

#### **SELECTMEN'S REPORT**

The past year has been a busy one for Town government. The complexities of running a town, even a small one such as Columbia, are growing each year. No longer does the Selectman's job consist of meeting twice per month to sign checks. Every year the State and Federal governments require more of municipalities. These requirements translate to the Selectmen spending more and more time attending meetings, both locally and at the State level, to remain current on what the Town's responsibilities are in an ever-changing world.

Our total town-wide revaluation was completed this past year on time and within budget. Overall, there were few problems or complaints. In order to avoid the expense of doing another town-wide revaluation, the Board has signed a contract with Avitar Associates to perform these services on an on-going basis. The Town will be divided into four segments. Each year, one segment will be reviewed. On the fifth year, all properties will be brought up to market value based on the most recent sales information.

Again, this year we are faced with the problem of outgrowing our current office space. A Building Committee, which was open to any resident, was formed after Town Meeting last year with seven members volunteering their time. The Committee has spent much time researching different options. We sincerely believe that the time has come for the Town to build a new municipal office building. Not only will this solution give us much needed meeting and storage space but it also allows for future expansion years down the road. With the offices no longer located at the Town Hall, we will be able to convert the Hall itself back to its original size. In doing so, we will comply with federal legislation (Help America Vote Act.) This will also help by giving us additional seating room for Town Meetings. We ask for your support in voting for this much needed office building. The Town continues to grow and we must grow with it. At this time, we would like to recognize Donald Campbell and Edward Poulin who are not seeking re-election this year. Mr. Poulin has served the Town for the past 30 years on the Planning Board. He has been a wonderful source of knowledge with regards to the Town and its growth. Mr. Campbell has served as a Selectman for the past 4 years. He has been a valuable member of the Board and an asset to the Building Committee. We will miss them both and wish them well in future endeavors.

#### WARRANT

The Polls will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Columbia Town Hall on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next, at 7:15 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

<u>Article 1:</u> To vote to bring in ballots for election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the year ensuing.

<u>Article 2:</u> To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officials as required.

<u>Article 3:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$318,000.00 for the construction of a new Municipal Office Building, and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$318,000.00 in notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. Further, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$71,334.00 for the first year's payment. (2/3 ballot vote required) (Board of Selectmen recommends this article.)

<u>Article 4:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200,000.00 for the purchase of land located at Map 408, Lots 7 and 9. Said amount to be taken from the December 31, 2004 unreserved fund balance and not to be raised through taxation. This is a <u>non-lapsing</u> appropriation and will not lapse until the land is completely paid for or by December 31, 2009, whichever is sooner. (Board of Selectmen recommends this article.)

<u>Article 5:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$87,000.00 for Town Charges for the ensuing year.

<u>Article 6:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for extinguishing fires in said Town.

<u>Article 7:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,360.00 to help support the operation of the Colebrook Communications Center.

<u>Article 8:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,750.00 to help support the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Ambulance Fund.

<u>Article 9:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association to cover medical emergencies.

<u>Article 10:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for operating expenses of the Upper Connecticut Valley Home Health Association.

<u>Article 11:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as a contribution for the support and services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service.

<u>Article 12:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as a contribution for the support and services of the Vershire Center.

<u>Article 13:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Town Cemetery Maintenance Expendable Trust Fund previously established. (Board of Selectmen recommends this appropriation.)

<u>Article 14:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for support of the Community Outreach Program.

<u>Article 15:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the support of the poor.

<u>Article 16:</u> To see if the Town will vote to extend Winter Maintenance for the northeast end of Bungy Road by 440 feet past the Fred and Margaret Smith residence. (By Petition)

<u>Article 17:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for the maintenance of summer roads. Out of this \$70,000.00, \$37,556.00 to be reimbursed by the State of New Hampshire Highway Block Grant monies.

<u>Article 18:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74,000.00 for the maintenance of winter roads.

<u>Article 19:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,000.00 for solid waste disposal and recycling.

<u>Article 20:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,975.00 for the Colebrook Public Library.

<u>Article 21:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,300.00 for appraisal upkeep.

<u>Article 22:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$910.00 for maintenance of the Tax Maps.

<u>Article 23:</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$296.00 to help support the services of the American Red Cross.

<u>Article 24:</u> To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for State and Federal Funds and to apply for, contract for and accept

aid relative to disasters and incur debts for temporary loans for same should the need arise.

#### MINUTES OF COLUMBIA TOWN MEETING MARCH 9, 2004

Moderator, Arthur Dodge, Jr., called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. Mr. Dodge reviewed the rules of the meeting. Boy Scouts Brett Pike, Christopher Hastings, Cody Hastings and Jeremy Moren presented the colors and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. The Moderator asked for a moment of silence in memory of Town Treasurer Barbara T. Killam. Articles of the warrant were voted on as follows:

ARTICLE 1: The Polls were open from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (A total of 58 votes were cast, which accounts for 18% of the checklist.) Officers elected were announced by the Moderator as follows:

- ARTICLE 2: Motion made by Irene Dodge and seconded by Carolyn Foss-Monson to instruct the Selectmen to appoint all Other Town Officers as required. Motion carried by voice vote.
- ARTICLE 3: Motion made by Carolyn Foss-Monson and seconded by Garry Parkhurst to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80,000.00 for Town Charges for the ensuing year. Motion carried by voice vote.
- ARTICLE 4: Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Garry Parkhurst to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for extinguishing fires in said Town. Motion carried by voice vote.

ARTICLE 5:	Motion made by Virginia Weber and seconded by Phil Monson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,147.00 to help support the operation of the Colebrook Communications Center. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 6:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by James Lawrence to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,750.00 to help support the services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Ambulance Fund. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 7:	Motion made by Robert Soucy and seconded by Ronald Beloin to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association to cover medical emergencies. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 8:	Motion made by Robert Soucy and seconded by Ronald Beloin to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for operating expenses of the Upper Connecticut Valley Home Health Association. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 9:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Clifton Boudle, Jr. to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as a contribution for the support and services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Heath Service. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 10:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Dale Simpson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as a contribution for the support and services of the Vershire Center. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 11:	Motion made by Carolyn Monson and seconded by

ARTICLE 13: Motion made by Robert Soucy and seconded by Phil Monson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for support of the poor.

> Phil Monson asked if the Town gets repaid for the money that they pay out in support of the poor. Selectman Campbell explained that in some instances the Town does get repaid. In other situations, the Town can place a lien on the person's property for the amount of the aid. This lien plus interest gets paid off when the property is sold.

Motion carried by voice vote.

ARTICLE 14: Motion made by Robert Soucy and seconded by Phil Monson to pass the article as written. "Whereas the Town of Columbia previously maintained 0.2 miles of C. Stoddard Road located off Marshall Hill as a Class V road until the Goodrum family moved. The road has now been renamed 'Oakes Road.' The petitioners put forth an Article to see if the Town will vote to reinstate 0.2 miles of Oakes Road as a Class V road." (By petition)

> Dr. Soucy asked to speak to the motion, explaining that it had previously been a Class V road and that basically all they wanted was the road plowed in the winter. Selectman Stohl explained that this road is currently a Class VI road and that once the Town starts putting money into the road it will automatically become a Class V road again which means both summer and winter maintenance. Dr. Soucy stated that the people who live on the road would be willing to cut the brush and make a turn-around for the plow truck driver. Selectman Stohl stated that they would need to bring it

up to Class V state specifications which would include possible ditching, grading, etc. Richard Perkins asked what would happen if someone else were to build a home past the .2 miles on the road. Selectman Stohl stated that if we pass this article, the Town would maintain only .2 miles. This mileage would only be extended if approved by the voters at a subsequent Town Meeting. Dr. Soucy stated that he would like to amend the Article by adding "and the petitioners agree to bring the first .2 miles and the turn-around of said Oakes Road up to Class V state specifications." Motion was seconded by James Lawrence.

The moderator asked for a voice vote on the amendment. Amendment passed by voice vote.

Moderator Dodge explained that he had received a request for a written ballot on this article. The results of the written ballot were 40 - yes and 33 - no. Motion passed.

#### ARTICLE 15: Motion made by Francis Gray and seconded by James Lawrence to see if the Town will vote to provide winter maintenance for South Jordan Hill Road, a distance of approximately one mile. (By petition)

James Lawrence asked to speak to this motion. Mr. Lawrence explained that the families living on this road would like it to be plowed in the winter. He stated that currently Clark Jeffers, Jr. is plowing the road at the expense of the residents. He asked Mr. Jeffers what he thought it would cost to plow the road for the winter. Mr. Jeffers stated that he believed it would cost approximately \$5,000.00. Mr. Lawrence asked Mr. Boudle why the Town had put a price of \$10,000.00 on the road. Mr. Boudle explained that he and the Selectmen were looking at the worst-case scenario. The road is very steep and narrow. If we had a winter with a lot of freezing rain, that road would require a great deal of sand. Mr. Boudle explained that he was not in favor of passing this article.

Scott Stepanian asked to speak. He also stated that he was not in favor of passing this article.

Renee Tessier asked what would need to be done to the road for summer maintenance. Mr. Boudle said that overall the road is in pretty good condition and that it wouldn't take that much money to prepare it for winter plowing. He again stated that it wasn't the condition of the road that made plowing so expensive. It is the fact that the road is very steep and narrow.

The moderator stated that he had received a request for a written ballot on this article. The results of the written ballot were 40 - yes and 34 - no.

 ARTICLE 16: Motion made by James Lawrence and seconded by Garry Parkhurst to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000.00 for the maintenance of summer roads. Out of this \$70,000.00, \$32,335.00 to be reimbursed by the State of New Hampshire Highway Block Grant monies.

> Garry Parkhurst asked if we needed to amend this article since we just took over two new roads. Selectman Campbell said that we would need to re-allocate the funds we have.

Motion carried by voice vote.

ARTICLE 17: Motion made by Wayne Volkmann and seconded by Carolyn Foss-Monson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60,000.00 for the maintenance of winter roads.

	Moderator Dodge asked for a vote on the article as amended. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 18:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Ronald Beloin to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,000.00 for solid waste disposal and recycling. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 19:	Motion made by Carolyn Foss-Monson and seconded by Ronald Beloin to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,975.00 for the Colebrook Public Library. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 20:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Clifton Boudle, Jr. to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for appraisal upkeep. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 21:	Motion made by James Lawrence and seconded by Phil Monson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$910.00 for maintenance of the tax maps. Motion carried by voice vote.
ARTICLE 22:	Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Robert Soucy to raise and appropriate the sum of \$296.00 to help support the services of the American Red Cross. Motion carried by voice vote.

#### ARTICLE 23: Motion made by Carolyn Foss-Monson and seconded by Clifton Boudle, Jr. to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000.00 to purchase the former Lynn Parkhurst residence for the purpose of moving the Town Offices to that location. This sum to come from the 2003 fund balance and not to be raised through taxation.

Selectman Stohl spoke to the article. He stated that the purchase price of the property was \$75,000.00 and that the Board felt an additional \$25,000.00 would be needed for minor renovations such as a handicap ramp, parking lot, etc. He explained to the meeting how a fund balance comes about and that this purchase would not increase the town tax rate. He said that the Board had only learned in January that this property was for sale. After viewing it, the Board members felt that it would be an ideal location for the Town Offices. Selectman Stohl explained that the changes done to the the Hall itself (installation of a handicapped voting booth, larger aisles, etc.) were the result of federal legislation titled "Help America Vote Act." He noted that the 100 + people inattendance could not all be seated. If the offices were removed from this building, it would add another 495 feet of seating space.

Phil Monson stated that he had viewed the house and that the felt it would require \$25,000 to \$30,000 to correct the problems that he had seen. Several people stated that perhaps it was time to buy land and build a building for the Town Offices rather than use another old building. Robert Young stated that "Columbia was an old town and that he thought we should have an old building for Town Offic's rather than a new one." Kenneth Grimes stated "that we need to look 100 years in the future as to what the Town's needs would be." James Lawrence suggested that perhaps the Town should form a Building Committee to look into what the Town should do for new Town offices. After much discussion, again the Moderator stated that he had received a request for a written ballot on this article. Results of the written ballot were 39 - noand 36 - yes.

- ARTICLE 24: Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Garry Parkhurst to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to be added to the Road Improvement Capital Reserve Fund previously established. This sum to come from the 2003 fund balance and not to be raised through taxation. Motion passed by voice vote.
- ARTICLE 25: Motion made by Phil Monson and seconded by Scott DeBlois to authorize the Selectmen to apply for State and Federal funds and to apply for, contract for, and accept aid relative to disasters and incur debts for temporary loans should the need arise. Motion passed by voice vote.
- ARTICLE 26: To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

Selectman Stohl stated to the meeting that as of June 30, 2004, the Town will no longer be able to purchase water rights from Mr. Gadwah next door. Therefore, the Town needs to look into acquiring water for the Town Hall somewhere else or drill our own well. Selectman Campbell read a note received from David Killam thanking the Townspeople for their care and concern at the untimely death of Mrs. Killam. Selectman Campbell stated that the Board would like to purchase a "grandmother's clock" in honor of the many hours Mrs. Killam devoted to the Town. Everyone in attendance felt that would be an excellent idea.

William Schomburg told the meeting that the Conservation Commission was looking into purchasing land from Malcolm Washburn along the river. If purchased, the land would be used for canoeing, picnicking, swimming, etc.

Motion made by Garry Parkhurst and seconded by Dale Simpson to dissolve the meeting. Motion carried by voice vote.

Moderator, Arthur Dodge, Jr., declared the meeting dissolved at 10:25 p.m.

The Town Clerk, in accordance with the laws of New Hampshire, swore in all elected officers.





#### ANNUAL REPORT - 2004 Headwaters Subcommittee Connecticut River Joint Commissions

This year the Headwaters Subcommittee updated the Recreation chapter of our *Connecticut River Management Plan* with a close look at a variety of recreation-related issues in our region, especially the need for more access for small boats. We helped stimulate a state study of water quality in the Connecticut River after discovering gaps in information on the safety of the river for swimming, fishing, and boating.

The Subcommittee continues to carry out our legal obligation to provide information and assistance to the states, towns, and local landowners on projects near the river, including advice to the State of New Hampshire on riverbank stabilization at the Coos County Farm. We sponsored a meeting for area town and state officials about emergency planning for Murphy Dam, and are advising the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission about a new license for the Canaan Dam.

We encourage all towns in our region to review our current *Connecticut River Corridor Management Plan*, and to incorporate its recommendations as they adopt and update town plans and revise their zoning ordinances, particularly for shoreland protection. Heavy rains can send sediment from land clearing and removal of riverside vegetation into tributaries, demonstrating the critical importance of giving rivers and streams enough room. All riverfront landowners should be aware that the statewide Shoreland Protection Act applies to the Connecticut River. Contact the town office for more information.

The Subcommittee is advisory and has no regulatory authority. The public is welcome to participate in our meetings, on the second Thursday evening of every other month at the Columbia Town Hall. More information, including a calendar, advice on bank erosion and obtaining permits for work in or near the river, and a summary of the *Connecticut River Corridor Management Plan* is on the web at www.crjc.org/localaction.htm.

Delete/Move "A rental charge of 2% shall be included in the tuition rate in accordance with the provisions of RSA 194:27".

Add - As part of the tuition rate, there shall be a rental charge, capital outlay (appraised value of building, fixed assets, furniture and equipment) x 2%, as provided in RSA 195-A in accordance with the following formula:

A rental charge shall be determined based on square footage for kindergarten and divided by the average daily membership for the preceding school year. The value, as stated above, of the building less the kindergarten square footage shall be the determining value for grades 1 - 8 divided by the average daily membership for the preceding year. The value of Colebrook Academy (grades 9-12), as outlined in the

formula above, divided by the average daily membership for the preceding year will be the value used for the 9-12 building rental.

The costs of Special Education or Section 504 support services (aide, speech and occupational therapy) provided by the receiving district for the students of the sending districts shall be charged to the sending district on an individual basis for the actual costs of the services provided (when these services are unique or not included in the comprehensive programs of the school)

Section D – Remove: "bi-annual basis not later than December 15 and June 15 in each year."

Add: The receiving district shall bill the sending district on the following basis: November 1<sup>st</sup>, January 1<sup>st</sup>, April 1<sup>st</sup> and June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Section E – delete July 1, 1978. Add: July 1, 2006.

Section F – delete:

with the following exceptions:

- 1. The sending district may pay tuition to any other district for pupils requiring special education not provided by the receiving district.
- The sending district, upon notification to the receiving district, may in exceptional cases tuition to a neighboring school district those pupils not living within 1 ½ miles of current established bus routes transporting to the receiving district as determined at the effective date of the contract.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT COLEBROOK – COLUMBIA

This is the third year in a row where I can begin this report with the uncertainty of school funding. We go into another Annual School District Meeting without knowing what the school districts will receive for state education adequacy funds. Again, we can only estimate what we will receive from the adequacy distribution, so we are making a conservative estimate and not assuming that there will be any increase over the current level of funding. The revenue side of the budget is always an estimate, but if the adequacy amount were known, it would be a much more accurate estimate. Last year it was late summer before the adequacy funding was determined, so we were already two months into the fiscal year before receiving the information. There are bills being introduced in the legislature this session to make changes in the distribution formula and, hopefully, establish a system that will be consistent from year to year.

The State Board of Education is currently conducting public hearings to review revised "Standards for Public School Approval". The review and adoption process for the standards should be completed by the end of June. The standards must be reviewed every ten years and this time the State Board of Education, to their credit, dedicated much time and effort to a thorough review of the standards, resulting in many significant changes.

Another change at the state level will be the appointment of a new Commissioner of Education. Former Commissioner Nicholas Donohue resigned effective January 6, 2005. A change in the statute now provides that the Governor, rather than the State Board of Education will make the appointment of the Commissioner, with confirmation by the Executive Council. The position of Commissioner, as the chief executive officer of our state's education system, is a four-year appointment. Therefore, it is important to take sufficient time to find the best person for the job. Governor Lynch is consulting with several organizations, including the New Hampshire School Boards Association, New Hampshire School Administrators Association, and the National Education Association – New Hampshire to determine the qualities desired in the next Commissioner.

We need to pay attention to these changes at the state level because state and federal decisions are increasingly impacting local education decisions. I have focused on state level issues in this year's message because of the number of significant changes and the magnitude of the impact they will have on local decisions. I would be happy to discuss these issues with anyone because to understand local decisions you need to understand what is happening at the state and federal level that impacts our school districts.


