## WARRANT.

---

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lebanon on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

2d. To choose three Selectmen, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

3rd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways for the ensuing year.

5th. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

6th. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to issue bonds under the provisions of the "Municipal Bond Act" of 1895, to cover the indebtedness of the town incurred in consequence of the building of the iron bridge over the Connecticut river at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

7th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum, not exceeding three hundred dollars, for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.

8th. To see if the town will vote to refinish the interior of the Town Hall, and refit the stage and appropriate money therefor.

9th. To hear the report of the Auditors and the School Board of the Town School District.

10th. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.

11th. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of the Justice of the Police Court, or act thereon.

12th. To see if the town will make a discount in the charges for the use of the Town Hall, for the occasional use of the religious societies in town.

Of the cases of Typhoid Fever six were manifestly contracted outside of the town.

Many complaints have been made to the Board concerning sink-spouts, privies, etc., all of which were duly noticed.

The malodorous spot on Mechanic street has disappeared by the construction of a sewer to the river. There are other places in the village which would be benefitted by sewers, but the construction would be difficult and expensive. The Board has used and furnished for use large quantities of disinfectants for those places.

It is pleasant to note in the past year that the births have exceeded the deaths. Births reported, 98, the largest number ever reported. Deaths, 72. The county or town in which deaths are in excess of births has an unpromising outlook.

## REPORT

## GLENWOOD CEMETERY COMMITTEE.

In the past year more improvements have been made than in any previous year. Considerable work was done on the piece of land near the tomb, in fencing, draining, etc. The land bought of F. B. Kendrick has been fenced and partly cleared; one new section of road has been opened and graded. A great improvement has been made in the appearance of the roads by cutting out the grass in the centers and straightening the sides. Considerable blasting was done near the circle so that it could be graded. The grading of the circle was finished and stocked down. Quite a large amount of work was done in the westerly part of the cemetery in digging up the big pine stumps, plowing and harrowing, and getting it in shape to lay out in lots. An addition has been built on to the building to give more room for tools and storage. A water meter was purchased and a brick cistern built for it. Last year we had two small flower gardens, the people seemed to enjoy them so much that we have added two or three more. Under Mr. Williams' care we had some of the finest pansies, astors, and other flowers ever seen in town. We think that fifty dollars would cover the entire cost of seeds, plants, bulbs, and caring for them. Two years ago comparatively few people visited the cemetery;

and we seldom sold a lot except for immediate use. The last part of last summer and early fall there were but few pleasant days when there were not from a dozen to several hundred people in the cemetery during the day, and comparatively few of the lots sold were for immediate use. The lot owners have taken very much more interest in having their lots look well.

THE OLD CEMETERY COMMITTEE.

---

The Village Cemetery was raked over in the spring, the rubbish cleaned up, and was mowed twice during the season. Last year a part of the foot-stones were removed and it added so much to the appearance of the cemetery we decided to remove the rest. The cemetery is more easily cared for, and we think it looks much better. In a good many cemeteries only one stone is allowed to a grave.

The posts at the entrance near the church have been straightened up and trimmed, adding much to their appearance. The fence back of the sheds was so near them that the space made a catchall for rubbish, so we have removed it and cleaned up the rubbish and bushes. The evergreen trees have been trimmed. Quite a number of head stones have been straightened up and re-set in brimstone. The people seemed to enjoy the flowers so much in Glenwood Cemetery that we have started several new beds in the Village Cemetery.

THE CEMETERY NEAR DEACON COLE'S.

This cemetery has been put in very good order except the fence which needs some new posts and should be painted.

## THE CEMETERY AT EAST LEBANON.

We have re-set quite a number of stones in brimstone and straightened up others. The remainder of the stones should be straightened up. A new gate should be hung, and the fence put in good order. Elisha Payne, who was at one time Lt. Governor of Vermont and prominent in the early affairs of the town, is buried in this cemetery.

## THE CEMETERY AT WEST LEBANON.

This cemetery has been kept up in the past the best of the old cemeteries of the town. The committee during the past season have re-set and straightened up quite a number of stones. The evergreen trees that were in the way of the road when covered with snow have been trimmed. If running water could be introduced into this cemetery so that flowers could be planted, and the lots that are lawn-mowed could be kept green, it would add much to the appearance of the cemetery.

## THE OLD CEMETERY NEAR MISS ALDEN'S.

This cemetery needs quite an amount of work to put it in proper order. The stones should be straightened up, the remainder of the bushes cut, and a new fence built part way around it. A good many of the early fathers of the town and revolutionary soldiers are buried here. It was the intention of the committee to do quite an amount of work the past season in this cemetery, but we found it difficult to obtain good help in September and October, and we had promised to grade quite a number of lots, and so did not get to it.

The committee would say in conclusion that three hundred dollars ought to be appropriated each year for the six cemeteries, that makes only an average of fifty dollars for each cemetery. Glenwood cemetery alone

contains about twenty acres, with quite an amount of roads which have to be kept up. We think the cemeteries of the town can be kept in very good order with this amount of money, in addition to what is received from other sources; and this is not a large sum for a town the size of Lebanon. Last year seven hundred and sixty-six dollars were spent in the cemeteries of the town in putting them into proper order and for permanent improvements.
