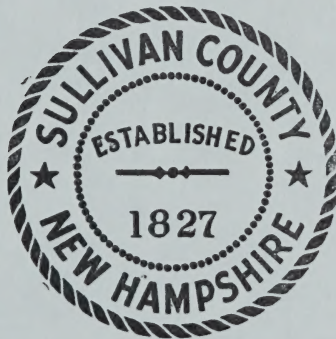

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

To the Citizens of Sullivan County:

The year 1970 marked the completion of the new county hospital building. With the additional beds, we can now care for 150 citizens, giving the best in nursing care and living conditions.

Your Commissioners would like to stress this point to the citizens of Sullivan County—it is a County institution, owned and operated by the citizens, under the direction of your Commissioners. This hospital will continue to be operated as one of the best homes for the aged in the country only if each and every person shows a continued interest in it and its operation. By this we mean that if you have a parent, friend, neighbor or just an acquaintance there, don't let him be entered into this nursing home and then forgotten.

Your County Commissioners realize and appreciate the investment of over \$2,000,000.00 you have in this property and will do the best they can to manage your interests. However, it will be in vain unless you show your concern for the reason for its being.

A new sewage system was started this fall and will replace the smaller system in the spring of '71.

A new hay barn was built this past year which replaced the one destroyed by fire. It is by far a better looking building and adds to the beauty of the other farm buildings.

Oil heat is now being used throughout, replacing the coal furnaces, and is proving a forward step in efficiency.

We discontinued raising pigs and making maple syrup last year because of the expense of these two items in ratio to income. Times change and other changes are being considered to curtail expenses. This, as in any business, is a continuous study.

It has been a busy year and our Commissioners are thankful for the excellent support and cooperation of all our employees, the County Delegation and all elected county officials.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

January 1, 1971

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners:

It is with pleasure that we make our report for 1970. During the year we dedicated the addition to our County Nursing Hospital with Governor Walter Peterson in attendance. The new facility was named the Stearns Building honoring Dr. Carl Stearns, our County physician of twenty-five years. The original building was called the Sanders Building in honor of Dr. Henry Sanders, a former County Home physician.

The first patients were admitted in August and by December we were operating at capacity—150 patients. This facility will be of real assistance in helping to meet the health needs of Sullivan County. We want to express our thanks and appreciation to everyone who had a part in making this facility a reality.

The House of Correction and Jail population has been higher than in previous years. A survey made during the year showed that we had 127 prisoners confined for the first time. However, the greater number of confinements are prisoners returning many times during the year and we feel this is due to inadequate programs for rehabilitation.

I would feel that consideration should be given to properly staffing and moving the Jail and House of Correction to a location where programs would be available for intensive rehabilitation.

Some changes have been made in our farming program for greater economy. As a result of our farm study committee report we are no longer raising pigs and we have expanded our dairy operation.

We want to take this opportunity to thank the many volunteers, groups, and organizations who have given so much of themselves in providing entertainment, gifts, etc. to the residents of the County Home and Nursing Hospital.

In closing we want to express our thanks and appreciation to our County Commissioners, our Sheriff and his deputies, our County Attorney, Dr. Stearns, Mrs. Waldo, R. N., our Director of Nursing Services, our Chaplains, and all our personnel for their cooperation and dedication which makes it possible to efficiently operate the Sullivan County Home and Hospital.

PHYSICIAN'S REPORT

January 1, 1971

To the Commissioners of Sullivan County:

When the new Sullivan County Nursing Hospital was dedicated—with Governor Walter Peterson participating in the ceremonies—on Sunday, July 19, 1970, it was a very happy and meaningful day in our lives,—and in the lives of many elderly patients.

I appreciate deply the honor bestowed upon me by the Commissioners. I am thankful to you, to Mr. and Mrs. Omer Ahern, to Mrs. Waldo, R. N. our Director of Nursing Services, and to her highly capable nursing staff. Due to these wonderful people, there is a spirit of cooperation and genuine teamwork, resulting in giving tender, loving care to our patients. Our frequent meetings and conferences have been pleasant. A special thanks must go to Mrs. Jean Egbert for successfully training new classes of nurse aides.

During 1970, 103 patients were admitted. In the same period there were 30 deaths. Our bed capacity now is 150, and every bed is taken.

The occupational, recreational, and physiotherapy departments are very active and keep our patients busy and contented.

During the year more than 20 patients were admitted to the Claremont General Hospital for special surgical or medical care and many others had the benefit of consultations with various other specialists.

We are indebted to Mrs. Brenner, Lab Technician at the Claremont General Hospital, for her frequent visits to draw blood samples for routine laboratory work,—also to our medical consultant, Dr. Alberto Miyara, and to our surgical consultant, Dr. Robert Maxfield.

THE SULLIVAN COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION

December 30, 1970

To the Commissioners of Sullivan County:

The past year has been a difficult but interesting one for the Sullivan County Mental Health Clinic. The lack of adequate State funding for the fiscal year caused a severe budget crisis which threatened to close the Clinic. Our critical situation was presented to the County Commissioners and Delegation, who very generously tripled their previous allotment to the Clinic, but were unable to provide the additional funds which the Clinic requested to permit the recruitment of a sorely needed fourth staff member. Therefore, it was necessary to face the constantly increasing demands for Clinic services without an increase in available staff time.

Within these restricting conditions the Clinic has attempted to meet the most crucial demands for service and to develop temporary methods of doing something for each person asking for help, although in no instance being able to give the kind and amount of assistance that was really needed.

On January 1, 1970, the Clinic had 122 active cases, as compared to 88 in 1969, 57 in 1968 and 37 in 1967. On January 1, 1970, there were also 25 persons on the waiting list. These figures give some indication of the growing demands for service and of the continuing involvement that is required of the staff once patients have been admitted for treatment or other service by the Clinic.

Service has now been provided to one out of every 15 families in the County (based on current census figures) and it continues to be available to these families as new problems arise. We have in the past year provided consultation or direct service to all the outlying School Districts, many of whom have only recently begun to make use of the Clinic's availability. In addition, with the assistance of a temporary, parttime social worker, we were able to initiate an 8 week group therapy program at the County House of Correction, which indicated that this could be an excellent future function of the Clinic if staff time permitted.

REPORT OF COUNTY ATTORNEY

December 31, 1970

Gentlemen:

The following is my report to you as Sullivan County Attorney for the year 1970, relative to matters handled by this office during the year 1970.

During 1970 this office handled a total of (81) felonies including one murder case which resulted in a conviction of 2nd Degree Murder and the rest included a large number of burglaries, aggravated assault, possession and selling of drugs and larceny.

Other matters handled were numerous appeals from the lower Courts, investigations of fatalities, suicides, reciprocal non-support actions and advice to the County on various civil matters.

The records will indicate that crime has increased in Sullivan County in the past year, largely as a result of an increase in the number of burglaries, still Sullivan County remains relatively low in its crime rate compared to the rest of the State and the Country.

I believe that during my tenure as County Attorney that we have had Law and Order with Justice in this area and my only regret is that we were unable to solve the Dunham Homicide.

Leaving office, I want to take this opportunity to express my thanks to all the law enforcement agencies of this area for their fine cooperation.
