To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of Coos and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the West Milan Town Hall in West Milan on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for summer and winter road and bridge maintenance.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$419.40 and the State will give \$2796.03 for Town Road Aid.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Town Poor.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for aid to soldier's and their families.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town libraries.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountain Regions Association.
11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.
12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Coos County Mental Health Clinic.

13. To see if the town will vote to add the following to Question I, and in accordance with Article V, of the Town of Milan Safety and Health Board Regulations as enacted by the voters on March 10, 1959: "If dwelling is to be of the "mobile home" type, give Model, length, Serial Number and year of manufacture and complete the remainder of the questionnaire."
14. To see if the town will vote to accept the balance of the budget as prepared by the Selectmen, and to raise such sums of money as may be necessary.
15. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Report of Police Department

During the year 1969, many new and different complaints were answered by our department. We regret that we had to go beyond our budget. Through matching funds, we were able to have a new radio system installed, as we knew our radio contacts with other departments would soon be changed. This now gives us two mobile radios for better coverage.

Our department was faced with many complaints of unpleasant nature. Due to the nature of these complaints, we found it necessary to purchase tear gas for each officer.

One new problem that has crept into our community is narcotics. This took much time and travel to investigate and we are happy to report that the problem is much smaller now. With the cooperation of parents and the citizens of Milan, our town will keep ahead of the problems of this fast moving world.

Our department answered 360 complaints and we had 15 court cases during the year 1969. We also assisted the State Police and other departments from neighboring towns.

We thank all of our citizens for backing us in our law enforcement efforts this past year.
