REPORT

OF THE

SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

The average length of the schools during the past year has been about twenty-two weeks. Most of the teachers have been well qualified for their position, and have attained more than an average degree of success. The improvement on the part of the pupils, seems fully to justify the increase of interest and expenditure on the part of the community.

The union of two Districts in the east, and five in the central part of the town, will give opportunity for three terms of schools in each of the united districts. The upper department in District No. 1, will give facilities for obtaining in our own town the education which is necessary in the ordinary occupations of life. In the accompanying table of school statistics, the 1st. and 2d. terms of Districts 2 and 3 are reported as one term in each. In accordance with previous custom, the names of those neither absent nor tardy, are recorded. A record of those who have been perfect in scholarship and deportment has been kept in some of the schools, with marked effect. Had this been done in all the schools, the names of those perfect in these departments would also have been recorded.

In the summer terms of Districts 3 and 8, and the winter terms of 4 and 7, there is reported to have been no whispering. The number of scholars between the ages of 4 and 14, reported as not attending school, is 3. Whole number of scholars, 242.
