## REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF

This was another busy year for us on the Fire Department. We were called out for:

- 10 Structure fires
- 8 EMT calls
- 4 Chimney fires
- 2 Car accidents
- 2 False alarms
- 1 Brush fire permit violation
- 1 Smoke investigation
- 1 Stand by

I would like to explain here that in lieu of a personal letter to each home, this year, we are going to combine it and the town report together. If you would rather have received the letter, I would like to hear from you.

Our training this year encompassed trips to Meadowood training center for fire fighters, a ventilation and forcible entry course, and a special cold weather fire school in Hanover.

The Meadowood training is an on-going program of fire fighting and fire prevention. It is one of our most valuable tools.

The ventilation course was taught by Chief Sullivan (Skip) of the Claremont Fire Dept. He is a State certified fire instructor. This was accomplished in several evenings at our station, with buildings here in the village serving as examples. Ventilation of fire involved buildings is extremely important, and it must be done right. A great deal of knowledge can be gleaned from a man with the experience in fire fighting such as Chief Sullivan has.

The Cold Weather Regions Fire School was held in Hanover, N. H. This course gave us a different twist on the operation of apparatus and personnel in cold weather. I would say that the highlight to this school was Ray Labbe lugging Bruce Cheeney around in a 20 below zero freezer room with full gear on, including breathing apparatus. In tight competition with this, would be several firemen and instructors, falling through the ice into shallow water, because there were a few too many demonstration holes cut in the ice. Well, live and learn.

In addition to the above mentioned classes, we had eleven people complete a Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation course. I hope this will be the first of several courses involving basic life support. Fire Depts. everywhere are becoming more deeply involved in this field because they are the best equipped organization to handle it. This is due to the manpower, radio communications, and availability of training, among other reasons. It also ties in with the fact that the fire dept. normally handles extrication in car accidents. We need more equipment to handle this aspect of our job. Right here, I would like to say

that to save the village some excess expense, I am asking that anyone who has some articles in excess, and who can afford to, donate them to the dept.

1. Canvas tarp
2. Warm blankets (Army type are real good)
3. 2 lb. hand sledge hammer
4. Vise grips
5. Hacksaw
6. Screw drivers, large and small (phillips and straight)
7. Hydraulic jack
8. Bolt cutters
9. Linemans pliers
10. Come a longs
11. ¼ in. or 3/8 in. link chains
12. Spring loaded center punch

If you would like to donate any items, please call 835-2365.

I would like to add that during the course of the year we attended car accidents, motorcycle accidents, a fall from heights onto rocks in Cold River, heart attacks, fractured bones, and various calls here in town. We have six Emergency Medical technicians available and on call for you. The firemen also respond for assistance. The same telephone number which you use for fires, 352-1100, is also to be used for medical calls. Help is only minutes away. Just dial it and give the 24 hour dispatchers, the location and nature of the call. Also, try to give the house number when possible.

Now I have to mention that we need more portable pagers (monitors) for alerting our men to emergencies. These have been purchased the last two years and they are the best thing that ever happened to a volunteer fire fighter. It is a real pleasure to sleep soundly until your own tone is dispatched. Formerly we had to listen to every emergency and fire from thirty or so towns. Just ask any fireman who is lucky enough to have one, or his wife and family what the difference is. They certainly help to preserve the peace.

I also hope that you will see fit to let us finish buying our turn-out gear this year. This is the third and last year for this project. After this year our personal gear should be complete, or very nearly so. At that time, I would recommend that plans be made to obtain a pumper with a 750 GPM pump and 750 gallon booster tank. It would also carry two story ladders, which we can't carry now. This would give us more ability to knock down fires and take some of the load off of our present attack truck, which is getting over-loaded.

A couple of other projects that should be mentioned are that the firemen put a new roof on the station this year. All it cost the town was the materials. All the labor was provided by the firemen and several interested townspeople. Those people being Lennie Mignault,

Rene Venne and Mike Monahan. In one weekend we stripped the old shingles, put on new ones, painted the doors, cupola, and trim on the station. Everett Adams was Straw Boss on this job.

Another project which we would like to continue each year is the work on the water holes. Doug Beach donated his time and equipment this year to dig out two water holes for us. For this we are grateful.

With the help of the Mutual Aid Chief, Bob Callihan, we were able to bring the pre-plan for the Fall Mountain School up to date and involve all of the new equipment of the other towns. This is important because the potential of confusion is so great when a building with the occupation hazard and size of F.M.R.H.S. is involved. With the help of an up to date pre-plan, we will try to maintain a semblance of order should a serious fire occur there.

If you have any questions that we can help you with regarding the dept., all you have to do is call.

I will end with the annual appeal for volunteers. We always need more men, and you are more than welcome.

**FALL MOUNTAIN VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION  
ANNUAL REPORT TO THE TOWN OF LANGDON**

Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association is requesting from each of its towns in 1980 the same amount of support received in 1979. The amount for Langdon, calculated on a per capita basis for Langdon's population is \$1,394.00

In 1979 the VNA provided services to 26 residents of Langdon (6.1% of the total population). The services included home visits for skilled nursing and occupational therapy and clinic services that included free flu vaccinations and screening for hypertension, diabetes, liver and kidney disorders and bowel cancer.

The VNA has felt the inflation pinch along with everyone else. However, a number of factors have helped the agency to contain expenses that must be supported by the town:

- A larger volume of services helps to reduce cost per unit of service.
- The agency has received two small grants from the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health to help subsidize programs that previously the towns were requested to support.
- West Central Community Mental Health Services will be helping to pay for mental health services that the VNA previously had no reimbursement for.
- The agency plans to continue searching for alternative sources of income in an effort to reduce the burden for local taxpayers.

The VNA appreciates the community support it receives and will continue to insure that its program is a worthwhile investment.

## CHARLESTOWN CHILDREN & YOUTH PROJECT

Children are enrolled up to age 5 and receive services until their 14th birthday.

The C. & Y. Project strives to assure the very best physical, social and emotional development of each child. Health services are provided by a multidisciplinary team consisting of a physician, nurse coordinator, nutritionist, social worker, clerk and health aide.

Emphasis is placed on preventive health care to limit potentially disabling childhood diseases. For example, early treatment of ear infections can prevent later deafness; early treatment of strep infections can prevent rheumatic fever, and kidney disease. Preventive health care includes physicals, immunizations, guidance in emotional and physical development, nutrition counselling, dental screening and health education. In addition to routine clinic services, the C. & Y. Project provides treatment services to those children who are eligible. Treatment services include medications, diagnostic and laboratory services, dental treatment and physicians visits.

### Funding:

The Children & Youth Project is funded by Title V of the Social Security Act and State matching funds through the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health in the New Hampshire Division of Public Health Services.

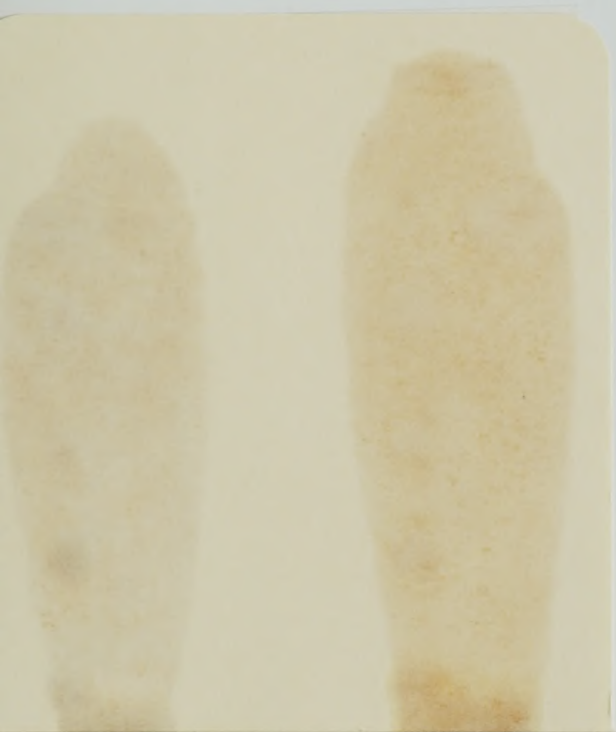
