

#### **SELECTMENS REPORT**

Nineteen-hundred-seventy-one has been an outstanding year for the Town of Derry.

The highlight was the homecoming of its First Citizen, Rear Admiral Alan B. Shepard, Jr., Derry's Own and the Nation's First Astronaut. The Town really turned out to celebrate his trip to the Moon, and the proceeds of the festivities were used to support the Coronary Care Unit at the Alexander-Eastman Hospital.

The Town's continued growth was marked with the greatest number of Building Permits ever issued.

The Industrial Park came to life with the completion of the building for Moduline Industries, Inc. and construction was begun for the new plant for Continental Can. Across the way, Treasure Masters, Inc. started its new home on Linlew Drive.

Keeping pace with the population growth three large apartment complexes were under construction and the addition to Hood Memorial Junior High School was completed.

Aerators for the Sewer Lagoons were voted at last year's Town Meeting. This work was completed and the system is taking care of current needs.

The Comprehensive Sewer Study was begun and the final report will provide the information to plan for future expansion.

Plans for the Proposed Route 102 By-Pass were dropped when the corridor hearing showed a lack of unanimity by the citizens and the By-Pass appears to be shelved for ten years or more.

The Highway Safety Agency provided the Town with \$6,750.00 to assist in purchasing the new ambulance.

The appropriation of \$5,000.00 of matching funds have been combined with a grant from the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency to provide a Juvenile Officer in the Police Department. A Patrolman has also been added to the force with funds provided under the Federal Emergency Employment Act. A survey of the Police Department was also made by the N.H. Association of Chiefs of Police. A policy has been established to utilize the State Department of Personnel in the ad-

ministration of examination and selection of candidates for positions in the Department.

Renovations of the Town offices in the Adams Memorial Building has been continuing. The facilities of the Police Department have been improved and funds are being asked to continue this work. The Town Quarters are still crowded, but are decidedly more comfortable.

The District Court has employed a new clerk with office space in the Judge's Chambers and renovations are planned also for this

The Conservation Commission has been appointed and vacancies on the Planning and Zoning Boards have been filled. Town government activities have increased to the point that meetings are being held almost nightly.

The Highway Department spent a very busy summer reconstructing the Fordway Bridge and a lengthy portion of Tsienneto

The Water and Sewer Departments have been working hard to keep up with the growth and maintenance problems and the West Derry Standpipe was reconditioned and repainted.

All in all, it has been a strenuous but productive year and in order to keep abreast of the needs of the Town, we are requesting funds for the following:

\$65,000.00 for a complete revaluation of all taxable property. \$50,000.00 for a Comprehensive Water Study to anticipate the

future needs of the Town. \$50,000.00 to be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund for future building needs of Municipal Departments and Offices.

#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in town affairs:

Voters in District No. 1 are hereby notified to meet at the Veterans Memorial Hall in said district, and voters of District No. 2 are hereby notified to meet at the new East Derry Fire House in said district, on the seventh day of March, 1972, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the articles required to be voted on by official ballot, and to meet at eight o'clock in the afternoon on March 14th, in the Veterans Memorial Hall to act on all other articles in this warrant.

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until eight o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

- 1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustees, and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the following question submitted by petition: "Do you favor adoption of the town manager plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated?"
- 3. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the following question submitted by petition: "Are you in favor of increasing the board of selectmen to five members?"
- 4. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the adoption of a Fire Prevention Code Ordinance adopting, by reference, the Fire Prevention Code recommended by the American Insurance Association, 19.70 abbreviated edition as proposed by petition of the voters for this town.

(Approved by Planning Board)

(A copy of the proposed ordinance is posted with this warrant, and copies of the proposed ordinance, together with copies of the Fire Prevention Code recommended by the American Insurance Association, are available at the office of the Town Clerk and the Town Office, and also at the polling place.)

5. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the following proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Derry, N.H., proposed by petitions of the voters for this town:

# CHANGES PROPOSED BY JUDITH GILES AND OTHERS

a. To be adopted as Article X — Historic District of the Derry zoning ordinance:

#### Section 1 - Definition

A historic district is a specified area in a municipality which reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history.

#### Section 2 – Purpose

Its purpose is to see that the heritage of a district will be safeguarded by the preservation of structures and places of historic value and that the district will be protected for the education, pleasure, and welfare of the citizens of the municipality.

#### Section 3 - Location

The historic district shall include the area 1,000 feet either side of the East Derry Road which extends into the Hampstead Road, from Pond Road on the west to Warner Hill Road at Glidden's corner on the east.

#### Section 4 – Regulations of structures

All applications for permits for construction, alteration, repair, moving, demolition of buildings or structures located in a historic district shall be subject to special scrutiny and approval of the

Derry Planning Board until the event that a Historic District Commission is established to assume these duties.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

b. To amend Article II, Section 7 of the Derry Zoning Ordinance by deleting the first paragraph under Garden Type Apartment Houses and by inserting the following:

Garden Type Apartment Houses are buildings conforming to multiple dwelling and/or apartment house specifications located with each building having its own subdivided lot and cluster developments acceptable provided all requirements of this section are met. All multiple dwelling buildings shall be planned so that the entire subdivision will have light, air and a recreational area and shall have a common owner.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

# CHANGES PROPOSED BY ROBERT LEVESQUE AND OTHERS a. To be adopted as an article. SIGN ORDINANCE

Section 1. All signs to be restricted to retail business and industrial zones only, with the exception of businesses incidental to the home in which case signs are to be restricted on size to (3) three square feet. Sub-division signs and for sale signs are permitted in the residential zone.

Section 2. Blinking and rotating signs are prohibited.

Section 3. No sign shall exceed a size of (48) forty eight square feet.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY ROBERT E. WEBBER AND OTHERS a. Insert after SECTION 1.170 the following new section: RECREATIONAL BUSINESS ZONE.

All that land included in the following description: Beginning at the intersection of Island Pond Road and North Shore Road, thence (1) Easterly by said North Shore Road, one thousand two hundred (1200) feet, more or less, to land of Margaret E. Gebelein, now or formerly; thence (2) Northerly by said land of Gebelein, now or formerly, one thousand two hundred fifty (1250) feet, more or less, to land of Mark and Joan Carroll, now or formerly; thence (3) Westerly nine hundred (900) feet, more or less, by land now or formerly of Carroll to said Island Pond Road; and thence (4) Southerly, one thousand one hundred (1100) feet, by said Island Pond Road to the point of beginning. Containing 24 acres, be the same more or less.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY ALBERT W. BASKERVILLE AND OTHERS

- a. To amend Article II, Section 7, by deleting the apartment house density requirements and by inserting the following:
- 1. A maximum density of (24) twenty four dwelling units per acre for buildings located on town water and sewer.
- 2. A maximum density of (8) eight dwelling units per acre for buildings not located on both town water and sewer.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

b. Amend Article II, Section 7, by deleting the paragraph refering to the height restriction of 45 feet. And, adopting the state of New Hampshire Underwriters Fire Division revisions pertaining to maximum building height.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY ARTHUR BOUDREAU AND OTHERS

a. Amend Article I, Section 1.100 and add section 1.190 starting on the easterly side of Hampstead Road at the junction of Pond Road and Hampstead Road, and continuing along Hampstead

Road to the former East Derry Town Hall. This commercial zone shall extend to the rear property lines of East Derry Mercury Garage, Dorothy Rice, and East Derry Store properties.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY VINCENT FERDINANDO AND OTHERS

a. We, the undersigned residents of Derry, New Hampshire do hereby petition; to see if the town of Derry will vote to rezone to a retail business the area 300 feet back on either side of Route 102 from Pond Road to Bisbee Circle on Chester Road.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

b. Amend Article, Section 1.100, And add section 1.190 We, the undersigned residents of Derry, New Hampshire do hereby petition; to see if the town of Derry will vote to rezone to a retail business the area 200 feet back on either side of Rt. 102 from Pond Road to English Range Road on Chester Road. Article I, Section 1.190.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY LOUIS T. BRUNO AND OTHERS a. To see if the Town will amend Article I, Section 1.100 by deleting the following section:

Section 1.180

The area situated at the intersection of the Northerly line of Route 102 and the Easterly line of Route 28 By-Pass bounded Southerly by State Highway 102 a/k/a Chester Road; Westerly by State Highway Route 28 By-Pass, a/k/a North Main Street; Northerly by land formerly of Mary B. Hill now believed to be of Howard Bouldry; Easterly by Thornton Street and land owned by R & N Realty and being the location of the Wilbert Coburn Vault Corp. Meaning and intending to include in the above description the area comprised by No. 1 North Main Street (formerly owned by Zirpolo), NO. 3 North Main Street (formerly owned by Tomaszewska), and No. 5 North Main Street (formerly owned by Goyette) now owned by Charles Cutter, Et Al by deed dated May 21, 1968 and by Derry Village Trust, Inc. by deed recorded in the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds, Volume 1919, Page 460, and request that the same be considered by said Planning Board as provided by statute.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY CAROLINE E. O'CONNOR AND OTHERS

a. To see if the Town will amend the Zoning Ordinance by amending Article II, Section 7 by changing the following requirement to:

Density: A minimum lot area of 2,500 square feet per dwelling unit.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

b. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by changing Article II, Section 6, Paragraph b to the following:

b. From and after the enactment of this section, all lots not supplied either by the municipal sewer system or municipal water system shall contain a minimum area of (1) one acre, with a width of at least 125 feet at the 35-foot set-back line from the street or on the road. However, this requirement shall not be applicable to any legally existing or approved lot containing at least 25,000 square feet with a width of 125 feet at the 35-foot set-back line from the street or on the road, provided said lot meets the requirements of the State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

c. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by changing Section 1.410 to read as follows:

Section 1.410. All the rest of the Town not included in the above three zones and, except as otherwise provided by this ordinance, shall be limited to residential type construction and uses. However, accessory uses, including business, may be per-

mitted by special exception of the Zoning Board of Adjustment provided such use is not objectionable by reason of noise, smoke or fumes or other causes. Accessory use is defined as: A use incidental to, subordinate to, and on the same lot as a principal use.

(Disapproved by the Planning Board)

d. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by amending Article II, Section 7, by adding the following requirement:

Minimum Lot Area: Three Acres

(Approved by the Planning Board)

- e. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article II, Section 6-c (1) be deleting it and inserting the following to become Article II, Section 6-c (1):
- (1.) Residential lots where municipal water or municipal sewer are available, shall contain a minimum of 15,000 square feet with a width of at least 100 feet at the 35 foot set-back from the street or on the road. Residential lots where community water systems are available must contain a minimum of one acre (43,560 sq. ft.) with a width of at least 125 feet at the 35 foot set-back from the street or on the road.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

f. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article II, Section 7, by changing the following requirements to:

Water and Sewer: Multiple dwellings, apartment houses and garden type houses shall be connected to the municipal water and sewer system.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

g. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by amending Section 1.200 by adding the following:

The Industrial Zones north of Broadway except for the "Campbell Development" (shown as Parcels 7-1 through 7-7, Map 42, and Parcels 2-1 through 2-7, Map 48 on the Town of Derry Property Maps) shall be limited to public utility, transportation, wholesale trade, and manufacturing uses, except as otherwise provided by this ordinance.

(Approved by the Planning Board)

- 6. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town buildings, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observances of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purpose of paying the same to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association, which serves the Derry

area, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from meter receipts the sum of \$2,290.00 to be expended for repairs and maintenance of parking meters and to transfer any balance of parking meter receipts to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the Parking Lot Fund, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to provide for the prepayment of taxes, and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes, as provided in Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 80, Section 52-a; and to further allow the Collector of Taxes to discount taxes according to the following schedule or such other schedule as the meeting may determine, fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend the following schedule and discount: 2% discount on installments of not less than \$100.00 prior to July 1, 1972, 1½% discount on installment payments of \$10.00 or more until tax rate is determined and announced by Selectmen, and a 1% discount from the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after date of invoice.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,550.00 for the Derry Head Start Program, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Sewer Equipment Fund and expend said sum for the purchase of a truck for the Sewer Department, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$65,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining a complete revaluation of the taxable property in the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Sclectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Sewer Maintenance Fund and expend said sum for the inspection and repair of the Horne Brook and Ross Pond Sewer Interceptor, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining a comprehensive study of the Town's water supply, storage and distribution system, and pass any vote relating thereto. (Submitted without recommendation by Budget Committee)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$35,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Replacement of Water Main Fund and expend said sum for the purpose of replacing water mains on North High Street, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$1,800.00 from the Capital Reserve Parking Lot Fund and expend the same for the purpose of developing and paving parking lots at Veterans Hall and Adams Memorial Hall, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of establishing and funding a capital reserve fund, in accordance with Chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, or any amendments thereto, for the financing of improvements to existing municipal buildings or for the acquisition and construction of future municipal sites and buildings, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take such action as, in their discretion, may be necessary, including the execution of any documents, to grant access over a certain proposed roadway leading Northeasterly from North Shore Road at Beaver Lake, as shown on plan of land as subdivided for Harold P. Davis, Feb. 1953, (said roadway having been acquired by the Town for nonpayment of taxes) to the

owners of land abutting said roadway, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to give a deed to the owners of the property on Crystal Avenue now or formerly occupied by the Standard Sash & Door Company, in which deed the Town would release its easement or ownership to a very few square feet of land adjacent to Crystal Avenue upon which part of the building of said Standard Sash & Door Company sits, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 22. By petition: Warrant Article In the event that the Town Manager Plan is adopted by the voters, to see if the Town will vote to set the salary and expenses for the Town Manager at a figure not exceeding \$15,000.00 for salary and a figure not exceeding \$1,000.00 for expenses, and vote to raise and appropriate such proportion of said salary and expenses as the Town may determine is needed for the year 1972, and pass any vote relating thereto. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee)
- 23. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$4,500.00 (Four thousand five hundred dollars) for the purpose of a "Management study including organization and methods, administrative review, and a classification and compensation study," and pass any vote relating thereto. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee)
- By petition: Article 1 To see if the Town of Derry will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission now organized and named the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission. This commission will have membership of at least two municipalities and will have jurisdiction over planning region 13 delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the commission will be to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide concensus on regional problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects within and which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town. The commission will have only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36: Section 45-53, RSA 1955, as amended, and will be an advisory commission to local governments in the region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the selectmen in accordance with state law. Three representatives will be appointed from Derry.

Article 2 — To see if the town will vote the appropriate sum of \$4,099.20 (.35 per capita) as the Town's share for the operation of the regional planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes.

A vote on this article is contingent Town Meeting approval of the prior article.

- 25. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the town will vote to change the present form of an appointed budget committee that is elected by the registered voters of Derry as permitted in Chapter 32:2 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 26. By petition: To see if the Town will vote to require the Selectmen to require an examination of all applicants for the job of police officer for the Town of Derry and after appointment the newly appointed officer will be required to serve a probationary period of six (6) months plus an additional six (6) months at the discretion of the Selectmen upon recommendation of the Chief of Police. At the satisfactory completion of the probationary period the appointee will become a permanent member of the Derry Police Department, dismissal to be made for just cause only and only after a hearing has been granted.

All promotions within the Police Department shall be made by competitive examination only. These examinations to be con-

ducted by the State of New Hampshire Personnel Department, after qualifying requirements have been established by the Selectmen and the Chief of Police.

All regular police officers who have served six (6) months on the police department prior to the 1972 Town Meeting shall not be effected by the six (6) months probationary requirements.

- 27. By petition: To see whether the voters of Derry will authorize the Selectmen of the Town of Derry to sign a ninety-nine (99) years lease at One (\$1.00) Dollar per year, leasing the West Side School to the Greater Derry Boys' Club, Inc.
- 28. By petition: To see if the town shall vote to authorize the selectmen to make the West Side School available for development as a Community Center operated by the Derry Recreation & Parks Commission and if not utilized for same to revert back to the Selectmen for their disposition.
- 29. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the town will recommend to the Selectmen that they adopt the following safety ordinances regulating residential swimming pools.
- A. A swimming pool is considered a body of water contained in an artificial or semi-artificial receptacle whether in or above the ground, or created by artificial means from a natural water-course, and all appurtenances, equipment, appliances and other facilities for its operation, maintenance or use, used or intended to be used for swimming, wading or recreational bathing, but not including portable pools incapable of containing a depth of water exceeding twenty-four (24) inches at any point.
- B. A residential swimming pool is a swimming pool used or intended to be used solely by the owner or tenant thereof and his family, and by friends invited to use it without payment of any fee.
- C. Every outdoor residential swimming pool shall be completely surrounded at all times, whether or not the same be filled with water, by a fence or wall not less than five (5) feet in height. Each such fence or wall shall be so constructed as not to have openings, holes or gaps larger than four inches in any dimension except for picket fences in which case, however, the gaps between the pickets shall not exceed four inches, and except

for doors or gates which can have no openings, holes or gaps. A building may be used as a part of such enclosure.

- D. All gates or doors opening through such enclosures shall be of not less than the same height as the fence or wall and shall be equipped with a self-closing and self-latching device located not more than one foot below the top of the fence or wall for keeping the gate or door securely closed at all times when not in actual use except that the door of any dwelling which forms a part of the enclosure need not be so equipped. Each such gate or door shall be kept locked at all times when the swimming pool enclosure is not in use.
- E. The provisions of these regulations shall not become applicable to residential swimming pools in existence on the date of enactment of said regulations until the date four months subsequent to such date, or 1 June 1972, whichever comes first.
- 30. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 31. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.
- 32. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Derry for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the audit reports enclosed herewith must be given the Town Clerk to be retained as part of the permanent Town records.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Works, District Court, Public Library, Taylor Library, Alexander Carr Playground, MacGregor Memorial Park, Cemetery Trustees and Trustees of Trust Funds.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Revenue Accounts: (General Fund)

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1969 and December 31, 1970: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - as of December 31, 1969 and December 31, 1970, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Town decreased by \$170,756.97 in 1970, from \$1,177,326.56 to \$1,006,569.59. Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows.

The outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1970, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit K.

#### **AUDIT PROCEDURE**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

# GENERAL COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$25,756.97 in 1970, from \$161,673.44 to \$187,430.41 as shown herewith:

Trustees of Trust Funds:

Our examination of the accounts of the Trustees of Trust Funds for the year 1970 disclosed no improvement in the accounting and management practices attending the administration of trust fund affairs. The recommendations contained in our 1969 audit report concerning these matters were not implemented in 1970.

Our comments relative to trust funds, therefore, are similar to those made last year and consist of the following:

(1) Receipts:

The handling of receipts was very lax. Cash and checks were held for extended periods of time and deposited infrequently. As indicated in Exhibit J-3, 1970 receipts totalling \$7,954.11 were deposited during a period extending over four months after the close of the fiscal year. Included in these receipts were checks received during the last five months of the year.

In addition, cash receipts records were incomplete and inaccurate; a substantial amount of income received during the year had not been distributed to individual trust funds. Other 1970 income was improperly distributed to a number of accounts, because distribution was made without regard to the contributory interests of certain common trust funds. This practice is contrary to the statutes applicable to trust funds.

Included in receipts during the year were excess interest payments of \$271.25 received on U.S. Treasury Notes. This situation had not been detected by the Trustees. These funds are due the U.S. Government.

(2) Securities:

Stock certificates covering ninety (90) shares of Central Maine Power - 3.50% preferred stock, which were purchased in 1967 at a cost of \$5,460.00, could not be located when the auditors examined and listed the securities in the custody of the Trustees.

An investigation of this matter by our auditors revealed that these securities had not been delivered by the brokers of record. The trustees were advised of this fact. Confirmation of this particular transaction was obtained from the brokers on April 20, 1971. Delivery of the stock certificates for the original purchase price has been guaranteed by the brokerage firm involved.

Securities consisting of sixteen (16) certificates for seven hundred forty four (744) shares of stock and a number of fractional shares, plus three (3) U.S. Treasury Notes (with a total face value of \$3,000.00), were found scattered among the various records, documents and books submitted to the auditors during the course of the examination. These certificates bore dates ranging from January 22, 1965 to November 12, 1970. Obviously, these securities should have been placed in the Trustees safe deposit box for safekeeping immediately upon receipt.

(3) Income on Investments Not Received:

In connection with the Central Maine Power stocks discussed previously, the auditors found that dividends of \$551.25, due and payable on these securities for 1969 and 1970, had not been re-

ceived by the Trustees. This matter was brought to the attention of the brokers and payment was received by the Trustees during the course of this audit.

The preceding comments represent a few examples of the poor accounting and business practices relating to Trust Funds which need correction. Due to the condition of the records, an exhaustive review of the accounts of the Trustees of Trust Funds was required in order to establish the precise financial condition of these funds at December 31, 1970. This review by our staff resulted in a substantial expense to the Town and could have been avoided by the maintenance of adequate and complete records and the use of prudent business practices and procedures.

During the course of this examination, the current Trustees were advised of our findings concerning the management and accounting of trust funds in their custody. We have been assured by them that the necessary fiscal and accounting controls required for compliance with legal requirements and accounting principles applicable to trust funds will be established immediately.

Conclusion:

The provisions of R.S.A. 71:27-a (Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955) require that the summary of findings and recommendations of the auditors (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. The audit report may be published at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen, but this letter of transmittal must be published in its entirety.

We extend our appreciation to all the town officials and the members of their staff for the cooperation and courtesies extended furing the course of the audit.

#### **PROCEEDINGS**

(At 8:00 p.m. the meeting was called to order and following the Salute to the Flag and rules of the Meeting read by the Moderator the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR: We will now take up the Articles in the warrant. Article No. 1 has been taken care of as I understand it, of course, by your regular vote. You are all aware of what the results were of the various elections.

I will take up Article 2 at this time which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 2: To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan Apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town Buildings, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Now, what is your pleasure on this Article? I think it is ordinarily that we move that we take them up item by item.

MR. KIMBALL. I so move.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made. Do I hear a second?

MR. A. MacGREGOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. MacGregor seconded the motion. Any discussion? If not, all those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare. And we will take up each item in the Budget.

(Line items read by the Moderator with certain line items being questioned for the purpose of discussion after completion of reading line items.)

MR. KIMBALL. Mr. Moderator, On Selectmens' Salaries, the Selectmen haven't received a raise for many, many years. I think each of the Selectmen should be given \$1,500.00 and I so move, per year, increasing the Budget by \$1,500.00.

THE MODERATOR. You have heard the motion. Do I hear a second to increase the Selectmens' salary? What is it, \$1,000.00 presently which would change to \$1,500.00. Do I hear a second?

MR. LaGREE. Seconded.

JUDGE GRINNELL, Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Do we hear any discussion? FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Do you understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It appears that the "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. CADIEUX. Mr. Moderator, will you check that vote please. THE MODERATOR. Sorry. It takes seven. You are the only one, Johnny. Stand up, those that are questioning.

(Several people standing up.)

THE MODERATOR. The vote has been questioned. We will have a show of hands.

(Tellers assigned and a standing vote is taken.)

THE MODERATOR. The Town Clerk has the tally, those in favor, 158, those opposed, 78. I declare the "Ayes" have.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. KEN DAVIS. I will make it in the form of a motion, Mr. Moderator, that all of these salaries where the ten per cent - whether ten per cent or greater factor has been used in figuring the increase, be changed to seven and a half per cent so that we are continuing on with what we did last year.

MR. GOULD. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All right. Since I feel we have had adequate discussion, all those in favor of the motion as made by Mr. Davis say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

MR. GAYLORD SPINNEY. I would like to move a motion that we put \$15,000.00 more into this budget.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on that?

MRS. DEANNA SILVA. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made and seconded and we have been discussing it to add \$15,000.00 to this item under discussion, Town Maintenance-Summer, to \$74,000.00. Now, do you understand the question? All right. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

FROM THE FLOOR, Mr. Moderator, I move that we limit debate to items on the Town Warrant.

(Applause.)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made that we limit the debate to the items in the Town Warrant. Do I hear a second.

A. MacGREGOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. We will put it to a vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

MR. STARKESON. I would like to move that the appropriation be amended to \$82,450.00.

MR. GARLAND. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. You know what the question is. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare. And that item (General Expenses of highway Department) will be increased from \$81,950.00 to \$82,450.00.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

MRS. JACOBSON. I would like to make a motion that the MacGregor Park, this item be cut to \$1,200.00; Alexander Carr be cut to \$10,000.00, the Recreation Department in general be cut to \$30,000.00.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The motion has been made that that item be cut to \$30,000.00, from \$39,527.00 to \$30,000.00. Do I hear a second on that motion?

(No response)

THE MODERATOR. Nobody seconds the motion. There is no motion on the floor.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MR. COX. I would now like to make a motion that the Recreation & Parks Commission be empowered to hire a full time person on salary for maintenance and supervisory work.

MR. BOYCE. I second the motion.

(After further discussion the following ensued)

THE MODERATOR. As I understand the motion from the stenographer, Mr. Cox has made a motion that his department be empowered to hire a full time person for maintenance and supervisory work in his department. Is that correct?

MR. COX. Basically that is correct.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Now, you understand the question. I will put it to a vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. DORIS ADAMS. I move that we take up Article No. 8.

MRS. DIMARZIO. I will second that.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and I so declare and we will take up Article 8, which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be used as matching funds with State or Federal funds that may become available, for crime prevention and law enforcement or for pollution control and protection of the environment (the money so appropriated will not be expended unless State or Federal matching funds become available), and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this item?

MR. GARLAND. I move we accept it as read.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made that we accept the item as printed by Mr. Garland. Who seconded it? Mr. Ferland seconds it. Any discussion?

MR. GARLAND. The question, Mr. Moderator.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. Do you understand the question? We are taking up this Article No. 8 at this time so we can transfer into the budget when we get to it, we are taking it up at this time rather than a later time. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare. And Item 8 is now transferred into the budget which we will vote on an actual appropriation when we get to the end of this.

THE MODERATOR, Mr. Kimball.

MR. KIMBALL. Warrant Article 11, the same as data processing, that is listed under libraries. If it is, I move we take it up at this time.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Mr. Kimball says there is another item included in this particular section that appears as Item

11. He has made a motion at this time to take up Article 11 and transfer into the budget so we can vote on it all at once. Do I hear a second on that.

MR. DAVIS. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion under that item? If not, I will put it to a vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" appear to have it, the "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. I will read the Article:

ARTICLE 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,600.00 for the purpose of data processing of municipal bills for taxes, sewer, water and head and poll taxes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Do I hear any motion under this item?

MR. GARLAND. I move we accept the item as printed.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. You know what the motion is under this Article. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Now we will go back to that particular item that we were discussing.

Mr. Adams points out that this particular appropriation in the budget is related to Article 14, in the Town Warrant. You want to move that we take up 14 at this time?

MR. ADAMS. I so move.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Adams makes a motion we at this time take up Article 14, Mr. Hobsch has seconded that motion. Any discussion?

FROM THE FLOOR. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. All those in favor of that motion as made will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare. We move Item 14 into the budget.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. We will take up Article No. 14 at this time. I would like to have the motion restated on accepting Article No. 14 as read.

ARTICLE 14: To see if the Town will vote to change the water rates charged to water users on the municipal water system by doing away with the commercial rate so that all water users will be charged on the same basis as charged to dwellings and other users not now classified as commercial, and pass any vote relating thereto.

MR. MacGREGOR. So moved.

MR. ADAMS. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. RICHARD MacGREGOR. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Do you understand the question? All right. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move we take up Article 10.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Dimarzio has made a motion we take up item No. 10 in the warrant at this time under this particular item. Do I hear that seconded?

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

MR. RICHARD MacGREGOR. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. All right, you have heard the question. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare it and we will take up Article 10 in the Town Warrant.

Article 10 reads as follows:

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$5,000.00 for the purpose of a long-range engineering study of improvements to the municipal sewerage disposal system so that the plant may be improved to meet conditions for the next fifteen to twenty years, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MR. GAY. Move it be accepted as printed.

THE MODERATOR. Captain Gay moves that we accept the item as printed. Mrs. Dimarzio seconded it. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. KIMBALL. I move we take up Article 5.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Kimball makes a motion we take up Article 5 in the Town Warrant and Mr. Hobsch seconded it. Any discussion?

All right. Those in favor of the motion as made by Mr. Kimball will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. We will take up Article 5, which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the same to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association, which serves the Derry area, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MR. HOBSCH. I make a motion we accept it as printed.

MR. MacGREGOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Hobsch moves we accept Article 5 as printed and it has been seconded by Mr. MacGregor.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved on this particular article to accept it as read. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a motion to take up Article 13 under the warrant?

MR. HOBSCH. So moved.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. So moved by Arthur Hobsch to take up Article 13 and seconded by Mr. Warren Garland. Any discussion? Anybody move the Question? All right. The Question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and we will take up Article 13 at this time, which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 13: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$150,000.00 under the terms of Chapter 33 of Revised Statutes Annotated, entitled Municipal Finance Act, and any amendments thereto, and to execute serial notes in the name of the Town in payment therefor, payable in annual installments over a period of ten years, and further authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the terms of said loan and do any other act necessary to accomplish the purpose hereof, the proceeds of said loan including interest to be used for the Horne Brook Interceptor and appurtenances thereto, State and Federal funds anticipated up to \$134,000.00 net to the Town \$16,000.00, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article in the Town Warrant? MR. BIENVENUE. I move we adopt it.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Emile Bien-

venue that we adopt the Article as printed or as I read it. Arthur Hobsch seconded it. Now it is open for discussion. Any questions?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Since this is a bonding issue and not to take any chances we are going to have a standing vote on it. It is going to be counted.

(Tellers appointed and standing count taken.)

THE MODERATOR. Well, I declare that we have accepted the article as printed, passes by a vote, what was the total, 199 to 7, 199 in favor and 7 opposed. So Article 13 is taken up under the \$150,000.00 item under the Horne Interceptor.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

MR. PILLSBURY. I move we take up Article 12 in the warrant. MR. MacGREGOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Walter Pillsbury has made the motion that we take up Article 12 in the warrant and Mr. MacGregor seconded the motion. Any discussion? All those in favor say "Aye," Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. And we will take up Article No. 12 which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$200,000.00 under the terms of Chapter 33 of Revised Statutes Annotated, entitled Municipal Finance Act, and any amendments thereto, and to execute serial notes in the name of the Town in payment therefor, payable in annual installments over a period of ten years, and further authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the terms of said loan and do any other act necessary to accomplish the purpose hereof, the proceeds of said loan including interest to be used to install aeration and appurtenances at the sewer lagoons, State and Federal funds anticipated up to \$180,000.00 net to Town \$20,000.00 and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this item?

MR. BIENVENUE. I move that it be accepted as read and printed.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Second the motion.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BOYCE. I would like to amend Article 12 to read on page 8: The proceeds of said loan including interest to be used to install aeration and appurtenances at the Derry sewer lagoons, with the understanding that if the State changes its mind again, I mean, Water Supply and Pollution, they go to any other system, we would not be able to spend this money. It has to be spent to install aeration and appurtenances. I would like to make my amendment to read: Aeration and appurtenances at the sewer lagoons and any other installation approved by the State.

REVEREND STRAIT. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. This is on the amendment. Again, the same counters. All those that are in favor will rise. All those opposed "No."

(Count taken by appointed tellers.)

THE MODERATOR. I just want to make the announcement of the outcome of the vote: 203 voted "Yes," none were opposed, zero opposed, for the record. Now, that was on the amendment. Now we have got the question as amended to vote on.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor will stand and remain standing until they are counted. All those opposed will rise on the question as amended.

(Count taken by appointed tellers.)

THE MODERATOR. There are 195 "Yes," none opposed,

zero opposed. The motion is carried and I so declare.

MR. KIMBALL. Mr. Moderator, I move that we take up Article 9 at this time.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and you will take up Article 9 which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$35,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing and installing a pump to increase the water pressure in the municipal water system, and pass any vote relating thereto.

MR. KIMBALL. I move Article 9 be accepted as read.

THE MODERATOR. Wallace Kimball moves that it be accepted as read and printed and Walter Hobsch seconded the motion. Any Discussion?

FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved without any further discussion. Since again this is an item, a bond issue item, I assume, being over \$20,000.00, a standing vote will be necessary. All those in favor will rise and they will be counted. All those opposed will rise. Anybody opposed to it? All right. No opposition.

(Count taken by appointed tellers.)

THE MODERATOR. 176 in favor, none opposed. It is a vote and I so declare that Article No. 9 is adopted.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. I think that we have taken up every item that was questioned. Now, at this point here, what is your pleasure on the appropriations.

MR. DiMARIA. Mr. Chairman, I move to accept the budget as amended.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. You move to accept the budget in the sum of \$1,654,567.63 plus ---

MR. DiMARIA. I am including that. There was an increase in the Town Officers' Salaries of \$1,500.00 and an increase of \$500.00 under general expense.

THE MODERATOR. So there is an increase of \$2,000.00 in your total appropriation. Any discussion on the appropriations. If no further discussion, move the question.

MR. MacGREGOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. ARTHUR MACGREGOR. I move that we accept the receipts as printed with the amendments that we have in the expenditures.

THE MODERATOR. In other words, we move to accept the receipts in the sum of \$1,654,567.63 as amended on the \$2,000.00.

RICHARD MacGREGOR. I will second that.

THE MODERATOR. Arthur MacGregor moves to adopt the receipt item, is that the way they want it done, and the other Mr. MacGregor seconds it.

All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we accept the receipts as amended in the sum of \$2,000.00.

MR. HARTMAN. I move that we take up Article 15.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion. All right. If not, I will read it off to you. It reads as follows:

ARTICLE 15: To see if the Town will vote that there is a need for a Housing Authority as set forth in Chapter 203 of Revised Statutes Annotated, and request the Selectmen to implement said need by appointing Commissioners so that a Housing Au-

thority will exist and function in the community, and pass any vote relating thereto.

First you want to vote to take it up. I am sorry. Any discussion. MRS. DiMARZIO. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare.

(Article 15 is now reread by the Moderator)

THE MODERATOR. What is your pleasure?

MR. QUIMBY. I move it be adopted, Mr. Chairman.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made that we adopt it. Do I hear a second.

MR. LaGREE. Seconded.

MR. HARTMAN. Mr. Moderator, I would like to amend this Article so that this motion be voted on by ballot. This is part of the statute.

THE MODERATOR. You don't need an amendment. We have got a ballot. It is going to be prepared and it is going to be voted on by written ballot. We were aware of the fact that the Statute so required and anticipated it. All right. You may discuss it.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. I think we have had plenty of discussion on the matter. We are going to have to vote on it by ballot. I want to admonish you, the only voters who are eligible to vote are on the checklist. At this point here we have got the booths set up so you can vote in private.

(Balloting takes place on Article 15)

THE MODERATOR. All right. We are going to continue with the Articles in the Town Warrant that we have not taken up.

MR. MacGREGOR. Mr. Moderator, I move we take up Article 24 at this time.

MR. ADAMS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All right. You have heard the motion made at this time that we take up Article 24. Any discussion?

MR. KIMBALL. The question.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved we take up Article 24 at this time. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it, it is a vote and I so declare.

We have now taken care of Articles 1 and 2 in rotation and others thereafter, but the next article is Article 3:

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this article?

MR. KIMBALL. So moved.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made that we adopt it as read.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. And the question has been moved. You know what the question is. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and it is a vote and I so declare and Article 3 is Adopted.

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this article?

JUDGE GRINNELL. I move its adoption.

MRS. ADAMS. Seconded.

MR. BOYCE. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

All right. We have the results of your balloting on Article 15. The count shows that "Yes" were 44 and "Nos" 129. The Article is defeated.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. We now move on to the next Article, Article 6, that we had not taken up to this point and Article 6 reads as follows:

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from meter receipts the sum of \$1,660.00 to be expended for repairs and maintenance of parking meters and to transfer any balance of parking meter receipts to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the Parking Lot Fund, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on Article 6?

MR. ARLAND. Move it be accepted as read, Mr. Moderator.

MRS. JACOBSON. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. KIMBALL. Mr. Moderator, I move that we amend this article to transfer \$6,000.00 from meter receipts to the funds to police the meters.

THE MODERATOR. Six thousand dollars?

MR. KIMBALL. Right.

MR. BLUNT. Second the motion.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Why don't you make the amendment, whatever the amendment is, right, make it over again so we can understand it.

MR. KIMBALL. There is an article, there is a section here tells how much is coming from the meters. I think on Article 6 I would amend the article to read: Transfer \$1,660.00 to repair the meters and the balance of the receipts should be transferred for the police department to supervise the meters, the balance of the receipts for the past year, which is about \$5,500.00 according to the book.

THE MODERATOR. Now, do I hear a second on that motion? MR. BLUNT. Seconded.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. I hope you understand it. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Well, lets vote over again. I can't make up my mind. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. The amendment is lost. Now we are back to the Article.

MR. BOYCE. Move the question.

MR. GAY. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. We are on the Article as printed. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

ARTICLE 7: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 80, Section 52-a, providing for the prepayment of taxes, and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in pre-payment of taxes, and to further allow the Collector of Taxes to discount taxes according to the following schedule or such other schedule as the meeting may determine, fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend the following schedule and discount: 2% discount on installments of not less than \$100.00 prior to July 1, 1971, 1½% discount on installment payments of \$10.00 or more until tax rate is determined and announced by Selectmen, and a 1% discount from the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after date of invoice.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MR. GAY. Move that it be adopted.

MR. KIMBALL. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion?

MR. GAY. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

We now go to 16, which reads as follows:

ARTICLE 16: By petition: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$2,750.00 for the Derry Head Start School, to enable said school to enroll five (5) additional children beyond its present budgeted capacity of 30 for the school year beginning September, 1971.

Now, this article has been disapproved by the Budget Committee and I feel that no matter how we vote it is not going to make any difference.

MR. KIMBALL. I move the Article be tabled.

MR. GAY. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion?

MR. MacGREGOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor of tabling Article 16 will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

ARTICLE 17: By petition: To see if the Town of Derry will vote to accept Dolores Avenue, Doris Street, Paul Avenue in their present location, as they exist and as shown on a Revised Plan of Edgewood Estate, dated August, 1970, made by Edward N. Herbert, Surveyor, and recorded as the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds.

What is your pleasure?

MRS. CASTEN. Move the Article be tabled.

MR. BLUNT. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. CASTEN. I withdraw my second.

MR. KIMBALL. I move the Article 17 be adopted as read.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion? All those in favor will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, and it is a vote and I so declare.

ARTICLE 18: By petition: To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of the Central Fire House land and buildings, from the Derry Fire District when their new building is constructed. Said land and buildings at 32 West Broadway, will be used only for recreation purposes, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MR. GAY. Mr. Moderator, I move that Article 18 be indefinitely postponed.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Do you understand the question? That this article as printed be tabled. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote, and I so declare.

All right. The next article is Article 19:

ARTICLE 19: By petition: We the undersigned residents of Hickory Avenue, Juniper Road, Pine Street and Cole Road, Woodland Park so called, do hereby petition our Selectmen to repair and resurface the above said roads up to the town requirements, including adequate surface drainage. Estimated cost being \$49,700.00.

This has been disapproved by the Budget Committee.

MR. KIMBALL. I move a motion that Article 19 be tabled.

MR. BLUNT. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion? The question has been

moved. All those in favor of the motion to table say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare, and Article 19 is tabled.

ARTICLE 20: By petition: To see if the Town of Derry, New Hampshire will vote to transfer for one dollar, or such other consideration as the Town of Derry deems proper to the First Parish Congregational Church in Derry, New Hampshire, Incorporated, a church duly incorporated under the laws of the State of New Hampshire and located at the corner of Hampstead Road and Cemetery Road in Derry, New Hampshire, its successors and assigns, a certain parcel of land with the buildings thereon bounded and described as shown on Plan of Land in Derry, N.H. drawn for First Parish Congregational Church, January 1971, by Edward N. Herbert, Surveyor, showing 2.85 acres of land and being the land upon which the present church sits at East Derry plus some additional land to the south for parking, etc. This transfer is granted with the reservation that in the event the First Parish Congregational Church in Derry, New Hampshire, Incorporated, its successors and assigns, ceases to exist or does not function as an active Church in its services of worship and general activities for a period of three (3) successive years, said land and easement as described above shall revert to the Town of Derry, New Hampshire. And to pass any other vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article?

MR. HOUSTON. I move the adoption of Article 20.

MR. KIMBALL. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Donald Houston moves that we adopt this Article and Mr. Kimball seconds it. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

JUDGE GRINNELL. I would like to amend the Article so that this restriction or words similar would appear in the deed: The title to the property transferred to the Church not to be transferred to any church group outside of the Town of Derry, and as an additional restriction in here which the Church put in it, if they ceased to use it for three consecutive years, or whatever it says, that it would automatically revert to the Town. And I think that would be ample protection to a site that is an historical site and part of our Town Common up there.

MR, KIMBALL, Seconded.

MR. MacGREGOR. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question is on the amendment. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed? The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and the Article is amended.

Now what action do you want to take on the article as amended?

MR. MacGREGOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye," Those opposed "No," The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Now, Article 21 has been disposed of, as I understand it, by

ARTICLE 22: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

I recognize Mr. Myette.

MR. MYETTE. The Town Study Committee by majority recommended the following four proposals necessary for good town government:

Proposal No. 1: The two fire departments, East Derry and Derry, to merge into one district under the direction of one fire chief and three fire commissioners.

Proposal No. 2: The merging of the two school districts having been resolved, no action to change was taken by the Study Committee.

Proposal No. 3: The Town to have a head administration officer responsible for proper administration of town affairs, known as Town Manager, RSA No. 37.

Proposal No. 4: The establishment of representative Town Meeting Government as set forth in the New Hampshire State Statute RSA 40, which replaces our present Town Meeting form of government.

The voters having heard the proposals, the Study Committee by majority recommends they ought to pass. And I so move, Mr. Moderator.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Do I hear a second on that motion?

MR. MacGREGOR. I second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. There was a minority report that was filed by Mr. Bienvenue. Do you want to submit your report?

MR. BIENVENUE. This is really minority, a report of one.

Minority report of the Town Study Committee:

I voted against changing the form of government recommended by the majority of the Study Committee. I feel that the present system under which the town is operating is a good one. We are still a small town in which progress has been accomplished during the past few years under the present form of government in Derry. To mention some of the progress made during those years: new public sewer system installed in '58, extension of sewer facilities to Derry Village, extension of sewer facilities to Route

28, industrial area, rebuilding of Crystal Avenue, rebuilding of East and West Broadway, resurface of Birch Street, new bridge at Derry Village, West Broadway, Highland Avenue and North High Street. New highway garage, new chlorinator, new water supply in Londonderry, new Manning Street parking lot, new industrial park, new 12 inch water main from Pinkerton Street to Klev Brothers making it possible for industry in this part of Town. An Article to adopt a Town Manager form of government was adopted at the 1960 Town Meeting. The Town at present is fully staffed with a full-time assessor, town engineer, building inspector, road agent, recreation director and supervisor of the sewer and water. There are many who know very little about our present form of government functions who are in favor of a change. I do not favor a change just for the sake of change.

The recommendation of the Majority of the Study Committee would do away with Town Meetings. I feel that 500 people or more taxpayers attending a town meeting spending their own money is far greater representation than would be afforded by 12 or 15 people who were the full authority to spend your money under the proposed form of government.

I feel that our present form of government should be retained. I might also add that under our present form of government, a Town Manager can be voted in by petition of ten members, ten voters or it can be put on ballot by petition of the Selectmen. And this is the minority report.

THE MODERATOR. You heard the reports. The motion made that we accept them. What is your pleasure? Any discussion.

MR. DiMARIA. I move that we vote on each item of the recommendation separately.

MR. GARDNER. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of taking up these articles separately as filed by the Study Committee, say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. What is your pleasure on the recommendations or on the motion made by Mr. Myette and seconded?

FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No."

Well, I am not decided. We will have to take a standing vote. All those in favor will rise.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

JUDGE GRINNELL. I move we accept the report and we give the Committee a vote of thanks for their long laborious efforts.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Any further discussion on accepting this report?

Lets try once again. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. MYETTE. The Moderator is directed to request that the seven member town government study committee to continue in office another year for the purpose of presenting to the voters and to the State Legislature, if required, its three recommendations for the merger of the Derry and East Derry Fire Districts, the adoption of Town Manager Plan and adoption of the Representative Town Meeting Government. These three recommendations should be presented to the appropriate voters at the 1972 annual meeting in such a form and have the required hearings and public notices as will permit voters in the appropriate districts to consider formal action on these recommendations. The Moderator is authorized to make any replacements to the Study Committee caused by resignation or otherwise, and the Committee is authorized to spend, if needed, funds which might be available which were created at the 1970 Town Meeting to assist the Committee with its work.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on that?

MR. GAY. Seconded

MR. KIMBALL. Under Article 23.

THE MODERATOR. We will take this Article up because Mr. Kimball is correct. We are on Article 22. Any further business to be taken up under Article 22?

MR. KIMBALL. I move that the reports published in the Town Report be accepted.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor will vote "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and I so declare. We are now under Article 23.

ARTICLE 23: To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

And rather than have Mr. Myette restate his motion, I have got it here before me, you know what it is. It has been made and seconded under Article 23. Any discussion? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

ARTICLE 24: To transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

MR. METTS. I have two things, not in the form of a motion. I would like to hear a better sound system.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BOYCE. I would like to make a motion at this time that the Board of Selectmen be directed to invite the Governor of the State of New Hampshire, the Governor's council, the State of New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission and their Executive Director and his staff to a public meeting to be held in the Town of Derry, New Hampshire for the purpose of trying to finalize the problems facing Derry at this time with regards to the Derry sewer system.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of the motion as made will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Is there any other further business to come before this meeting?

MR. ARTHUR MacGREGOR. I would like to make a resolution to read as follows: Be it resolved that the Town Meeting go on record as being opposed to any State Sales Tax and/or income Taxes; and that any future action regarding same be the subject of a special state referendum held not later than March 15, 1972.

MR. MYETTE. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and I think it was emphatic with the group that is here. It is a lot more than I have seen vote on an article containing thousands of dollars. And to put it flatly, I wouldn't trust that Governor no matter what he was in favor of.

Now we will entertain your motion.

MR. GAY. I move that we give a rising vote of thanks to the Budget Committee.

(Applause)

THE MODERATOR. It is exactly two o'clock.

(Whereupon at 2:00 o'clock a.m. on March 17, 1971, the Annual Town Meeting for the Town of Derry was adjourned.)

### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

#### LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalant on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellarholes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947. Nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let

these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand – a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.

2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.

3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.

4. Most important — Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year -1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

Another officer, hired to replace a man who resigned to become chief of another town's department, is scheduled to attend school in the very near future. A cruiser was added, as well as one being replaced, to bring the total up to three and new radios on the new Rockingham County Sheriff's Department network were obtained for them through the N.H. Crime Commission. There were also four shotguns purchased.

Two hundred and forty-one dollars and thirty-six cents was collected for the Jimmy Fund.

There were seven hundred and eight bicycles registered and five thousand seven hundred and ninety-two dollars taken in on parking violations.

In the area of traffic accidents we had three hundred and fifteen reported on the various highways — this does not include the many that occurred in parking lots.

Below is a breakdown of the five hundred and six cases that were processed in the Derry District Court from arrests made during the year.

#### REPORT OF THE BUILDING INSPECTOR

Construction requirements were upgraded as of April 1971 as follows:

- 3. No fuel oil tanks are permitted in a basement garage.
- 4. Type "L" copper pipes is the minimum requirement for hot and cold water pipe.

#### 1971 ANNUAL REPORT

Now in our eighth year as a year round department we are continuing to serve the citizens of our community with the best program and facilities our budget will allow. If compared to other communities of similar size, the Town of Derry has a lot to offer young and old during spring, summer, fall and winter. We have to rely some what upon the volunteer services of men, women and older teenagers for leadership, supervision and coaches in most of our sports programs.

James Kizer who had served the board of commissioners for many years, some as chairman, resigned and was replaced by Mrs. Camille Brisebois who has participated in town activities for summer and winter. This board meets at least once a month and is responsible for the content and quality of recreation and parks in our community. Selectmen appoint new members to the board each year.

The biggest change in our department was the addition to our staff, on a year round basis, of Mr. F. Donald Ball.

He is a two edged sword, who not only supervises children's activities on the summer playground, autumn flag football and winter basketball, but also acts as head maintenance man and his nany skills both in leadership and building has made him a most valued and popular addition to our department.

Also working on a full time year round basis for the Recreation & Parks Department, we have Gerald H. Cox, director and Mrs. Diane LaPlante in charge of our office, as well as supervising activities for cheerleaders, Sr. Citizens, some dances, community fund, softball, crafts-reation and others.

As our towns' population has risen to new hights of nearly 13,000 our programs and the number of people participating has risen likewise. The greatest increases have been in the areas of hockey, tennis and street hockey. Demands by the public have also been heard about lighting at night those areas, with high use.

The problems on the town's parks have increased in like measure, due to additional usage and an increase in vandalism during the unsupervised hours mainly nights and weekends. These problems precipitated the addition of lights in areas such as MacGregor Park and Hood Park.

A town ordinance was also approved which created a curfew at all town parks and playgrounds from 11 p.m. to 7 p.m. This was done to help eliminate some of the problems both social and physical which have been occuring at these areas.

Another change took place in our program last summer, we added a new playground with summer leaders and an arts & crafts program at A-C. It started slow, but was very active by the end of the season. One of the most interesting facts about the summer participants is the increase of the téenage students in both the swimming and playground activities.

Our success on the playground may be due to the return of all

of last years' leaders, except Mrs. Theriault. On the Hood Playground we had Miss Mary Sullivan as playground leader and Mrs. Dorothy Hines as arts & crafts specialist. In the swim program Mrs. Claudia Ketchum as head of the instructional program. Súsan Putnam, Peter Brassard, Susan Roemer and Mary Putnam taught swimming and also did life guard duty for free swim periods during the afternoons and weekends. Carol Madden taught our mother & tot classes and with the help of volunteer aids she also taught a class for the handicapped children. Sandra Crocker and Melinda Nicholson taught the adult swim classes.

Every year we must thank those people who so generously allow our department into their private swimming pools for the special classes. Thank you Mr. & Mrs. Henry Barrieau, Mr. & Mrs. Ralph Skillin and Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Crocker without your cooperation many children would have been without the opportunity to learn and enjoy swimming.

Improvements in play facilities and equipment include another light at the Martha Moore Multi-purpose Area in Hood Park, as well as basketball backstops at that location. A new set of bleachers was used between Veteran's Field and Buckley Field, these are fiber-glass and portable. Two sets of bleachers were purchased for the new little league facility, Smith Field at Derry Village School, these will be installed in the spring of 72. New fences were also erected for protection of spectators as well as security with abuttors at Veterans Field and around two sides of the tennis courts at Hood Park. At A-C the out run for the slope was extended to the brook and additional parking spaces were created along the road leading into the parking lot. Game courts were also painted on the parking lot beside the ski lodge. Expansion of the space between the parking lot and the brook will continue with fill, so we plan to add lighted horseshoe courts to this facility in the near future.

Program expansion was also realized with some new things for kids to do as well as some adult groups, but all were co-ed and approximately 150 Derry citizens participated in these special groups. 1) Golf classes were taught by Mr. Lee Thurston, pro of Hoodkroft Country Club in preparation for the opening of the states newest links. 2) Summer basketball was popular with Mr. Thomas Saunders, of the Boston Celtics and Mr. Lou D'Allesandro, of the N.H. College giving a clinic and then Mr. Brad Ek supervising a night time league of basketball at Hood Park, a first for the Town of Derry. 3) Snowmobiles are also popular and were organized for the first time as a club in Derry. Mr. Howard Clark is their first president. They hold many weekly activities for those interested, when good conditions prevail. 4) A wreath making class was also conducted for a group of very interested ladies. We started with a few special instructors and finished with local talent who was perfectly capable of continuing. Mrs. Ray Davis (Julie) and Mrs. Diane LaPlante finished the season teaching this class and are already planning to start their next class in September of 72.

As usual, all is not a bed of roses. We have our problems and disappointments too. One continuing concern is still the lack of a public outdoor shooting range which has been pending since 1964. Due to the building addition at Hood we were unable to use the Hood and Grinnell gymnasiums, which seriously curtails the indoor sports programs. Expansion of the Police Department also reduced the size of the Recreation office by 60%. We now operate out of what was once the reception room with limited storage. Our present office is now less than 250 sq. ft. and we

need more space.

Future plans are ambitions, but will reflect the needs and demands of the public. The operation of the old West Side School as a Community Center to benefit everyone is our biggest hope. This center should serve a variety of organizations as well as all age groups, if approved at election time. If not, we intend to negotiate for the use of the Central Fire Station for the operation of the Recreation & Parks Commission programs.

Improvement of facilities to meet the demands of the most popular activities dictates the direction we hope to go in other areas. Adding lighting and fencing at Veterans' Field for softball one of our best attended activities. New tennis courts at Vets Field in the dead center field area, as well as public toilets for that entire sports complex. Color sealer for the present tennis courts at Hood Park and the Martha Moore Multi-purpose Area which is used for basketball, hockey and street hockey. We would also like to complete our hockey boards for this area.

In programs we plan to add something for everyone. Hockey-ice time at an area yet to be built in Manchester, perhaps a team in one of their youth hockey leagues for the girls especially, but boys will be welcome to an archery program at A-C starting sometime in the summer. Horse shoes and new pits with adequate lighting for the fat-an-forty crowd and everyone else interested as well. Another co-ed activity. This time in a high risk sport, junior markmanship, will be offered under competant direction and supervision. They will shoot at an indoor range on English Range Road.

Here is a list of the public Recreation & Parks areas:

#### Alexander-Carr Playground - Pierce Avenue

Lighted ski area, ski jump, ski lodge, no charge for lessons for children on Saturday; Adults—Wednesday nights; Housewives, Tuesday and Thursday mornings; Teenagers—Friday night, Scout camping grounds and hiking trails, "no hunting." Pre-school playground equipment. Supervised summer playground. Fireplaces and picnic tables.

#### MacGregor Park - East Broadway

This is where the library, band shell and war monuments are located. During the summer months a weekly band concert free of charge, on Tuesday evenings. Otherwise its just a place with trees and benches where you can rest or run barefoot in the grass along with the flower children.

#### Hood Park - Rollins Street

Swimming lessons for children and open swim with life guards, tennis-housewives lessons, Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Basketball 3 courts. Summer playground program (5-15) games, arts & crafts, etc. Playground equipment-swings, slides, sand box, merry-go-round, climbers and see-saws. Hockey rink and ice skating, horseshoes, shuffleboard, badmitton, fireplaces and picnic tables.

#### Pinkerton

Hunter Safety Course every autumn, Volleyball for men, Oct.—March.

#### Hood Jr. High

Buckley Field—Chargers, tackle football (12-15), flag football (7-12), teenage baseball (13-16), grasshoppers baseball (7-12), Legion baseball (15-18), girls softball (7-15).

#### Grinnell Gymnasium

Basketball (boys) Dec.—March, Saturday afternoons. Basketball (men) Oct.—March.

#### South Range School

Little League.

#### Derry Village School

Smith Field, Little League, woman's basketball.

I think the Town of Derry is fortunate to have many talented people in a variety of fields of interest, without them our entire Recreation & Parks program would not enjoy the success it presently does. Also a big part of our ability to provide so much for the citizens of this community, is the budget. In 1971 we spent \$39,705.07 of tax funds. From the trustees of trust funds we spent \$1,339.41 at MacGregor Pioneer Park. The trust funds as well as income from user fees, donations and concessions provided us with \$13,856.03 which was spent at Alexander-Carr Playground.

This amounts to a grand total of \$54,900.51.

Speculating the present census to be approximately 13,000 men, women and children, this means the per capita cost, or average amount spent for each individual was \$4.22 (.17 less than last year).

We were also able to save some money by utilizing several young people in our maintenance and playground program from the Neighborhood Youth Corps program where the U.S. Department of Labor paid their wages. Participating in this program were; Danny Julian, Bobby Hills, John Corvo, Bruce Beckford, Ron Kezer, Dolores Menento, Nelan Curtis and Shirley Oikle.

This year we hope to add some work-study college age leaders to our summer program in both maintenance and activities. Last summer the ball fields were maintained by three local high school boys, David Cino, Chuck Johns and Bill Yelland. Also the leaders at the new A-C Playground were new to our family, Bill Rider and Ann Evans.

The Derry Recreation & Parks Commission is a group of 5 citizens who meet monthly. They try to provide activities for as many citizens as they can in the Town of Derry. Their meetings are open to the public and everyone is invited to attend the first Wednesday of the month at 8 p.m. in the Recreation office. We welcome any constructive criticism and will try something new if demands warrant it.

Our regular scheduled activities may usually be found in any of the local papers, or our office is open 9 a.m. - 12 noon and 1 p.m. - 4 p.m., Monday through Friday ready to answer any questions you may have about programs, personal, or facilities.

Cooperation with other town departments hit an all time high in 1971 in my estimation. Due to this we should be able to, at least, keep an even keel on ever increasing demands on facilities and equipment. The Highway and Water Departments have been especially helpful and we appreciate it. With continued cooperation we shall be able to offer a quality program of activities and well maintained facilities for these programs to every citizen in our town.

The Derry Recreation & Parks Commission hopes you will participate in some of our offerings regardless of age or sex, if we don't have what you enjoy, let us know and perhaps we can do something about it.

#### **CIVIL DEFENSE ACTIVITIES FOR 1972**

Activities held this year at the EOC were two seminars for N.H. school teachers held by the State Department of Education.

There was a simulated emergency conducted in the field including auxiliary personnel and hospital personnel and town departments.

Several meetings at the EOC drawing up the town of Derry Emergency Operations Plans with assistance from the University of N.H. This plan was drawn up, approved by the selectmen, and delivered to all town departments and interested persons with the request that they draw up their own emergency plans to be included in the Derry Master Emergency Operations Plan.

The ventilating system was completed allowing us to update the number of personnel allowed in the Emergency Operations Center during emergency operations.

The radio communications in EOC have been updated with the addition of two meter radio equipment.

Several other tests, seminars, and drills were conducted at the EOC, involving 1089 manhours.
