SELECTMEN'S FOREWORD AND REPORT

The Selectmen are happy to report that there has been a lot of progress made in many areas this past year.

The Chlorination Facility at the sewer lagoons has been completed and is currently functioning.

Derry Village sewer has been completed except for some minor items of cleaning up.

The expansion of the Water Department is continuing to meet the needs of the growing community.

Crystal Avenue has been completed and the new street lights are currently being installed.

The corridor hearing for the proposed 102 By-Pass has been held and the Selectmen are looking to a favorable outcome of this project, however, the construction would not begin in the immediate future.

There is a new industry currently in the Industrial Park and we are anxiously looking forward to more industry in that area of town.

The Selectmen recognize the fact that there is still much to be done in the town and hope to proceed this year with several new projects such as aeration at the sewer lagoons, a new pump to increase pressure in the northern area of the town so as to enhance more industry, new engineering studies to study the sewage conditions for potential growth in the future, and many others.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in town affairs:

Voters in District No. 1 are hereby notified to meet at the Veterans Memorial Hall in said district, and voters of District No. 2 are hereby notified to meet at the new East Derry Fire House in said district, on the ninth day of March, 1971, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the articles required to be voted on by official ballot, and to meet at eight o'clock in the afternoon on March 16, in the Veterans Memorial Hall to act on all other articles in this warrant.

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until eight o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustees, and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town buildings, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observances of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of

\$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the same to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association, which serves the Derry area, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from meter receipts the sum of \$1,660.00 to be expended for repairs and maintenance of parking meters and to transfer any balance of parking meter receipts to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the Parking Lot Fund, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Revised Statutes annotated, Chapter 80, Section 52-a, providing for the prepayment of taxes, and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes, and to further allow the Collector of Taxes to discount taxes according to the following schedule or such other schedule as the meeting may determine, fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend the following schedule and discount: 2% discount on installments of not less than \$100.00 prior to July 1, 1971, 1½% discount on installment payments of \$10.00 or more until tax rate is determined and announced by Selectmen, and a 1% discount from the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after date of invoice.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00, to be used as matching funds with State or Federal funds that may become available, for crime prevention and law enforcement or for pollution control and protection of the environment (the money so appropriated will not be expended unless State or Federal matching funds become available), and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$35,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing and installing a pump to increase the water pressure in the municipal water system, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$5,000.00 for the purpose of a long-range engineering study of improvements to the municipal sewerage disposal system so that the plant may be improved to meet conditions for the next fifteen to twenty years, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 for the purpose of data processing of municipal bills for taxes, sewer, water and head and poll taxes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$200,000.00 under the terms of Chapter 33 of Revised Statutes Annotated, entitled Municipal Finance Act, and any amendments thereto, and to execute serial notes in the name of the Town in payment therefor, payable in annual installments over a period of ten years, and further authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the terms of said loan and do any other act necessary to accomplish the purpose

hereof, the proceeds of said loan including interest to be used to install aeration and appurtenances at the sewer lagoons (State and Federal funds anticipated up to \$180,000.00 net to Town \$20,000.00), and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$150,000.00 under the terms of Chapter 33 of Revised Statutes Annotated, entitled Municipal Finance Act, and any amendments thereto, and to execute serial notes in the name of the Town in payment therefor, payable in annual installments over a period of ten years, and further authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the terms of said loan and do any other act necessary to accomplish the purpose hereof, the proceeds of said loan including interest to be used for the Horne Brook Interceptor and appurtenances thereto (State and Federal funds anticipated up to \$134,000.00 net to the Town \$16,000.00), and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to change the water rates charged to water users on the municipal water system by doing away with the commercial rate so that all water users will be charged on the same basis as charged to dwellings and other users not now classified as commercial, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote that there is a need for a Housing Authority as set forth in Chapter 203 of Revised Statutes Annotated, and request the Selectmen to implement said need by appointing Commissioners so that a Housing Authority will exist and function in the community, and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. By petition: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$2,750.00 for the Derry Head Start School, to enable said school to enroll five (5) additional children beyond its present budgeted capacity of 30 for the school year beginning September, 1971. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee)

17. By petition: To see if the Town of Derry will vote to accept Dolores Avenue, Doris Street, Paul Avenue in their present location, as they exist and as shown on a Revised Plan of Edgewood Estate, dated August, 1970, made by Edward N. Herbert, Surveyor, and recorded at the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds.

18. By petition: To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of the Central Fire House land and buildings, from the Derry Fire District when their new building is constructed. Said land and buildings at 32 West Broadway, will be used only for recreation purposes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

19. By petition: We the undersigned residents of Hickory Avenue, Juniper Road, Pine Street and Cole Road, Woodland Park so called, do hereby petition our Selectmen to repair and resurface the above said roads up to the town requirements, including adequate surface drainage. Estimated cost being \$49,700.00. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee)

20. By petition: To see if the Town of Derry, New Hampshire will vote to transfer for one (\$1.00) dollar, or such other consideration as the Town of Derry deems proper to the FIRST PARISH, CONGRAGATIONAL, CHURCH IN DERRY, NEW HAMPSHIRE, INCORPORATED, a church duly incorporated under the laws of the State of New Hampshire and located at the corner of Hampstead Road and Cemetery Road in Derry, New Hampshire, its successors and assigns, a certain parcel of land with the buildings thereon bounded and described as shown on Plan of Land in Derry, N.H. drawn for First Parish Congregational Church, Jan. 1971, by Edward N. Herbert, Surveyor, show 2.85 acres of land and being the land upon which the present church sits at East Derry plus some additional land to the South for parking, etc. This transfer is granted with the reservation that in the event the First Parish, Congregational, Church in Derry, New Hampshire, Incorporated, its successors and assigns, ceases to exist, or does not function as an active Church in its services of worship and general activities for a period of three (3) successive years, said land and easement as described above shall revert to the Town of Derry, New Hampshire. And to pass any other vote relating thereto.

21. Are you in favor of the adoption of the amendments to the Town Zoning Ordinance as

Proposed by the Town Planning Board

1. Amend Article VI, Section 3, to make building permits valid for one year with renewal rights. (Approved by Planning Board)

2. Amend Article I, Section 1.100, to change 8.1 acres of land adjoining Hood Shopping Center from General Residence Area to Retail Business Zone. (Approved by Planning Board)

3. Amend Article I, Section 1.120 to increase the depth of the Retail Business Zone on the Easterly side of Crystal Avenue. (Approved by Planning Board)

Proposed by Herbert Hartwell, et als.

1. Amend Article I, Section 1.100 and add Section 1.180 to include in the Retail Business Zone three lots at the Derry Village Rotary, being No. 1, No. 3 and No. 5 North Main Street. (Approved by Planning Board)

Proposed by William Fleming, et als.

1. Amend Section 1.200 by limiting the Industrial Zone situated Northerly of Broadway to industrial uses only. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

2. Amend Section 1.410a General Residence Zone to limit lot size to one acre and dwellings to single residence type with some exceptions. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

3. Amend Section 1.410b General Residence Zone to limit two-family residence lot to minimum of 30,000 square feet, limit multiple dwellings and apartments to be permitted by special exception with

minimum lot size of 150,000 square feet. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

4. Amend Section 1.410c General Residence Zone to limit lot size to 2½ acres and single family residences with some exceptions. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

5. Amend Article II, Section 7, to limit multiple dwellings and apartments to provide minimum of 2500 square feet of land per dwelling unit. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

6. Amend Article II, Section 7, to require all buildings to be connected to Town sewer and water. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

7. Amend Article II, Section 8, to define zoning district boundaries. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

Proposed by Walter Gardner, et als.

1. Amend Article VI, Section 1, by adding Sections 1a, b, c, d, e, f and g to raise building permit fees over one to any applicant to \$1,000.00 and \$1,500.00 and use the money for schools and water-sewerage expansion. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

(All zoning articles to be voted on by ballot during the hours of voting on March 9th)

22. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

23. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

24. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Derry for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town.

Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the audit reports enclosed herewith must be given the Town Clerk as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Works, Derry Public Library, Taylor Library, Alexander Carr Playground, MacGregor Memorial Park, Sewer Fund, Parking Meters, District Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Revenue Accounts: (General Fund)

Comparative Balance Sheets – General Fund – December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets – General Fund – as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Town increased by \$295,654.54 in 1969, from \$881,672.02 at December 31, 1968 to \$1,177,326.56 at December 31, 1969.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition – General Fund:
(Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures – Estimated and Actual Revenues – General Fund: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, esti-

mated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$84,607.36, plus a revenue surplus of \$29,035.66, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$113,643.02.

Non-Revenue Accounts:

Comparative Balance Sheets – Non Revenue Accounts – December 31, 1968 – December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-5)

Comparative Balance Sheets – Non-Revenue Accounts – as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, are contained in Exhibit A-5. Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures – Non-Revenue Accounts: (Exhibit A-6)

A comparative statement of Appropriations and Expenditures – Non-Revenue Accounts is included in Exhibit A-6.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures – General Fund: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures – general fund – for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is contained in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance – general fund – as of December 31, 1969, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statements of Receipts and Expenditures – Non-Revenue Accounts: (Exhibits B-5 & B-6)

Statements of the activity during 1969 in the Highway & Water Construction account and the Derry Village Sewer Construction account are presented in Exhibits B-5 and B-6.

Water Works: (Exhibits E-1 thru E-5)

The financial condition of the Derry Water Works as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, is disclosed in the Comparative Balance Sheets, Exhibit E-1. The results of operations for the year and the change in retained earnings are detailed in Exhibit E-2, Statement of Profit and Loss and Retained Earnings. Summary statements of the Treasurers' accounts for the year examined are contained in Exhibits E-3, E-4 and E-5.

Sewer Fund: (Exhibit F)

The activity in the Sewer Fund account for the fiscal year is shown in Exhibit F.

District Court: (Exhibit G)

Exhibit G presents a summary statement of the District Court account for the calendar year 1969.

Parking Meter Account: (Exhibit H)

Cash transactions with respect to parking meter activities are summarized in Exhibit H.

Library Accounts: (Exhibits I-1 & I-2)

The financial affairs of the Derry Public Library and the Taylor Library are reported in Exhibits I-1 and I-2.

Trust Funds: (Exhibits K-1 & K-2)

Statements of trust fund principal, income and investments as of December 31, 1969, as indicated by the records of the Trustees of Trust Funds, are included in Exhibits K-1 and K-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit L)

The outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1969, as well as annual debt service requirements, are contained in Exhibit L.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$8,345.56 in 1969, from \$153,327.98 to \$161,673.44, as shown herewith:

Trust Fund Records Incomplete – Cash Unrecorded and Not Deposited:

Our examination of the accounts and records of the Trustees of Trust Funds disclosed the following facts:

- 1) Undeposited receipts amounted to \$1,505.00 at December 31, 1969. Of the aforesaid amount, fourteen (14) checks, totalling \$1,155.00, received during the month of January 1969, had not been deposited as of April 26, 1970. We were advised that the said checks had been inadvertently misplaced.
- 2) In a number of cases, the auditors were unable to account for receipt of income on stocks held.
- 3) Some of the securities were not available for physical count.
- 4) Cash receipts were not all reflected on cash journals. Receipts for the months of January and February were not recorded therein; other detail receipts were not recorded.
- 5) Receipt items which were part of certain bank deposits were unidentifiable.
- 6) Income credits to the individual general cemetery trust fund accounts were incorrectly distributed, because all income derived from the investments of the several common trust funds was combined and apportioned without regard to the contributory interest reflected in each common trust fund.
- 7) Distribution of income in a number of other trust funds was incorrect due to clerical errors.

It is apparent from the foregoing comments that a great deal of laxness has attended the accounting for the activity in the trust fund accounts in 1969.

This situation has caused a substantial increase in audit expense in connection with the examination of the accounts of the Town.

The following steps should be taken in order that adequate accounting records and physical control over resources of the trust funds be obtained:

- 1) Incoming cash and checks should be promptly recorded on cash journals with accurate identification as to source, amount and accounts to be credited.
- 2) Bank deposits should be made as often as practical, at least once weekly.
- 3) Cash journals should be utilized which will permit the adequate accounting for all changes required due to income on investments, activity in investments (purchases, sales and exchanges) and creation of new trust funds.
- 4) Distribution of income to the accounts should comply with the provisions of R.S.A., Chapter 31. Income received by the Trustees of Trust Funds on investments of common trust funds should be credited proportionately to the credit of each trust in each common trust fund on the basis of contributions made by said trusts.

5) All receipts in hand at December 31, should be deposited within a day or so after the close of the year.

Surety Bonds:

Town officers surety bonds should be increased in amount as indicated herewith:

Town Treasurer From \$25,000.00 to \$60,000.00

Town Clerk From \$ 5,000.00 to \$19,000.00

Town Clerk & Tax Collector Checking Accounts:

It is again recommended that bank (checking) accounts maintained by the Town Clerk and Tax Collector for deposits of their collections be closed and that, hereafter, both officials deposit their daily collections direct to the credit of the Treasurer's bank account and provide the Treasurer with the usual remittance advices. This procedure will obviously place these funds in the custody of the Treasurer much sooner than under present practice, but more importantly will permit, if feasible, investment of funds which now lie idle and unproductive in the accounts of the Town Clerk and Tax Collector.

Change Funds for Tax Collector & Town Clerk:

The Tax Collector and Town Clerk should each be furnished with a change fund commensurate with their specific requirements. This arrangement will permit these officials to remit their daily collections intact to the Treasurer, in conformance with generally accepted business practices.

Cash Registers:

The feasibility of adopting the use of cash registers in both the Town Clerk's and Tax Collector's operations should be fully explored. Validation equipment and automatic totalling provided by these machines can reduce considerably the time required to process payments and expedite materially the reconciling of daily accounts.

Conclusion:

The provisions of R.S.A. 71:27-a (Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955) require that the summary of findings and recommendations of the auditors (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. The audit report may be published at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen, but this letter of transmittal must be published in its entirety.

We extend our appreciation to all the town officials and the members of their staff for the cooperation and courtesies extended during the course of the audit.

PROCEEDINGS

THE MODERATOR. Under the Articles of your warrant which appear beginning on page six, item one on page six has already been disposed of by balloting. On page nine, item 22, item 25 and item 26 have been disposed of by balloting and on page ten, Article 27 has been disposed of by balloting. 1 22, 25, 27

ARTICLE 2: To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money (2) as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges; for suppression of moths, for police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town Officials, for the Board of Health, for the expenses of the Town Buildings, for support of the libraries; for State and County taxes, for the observances of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Now, what is your pleasure under this item?

MRS. CASTEN. I move that the Article be accepted as read.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made to accept the Article as read. Do I hear anybody second it?

MR. DENSMORE. Horace Densmore, seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion under this Article.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye". Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. LYONS. I move we take up the budget item by item.

THE MODERATOR. David Lyons makes the motion that we take up the budget item by item under Article 2.

MR. HART. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Hart seconded it. Do I hear any discussion on it? The question has been moved. There is no further discussion. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare and we will take up Article 2 item by item.

(Line items read by the Moderator with certain line items being questioned for the purpose of discussion after completion of reading line items.)

MR. GARLAND. I move we go to Article 8 to in part explain this. (8)

MR. BROOKS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made and seconded that we take up Article 8. Any discussion. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we take up Article 8 which reads as follows:

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a Health Officer and Building Inspector, and appropriate therefor the sum of \$5,000.00 for expenses of said official so that the office of Tax Assessor will be relieved of those responsibilities, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Now, what is your pleasure under this Article 8 in the Warrant?

MR. LYONS. Mr. Moderator, I move we pass this as read.

MR. HOBBSCH. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

A hand count was taken by tellers appointed by the Moderator and the results were 7 "no" and 232 "Yes.")

THE MODERATOR. The Article is adopted, and I so declare.

(After considerable discussion on other questioned items the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Ambulance Service, \$30,000.00, that is Article 17 in the Warrant. Do you want to take that up at this time? If you want to we can move to Article 17.

MRS. DIMARZIO. So moved.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Dimarzio and seconded by Mr. Garland that we take up Article 17 in the Warrant that takes up this item.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$30,000.00 for the purpose of providing ambulance service for the Town of Derry, said ambulance service to be established and set up under the supervision and direction of the Board of Selectmen, and to further authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into agreements with surrounding towns to share the cost of said ambulance service as occasion arises to so do and to accept from the State of New Hampshire or the Federal Government such assistance as may be obtainable to offset the cost of said ambulance service, and pass any vote relating thereto. (17)

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MRS. CASTEN. I move we accept the Article as read.

MR. WINSHIP. Seconded.

(After long discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BARLOW. At this time I make a motion to transfer this \$30,000.00 from this fund, from Article 17, and apply it in the Fire Department Budget. Thank you.

MR. MERRILL. I second it.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BARLOW. Mr. Moderator, I make that in the form of an amendment.

MR. BARKA. Seconded.

(After further discussion the following ensued.)

MR. BARLOW. Mr. Moderator, to expedite this I will change my amendment to read —

THE MODERATOR. Just one second. If you are going to change your amendment. Who seconded it? Do you withdraw the second?

MR. BARKA. I will withdraw my second.

THE MODERATOR. You withdraw your amendment. You are going to make a new amendment.

MR. BARLOW. I make the amendment to read as follows: To authorize the amount expended to authorize the selectmen to enter into an agreement with the Fire Department to provide the service that the Town of Derry has an ambulance service and have negotiations with the Fire Department. So they will get together as far as fees and etc., but be very dogmatic that it be geared to the Fire Department, but authorized through the Selectmen to negotiate with the Fire Department.

MR. GARLAND. I will second that.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Everybody understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Now the amendment has carried. Now, what is

your pleasure on the Article as amended. Doctor Sipe.

DOCTOR SIPE. I move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. There will be no further discussion since I think we have had adequate time. Everybody understand the article that we are on, Article 17 as amended by Mr. Barlow. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "no." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare. And Article 17 is passed as amended.

THE MODERATOR. Now we are returning back to page 13, Town Poor, the next item was Town Poor, \$15,000.00.

FROM THE FLOOR. I would like to amend this item to increase it by \$650.00 to be appropriated to the Community Action Program to be used for the local Headstart program.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. I made a ruling at the beginning of this meeting that I would not take up any items that were turned down by the Budget Committee that called for funds.

The next item that was questioned was the Study Commission, \$500.00. That is Article 18 in the warrant. Now, if you want to move to Article 18 in the Warrant, we will take that up. Anybody so move?

MR. ADAMS. So moved.

MRS. CASTEN. So moved.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second.

MR. SWART. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR: Article 18: By petition:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. and to direct the Moderator to appoint a seven member committee, to recommend to the 1971 Derry Town Meeting proposals to merge the Derry and East Derry Fire District, the Derry Village School District with the Derry Cooperative School District, and one or more proposals for Derry Town Government reorganization. The \$500. appropriation to be used for possible legal expenses. (18)

What is your wish on this item?

MRS. CASTEN. I move the Article be passed as read.

MR. QUIMBY. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made by Mrs. Casten and seconded by Mr. Quimby that we adopt this Article as read. Do I hear any discussion? The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye."

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. HARTMAN. I would like to make an amendment that we appoint a seven-man committee chaired by the Moderator with three representatives from the East Derry Fire District, three representatives from the Derry Fire District with no funds, to report back to the 1971 meeting.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on that amendment. I hear no second so we can't.

FROM THE FLOOR. I move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question now is moved as written in the warrant as I read it of Article 18. Everybody understand the question? If so, all those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "no." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next question is under the Salem Mental Health of \$3,000.00. That is Article 5. Will somebody move that we take up Article 5 at this time.

MR. GAY. So moved.

MR. HOBSCHE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Captain Gay that we take up this article, Mr. Hobsch seconded it. All those in favor of taking up this Article say "Aye", Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and we will take up Article 5 as it appears in the Town Warrant.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the (5) sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the same to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association, which serves the Derry area, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article?

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move we accept this as read.

MR. O'DONNELL. Seconded.

FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. There is no further discussion. Everyone understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and I so declare. And Article 5 is adopted.

All right. We move to the next item which was questioned and that was the little league field, \$5,053.00. My understanding is that this is Article 14 in your warrant. Do I hear a motion to take up this Article in the warrant at this time.

MR. LYONS. So moved.

MR. GERARD. John Gerard, seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion to take up at this time Article 14? Somebody move the question.

MR. GAY. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare. We will take up Article 14 which reads as follows:

Article 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the (14) sum of \$5,053.00 to construct a Little League Ball Park, so-called, on land of the Cooperative School District No. 1 of the Town of Derry located on the Turnpike in Derry Village, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move that it be accepted as read.

MR. LYONS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Dimarzio moves it be accepted as read, Mr. Lyons seconded it. Discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Everybody understand that, to adopt Article 14 as printed. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next Article that I have questioned here is under Culverts, \$7,150.00. And that is Article No. 9 in your Warrant.

MR. GARLAND. I move we take up Article 9.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

It has been moved by Mr. Garland and seconded by Mrs. Casten. Somebody move the question. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we will take up Item 9 which reads as follows:

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the (9) sum of \$7,150.00 for the purpose of improving the channel of the brook running from Crystal Avenue across Franklin Terrace and Franklin Street into Horne Brook and for the installation of and improvement of culverts where said brook crosses public highways, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure?

MR. HOBSCHE. I move we accept this article.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Hobsch has moved that we accept this article as printed. Do I hear a second. All right, Mr. Boyce seconded it. Discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion under this item?

FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved to adopt article 9 as printed. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and Article 9 is adopted.

The next questioned item was on highways and bridges, that is Article 11 as I understand it in your warrant. Do I hear a motion to take up Article 11.

MRS. DIMARZIO. So moved.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Dimarzio moved to take up the Article and Mr. Garland has seconded it. Any discussion.

MR. GAY. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. We will take up Article 11 which reads as follows:

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the (11) sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of improvements in the highway and highway drainage on Folsom Road and High Street with the intention to appropriate further money annually until said highways are completely rebuilt and improved, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this item?

MRS. DIMARZIO. I so move.

MR. HOBBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Dimarzio and seconded by Mr. Hobsch. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Any further questions? The question has been moved. Everybody understand the question that we adopt Article 11 as printed in the Town Warrant? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "no." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next item that was questioned was a \$40,000.00 item under share of new well, and as I understand it, that is Article 13 in the warrant. Mr. Garland moves that we take up Article 13 as printed in the warrant. Seconded by Mrs. Dimarzio. Any discussion? The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we will take up Article 13 which reads as follows:

Article 13: To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of (13) \$40,000.00 for the purpose of constructing an additional well on town land in Londonderry for supplying additional water to the Town Water system and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article? The motion has been made to adopt by Judge Grinnell. Do I hear a second.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion under this item? The question has been moved. Do you understand the question which is to adopt Article 13 as printed in the warrant. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next item on page 13 that was questioned was the Water Works Construction, water, Crystal Avenue, \$11,355.00, that is Article 10 in the Warrant. Anybody move to take up this Article 10 in the warrant?

MR. LYONS. So move.

MR. HOBBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mr. Lyons to take up this Article, Mr. Hobsch seconded the motion. Any discussion? The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and Article ten reads as follows:

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the (10)

sum of \$11,355.00 for the completion of the water main on Crystal (12, Avenue at the time of the reconstruction of said Crystal Avenue and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure?

MR. SWART. I move it be accepted as read.

THE MODERATOR. Gentleman moves to accept it as read. Do I hear a second. Mr. Barlow seconds it. Do I hear any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion? The question has been moved to adopt Article 10, as printed. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Well, lets have a vote again. I am not sure on that one, unless you want a count vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next controversial item or questioned item was \$50,000.00 sewer construction in Derry Village, Article 12. Do I hear a motion to take up Article 12.

MR. MACGREGOR. I move we take up Article 12.

MR. BARKA. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of taking up Article 12 will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and we will take up Article 12 at this time which reads as follows:

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend interest money earned on Bond issues, not to exceed the sum of \$50,000.00 for the completion of the sanitary sewer system of the Town in the Derry Village area and to make such transfers from one account to another as is necessary to accomplish the intent hereof, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this item?

MR. HOWARD. I move that we accept this as printed.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Howard moved that we accept this as printed and Mrs. Casten seconded it. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Any further questions or discussion? The question has been moved to adopt Article 12 as printed. Everybody understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and Article 12 is adopted.

And the next item which we have a question on is new equipment, \$58,500.00.

(After considerable discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BARKA. I think where the taxpayers have enough trouble without adding to it, I think there is two or three other items going through the other things that are much more important. And I would like to see to get the rest of them. I would like to see this \$15,000.00 defeated. I think we can do without it for another year.

THE MODERATOR. Do you make that as an amendment?

MR. BARKA. I do.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Barka moves to amend this item by reducing it by \$15,000.00.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

MR. BARKA. I want to amend it so that the mobile radios, the sum of \$15,000.00 be deleted. This is what I said, that the \$15,000.00 that is included for mobile radios be deleted.

THE MODERATOR. The motion that you have given here, it has been seconded, has been to delete the mobile radios. All right. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion on this matter? This is on the amendment to delete the \$15,000.00 for the radios. Any further discussion? Somebody move the question.

MR. O'BRIEN. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Do you understand that? This is strictly on just on the amendment to delete. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Since we are not voting on the whole item we move to the next controversial item. . . I think there is one left, if I remember correctly and that is under payment on principal debt, Bond, \$145,000.00. I am sorry, that item was turned down, wasn't it? That was a bond issue item.

(After explanation and discussion the following ensues:)

MR. MACGREGOR. We haven't finished with this new equipment. You just passed over the radios, period.

THE MODERATOR. At this point here we are not taking up these items unless they were an article in the Town Warrant. Somebody will move I hope somewhere to take up all the items. There has been nothing amended up to this point.

MR. MACGREGOR. All you took up under that \$58,000.00 on new equipment was just the mobile radios. Maybe somebody had another question. You didn't give them a chance.

THE MODERATOR. All right. I will return in this one instance, if it is a clear error of mistake of something that had been taken up under that item. I thought the only controversy was the radios.

MR. MACGREGOR. I am against the sweeper and I move that we delete \$14,000.00 for the sweeper.

MR. MENGNER. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Any discussion on the motion.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion? Somebody move the question. All those in favor say "Aye", those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it and the item stands as it was, \$58,500.00.

Anything further? Now, we have taken up all of the items under this line item budget plus the articles that were in the Town warrant which already been approved. We haven't changed the figure one nickle, I don't think. It is \$1,178,618.16. Now, at this time I will entertain a motion to adopt all the articles that have not been adopted and as printed or adopt the entire budget and that we appropriate the sum of \$1,178,618.16. Do I hear a motion on that.

Mr. Piper moves and Captain Gay seconded it. Do we have any discussion on that?

All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare.

We have got to move to the source of revenue items.

MR. GARLAND. Our revenue items that are shown on pages 11 and 12 you have to delete the \$2,500.00 for ambulance service and that will change the amount to be raised by property taxes to \$571,147.00. That is what you are going to raise by taxes. I am sorry, that is the total anticipated revenue, I am sorry. So you come up with the anticipated revenue then will be \$571,147.00 and that in turn will make your total revenues by taxation, \$607,471.16. Then you will balance out.

THE MODERATOR. You understand that the point here we have got to act on, we have got to adopt it as amended by Mr. Garland. Do I have a motion to adopt the entire - - -

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Boyce seconded it. Do we have any discussion on that? The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed, "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next article in the Warrant is

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to (3) sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under that item? Motion has been made by Mr. Boyce to adopt. Do I hear the motion seconded.

MRS. RICHARDSON: Nancy Richardson, seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting Article 13 as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and Article 3 is adopted.

The next Article is Article 4:

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to (4) incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under that article?

MRS. CASTEN. Move its adoption. I move its adoption as read.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Casten moves that we adopt Article 4 as printed. Do I hear it seconded.

MR. YOUNKERS. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear any discussion? The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next item on the budget is Article 6 which reads as follows:

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from meter receipts the sum of \$1,460.00 to be expended for repairs and maintenance of parking meters and to transfer any balance of parking meter receipts to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the Parking Lot Fund, and pass any vote relating thereto.

And I am informed by Mr. Garland this has already been done. It is already in the budget, we passed it without knowing about it. It has already been taken up as I understand it in the budget.

The next article is Article 7:

To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 80, Section 52-a, providing for the prepayment of taxes, and authorize the collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes, and to further allow the Collector of Taxes to discount taxes according to the following schedule or such other schedule as the meeting may determine, fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend that following schedule and discount: 2% discount on installments of not less than \$100.00 prior to July 1, 1970, 1½% discount on installment payments of \$10.00 or more until tax rate is determined and announced by Selectmen, and a 1% discount from the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after date of invoice. (7)

What is your pleasure on that article?

MRS. DIMARZIO. So moved.

THE MODERATOR. That we adopt the article as printed. Mr. Garland seconded the motion. The question has been moved. All those in favor of adopting Article 7 as printed will say "Aye." All those opposed, "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare, and Article No. 7 is adopted as printed.

The next article, we have done 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14,--Article 15.

Article 15: To see if the Town will vote to transfer by deed to the (15) State of New Hampshire a certain parcel of land situated near Beaver Lake in Derry and described as "Land and Icehouse, located at Chase Street, Beaver Lake - ½ acre", being the same premises conveyed to

the Town of Derry, by deed of Gladys G. Downing, Collector of Taxes, dated February 5, 1958 and recorded in the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds in Volume 1458, Page 228, the purpose of said transfer to be only for the establishment by the State of New Hampshire of an access road from State Highway Route 102 to the public waters of Beaver Lake and associated parking facilities, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under Article 15?

MR. GARLAND. I so move that we adopt it as read.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Second it.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. There will be no further discussion. All those in favor of adopting Article 15 as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and Article 15 is adopted as printed.

The next Article is Article 16:

To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any (16) class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article?

MR. MACGREGOR. I move that the article be scrapped.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Macgregor moves that it be scrapped, if that is the exact wording. Do I hear a second to his scrap. Don Chase seconds the motion. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensues:)

MR. MACGREGOR. I withdraw my motion.

THE MODERATOR. Who seconded that motion? Will you withdraw that second?

MR. CHASE. Yes.

MR. MACGREGOR. I move that we pass it as printed.

THE MODERATOR. Now Mr. Macgregor moves that we accept it as printed.

MR. CHASE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion? The question has been moved. All those in favor of adopting Article 16 as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare, and we have adopted Article 16.

Now we go to 17, 18, 19, 20 – 19, that was disapproved.

Article 20: By petition: Be it resolved that Town Counsel be directed (20) to withdraw the Derry School System from Supervisory Union (No. 10) and thereby restore local independence.

What is your pleasure? Okay, Mrs. Richardson moves that we adopt this article. Seconded by Mae Casten. All right. We will have discussion.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

The question is now moved. You know what the question is. If you want to kill it you will vote "No." If you want to adopt it, you will vote "Yes." All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Well, I think it is close enough so that we should have a count.

(Hand count taken by appointed tellers.)

The count recorded by the clerk is 92 "Yes" and 86 "Nos." The "Yeses" have it and I declare that it is adopted.

The next Article to take up is Article 23.

Article 23: To see if the Town will recommend to the Selectmen (23) that they adopt a new ordinance regulating the conduct of business on the Lord's Day, and further recommend whether or not the ordinance should be a liberal one allowing more business to be conducted than is presently allowed or a restrictive one which will curtail the amount of business to be done on the Lord's Day or, in the alternative, approve the ordinance as adopted by the Selectmen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

REVEREND JONES. I make a motion that we vote against this Article.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Reverend Jones that we vote against this Article. Do I hear it seconded? Reverend Montgomery seconded the motion. Any Discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Reverend Jones, when you got up as I understand it, the stenographer tells me you used the word that you "voted." Now, would you make a motion to strike this article rather than "Voted" on this Article?

REVEREND JONES. I so do.

THE MODERATOR. I think I know what you meant and the seconder will also be by Reverend Montgomery to strike rather than vote on the article. I think everybody will understand that.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Well, you understand the question. All right. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. Now, what is your pleasure? We are back on the Article.

MR. ADAMS. I move the Article be adopted.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Mr. Adams has moved to adopt the Article, it has been seconded by Mrs. Casten. Now, it is open to debate again. Now, Reverend Montgomery.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

REVEREND MONTGOMERY. I would like under the recommendation of Article 23 to move that we include under this article, that the Town instruct the Selectmen to charge a fee to all movie theatres of \$500.00 per showing of each showing of all "X" or "R" rated movies and of adult only movies restricted to 17 years of age or over effective each day of the week.

THE MODERATOR. All right. To amend or add to the adoption of the ordinance as printed. Do I hear a second?

REVEREND JONES. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Seconded by Reverend Jones.

THE MODERATOR. We are working on the amendment now to license movie theatre owners, as I understand it. Any discussion?

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved on the Amendment. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" appear to have it. The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. We are back to the original motion to adopt the Article as printed — the Ordinance, I am sorry.

MR. O'BRIEN. The question

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved to adopt this. There will be no further discussion. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" appear to have it. The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 24: To see if the Town will vote to approve the action of the (24)
Selectmen in setting aside for use as a public way a certain parcel of land leading from the southerly end of Ela Avenue to the Sunstein Development, so-called, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on Article 24?

MR. HOBSCHE. I move to adopt it.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Hobsch moves to adopt as printed. Mrs. Casten seconded it. It is now open to discussion.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor of the adoption of the article as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 28: To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and committees (28)
heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Are there any agents, auditors or committees?

JUDGE GRINNELL. I would like to refer you to page 88 and at your leisure read the report of the Town Building Study Committee. Now, there are many recommendations and we still sometime have got to do something about town buildings. And at this time I wish to commend the members of the Committee, other than myself, who did most of the work, and particularly Nancy Gagnon who put a great deal of time on this. I hope as she leaves you will take a look at this report because at sometime we have got to do something about our town buildings.

THE MODERATOR. Any other reports to hear from? Any auditors, any committees? All right. If not, we will move to Article 29.

Article 29: To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant. (29)

(After considerable discussion no action was taken with reference to Article 29.)

THE MODERATOR. Article 30: to transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting. (30)

MR. BURDICK. Mr. Moderator, I rise to introduce the following resolution: Be it resolved that no official board or commission of the town shall seek legal action in the name of the town or any district thereof for the purpose of setting aside the results of any vote taken under the terms and conditions of the municipal Finance Act which requires a two-thirds majority vote.

And I move that this resolution be adopted.

MRS. CASTEN: Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made to adopt a resolution, moved by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mrs. Casten. Now, any discussion on this particular Resolution?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question. All those in favor of the Resolution as made will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. HARTMAN. I would like to make a new motion under new business. That under the provision of Article 10 that an abutter reimburse the town on the same basis as prior water extensions in the Town of Derry.

FROM THE FLOOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Just one minute. I have got to decide whether I would entertain the motion.

MR. HARTMAN. Disregard Article 10.

THE MODERATOR. All right. If it doesn't pertain to Article ten I will then entertain such a motion, if it does not apply to any article that we have already voted on.

MR. HARTMAN. I will rephrase it, that any new abutters under the water system in the Town of Derry reimburse the Town on the same basis as prior years.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made and seconded. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare.

MR. MARKA. Mr. Moderator, I have a resolution I would like to make:

Be it resolved that the Town Meeting approve establishment of a committee of ten members to work without pay or expenses to explore means and methods to enhance the well-being of the elderly. Said committee shall meet at planned intervals to discuss proposals and

plans and shall prepare a written report of their recommendations for the consideration of the regular town meeting on the second Tuesday of March, 1971.

THE MODERATOR. Anybody second the motion? Who seconded that please? Paul Brown seconds the motion. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT

It appears that police work has become more time consuming as we have received more complaints, between eighteen and twenty thousand telephone calls per year. Two new officers were added this year, bringing the department to fourteen men, and we would like to add two more this year to better handle the increased work load. Even this will not bring the department up to the recommended number of officers per capita. Due to the growth of business outside the center of town we feel we need an additional cruiser.

In conjunction with the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency, which two of our officers attended, a new communication system is being initiated.

There is a great need for additional space for this department. At present we are handicapped by not having room for interrogation or for holding juvenile and female offenders, to stay within the perimeter of the law.

The department collected \$320.75 for the Jimmy Fund this year.

Three hundred and seventy-nine cases were brought into the Derry District Court by our officers. A breakdown of these is listed below.

I wish to thank the Selectmen, the people of the Town of Derry and the members of the Department for their continued cooperation.

1970 ANNUAL REPORT

Our seventh year as a full time department reflected the changes felt by the entire community. The reasons for our existence has not changed since we started in 1963. The citizens of the Town of Derry expect and receive a year round Recreation Program for all ages, regardless of sex, creed or color. This program has increased in number in the past 12 months, not only in participants and spectators, but also volunteers involved in coaching, officiating and helping us organize various activities.

All of this add up to the best Recreation & Parks maintenance which can be provided with the monies made available to us.

From the tax funds we received and expended a total of \$33,780.25, from the MacGregor Pioneer Park Trust Fund we expended a total of \$1,325.35 and from the Alexander-Carr Trust Fund plus the user fees an income at the ski area we spent a total of \$13,156.26 for a grand total of \$48,261.86.

Using the approximate U.S. census for Derry of 11,000 people, this gives Derry a per capita cost or average amount spent on each person in town of \$4.39.

The commission lost its chairman during the year, Mrs. Joan LeMahieu who had served on the commission since 1964. The Selectmen appointed Mr. John Monty to fill the vacancy left by Mrs. LeMahieu, and it is due to the efforts of this group that the Town of Derry enjoys the many wonderful programs and activities which it has.

The Recreation staff which served the public in 1970 include two full time employees, Gerald H. Cox Director and Mrs. Diane LaPlante in charge of our office. Part time maintenance employees were Marty Quinlan, Jimmy Cote, Harvey Cote, Jim Cassidy, Chuck Johns and Glen Kelley. We also utilized some teenagers under the Neighborhood Youth Corps Act, where by the federal government paid their salaries, but they worked for our department on summer maintenance projects. Participants in this program were: Billy Casey, Danny Julian, Bobby Miller and Margaruite Julian helping in the office during the summer months.

Our most outstanding change made during the year was the consolidation of many part time maintenance employees to one full time maintenance person, except during the summer months when the demand is greatest. We also utilize the talents of Donald Ball in supervising our summer playground as well as football, baseball and basketball.

The largest single change in our operation was the increase in the number of participants of our summer playground program at Hood Park, nearly 60% greater than the previous years, it has had its effects on the plans of the future.

Those leaders serving in a summer program include: Playground Leader Mary Sullivan, Arts & Crafts Specialist Dorothy Hines, Head Swimming Instructor Sandra Crocker and under her direction, swimming instructors, Sue Putnam and Claudia Ketchum and life guards Peter Brassard, Sue Roemer, for the free swim periods, afternoons and weekends. Other special instructors were: Carol Madden, Melinda Nicholson, Janet Theriault and Recreation Director Gerald H. Cox. These special instructors handled the adults swim lessons, mother and tot learn to swim program and the newly formed handicapped program.

We wish to take this opportunity to thank publicly those private citizens who generously allowed us to use their pools for our special swim classes. Our thanks go to Mr. & Mrs. Ralph Skillin, Mr. & Mrs. Henry Barrieau and Mrs. Marie Hansen, without their generosity our summer swim classes would have been curtailed considerably.

Improvements in the facilities include the new Martha Moore Multi-purpose Area at Hood Park, part of this project was provided by the Derry Junior Women's Club and a new section of fence has been added to improve the parks security, lights have been installed with the help of the Business Professional Women's Club and a new rest room facility has been built at Hood Park to accommodate the ever increasing numbers of participants. Four new pieces were added to the playground at Hood Park, they are cast aluminum on steel springs. They are extremely popular with the pre-school age group. Several new fireplaces have been added to the picnic areas at Alexander-Carr Playground which already have many picnic tables convenient to the parking lot. Also at Alexander-Carr Playground improvements were made by creating a pond behind the lodge for ice skating. The parking lot was also hot topped to improve that situation. We also used the fill from the construction of the pond to fill in the bottom of the ski area to improve the outrun a little. Other improvements in the lodge have made this area a year round facility.

Money has been approved for the construction of the Smith Field, a Little League size diamond, which will be built behind Derry Village School. Although not yet complete we expect this facility will be much used before the end of the season.

In the area of programs we have had a hand in creating at least 3 new special interest groups. 1. Radio Control Airplanes which meet in the

Recreation office every other Thursday. 2. Derry Rocketeers Model Club, who meet at the home of Mr. Silva, on Windham Road. 3. A new activity for girls, was the creation of a cheerleaders squad for girls ages 7-12 years of age, who cheer for the flag football games on Saturday.

We have had some disappointments in the past year, due to the fact that there is still no provision anywhere in town for a public shooting range. It was disturbing to see the town vote to sell recreation property for industry, when they should be trying to obtain more recreation space for the future instead of getting rid of it. Our Hockey program has not been well enough organized to attract sufficient number of participants, probably due to the poor ice conditions on our artificial rinks.

We are not discouraged, our plans for the future include: improvements to keep up with the increasing demands on our facilities and programs, these plans include better seating, more fencing, lighted areas for increasing night time use, playground leader at Alexander-Carr Playground, improvements to the road to that playground and a reasonable degree of maintenance on all areas.

A list of our public facilities follows:

Alexander-Carr Playground—Pierce Avenue

Lighted ski area, ski jump, ski lodge, no charge for lessons for children on Saturday; Adults—Wednesday nights; Housewives—Tuesday and Thursday mornings; Teenagers—Friday night, Scout camping grounds and hiking trails, "no hunting." Pre-school playground equipment.

MacGregor Park—East Broadway

This is where the library, band shell and war monuments are located. During the summer months a weekly band concert free of charge, on Tuesday evenings. Otherwise its only a place with trees and benches where you can rest or run barefoot in the grass along with the flower children.

Hood Park—Rollins Street

Swimming lessons for children and open swim with life guards, Tennis-housewives lessons, Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Basketball, 3 courts. Summer playground program (5-15) games, arts and crafts, etc. Playground equipment—swings, slides, sand box, merry-go-round and climbers and see-saws. Hockey rink and ice skating, horse-shoes and shuffleboard, badmitton, fireplaces and picnic tables.

Pinkerton

Hunter Safety Course every autumn.

Hood Jr. High

Buckley Field—Chargers, tackle football (12-15), flag football for boys (7-12), teenage baseball (13-16), grasshopper baseball (7-12), Legion baseball (15-18).

Gymnasium—Volleyball (men), Oct., March, Mondays. Basketball clinic (boys). Dec., March, Saturday mornings, basketball (girls) Jr. Pin-Up's, Saturday afternoons.

Grinnell Gymnasium

Basketball (boys) Dec.-March, Saturday afternoons. Basketball (men) "Jet" Oct.-March, Friday night. Basketball (women) Pin-Up's Oct.-Mar., Tuesday and Thursday night. Basketball (men) informal Oct.-March, Wednesday night.

South Range School

Girls softball and Little League.

Derry Village School

Smith Field, Little League.

These meetings are open to the public and anyone may attend. A copy of our weekly activities is usually found in the local papers, but anyone who has questions regarding it may contact our office morning or afternoons since we have increased our office coverage.

I would like to report that the cooperation between various town departments has been increasing continually, and if everyone helps each other we shall be able to provide a quality Recreation & Parks Department for the citizens of the Town of Derry.
