The Committee hopes you enjoyed the picnic tables placed in different areas of the Town and remembered to help keep the areas clean.

Report of the Planning Board

In response to the Public Hearing in 1965, the Planning Board has continued its work on amendments to the Zoning Ordinance relative to Mobile Homes and Trailers and establishment of the Forest Recreation Area. The original Zoning Ordinance and all amendments thereto have been thoroughly studied and compiled in an effort to make it easier for those interested to know of and understand the rules the townspeople have established for the orderly growth of our town.

The Board expects to have its work completed on the above proposed amendments this spring, as well as several suggestions for correction of inconsistencies in the Ordinance. Hearings will then be held for further discussion of these matters prior to presentation to the town for consideration.

The Board, in compliance with its duty to recommend plans for future growth, approves the following:

- (1) Construction of a skating and fishing pond on town land adjacent to the town offices.
- (2) Support of the Lakes Region Mental Health Clinic.

The library continued under the able direction of Mrs. Ruth Wiggins for the first six months of the year during which time our last seventh and eighth grade classes of Sanbornton Central were among our library patrons, as well as the first six grades making regular visits during school time. Their needs were met with our own books and those of N. H. State Bookmobile service.

Mrs. Wiggins resigned at the end of June. We are very fortunate to have the services of Mrs. Barbara Powers who was appointed at that time.

As members of the Concord District Council of the N.H. Statewide Library Development Program we have the benefit of a grant of \$100. in reference books, allowing us to add to several categories in the collection. Also, as members of the program we are looking forward to other benefits in the years to come, such as a common borrowers card. This would in essence open up to the library patron the use of more than one library.

We hope in the coming year to open the library during an evening, thus making a step toward improved service. The amount necessary to do this has been included in the budget request for 1967. We hope that many adults who would not otherwise be able to use the library would take advantage of these hours. This would also give the young people an opportunity to use their library both for reference and reading materials. The library has grown and improved over the years through the steady, generous financial support of the townspeople, and also the unheralded efforts and gifts of many people. Our thanks go to everyone. We hope that many who have never been to their library will visit during the coming year.
