


REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

The second and third were taught by Miss Sadie E. Farley of Hillsboro. Miss Farley is at home in the school room and gained the good-will of her scholars and good progress was made in all their studies.

In Division Two there being only three scholars it was thought best to send them to Washington. They were sent to Washington 22 weeks, at an expense of \$60.50 including transportation.
