

## WARRANT.

---

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2nd. To choose three Selectmen and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3rd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways the ensuing year.
- 5th. To hear the report of the Auditors and the School Board of the town school district.
- 6th. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the Downer road, so called, commencing at the south-west corner of land of Jennie M. Slack (formerly land of Warren Lowe), thence south-westerly to the road leading from the Meriden road to Stephen Goodwin's dwelling-house, or act thereon.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the highway leading past Minor T. Purmort's dwelling-house, from the intersection of the new road built

by the town of Enfield in 1893, to Enfield line, about 96 rods, or act thereon.

10th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars for the improvement of the old cemeteries in town, or act thereon.

11th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase one or more road rollers, or act thereon.

12th. To hear the report of the Selectmen in reference to a bridge at Olcott as instructed by the town at the last annual meeting, and act thereon.

13th. To see if the town will vote to establish an entry fee of ten dollars to be paid by individuals who have or may enter main sewers, and to authorize the Selectmen to rebate to all individuals who have paid for entering main sewers in excess of ten dollars, or act thereon.

We would again urge the parents to take more interest in the schools, and to cooperate with the Board. By so doing our schools would soon rank with the best.


