

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Richmond, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges in addition to the amount required by law.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$351.00; the State to give the sum of \$1,682.84.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on all taxes paid in full within 30 days of date of invoice.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

- 9. To see if the Town will petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and make an appropriation to cover expense of such audit.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23.00 for publicity.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed \$1,800.00, for the construction of a building to house road machinery and fire-fighting equipment.
- 13. To hear the reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen or take action relating thereto.
- 14. To take any other action on any matter that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

To the voters of the Town of Richmond:

In addition to the information which may be gleaned from the financial report of the town, which follows, the Board of Selectmen wish to take this opportunity to call your attention to the following:

During the past year the Board has sincerely tried to meet regularly and promptly at the prescribed time in order that anyone who had matters which he wished to discuss with the members could do so with a minimum of inconvenience to himself. The meetings were held in the Selectmen's room where all of the town books, payrolls of the various town departments, the State Auditor's report etc. were at hand and available for examination by any who might be interested in any details not carried in the Town Report.

The Board has emphasized and been active in attempting to get as much of the property owned by the town as possible, back into the hands of individuals so that it may again appear on the tax rolls.

During this wartime period, when the mere fact of being alive imposes so much of a strain on the time and energies of all of us, the Board wishes to express appreciation to the townspeople for their cooperation with the civilian defense committee and to thank Mr. Dickinson and his committee for their efforts in trying to prepare the town for any eventualities which might result from the war. Especially, the efforts of Mr. Nelsen and his salvage committee in gathering and disposing of scrap material, merits appreciation since the money received from the sale of that material was offered to the town to be used for additional fire protection and accepted by the Board.

The following paragraph appears in the report of the audit and examination of the accounts of the Town made by the State Tax Commission:

"Balance Sheet: In the printed report of the Town for the year ending January 31, 1942, the Balance Sheet which appears on pages 11 and 12, is not made up in accordance with the uniform method as prescribed by this Division. Included, therein, in the statement of assets are the items 'Town Property—\$7,300' and 'Land Acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds—\$5,650'. As neither of these items should have been included the total assets were overstated by the amount of \$12,950, resulting in a reported 'surplus' of \$7,003.26, when actually there was a 'Net Debt' as indicated by the 'Revised Balance Sheet' included in 'Schedule C' of this report. It is recommended that in the future the two items herein referred to be eliminated from the Balance Sheet and included in the 'Schedule of Town Property' where they rightfully belong."

The Board discussed the matter at length. Apparently the Tax Commission views the matter from the standpoint that the items referred to cannot be liquidated and consequently are not assets. The matter may, however, be viewed from the angle that the buildings under discussion are a necessity and would require the expenditures of considerable sums of money should they have to be replaced. Since they answer the purpose for which they were designed and do away with the necessity of spending sums of money to replace them, it appeared to the Board that they constitute a very tangible asset. In the case of "Land Acquired from Tax Collector's Deeds" the situation seems to be even more cleancut. From time to time the Town sells some of this property and realizes certain sums of money therefrom as is evidenced by the report entitled "Receipts". When a person has something to sell and occasionally sells some of it, the Board holds that what he has to sell is an asset and that the same principal must hold in regard to the Town.

REPORT OF CIVILIAN DEFENSE AND PUBLIC SAFETY CHAIRMAN

To the Citizens of Richmond:

Several of the general committee feel that a report should be made concerning our activities, and the expenditures made thus far in following out, and endeavoring to cooperate with the rules and regulations issued by the State Committee.

In chronological order, we have the following to report. On April 3, last, the selectmen, chief air raid warden and I met in Keene to have a siren demonstrated to us at the Perkins Machine Company plant. We were impressed by its simplicity and effectiveness, and were allowed to bring it here to try out, which was done Saturday April 4th, and Sunday, April 5th.

Observers were sent to distant points to find out how far the signals carried. Every occupied house in town was reached in the tests, and was heard clearly in Fitzwilliam and Royalston.

A meeting of the sub-chairmen was immediately called and it was voted to place an order for a siren of the same size and power as the one tested. This was brought down May 6th, and on May 24th and 25th a concrete base was constructed near the Observation Post on land donated by W. W. Hinds. These volunteers put in a decidedly hard day and consisted of Ralph Whitney, Jesse Hood, Arthur Stinson, Henry Ballou, Charles Abbott, Henry Hood, Leon Amidon, Alonzo Bowen and Harold Dickinson.

Several bags of cement were donated by Mr. Whitney, and Mr. Hinds donated the use of his truck to draw gravel, etc., and Arthur Stinson donated the use of a concrete mixer. Not being able to be present, William Shinn, Jr. donated \$5.00.

On June 1st, the tower was constructed by Iva H. Ballou and crew of Keene, and the siren was mounted the following day. Following this, Mr. Whitney and Mr. Hood were appointed a sub-committee with powers to purchase a suitable truck

that could be outfitted for use as a fire truck. A truck has been secured, but no further action taken, awaiting the arrival of a pump, to be mounted on the truck. This pump was voted at a meeting of the general committee on August 24th, the delay being because of the necessity of slow process of following up red tape in getting the order through. A supply of small fire fighting equipment has also been purchased at a modest cost, and is stored in easily accessible boxes at the Four Corners.

As a town, we have participated in all night-time county wide black-out tests, and with few exceptions, the defense officials have received excellent cooperation. The few violators have been given friendly advice as to the possible penalties of non-cooperation, and we hope there will not be a recurrence. To those who have so faithfully cooperated, we, upon whom the responsibility of total blackout rests, wish to express our thanks.

When the new pump arrives and the truck is equipped as is now planned, this committee recommends that a fire department be organized, a few men be trained so that our efforts in fire fighting be efficient, and that orders come from a recognized and responsible head. Without such training and head no group of men, however willing, will work to best advantage. Some may feel that a continuation of defense activities is needless and a waste of time, but knowing that Hitler's Germany has constructed airplanes with a cruising range of 7,000 miles, this committee feels that it is better to be prepared and never be called upon in a real raid, than to let down and be caught napping.

We ask your continued whole-hearted support and cooperation until our boys have their job finished and head for home.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Richmond:

I have the honor to submit my fifth annual report.

TEACHERS: The Richmond schools opened in September with Mrs. Stone returning to North Richmond but a replacement was necessary at the Four Corners School as Miss Della Greenly resigned. To take her place, the School Board elected Miss Viola Fenton of Westminster, Vermont. Miss Fenton is a graduate of Castleton, Vermont, Normal School and has had extensive experience in schools of Vermont and New Hampshire. The work of both teachers in the Richmond schools is to be highly commended.

TRANSPORTATION: The School Board, this year, was able to consolidate the transportation routes into one route and engaged Mr. Howard Baird of Richmond as conveyor. All the pupils transported to attend the Four Corners School.

INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES: Special attention is being given this year to Spelling and Arithmetic in all the grades, and as a result of standard tests given in the fall, a definite program has been arranged in order to improve the attainments in these fields.

WAR SAVINGS STAMPS AND BONDS: The purchase of war saving stamps and bonds started last year has continued with enthusiasm through the months of this year with a great deal of success.

RATIONING PROGRAM: All of the teachers, a few of the high school students, as well as numerous out-of-school volunteers have participated in issuing ration books for sugar, gasoline, fuel oil and kerosene during the past spring and summer and are again to participate in the distribution of War Ration Book No. 2 during the week beginning February 22.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the pupils and teachers, to the School Board and to the parents and patrons of our schools for their loyalty and cooperation.
