### TOWN WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon (the polls to close not earlier than 6:00 PM.; business meeting at 8:00 P.M.) to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60,000.00 for the maintenance and repair of Highways and Bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$981.62 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,544.13.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new truck applying the 1966 truck toward the purchase of the same.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new fire truck, fully equipped, and to raise and appropriate \$27,750.00 as follows: \$7,900.00 taken from the Capital Reserve Fund and \$3,100.00 to be raised this year for a down payment of \$11,000.00, the balance to be defrayed in three annual payments plus accrued interest.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purchase of a 1974 police cruiser, applying the old cruiser and the N.H. Highway Safety Agency funds deposited in the Bristol Savings Bank toward purchase of same.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund entitled Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and to authorize the Selectmen to deposit all federal revenue sharing funds into same.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,825.00 for the principal and interest on the new Fire Station Note.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the repair of sidewalks.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Cemeteries.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the care of the Village Cemetery.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a section of Blake Hill Road, beginning at the Sanbornton town line and proceeding northerly a distance of 400 feet.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of hospitals.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair or replace the Christmas tree on the Town Common and to see if the Town will vote to authorize the funds previously appropriated for the Town Common, for this use.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new Highway Equipment.

- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Pemigewassett Valley Conservation Council.
- 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the New Hampshire Humane Society.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.
- 24. (Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the preparation and tarring of Pine Drive in Wolfe Den Estates.
- 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the preparation and tarring of a portion of the Coolidge Woods Road beginning at the junction of the Blake Hill Road and proceeding in a northerly direction.
- 26. (Petition) To see if the Town will vote to elect rather than appoint the Police Chief for the Town of New Hampton beginning with the 1974 election.
- 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### NEW HAMPTON POLICE DEPARTMENT 1972 Annual Report

I am proud to report that 1972 passed without a single motor vehicle fatality in the town of New Hampton. The year was basically a quiet year. As the summer season approached us, several of the campground owners and myself were faced with a new problem and that was police patrol in these camping areas because the summer population of New Hampton swells in excess of 4000 people. To handle this situation the campground owners hired special police officers on a part time basis and I patrol the areas as often as possible.

I am proud to report that with the cooperation of the New Hampton Fire Department and some concerned citizens who generously donated their time and equipment, we were able to collect up 75 eyesore junk automobiles from the landscape of New Hampton. The project is not complete and I hope we can continue to work on this worthwhile campaign in the future but like everything

else it will take money to finish it

I have completed the following police courses during the past year: Crime Scene Investigation sponsored by the Belmont Police Department; Human Relations offered by St. Anselm's College; and Police Management sponsored by New Hampshire Police Standards Training Council and attended several seminars presented by the Council. In conclusion I'd like to mention that dogs continue to be the common complaint of many of the residents of town. Two hundred seventy eight police complaints were received by the department and 73 arrests made for the year.

### REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

The Planning Board of the town of New Hampton meets on the third Thursday of each month in the conference room of the Gordon Nash Library at 8 p.m. Members are: Chairman Guy Davis, Treasurer, Donald Morrill, Richard Blue, Donald Mudgett, Raymond Smith, Robert Moulton and the secretary Trudy Powers.

This year the board has been busy reviewing subdivision plans submitted by various members of the New Hampton Community. We have also been continuing our struggle to complete the final approval for the Smokerise Development located on Route 104 in New Hampton. This approval has not yet come, however considerable progress has been made. Another new development has appeared in our town over the past year. This development is located on the Straits Road (Forest Pond) and is owned by the Northland Investment Corp. This development includes 23 parcels ranging from 5 acres in size to 135 acres.

The Planning Board also held a special meeting with the State Resource Conservation and Development Commission to discuss any help they might be able to give us in starting various projects in our town such as locating a town beach, a town water supply and recreation and the planting of trees and the beautification of various parts of the town.

The board regretfully accepted the resignation of Miss Hope Swain from the board on July 20, 1972. We would like to thank Miss Swain publicly for her many years of faithful service and we wish her well in her "retirement."

All planning board meetings are public and everyone is invited and encouraged to attend, after all, this is your town too!

### NEWFOUND AREA NURSING ASSOCIATION

The need for nursing care in the Towns of Bristol, Bridge-water, Alexandria and New Hampton was again demonstrated in 1972 as NANA made 2323 visits. Many of these calls involved entire families or larger group efforts as occurred during the recent measle epidemic and in the Well Baby Clinics. The total number of people that were actually reached, therefore, far exceeds the number of calls.

Service has again been improved by the purchase of a much needed larger automobile. The generous donations by numerous local residents as well as summer and winter friends has made it possible to obtain a police radio for more rapid reaction to emergency situations.

The nominal sums contributed by the four member towns support the services of two registered nurses, one Licensed practical nurse and an office secretary. Their help is available to all residents. Five years ago the towns were called upon to contribute approximately 33% of the total budget. This year the same appropriations will be nearer 10% of the total budget with its much expanded service. The balance of the operating budget comes from fees which are largely reimbursed through Medicare-Medicaid.
