REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.



In submitting this our annual report, we think that our schools have maintained their usual good standing, and that the scholars have all made good progress the past year.

In Division Two we have no school house, and the School Board have always had to hire a room in a private house. And under the circumstances the School Board deemed it best to have the scholars go out of town fall and winter terms, as it is not convenient to unite with Division One.

In Division One there has been two terms. The first of ten weeks was taught by Miss Susie G. Sweet of Antrim. This was Miss Sweet's second term in this school, and, as before, gave good satisfaction, and the scholars made good progress,

The second term of fourteen weeks, was taught by Miss Fodie M. Prescott of Antrim. This was Miss Prescott's first attempt at teaching, but being a good disciplinarian, and laboring hard for the good of the scholars, good progress was the result.

In Division Two we have had but one term of ten weeks, taught by Mr. Dana S. Temple of Hillsboro'. This was Mr. Temple's first attempt at teaching, but the scholars made good progress, and with more practice we predict a bright future for the teacher.
