TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Town History Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand) \$1000 for the Water Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
5. To see what action the Town will take in approving a three-year term of office for the Collector of Water Rents instead of the current one year term.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Chief of Police rather than to have that position as an elective office, or take any other action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2000 to purchase a police cruiser and police radio with financial help from the State Department of Safety and the State Crime Commission, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (fifteen hundred dollars) \$1500 and appropriate the principal and interest in the Town Hall Painting Reserve Fund for the purpose of painting the Town Hall, or taken any other action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand one hundred twenty two dollars and twenty-nine cents) \$1122.29 as our share of the T.R.A. program, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two hundred and seventy two dollars) \$272 to support the mental health service program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, or take any other action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (six hundred and thirty eight dollars) \$638 to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc. This local request for financial support is based on a 70¢ per capita formula.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (fifteen hundred dollars) \$1500 for the use of the Recreation Committee, or take any other action relating thereto. This sum is allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Recreation Committee or to be added to by gifts of money.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Moderator to appoint a five member Dump Study Committee to include one Selectman, this committee to study the problems of the present town dump, possible future sites for a new dump, and possible arrangements for combining efforts with other towns on a dump, and to report to the Town Meeting in 1972 with recommendations, or take any other action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (three hundred dollars) \$300 for repairing and straightening the stones in the Pine Ridge Cemetery, or take any other action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of (eighty five hundred dollars) \$8500 for repairing and improving Sunset Lane, or take any other action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (seventeen hundred and eighty two dollars \$1782 to install aluminum siding on the Fire Station, or take any other action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate or borrow (sixteen thousand dollars) \$16,000 to purchase a new 2000 gallon tank truck for the Fire Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of purchasing a tank truck for the Fire Department, and to raise and appropriate (three thousand dollars) \$3000 for this purpose, or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

21. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

**REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN
AND DISTRICT CHIEF**

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture—to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning — such burning is restricted by regulation prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or Industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of chil-

dren, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?

3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

ANNUAL REPORT 1970

In May the Commission sponsored the annual tin can pick up by the Hancock teenagers. Also in the spring we dynamited the mouth of Moose Brook at Norway Pond to eliminate the undergrowth thereby to improve the flow of the brook into Norway Pond. In June we provided a scholarship under which Irving Joseph, Jr. attended the Spruce Pond Conservation Camp at Bear Brook State Park in Allenstown, New Hampshire. In November Moose Brook Park on the Bennington Road was purchased from Joseph Quinn.

In the matter of the elimination of undesirable deciduous trees around Juggernaut Pond preliminary studies have been concluded and we expect that work in that area will commence as soon as conditions permit. In this project the Commission will act as the agent of the Selectmen to oversee the conduct of the work.

On the invitation of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests the Commission has joined the recently organized New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions.

The Commission is grateful to James Hitchcock for the gift of aerial survey maps of Hancock and to Anthony Brown for the construction of a map case for said maps. We gratefully acknowledge the gifts and appropriations recorded in the financial report below.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY

"There is no magic like a book to keep children quiet and parents in their right minds." (Elizabeth Borton de Trevino in *Where the Heart Is*, p51.) The truth of this and that Hancock is an up and coming residential community is reflected in our increased circulation. Figures recently released by the State Library for the year ending December 1969 show Hancock residents borrowed 17.4 books per capita, the highest circulation in the Monadnock region. Three cheers for Elsie Frank and her capable assistants.

Doris Rogers continues to read or tell stories to the pre-school children who troop to the library each Tuesday morning. The third and fourth graders come to the library every other week to hear a story and to borrow books. Either Doris or Harriet Hampson, our children's librarian, go to the school library where the first and second graders are held spellbound with stories from the town library's collection. During the summer Doris conducted a six weeks story time program. Plans are already in mind for reaching a wider audience next year.

In July the statewide library borrowers card was instituted by the State Library whereby a patron in good standing may receive from his home library a card entitling him or her to borrow from many other libraries in New Hampshire. As a member of the State Library Development Program, Hancock honors this system.

How many towns our size can boast of an art gallery? The library walls have an ever-changing, provocative, colorful exhibition arranged for and displayed by Gladys Rockhill.

Miss Kay Crosby, district library consultant, has

made suggestions for the card catalogue, which Miss Frank is actively improving as time permits.

The Hancock Town Library has been represented at the District Advisory Council for each of the four annual meetings. One of four such groups, this is the liaison between the State Library and the individual Libraries, thus giving us the thinking of other librarians and an insight into future planning.

The frames of the windows on the front of the building have been repainted, sealed and all the windows washed. A folding table was purchased to facilitate the annual Old Home Day book sale. Also, a sheetrock picture display panel was installed on the rear wall of the children's room.

We express our appreciation to the donors who have given the library many fine memorial books during the past year, as well as books, magazines, and records from their own collections.

We welcome the many new residents of Hancock who have used the library and are gratified by their remarks regarding the appearance and the facilities offered. The trustees are always open to suggestions regarding more and better ways to serve our patrons.

**REPORT OF
MONADNOCK REGION ASSOCIATION**

Airports, youth, mountains, cables, snowmobiles, skiers, state parks, maple orchards, planning seminars, legislation, river basins, dumps, signs . . . all of these and many more are of vital interest and concern to the eighty volunteer MRA Directors, the town and city officials and residents of the Monadnock Region . . . those of us who enjoy living and working here . . . those of us who share a pride in preserving what we have and who will continue to be personally involved in an orderly desirable growth.

The MRA has assumed many roles in 1970 . . . a collector and dispenser of information as possible solutions to area problems . . . a sounding board for new ideas . . . a forum to air opinions and share knowledge . . . a catalyst to bring opposing groups together to promote better understanding . . . a voice for region resident, town and cities and the area as a whole . . . and a doing organization working for a better region.

The effectiveness of our efforts has only been possible through the excellent communication and cooperation of citizens in area towns and cities, community organizations, plus State and Federal officials. We firmly believe that by keeping in close touch with other groups and working with them, that we gain knowledge and avoid duplication of effort, thus our combined actions become more effective.

HANCOCK 1970

A year of belt tightening, reappraisal and continued growth.

Some 80 or so who pay the Interest and Dividend Tax which yielded \$44,000 to support the Town in 1969 will pay something less . . . but not much. Some in town lost their jobs at New Hampshire Ball Bearing, Sylvania, Honeywell or elsewhere . . . not many . . . but it hurts.

In spite of a changed economic climate the Town grows. It shows by official population figures to be up 21.7% in a decade to 879. It is part of a growth pattern in southern New Hampshire.

New houses built in Hancock the past nine years total 77, of these eleven were constructed in 1970. In addition 10 mobile homes were located, two of these in 1970. To the housing development on Prospect Hill is now added another on the former Reaveley property at the north end of the town. Norway Hill remains a popular place to build.

The Inn has changed hands. Lewis/Gail Kiesler purchased from Mrs. John King of Manchester who owned it (renting it from time to time) since 1966. They are young and come from Vermont. The Village Grocery store also was sold to James/Ann Wilhelm. Arthur/Edie Tremblay have served us well for 21 years. To those taking over on both sides of Main Street a warm welcome.

Underlining the changing tempo of life, it now is possible — at certain hours of the day — to almost find, but not quite, a traffic jam in the immediate area of the store, the Inn, Moller's and the Post Office.

The belt tightening didn't slow the various activities of the people of Hancock. Sports increased in popularity as the mini bikes and snowmobiles became more numerous but the interest in skating grows and grows. Bob Stewart and Mert Knowles are importantly responsible. In addition to erecting lights, they stay up late in the night spraying water for ice and keeping the snow off the surface. It is cold, very cold, spraying water under the stars. But there is a host of happy kids.

It is well to put Hancock events in focus with national trends and events. Mini, midi and maxi will be meaningless words a few years from now but the con-

troversy over skirt lengths bulked large in 1970. Perhaps it was a relief to focus on this and forget the Vietnam War, drug abuse, decline in law and order, pornography and the flood of foreign imports. "Ecology" was the word of the year and the theme of Old Home Day.

It was an election year of local rather than national interest. Governor Walter Peterson of Peterborough won a closely contested Primary and an equally close November election. In our Selectman contest Bud (Ernest L.) Adams nosed out Cecil Crissey by 5 votes. Representative Al Daloz on the other hand topped the Hancock ballot for his seat in the Legislature and Senator English won for a record ninth term.

All this as news came over the newly established Peterborough radio station WSCV "Voice of the Valley" in addition to a flow of soothing music.

The TRANSCRIPT with interesting items written by Nancy Adams contains the written record of our doings in addition to the activities of the area. It noted the purchase by our "ecologically" minded Conservation Commission, headed by Les Fogg, of an area bordering the by-pass known as Cranberry Meadow. Here, at one time, 18 to 20 bushels of cranberries were grown. It is an unusually interesting place for study and recreation. They also purchased Moose Brook Park on the Bennington Road from Joe Quinn.

In the days of Earl/Cora Otis' youth preserving beauty spots was hardly thought of — they were not threatened. Incidentally, Earl, now 88, was honored by being named Life Deacon; Cora for being a charter member of the Woman's Club.

A very interesting era in Hancock's history was spanned by Margaret Perry who was born in 1876. She came from Boston a little after the turn of the century. About the same time came the Grays, Briggs, Tudors, De-Pierrefeus, Thachers and a few others. They had an important impact on local life, supporting and developing the customs they found here. Theirs was an influence in developing the charm of Hancock today.

Speaking of the "good old days" we had a good old-fashioned Christmas. Twenty-four inches of snow on the ground, some think it was a record for the date.
