To the Inhabitants of the Town of WAKEFIELD in the County of CARROLL in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wakefield on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ARTICLE 2. Are you in favor of the adoption of the building code as proposed by the planning board?

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wakefield on Saturday, the seventeenth day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 3. Are you in favor of entering into a contract with the Sanbornville Fire Precinct to furnish fire protection for the rest of the Town outside of the precinct in the amount of nineteen thousand four hundred twentyeight dollars (\$19,428)? (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 4. Are you in favor of entering into a contract with the Union Fire Precinct to furnish fire protection for the rest of the Town outside of the Precinct in the amount of eight thousand three hundred twenty six dollars (\$8,326.)? (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) for

the support of the Community Action Outreach Program. (By petition) (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand (\$15,000.) dollars to complete the construction of the East Wakefield Fire Station including insulation, heating, plumbing and electrical systems. This fire station is being built on Sanborn Road in East Wakefield by volunteer labor as far as is practical. (By petition). (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town would raise and appropriate \$1500. Said monies to be used for the town ballfield improvements. (By petition). (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-eight thousand dollars (\$48,000.) to purchase a new truck for the Highway Dept. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.) to add to the existing capital reserve fund for the future purchase of an ambulance. (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500.) to establish a capital reserve fund for the future purchase of police cruisers. (Approved by the Budget Committee).

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.) for the purchase of land (10 acres) and building situated on Route 153, Tax Map 30, Lot 168 (locally known as Al Blair's Garage). (Approved by the Budget Committee). ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for the use as set offs against budget appropriations in the amounts indicated:

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to abandon any rights it may have to old roadways on the westerly side of Route 153 between stations 59+00 and 70+00 as shown on New Hampshire Department of Public Works & Highways map dated September 18, 1936.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer tax liens and convey property acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's Deed by public auction (or advertised sealed bid) or in such other manner as determined by the Selectmen as justice may require.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town Bills in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make application for and to receive and expend, in the name of the Town, such advances, grants-inaid or other funds for municipal purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government and/or separate agencies and/or other sources.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred seventy two thousand seven hundred thirty two dollars (\$672,732.) to defray town charges as submitted by the Budget Committee.

ARTICLE 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING RE: SEWER PROJECT

Guests invited by the Selectmen were: Alan Morgenroth and Joseph Bettencourt of Morgenroth Associates who did the study and Mike Sills and Mr. Cruess of the State Water Supply and Pollution Commission.

This meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M. as per order of the warrant.

Pledge to the Flag.

Selectman Twombley asked permission for these to speak which was granted. A question and answer period was held until 2:30 P.M. when the warrant was read. It was voted to take Article 2 out of order.

An amendment was verbally made by Mr. Hraba to strike out the portion beginning with "whatever other proportion that the Town may choose." This amendment passed with 82 in favor and 62 not in favor.

The Article was then presented as amended and opened for discussion. At this time another amendment was made by Mr. Ayers to Article 2 to pass the cost of the project 50 percent to the users and 50 percent to be borne by all of the taxpayers. This amendment passed with 96 in favor and 70 not in favor. The article passed as amended making the cost 50 percent to the users and 50 percent to all the taxpayers.

A recess was called for about 5 minutes to allow the officials to get to the voting room where the polls were opened at 3:00 P.M. for voting and remained open until 5:00 P.M.

There were 462 votes cast:

360 in favor of the sewer

102 not in favor of it.

Article passed by 78 percent.

Respectfully Submitted, FRANCES TWOMBLEY Town Clerk To the Taxpayers:

Voters of Wakefield passed a bond issue totalling \$2,424,000 for the purpose of designing and constructing sewerage and sewerage treatment facilities.

This amount is to be offset by Federal Grants of \$634,000 and a State Grant of \$343,000, leaving a local appropriation of \$291,000. The engineering portion of the work is estimated to be finished in April or May; construction will begin in early summer.

AMBULANCE REPORT

The Wakefield Area Ambulance Corps responded to 188 calls in 1983, an increase of 12 calls over 1982. These included 60 highway accident calls, 120 home emergency calls, and 8 requests for stand-by protection for the Sanbornville Fire Department. Total 1983 mileage of the ambulance was 4,112 miles, an average of 22 miles per call.

We presently are comprised of one registered nurse, two emergency medical technicians, two prospective emergency medical technicians, and seven advanced first aiders.

For those of you who asked, the corps does accept memorial donations and maintains a special fund for that purpose. The purpose of this fund is to purchase specialized equipment, not listed in the budget, but may be required by new state regulations. CABLE TELEVISION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Wakefield Cable Television Advisory Committee hereby submits its activities report for 1983.

Discussions took place with Nashoba Communications, Inc. of Westford, Mass. during late 1982 and the first part of 1983. Following a public hearing a proposed contract was prepared with the advice of the Town's attorney. However, the financial problems of Nashoba precluded further discussions and we are no longer considering their proposal.

When discussions had ended, we again solicited proposals from cable companies via newspaper advertisements and direct requests. No formal proposals were received by the deadline that was set.

Since that time discussions have been held with four companies headquartered in New Hampshire. One of those firms expressed no interest. The remaining companies may submit proposals during March 1984. We, the committee, feel reasonably optimistic that a feasible proposal for a cable television system will be found in one of these proposals.

REPORT OF THE TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Once again, our cooperative town and state forest fire prevention and control program leads the nation in least acres burned per forest fire. Less than one-half acre per fire statewide average.

At the town level, your Forest Fire Warden is responsible for the prevention and control of all grass and woods fires when the ground is not snow covered.

Forest fire prevention is achieved at the town level by issuing a written permit for every fire that is to be kindled on the ground out of doors when the ground is not covered with snow. Each person wishing to have an outside fire must obtain this written permit from the town Fire Warden before kindling the fire. Any person that does not obtain a fire permit, when one is required, is violating our forest fire permit law and is subject to a court appearance and could be fined up to \$1,000 and receive a jail sentence of up to one year.

No fire permit will be issued between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is raining. The reason for this is twofold: the fire danger increases steadily between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., then subsides to a safe level between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. This happens because the sun dries out the fine fuels that are easily ignited and dries the air which permits rapid fire spread. Also during this part of the day fire fighters are not readily available in most communities so an escaped fire could burn longer and cause greater damage before being suppressed.

Your cooperation in burning only when conditions are safe is greatly appreciated.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Highway Department cleared and removed snow without major difficulty in 1983. The spring thaw and heavier than normal spring rains caused washouts that kept our crew busy during the month of April.

During the summer the scheduled construction on Bonnyman Road was completed with State subsidy funds. A sealing coat of tar will be sprayed on the road in 1984 finishing this project. In addition to our regular maintenance program the streets in Sanbornville and Acton Ridge Road, Perkins Hill Road, and Steve Drowns Road were tarred in 1983. A section of Oak Hill Road was widened with State subsidy funds and the Witchtrot Road intersection with Route 153 was paved with State Aid monies. Completion of construction work on Witchtrot Road is anticipated in 1984.

During the year our Caterpillar front-end loader was overhauled and is now in good working condition. We have also purchased and installed radios in Department trucks. We have found them especially valuable during snow removal operations.

Our Department's goal is to maintain the streets and highways of Wakefield at a reasonable, yet realistic cost. Ours is a public service and we will gladly respond to any of your questions and comments regarding Town roads.

EAST WAKEFIELD FIRE STATION REPORT

Through the efforts of many volunteers the East Wakefield Fire Station moved a giant step nearer to reality.

In May the lot on Sanborn Road was cleared of trees and brush. The top soil removed and trenches were dug for footings. Footings were poured and block laying commenced in late summer and continued into the fall. Roof trusses and plywood roofing were put in place. The Aluminum roofing has been purchased but snow prevented its installation.

This building is 36' wide and 56' long with two double bays.

It is hoped that funds will be made available in 1984 to complete this structure.
