# TOWN WARRANT

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the use of the Town History Committee, or take any other action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 for the Water Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (nine hundred seventy-eight dollars and ninety-seven cents) \$978.97 as our share of the T.R.A. program, and to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to (seven thousand dollars) \$7,000 for a two year program and to raise and appropriate the necessary interest money, or take any other action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the road that runs southerly from the Cavender Road to the Peterborough line where it becomes the Scott-Mitchell Road, or take any other action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two hundred and seventy-two dollars) \$272 to support the mental health service program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Service, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred and forty-seven dollars) \$547 to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc. This local request for financial support is based on a 60¢ per capita formula.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2,000 for the use of the Recreation Committee, or take any other action relating thereto. This sum is to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Recreation Committee or to be added to by gifts of money.

10. To see if the Town will appropriate the principal and interest in the Fire Equipment Reserve Fund and raise, appropriate or borrow (thirteen thousand dollars) \$13,000 to be put with the money raised by public subscription, to purchase a new 2,000 gallon tank truck for the Fire Department or take any other action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will appropriate the principal and interest in the Town Highway Equipment Reserve Fund and from the principal and interest in the Town Highway Reserve Fund a total of (three thousand eight hundred thirty-eight dollars) \$3,838 to purchase a new pick-up truck and plow equipment for the Town Highway Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to accept Reaveley Road and the land set aside as the Recreation Area as shown on the subdivision plan entitled "Reaveley Orchard" dated August 29, 1969 and revised November 25, 1969 if and when the Selectmen determine that this road conforms to the Hancock Subdivision Regulations, or take any other action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to work with them to revalue the property in the Town, and to raise and appropriate (two thousand dollars) \$2,000 for this purpose, or take any other action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Moderator to appoint a committee to determine the best solution for providing additional Town Hall space and to report their recommendations to the next annual Town Meeting, or take any other action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 to purchase additional chairs and racks for the use of the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

16. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.

17. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of a Regional Planning Commission to be organized, and that a committee of two residents and taxpayers be appointed to represent the Town on said Commission, or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to change the time of the Town Meeting from the afternoon to the evening, commencing at seven o'clock, or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To hear a preliminary report from the Dump Study Committee, to extend its term an additional year, and to take any other action relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Conservation Commission, or take any other action relating thereto, this sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Commission or to be added to by gifts of money.

21. To see what action the Town wishes to take, and what sum of money the Town wishes to raise and appropriate, to provide ambulance service for the Town.

22. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 to replace the present wooden raft at Norway Pond with a 12 x 12 aluminum raft, or take any action relating thereto.

23. To see if the Town will vote to designate as scenic roads, under provisions of RSA 253:17, Old Dublin Road from Main Street to the Harrisville town line; and King's Highway from Route 137 to the terminus of said King's Highway at Lake Nubanusit, or take any other action relating thereto.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

26. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF THE NEW EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE

In the interest of improved fire fighting equipment for the town of Hancock, there are many factors which must be considered—such as, available man power, types and location of property, available water sources, and any other special hazards. Now taking all this into consideration, we must have equipment capable of maximum efficiency with a minimum of man power. During the day time many of our men work out of town somewhat reducing our initial attack man power. Considering that a very large percentage of our town's valuation isn't very close to readily accessible water supplies during the entire year, it becomes necessary to carry our water to the fire ground.

Admittedly, we have mutual aid from our neighboring towns but this takes time. We must make a strong first attack with our own units if the mutual aid units are to be truly beneficial to help your fire department save the life and property of Hancock.

This is why the committee recommends the purchase of a tank truck. This truck should be capable of carrying large amounts of water, and should also be able to be used as a pumper. It is recommended that we have a tank truck capable of carrying 2,000 gallons of water and being able to pump 750 gallons of water per minute.

HANCOCK CONSERVATION COMMISSION  
ANNUAL REPORT 1971

In April the Commission sponsored the annual tin can pick up. This year 12 trucks and 67 adults and teenagers spent most of one afternoon cleaning up the roadsides. A grateful town expresses its thanks.

Also in the spring we repeated the weeding out of undergrowth in the mouth of Moose Brook where it flows into Norway Pond in order to improve the circulation of water in the pond.

In May the Commission, in the person of Ernest Adams and Anthony Brown, constructed a foot bridge over Davis Brook near Old Dublin Road to replace a previous bridge which had rotted away.

In June we provided a scholarship for one camper at the Spruce Pond Conservation Camp at Bear Brook State Park.

The Commission is indebted to Anthony Brown for the construction of a case for our aerial survey maps of Hancock which are now available to the general public at the Town Library.

We express our thanks to Robert and Sylvia St. John for



their permission to use their land for access to the Cranberry Bog from Kimball Road.

In response to a letter from the Commission Dr. Henry Thatcher has conveyed to the Town twelve acres in the Jugger-naut Pond area including a substantial length of shore line.

In a letter to the federal study commission we have expressed our opposition to the proposed East-West Highway in southern New Hampshire.

The commission has acquired a supply of pocket size maps of Hancock which are available without charge to residents and visitors. The larger maps are still available at 50 cents each.

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### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY

"I'll see you at the library" is the order of the day on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday afternoons and now Friday evenings from 7 to 8:30 as well. The new hours were added in November in accordance with a recommendation of the Statewide Library Development Program. The Library is now open a total of fifteen hours a week.

New this year was a much appreciated six weeks summer story hour at the beach. Doris Rogers and Frances Russ read to separate groups of children each Tuesday between the swimming lessons.

Doris Rogers reads to the pre-schoolers in the library every other week, and also reads to the first and second graders during the school year, taking books from the library to the school. The third, fourth, fifth and six graders continue to come to the library for regularly scheduled visits.

Much interest has been shown in the colorful exhibits in the new display case purchased from Merton Dyer. Louisa Fairfield's hand carved painted wooden figures especially attracted attention.

With regret the trustees accepted the resignation of Harriet Hampson as children's librarian. Flora Frank was chosen to fill the position. Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Paquette are the new custodians, replacing Everett Hersey, who has moved away. The library at all times presents an inviting spic and span appearance.

Area artists have been represented with monthly shows in the library art gallery, thus providing another source of cultural enrichment to our patrons. Through July the displays were arranged by Gladys Rockhill. Since then Sally Hamilton has been the art director.

Insurance on the library building and contents was increased and is now included in a Group Policy arrangement pertaining to all town properties. Minor repairs to the book drop, electrical wiring, water pipes, and fireplace bricks have been directed by Harry Casler.

We are very grateful for the many memorial and gift books

donated during the year. The conservation committee has loaned a number of aerial views of Hancock labeled and protected in a case made by Lester Fogg.

The trustees appreciate the favorable comments received during the year and are always open to suggestions as to more or better ways in which the library may serve its patrons.

PROPOSED REPORT OF THE  
DUMP STUDY COMMITTEE

At the 1971 Town Meeting, the Moderator was authorized to appoint a five-member Dump Study Committee, this Committee to study "the problems of the present town dump, possible arrangements for combining efforts with other towns on a dump, and to report to the Town Meeting in 1972 with recommendations."

During 1971, Committee members devoted substantial time to familiarizing themselves with the full range of methods for solid waste disposal, including those in the experimental stage as well as those in actual operation. This was achieved by contacting federal, state, and local officials; reading many publications; viewing several films; talking with executives of corporations in the solid-waste disposal field, and traveling to other towns for a firsthand look at various incineration and landfill techniques.

Concurrently, the Committee explored the possible options for solid-waste disposal that are, as a practical matter, available to the Town. This is a task in which the Committee is still engaged. In this regard, the Committee has studied the problems of the current dump, the potential of the current dump for conversion into an acceptable site for future solid waste disposal, other possible disposal sites located within the Town, and the feasibility of sharing a dump with other towns. At year-end, these studies were still in progress and the Committee does not anticipate issuing recommendations at the 1972 Town Meeting because, among other factors, key information about some of the possible solid-waste options will not become available to the Committee until after the 1972 Meeting.

Through notices in the *Transcript*, among other means, the Committee has encouraged comments and ideas from Hancock residents. We continue to encourage such views.

MONADNOCK FAMILY AND  
MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE

During the 12 month period from October 1, 1970, through September 30, 1971, 5 families were referred to Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service from Hancock.

Services provided involved 10 adults and 3 children and included family treatment, psychiatric treatment, group and individual therapy. More than 37 direct treatment hours, provided by professional staff, were involved in this treatment, exclusive of consultation services and services of a general community nature.

Estimated cost of services provided to Hancock residents exceeds \$740. Families receiving services paid a total of \$41 in fees based on ability to pay. During this year, voluntary contributions total \$25. An allocation of \$272 was voted at Hancock's annual town meeting, 1971.

This combined total of \$327, together with the Community Mental Health grant from the State of New Hampshire, provided the total increase necessary for the provision of services to Hancock residents.

City and town governmental aid, along with voluntary contributions, State aid, and fees based on ability to pay, provide the support for the \$125,000 budget necessary to make these services available.

In 1972, the Agency received \$60,000 as a State grant for Mental Health services. This was made possible through the provision of local matching funds in the form of city and town allocations and voluntary contributions. Continuing local contributions as a matching requirement are a prerequisite for increased State aid for our services.

## HANCOCK 1971

Up pop more houses on Prospect Hill, Norway Hill, the North Road and elsewhere. Nothing to be seen in Hancock would suggest that this was the year that Honeywell, which at one time employed a thousand, would close its doors, as did the Hancock Tool Factory (30) owned by Fansteel. Sylvania substantially reduced its work force. There was a slowdown in the national economy, the dollar was devalued in August and a price freeze came into effect, with a hint of more controls from Washington to come.

Nothing in 1971 suggested that the growth of Hancock or the nature of our life here was not going to change still more. Yet much of the best in small town life is being preserved with the newcomers among those seeking to cling to the best of oldtime customs.

It seems as if our various organizations are ever more vital. The Woman's Club had a noteworthy display of local talent at Christmas. Among those active in this project were: Elsie Lyon, Ruth Lessey, Olive Rhines, Mildred Upton, Mabel Reaveley, Romney Weston, Frances Tripp, Lois Daloz, Mary Hibbard, Edith Bainton, Joan Kunhardt and Helen Troesch.

The Guild was up to things too. Pat Newcomb is the new president backed up, among others, by Fran Russ, June Chandler, and Gloria Neary. More members showed up at the Men's Club Meetings. Thirty member of the Adams family held a reunion. Church services were well attended as Rev. Thomas' sermons continued noteworthy.

The Recreation Committee, also going full steam ahead, was the recipient of loam for the Little League baseball field from F. J. McGregor in the north end of Town. The new member was Mert Knowles.

It's really something to keep track of all the activities these days. Everyone knows that Russ and Shirley Johnson of Weston, Massachusetts (he formerly with the Mitre Corp.) are running the general store, which the Tremblays had for so many years, and Jim Wilhelm for a short time. The store means a lot to us for its convenience and as a place to meet friends and neighbors.

1971 was the year direct dialing of toll calls came into being. Only a few short years ago, the Evas retired and the telephone exchange, so much a part of our rural life, was taken over by the impersonal dial system.

The national decline in law and order was mirrored in

Hancock by selecting Bruce Skinner as our first fulltime police chief. His wife Virginia is a niece of Howard and Doris Rogers.

A noteworthy change was Perley Dunbar taking over from Charlie Gleason as Fire Chief. Perley has had special training courses at Meadowood and at Monadnock College. Since then this leadership has passed to Foster Avery. Charlie remains active in the department as well as in his garage. His services to various aspects of our town life are outstanding.

It is an interesting tidbit that at Town Meeting 40 different people spoke; four persons spoke four times, five spoke five times and one eight times. At the Conval school election in Peterborough there was an interesting contest between Arnold Greene and Marian Harrington.

The old High School building so long largely neglected is now a community center and the home of the selectmen, the town clerk, the checklist supervisors and naturally, the tax collector. It also is a meeting place for various town organizations.

Somewhere in these reports is usually included some remarks about the weather which has interest because of its extreme variety. The winter of 1971 had plenty of cold, but it was a record breaker as far as snow was concerned. Besides records, it broke some rafters. Snow banks by the side of the road were seven feet high in the village. The weather prompted an ode by poet John Farrar. It may have helped Bob Fish, our rural mail carrier to shoot a wildcat close to his home. It probably didn't improve business for Mildred Phelps and Phyllis Shattuck's successful Status Thimble or Harrison Kendall's frame shop.

During storms and at other times Louisa Fairfield whittles charming figures which have attracted Statewide attention. Some of us remember years ago when she produced a scale model of the Meeting House in delicious white frosted cake large enough for almost everyone in Town to have a taste. It makes me hungry just to think about it.
