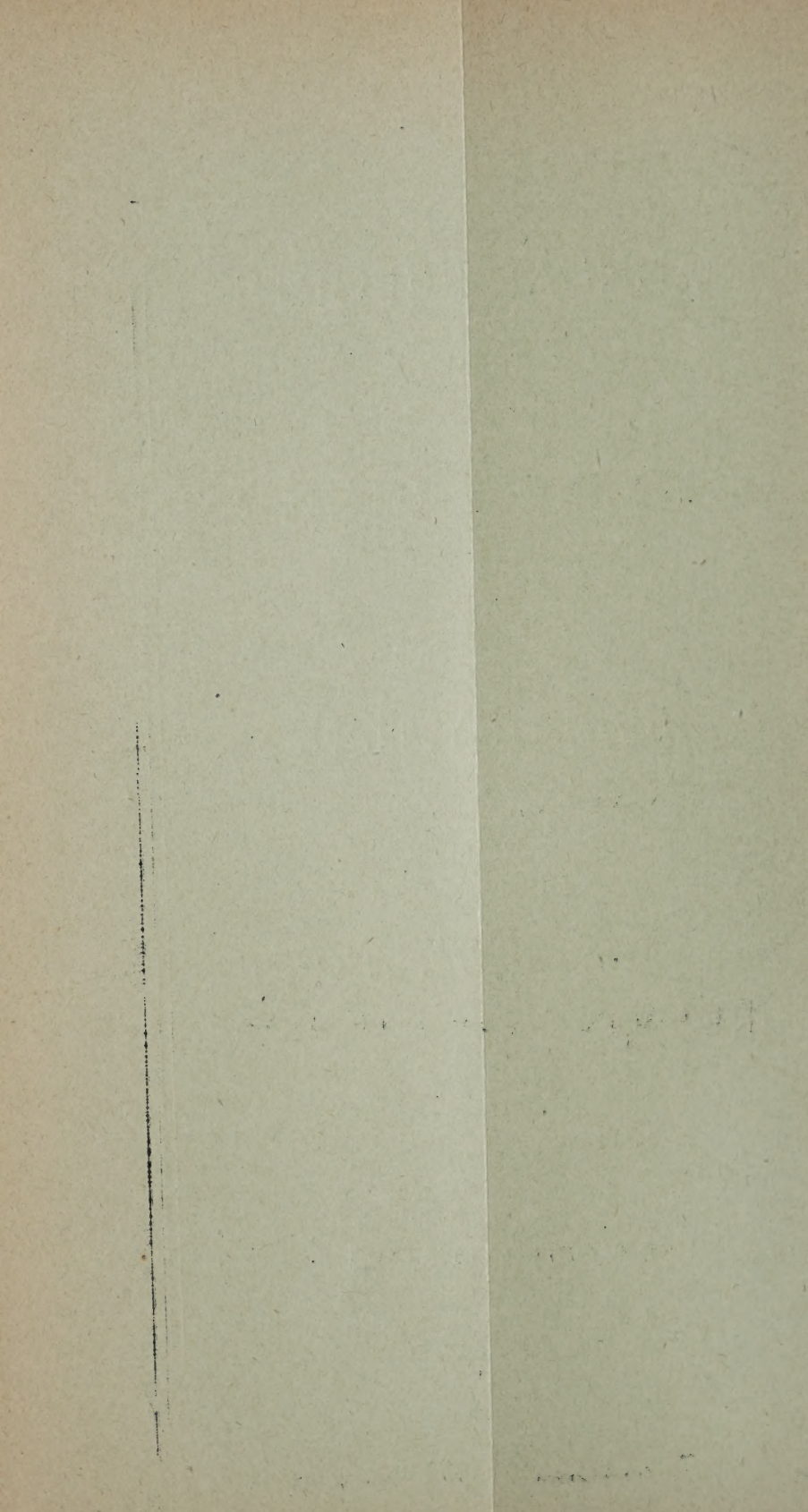

OVERSEER OF POOR.

To the selectmen of Roxbury: The overseer of the poor has been called upon but once during the year

for any assistance or relief of any want, and this case was found to be one directly chargeable to the county of Cheshire and was therefore transferred to the county commissioners for adjustment. The town has no individual poor for whom it is chargeable for support and at the present time there are no cases in town for which it is furnishing aid.

HEALTH OFFICERS.

To the board of Selectmen: We submit the following report for the year ending Feb. 12, 1901.

During the year a good degree of health has been the general condition throughout our town without any unusual sickness. Yet at the present time we note with much concern the prevalence of infectious contagious disease in our immediate vicinity and urge the most careful watch on the part of each and every inhabitant that the efforts of the board of health may not be hindered in their efforts to prevent the introduction or spread of any contagious disease within our borders. We urge the utmost care in regard to sewerage, accumulations of rags or garbage of any kind, and the absolute purity of any water supply so far as can be determined. Also through this report, we would call the attention of every citizen to their duty in reporting at once to the board of health any sickness of a mysterious nature or any cause for infection that may come to their knowledge.

The town has on hand about 300 feet of bridge plank, 1 Thatcher scraper and 1 leveler in good condition, 1 bush hook, 2 iron bars, 2 augers for bridge work, 1 bush scythe and snath and a few pounds of dynamite for blasting purposes.

The excess of expenditures over amount of appropriation is accounted for in that it was found necessary to repair two large bridges, one breaking down with a team upon it, but team being so near the end of bridge that it escaped injury. It will be necessary to repair one other large bridge the coming season, 3 of the 7 smaller bridges were also repaired during the year. I would recommend replacing two bridges on the Dakin road, so called, by more substantial structures than those now in use.
