THE TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for interest on same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,560.00 for Northwood Public Libraries.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,020.00 for Recreation, Parks and Playgrounds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Band Concerts.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$240.00 for the Care of Cemeteries.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,540.00 for the purpose of Street Lighting.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$688.35 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$4,589.02.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to be used in addition to the joint T.R.A. fund.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$376.00 for the Concord Hospital.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Ambulance Service, to be paid to the Barnstead Center Fire Department.

14. To see if the Town will vote to join the Rural District Health Council, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,454.00.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Control of Pine Blister Rust.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of establishing a Capital Reserve Fund to acquire Highway Construction Machinery.

17. To see if the Town will vote to sell the old Northwood Narrows Fire Truck to the Greater Lowell Council of Boy Scouts of America for the sum of \$1.00.

18. To see if the Town will vote to give the Northwood Historical Society permission to leave the Shoe Shop on Town property for the year 1969.

19. To see if the Town will vote to close the road beginning on the south side of the Mountain Road opposite the house of Mary Colcord Heirs and running southerly by the west side of the house owned by William A. and Phyllis Leighton to Route 43.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's deeds as the result of tax sales.

21. Should the time of the business meeting of the Annual Town Meeting be changed to 7:30 in the evening of the Annual Town Meeting Day, to permit voters who work during the day to attend this meeting. (By Petition).

22. Should the Town of Northwood restrict the number of elective offices that can be held by one individual to one, provided that any individual holding more than one elective office as of 2 April 1969 be permitted to serve the full Statutory Term of each office held as of that date. (By Petition).

23. Should the Town of Northwood, beginning in 1970, prohibit any one individual from filing for, or seeking election to, more than one elective office on the same Town Ballot. (By Petition).

24. To see if the Town will vote to restrict all Town Officers in their present office for not more than two (2) consecutive terms. However, if no person has filed with the Town Clerk in opposition to above stated offices, the above mentioned officers may file for re-election (By Petition).

25. To see if the Town of Northwood will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for the purpose of publishing the property tax report, for all parcels of property in the Town of Northwood, N. H., as of April 1, 1969. To be published as follows:

1. Name of owner, acreage or size of lot (Parcel), building, assessed value and taxes.
2. That all property owners receive a copy of this report. (By Petition).

26. To transact any other business that legally may come before said Meeting.

In September of 1968, seven new faculty members joined the teaching staff at Northwood Elementary School. Mrs. Louise Parker replaced Mrs. Judith Towle in grade 1; Mrs. Christine Ching replaced Mrs. Mabel LaFrambois in grade 4; Mrs. Paula McAllister replaced Mrs. Muriel Allen in grade 5; Mrs. Elizabeth Parks replaced Mrs. Carolyn Kinsman in grade 6; Mr. Ching replaced Mr. John Tent in grade 7; Mrs. Juanita Parker replaced Mr. Edward Camp in grade 8 and as Principal; and Mr. James Martell replaced Mrs. Margaret Ewert in Music.

In July and August a summer reading program under the direction of Mrs. Susan Barry and Mrs. Margaret Roberts, funded by Federal Funds under Title 1, operated for six weeks accommodating approximately 30 students who needed remedial help in reading. The assessment and evaluation of this program suggest serious consideration for a full time remedial reading program.

GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS

The following suggestions are based on the current thoughts of the principal and the superintendent's office, with consideration given to the request of the Chairman of the School Board, Mrs. Grace Parsons.

A. Staff additions and modifications:

1. A full time supervising principal to handle the growing workload, and to provide adequate supervision of the staff. This might be phased in with a part time administrator free from teaching duties in the morning.
2. A full time custodian is needed to keep the building in proper maintenance and repair.
3. Additional health services: this could be done by employing a teacher-nurse two days per week in lieu of one day per week.

4. A full time remedial reading teacher, provided that adequate space is available.

5. A modified physical education program including an inter-school athletic program in basketball, baseball and soccer.

B. Building Needs:

1. In view of the constantly increasing school population in Northwood, and the present crowded situation, the following additions are recommended.

a. The equivalent of a four room addition including a nurse's office, a library or resource center, and additional storage space.

C. Recommendations to the School Board:

1. The adoption and maintenance of a suitable, realistic, competitive salary schedule, especially with the view of keeping good staff members, and attracting experienced replacements.

2. A written and approved statement of all school board policies for the guidance of the staff, administration, and future members of the board.

3. Up-dating the curriculum by exploring the possibilities of initiating an ungraded system in the lower grades as a first phase, and replacing existing text books as needs require.

4. An in-service training program for teachers in subject matter geared to the need of the community. This could be shared with neighborhood towns.

5. A philosophy of providing a quality education for all of the children of Northwood and getting the utmost value per dollar spent.

In closing, the undersigned should like to express their appreciation of the cooperation they have received

from local citizens, school board, students and professional staff. During the days ahead we will appreciate, as in the past, your continued cooperation in the best interest of a good educational program.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

As part of the school health services for the year 1967-68, all elementary pupils in Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford received routine health inspections by the school nurse.

This type of inspection includes weighing, measuring, checking teeth and tonsils, checking hair and scalp for the presence of head lice or any infectious condition and doing screening tests to determine if a child has any vision or hearing handicap.

Whenever defects were found, the parents were informed. This is ordinarily done by means of a note, letter or telephone call although in many cases a home call is made by the nurse. Parents have been very cooperative in having such defects corrected, as is shown in the following summary:

A series of three immunization clinics was held in the fall of 1967 in both Barrington and Strafford. Sylvia Kennedy, M.D. of Exeter was the physician in attendance. The clinics were jointly sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Public Health and local organizations — the Barrington Woman's Club and the Strafford Parent-Teachers Association.

For the first time, all five towns participated in either the Matching Funds Dental Program (which provides for filling and/or extracting teeth) or the Prophylactic

Dental Program for having teeth cleaned and topical fluoride solution applied. Both programs are co-sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Dental Public Health and by one or more local organizations. Epsom and Northwood again had both programs, and it is to be hoped that these will soon become an established part of the health program in each town.

The health education film "The Story of Menstruation" was shown to the majority of the girls in grades 5 through 8 in each school. This was well received and will be repeated annually for the 5th and 6th grade girls.

Referrals made by the nurse included one to New Hampshire Department of Public Welfare for custodial care of a child, three to New Hampshire Crippled Children's Service, four to Mental Health Centers for psychological evaluation and one to Camp Lincoln. Vision examinations and glasses were provided for two children — one paid for by the Concord Chapter of the Lions Club and the other by the Nottingham Chapter of the American Red Cross.

A total of 103 home calls was made, and 198 first-aid cases were cared for by the nurse. Transportation was provided to Pittsfield, Rochester, Dover, Concord and Manchester in order for certain children to receive medical care.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, Mr. Morgan, members of the School Boards, the townspeople who sponsored and assisted in carrying out health programs, and the school children for their help and cooperation.
