## THE TOWN WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for interest on same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,667.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$860 for Recreation, Parks and Playgrounds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Band Concerts.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the Care of Cemeteries.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14.56 for the purpose of upgrading to a 3500 Lumen Mercury Vapor light, the light located on pole numbered 8/147, and move said light to pole numbered 8/151.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to maintain two electric flashing School Signs. One to be installed in front of the Town Hall, the other to be installed west of the Alco Pony Farm on Route 4, 202, 9.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,335.44 for the purpose of street lighting.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$692.55 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$4,616.97.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to be used in addition to the joint T.R.A. Fund.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$521.00 for the Concord Hospital.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Ambulance Service to be paid to the Barnstead Center Fire Department.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used for the Fire Proof Vault in the rear of the Town Hall.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$156.49 as a deficit for the year 1967.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen of Northwood to grant an easement and flowage rights on the present Town Dump property to Burt & Rogers, developers of the land known formerly as the Randlett Pasture.

20. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of \$4,000.00 from the land owners on the Bow Lake Lagoon, so called, for the purpose of installing a boat passage through Bennett's Bridge.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the remaining Town Truck and the Huber Grader.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's deeds as the result of tax sales.

23. To see if the Town will vote to reclassify, in part, the Mountain Road from Class VI to Class V. The parts of said road to be reclassified are described as follows:

Beginning at Mark Smith's House and running West-ly on the Mountain Road to the Northeasterly corner of the Parsonage Lot approximately 4,300 feet.

Beginning at the corner of the Blake's Hill Road, so called, and running Easterly on the Mountain Road, a distance of 6,280 feet.

24. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendments numbered Article III Part A New Developments Sec. 2, 3, & 3a and Article III Part B Trailers, Semi-dependent Mobile Homes, & Mobile Homes Sec. 4, 6, & 7 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Ordinances, as follows:

### ARTICLE III

#### A. New Developments.

2. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to in-spect the site of such proposed subdivision, and to re-

quire that all new rights-of-way shall have a minimum width of fifty (50) feet from side line to side line, and further, that such rights-of-way shall have a grade not to exceed 12%; and they may require such other areas for common use as will be eventually acceptable to the Town of Northwood for maintenance by the said Town; to approve the same when the Planning Board is satisfied that such plans are in harmony with, and conducive to the general welfare of the Town of Northwood; but in no sense shall this be deemed an acceptance by the said Town of Northwood of the defined rights-of-way in question.

3. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to see that building lots, having either a Community Water Supply or a Community Sewage System, meeting the approval of the N. H. Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, and offered for sale within the municipal limits, shall contain not less than 15,000 square feet, and the said lots shall have not less than 100 feet frontage nor less than 100 feet from lot line to lot line.

3a. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to require that all building lots, not having either a Community Water Supply or a Community Sewage System, shall contain not less than 40,000 square feet, and that said lots shall have not less than 100 feet frontage.

B. Trailers, Semi-dependent Mobile Homes and Mobile Homes.

4. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to see that all lots offered for sale, lease, rent or permissive use for individual trailers, semi-dependent mobile homes, and mobile homes shall have a minimum lot size of forty thousand (40,000) square feet per unit.

6. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to require that no additional Trailer Parks are approved, constructed or offered for use anywhere within the limits of the Town of Northwood after March 13, 1968.

It is also understood that existing Trailers Parks approved, recorded, or in existence, on the above date

of March 13, 1968, shall be allowed to expand to the limit only of the owner's or operator's recorded connecting land, either by recorded ownership, lease or option.

7. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to require that all Trailers; Semi-dependent Mobile Homes; and Mobile Homes, located on an individual lot of forty thousand (40,000) square feet, after March 13, 1968 shall be set on a permanent foundation of concrete, rocks, or any base approved by the Planning Board.

This regulation does not apply to those units located, or to be located in any or all Trailer Parks within the limits of the Town of Northwood.

25. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

To Superintendent of Schools:

We have successfully completed the 1966-67 school year. The staff at Northwood Elementary School appreciates the continual support and co-operation of the community and wishes to thank you for this support.

For the first time at this school, the seventh and eighth grades were semi-departmentalized. This type of organization allows the students to be instructed by teachers who are specialists in a certain subject area. This program will be continued and expanded during the following year.

In September of 1967, four new faculty members joined the teaching staff at Northwood Elementary School. Mrs. Albertine Hoogenvien replaced Mrs. Julia



Jordan in Grade 1, Mrs. Judith Towle was employed to teach grade 1 as an additional teacher because that grade had to be split in two sections. Mrs. Carolyn Kinsman replaced Richard Rowe in grade 6 and Mr. John Tent replaced Charles Thorne in grades 7 and 8. Of the four new teachers, Mrs. Hoogeveen is the only one who has had experience in teaching.

The last 5 years have shown an emergence of a new militancy on the part of school teachers in the United States. Our daily newspapers feature front page headlines reporting teacher strikes or sanctions across the nation.

Direct negotiations in education with schools boards is becoming more and more popular in New Hampshire. By collective negotiation is meant a process whereby the teachers choose an organization to represent them. This organization meets together with the school board. The two together and jointly set and determine the salaries and working conditions of the teachers in that school district. This is a bilateral decision making process as opposed to a unilateral decision making process. The agreements that are reached in negotiations are put in a form of a written document signed by both parties. The New Hampshire Association of School Administrators has adopted a legal form to be used in New Hampshire.

The reason for the above description of collective negotiation is to make the general public aware of what they may face in the future, for example that as of this writing, some of the immediate goals of the NHEA are as follows: a base starting salary of \$5,600, improved working conditions, increased sick leave, partial payment of group, life and health insurance, a signed professional negotiations agreement, etc.

I urgently recommend to all school boards that they join the New Hampshire School Boards Association and become active participants in this association and the educational problems of the state of New Hampshire.

Again this summer there will be a summer reading program paid for by Federal Funds under Title I. The

success of last summer's program made it evident that this program should be continued again.

School costs continue to increase and tuition rates are affected accordingly. The estimated state average for high school tuition is \$637.00 for 1968-69. This is reflected on your local budgets.

It is recommended that the school board release the teaching principal for part-time supervision by employing a part-time teacher. This has proved very effective organization in other neighboring districts.

In closing we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation from the School Board, teachers, children, and citizens of the community given to this office in the past year. We will need your continued cooperation for the best interest of the boys and girls in your schools.

## REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

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To the Superintendent of Schools:

The school health services in Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford included a routine health inspection of each child by the nurse. The parents were informed whenever defects were found, and most of these children were seen or treated by their family physician. The success of the health program depends largely upon such cooperation as the parents of these communities have shown.

In addition to the above, various clinics were arranged for the benefit of the children. Measles vaccine was given to 78 children in Barrington and to 49 in Strafford. Epsom joined with Chichester in having a measles clinic and a combined total of 22 children received this protection.

A series of three immunization clinics was held in both Northwood and Nottingham. In Northwood, 42 measles vaccinations, 18 smallpox vaccinations, 105 triple toxoid boosters and 24 oral polio immunizations were given; while in Nottingham 142 children received triple toxoid, 22 were vaccinated for smallpox, 55 for measles, and 134 for polio (both series and boosters).

Dental clinics were held in three towns — Barrington, Epsom and Northwood. The former participated in the Matching Funds Program only. Dental repair work was provided for 11 children. Epsom and Northwood also had this program and a total of 35 children was treated. These two towns also have a continuing dental program for cleaning the teeth and applying topical fluoride solution which is very beneficial in reducing dental decay. 199 children took advantage of this program in Epsom and 144 in Northwood.

Regarding clinics, it should be remembered that all immunization clinics are co-sponsored by the N. H.

Bureau of Public Health and a local organization. The dental clinics are also co-sponsored by the N. H. Bureau of Dental Public Health and one or more local sponsors. The local groups deserve a special word of commendation, since a great deal of time and effort is essential to the smooth operation of any clinic.

Through the N. H. Tuberculosis Association, the Heaf test for tuberculosis was administered to 239 students and faculty members at Epsom Central School, and 6 people received X-ray examinations. It is planned in the future to administer the Heaf test annually to children in first grade only. This will be done in all five towns in the fall of 1968.

During the school year of 1966-67, the N. H. Sight Conservation Program provided vision examinations and glasses for 3 students, and the Concord chapter of the Lions Club took care of an equal number.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you who helped in making the school health service so successful.
