

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in town affairs:

Voters in District No. 1 are hereby notified to meet at the Veterans Memorial Hall in said district, and voters of District No. 2 are hereby notified to meet at the East Derry Fire House in said district, on the sixth day of March, 1973, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the articles required to be voted on by official ballot. By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until eight o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

All voters are further notified to meet at eight o'clock in the afternoon on the 13th day of March, 1973, at the Veterans Memorial Hall to act on all other articles in this warrant.

- 1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustees, and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the following question submitted by petition: "Do you favor adoption of the town manager plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated?"
- 3. To vote by official ballot during regular polling hours on the following proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Derry, N.H., proposed by the Planning Board and by petitions of the voters for this town:

CHANGES PROPOSED BY THE TOWN OF DERRY PLANNING BOARD

The Board proposes that Article VII, Section 1 of the ordinance be deleted and the following be substituted therefor:

Section 1 — The Board of Selectmen shall appoint for a term of one year a Building Inspector, who, by his training and experience, is qualified to administer this ordinance. An application fee shall be charged for each permit, other than those for municipal structures, in accordance with the following schedule:

All fees collected shall be added to the general fund of the Town of Derry; however, in the event the applied for permit is not issued, said fees shall be refunded.

CHANGES PROPOSED BY ROLAND A. DEMERS AND OTHERS

Amend the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Derry, New Hampshire by striking out in the Retail Business Zone Section 1.110 and inserting in place thereof the following:

Section 1.110 – The area bounded by a line 200 feet South of South Avenue, a line 200 feet West of Central Street, a line 200 feet North and 200 feet South of Route 102, also known as

West Broadway, from Central Street and Maple Street Westerly to the Londonderry town line, a line 200 feet West of Maple Street, a line along the center of Rollins Street and Lenox Road, a line 200 feet East of Birch Street and Crystal Avenue. (Approved by Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY KENNETH A. HEPWORTH AND OTHERS

Amend Article I, Section 1.410 by deleting the entire paragraph and by inserting the following:

All the rest of the town not included in the above three zones shall be limited to residential type construction and uses except as otherwise provided in this ordinance. Accessory business uses shall be permitted to allow a place of work within his residence of persons employed in one of the following professions, occupations or trades:

- 1. office of a lawyer, doctor, clergyman, real estate or insurance agent, or similar recognized profession,
- 2. studio of an artist, artisan, or craftsman such as sign painter, musician,
- 3. shop or other facilities of a beautician, barber or tradesman, repairman such as a plumber, tailor, or electrician, provided:
- 1. that not more than one person not residing on the premises is employed on the premises at the same time,
- 2. that no sign or advertising device in excess of three square feet is displayed,
- 3. that sufficient off-street parking for clients, customers, and employees is provided, but not within 25 feet of the front lot line, or within 10 feet of a side or rear lot line,
- 4. the use is conducted within the structure, does not exceed 25 percent of the total gross floor area of the structure, and does not change the residential character of the structure, and
- 5. that exterior storage of materials, such as stock in trade or equipment is not placed within 100 feet of the front lot line or 20 feet of any side or rear lot line and is screened from view. (Disapproved by Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY RUSSELL G. BUKER AND OTHERS Amend Article I of the Derry Zoning Ordinance by adding Section 1.500, to read as follows:

Section 1.500 — GENERAL AGRICULTURAL AND FOREST CONSERVATION ZONE

The area bounded by a line starting at a point 600 feet east of Rockingham Road at the Windham town line; thence northwesterly parallel to and 600 feet east of Rockingham Road to a point 200 feet south of Lawrence Road; thence northeasterly parallel to and 200 feet south of Lawrence Road to Island Pond Road; thence northerly parallel to and 200 feet east of Lane Road to Floyd Road; thence northerly parallel to and 200 feet east of Floyd Road to a point 200 feet south of Hampstead Road; thence easterly parallel to and 200 feet south of Hampstead Road to the Hampstead town line; thence southerly to a point 200 feet north of Drew Road; thence southwesterly parallel to and 200 feet north of Drew Road to a point 200 feet west of the intersection of North Shore Road; thence southerly parallel to and 200 feet west of North Shore Road to a point

200 feet west of Island Pond Road; thence southerly parallel to and 200 feet west of Island Pond Road to the Salem town line; thence westerly along the Salem and Windham town lines to the starting point 600 feet east of Rockingham Road. All distances are measured from the center of the road.

(Disapproved by Planning Board)

CHANGES PROPOSED BY RUSSELL G. BUKER AND OTHERS Amend Article II of the Derry Zoning Ordinance by adding Section 8, to read as follows:

Section 8 — GENERAL AGRICULTURAL AND FOREST CONSERVATION ZONE

From and after the enactment of this section, all lots shall contain a minimum of five (5) acres.

(Disapproved by Planning Board)

- 4. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$350,000.00 for the purpose of replacement of water mains and the improvement of the Fordway well field and authorize the Selectmen to raise said sum by borrowing and the issuance of bonds or notes of the town under the provisions of RSA 33, and amendments thereto; and further authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the terms thereof and do all other acts necessary to accomplish said borrowing and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following resolutions.

Article 1

"WHEREAS, there is a need for a local housing authority to function in the Town of Derry,

Now, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the qualified voters of the Town of Derry that there is hereby created the Derry Housing Authority."

Article II

"WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

"WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the United States of America, acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Government") is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects that will assist in meeting this goal; and

"WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

"WHEREAS, the Derry Housing Authority (herein called the "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for a preliminary loan to cover the costs of surveys and planning in connection with the development of low-rent housing:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the voters of the town of Derry as follows:

- 1. That there exists in the Town of Derry a need for such low-rent housing which is not being met by private enterprise;
- 2. That the application of the Local Authority to the Go-

vernment for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects of not to exceed approximately 100 dwelling units is hereby approved.

The above two resolutions to be voted on separately by ballot,

as provided in RSA 203.

- 6. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town buildings, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for the Greater Salem Mental Health Clinic, for the Head Start program, for the Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from meter receipts the sum of \$2,800.00 to be expended for repairs and maintenance of parking meters and to transfer any balance of parking meter receipts to the Trustees of Trust Funds to be added to the Parking Lot Fund, and pass any vote relating thereto.

 10. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 1% discount from
- the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after date of invoice, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$65,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining a complete revaluation of the taxable property in the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Parking Lot Fund and expend the same for the purpose of developing and paving parking lots, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 and transfer the same to the Capital Reserve Fund, in accordance with Chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, or any amendments thereto, for the financing of improvements to existing municipal buildings or for the acquisition and construction of future municipal sites and buildings, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs

against budget appropriations in the amounts indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action hereon:

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the balance of funds, including accrued interest, from the Derry Village Sewer Construction Fund, the work now being completed and transfer the same to the General Fund.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the balance of the funds, including accrued interest, the work now being completed, from the Chlorinator Facilities Construction Fund and transfer the same to the General Fund.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$225,000.00 for the design and construction of a main sewer pumping station near Fordway Road; and to further authorize the Selectmen to initially borrow such sum or sums, either by bonds or note of the Town, and on such terms as the Selectmen deem advisable, as provided by the terms of Municipal Finance Act, RSA Chapter 33 and amendments thereto, and pass any vote relating thereto. (The Town anticipates that about 95% of this appropriation will eventually be funded by the State and/or the Federal Government.)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100,000.00 for the construction of sewer lateral extensions; and to further authorize the Selectmen to initially borrow such sum or sums, either by bonds or notes of the Town, and on such terms as the Selectmen deem advisable, as provided by the terms of Municipal Finance Act, RSA Chapter 33 and amendments thereto, and pass any vote relating thereto. (The Town anticipates that about 95% of this appropriation will eventually be funded by the State and/or the Federal Government.)
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept grants from Federal and State Governments for municipal purposes as provided in RSA 33:7-b, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, as in their discretion they may deem advisable, to employ either the State Tax Commission or a private accounting firm to accomplish an audit of the Town books.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to continue efforts to relieve traffic congestion on Broadway by appealing to the State to construct a By-Pass for State Highway Route 102 around the town. (To be voted on by special ballot during voting hours on March 6th)
- 22. To vote on the designation of certain roads as Scenic Roads, as follows:

By petition of The Derry Conservation Commission

To see if the town will vote to designate the following roads as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18, for the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Derry, and further that the Selectmen of said Derry shall, regarding such road or roads designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways for Town Road Aid Funds under RSA 241:7 (1).

- a. Stark Road from Lawrence Road to Kilrea Road
- b. Mill Road from Stark Road to Island Pond Road
- c. Cole Road from Route 102 to the Chester Town Line
- d. Cross Road from Adams Pond Road to Back Chester Road (otherwise known as Old Chester Road)
- e. Bowers Road from Windham Road to Fordway Extension
- f. Frost Road from Rockingham Road to Windham Town Line

The Conservation Commission requests that each road be voted on separately.

By petition of Alan Leach and others

To see if the Town will vote to designate the following Roads as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18, for the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Derry and, further, that the Selectmen of said Derry shall, regarding such road or roads designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways for Town Road Aid funds under RSA 241:7 (I).

- Goodhur Road from Windham Town Line (at Rockingham Road) to Gulf Road
- Gulf Road (including part known as Brady Rock Road)
 from Island Pond Road to Goodhue Road.
- c. Kilrea Road from Rockingham Road to Gulf Road
- 23. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the Town of Derry, New Hampshire will vote to expend \$500.00 for equipment for the teen age football program and to pass any other vote relating thereto.
- 24. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the Town of Derry will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of lighting Veterans Field and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 25. By petition: Warrant Article To see what action the Town wishes to take on the following question: "Do you favor suspension of parking meters in the Derry business district, Broadway and vicinity, for a trial period of one (1) year?"
- 26. By petition: Warrant Article To see if the Town of Derry will vote to allow each town department and commission the opportunity to use and/or acquire any parcel of town owned land before it is offered for public sale and to pass any vote relating thereto.

27. By petition: Warrant Article — To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to install five (5) each 3500 Lumens Mercury Street Lights, to replace those already in use on the upper portion of Everett Street, beyond the High Street intersection, and an additional one, for the purposes of safety, by more adequate lighting, and to appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Thirty (\$230.00) Dollars to cover the cost of the operation thereof. (Disapproved by Budget Committee)

28. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

29. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

30. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Many significant events have occurred in Derry during 1972. Not all of them have been good as witnessed by the destruction of the main sewerage pumping station. There were also many changes in the personnel of the Town Departments, Boards and Commissions. A reading of the "List of Officials" further on, will certainly indicate some of the changes in department heads and board members.

The Town has continued to grow. Continental Can and Treasure Masters have completed construction and are now in full operation. In keeping with this growth we are requesting that the voters approve a \$350,000.00 bond issue for water mains and well field improvements and lesser amounts for the rebuilding of the main sewerage pumping station and lateral extensions to the collection system. The Comprehensive Sewer Study has been completed and forwarded to the Pollution Control Commission for approval. In anticipation, we are asking for funds to complete the design of the facility.

Renovations have continued at Adams Memorial Hall. This year the work was confined to the exterior and the Police Station. Next year we anticipate remodelling the second floor into a new Court Room and other useful office space.

1973 promises to be a year of fulfillment, with the assistance of the Federal Revenue Sharing Act of 1972. The Town will now be able to start to do some of the necessary things, impossible before because of the lack of revenue.

It is our earnest desire that you support our program as encompassed in our requested appropriations.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Derry for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1971, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the audit reports enclosed herewith must be given to the Town Clerk to be retained as part of the permanent Town records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Works, District Court, Public Library, Taylor Library, Alexander Carr Playground, MacGregor Memorial Park, Cemetery Trustees, and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets – December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets — General Fund — as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Current Surplus increased by \$3,703.27 in 1971, from \$187,430.41 to \$191,133.68.

Analysis of Change in Current Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$96,430.56 plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$42,234.40 resulted in a net budget surplus of \$138,664.96.

Comparative Balance Sheets — Capital Projects Funds — as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971 are presented in Exhibit A-5. Reflected therein, is the authorization, voted at the Town meeting of March 9, 1971, to issue long term bonds in the amount of \$350,000.00.

Statements of the activity in the Highway and Water Construction Fund and the Derry Village Sewer Construction Fund during 1971 are presented in Exhibits B-3 and B-4.

Sewer Fund:

A statement of account and proof of balance — sewer fund — for the year 1971 is contained in Exhibit B-5. Sewer Rentals in the amount of \$81,626.54 were received, and \$86,500.00 was transferred to the General Fund during fiscal year 1971.

Water Works: (Exhibits E-1 thru E-3)

The financial condition of the Derry Water Works as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971, is disclosed in Exhibit E-1, Water Works — Comparative Balance Sheets. The results of operations for the fiscal year 1971 and the change in retained earnings are shown in Exhibit E-2. A summary statement of the Treasurer's account for the year 1971 is contained in Exhibit E-3.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71, Section 27-a, require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in this audit report is optional at the descretion of the Board of Selectmen. This letter, however, must be published in its entirety.

PROCEEDINGS

(At 8:00 p.m. the meeting was called to order and following the Salute to the Flag and rules of the meeting read by the Moderator the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. We will now proceed to the articles in the Town Warrant. We have already voted on the first five Articles and we will now take up Article 6 which read as follows:

Article 6: To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, including Town Road Aid Plan Apportionment A and Town Road Aid Plan Apportionment B, for building and repairing bridges, for suppression of moths, for

police department, for the Derry District Court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town buildings, for support of the libraries, for State and County Taxes, for the observances of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for cooperating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister, for ambulance service, and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on Article 6? If I may add, usually you go and take this particular article up item by item.

MR. METTS. I make that motion.

THE MODERATOR. Ernest Metts makes a motion we take it up item by item in the budget. Do I hear a second.

MRS. JOHNSON. Betty Johnson, I second it.

MRS. CASTEN. There is already a motion on the floor. Can you entertain another motion on the floor? This is the first motion: I move that we accept the Article as read is what I said. And Selectman Boyce seconded it.

THE MODERATOR. I did not hear anybody make that motion.

MR. BOYCE. I seconded it, Joe.

THE MODERATOR. Well, Mr. Metts, apparently there was a motion that 1 did not hear and therefore I will not entertain your motion. We will take up the motion that has been made here. The motion has been made to accept it as read and it was seconded, it was seconded by Mr. Boyce, as I understand it. Is there any discussion on this motion.

MR. HOWARD. Mr. Moderator, could I make an amendment to that motion?

THE MODERATOR. Yes, you can make an amendment.

MR. HOWARD. I would like to make it that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,660,717.15 to go with that motion.

MR. DiPIETRO. Second that motion.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. There will be no further discussion. First of all we are voting on Mr. Howard's amendment at this time. Does everybody understand? The amendment was that we ap-

propriate the sum of \$1,660,717.15. And then on the original motion was made that we accept the items as printed. So there would be no further discussion. But now we are on the amendment, to appropriate this sum of money and not take — In other words, not take up the budget item by item. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MR. BOYCE. I withdraw my second.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Mr. Boyce withdraws his second. Mr. Metts, would you go back because you made the original motion and you withdrew it. Now, what motion do you make?

MR. METTS. I would like to make a motion that we consider the budget and appropriate the money for article 6 Item by Item.

THE MODERATOR. Now, who seconded it originally.

MRS. JOHNSON. I did.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Johnson seconded it originally, so we go back now. Is there any discussion on this? (The question is moved and the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we will take it up item by item.

(Line items read by the Moderator with certain line items being questioned for the purpose of discussion after completion of reading line items.)

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MS. FRYE. My amendment would appropriate \$500.00 for ten new ballot boxes or as many as \$500,00 will buy.

THE MODERATOR. The amendment is to increase this article by \$500.00.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It appears that the "Nos" have it.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

JUDGE GRINNELL. What I would like to suggest is that the Associate Justice's salary be raised from \$1,830.00 which is 30% of the Judge's salary, to the sum of \$4,500.00 which is the difference of an additional \$2,670.00 to raise the Associate Justice's salary. I move that this amount be added to the Associate Justice's salary.

MR. TOMPKINS. Seconded

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The motion of the floor is to increase this item by \$2,670.00. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Well, it is very close, I am going to revote on that. I am going to vote on it again. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. HOWARD. I move we go to warrant article 14, Mr. Moderator.

MRS. DiMARZIO. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued.)

THE MODERATOR. We will go back to the item of \$37,132.00 and you say you are making a motion at this point here. Well, let's get the withdrawal of the other motion.

MR. HOWARD. I will withdraw it.

MRS. DiMARZIO, I will withdraw it.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Withdrawn. And we will go back to this item. You are moving to amend this item to reduce it to \$25,000.00 appropriation. What is your name?

MR. CATON. Caton.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on Mr. Caton's motion?

MR. HANSON. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question is to reduce this item by \$12,132.00 or to \$25,000.00. Is that correct?

MR. CATON. Correct.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of that motion say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It appears that the "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare it. We will go to Mr. Howard's item, if you will reiterate your motion, Mr. Howard.

MR. HOWARD. I move we refer to Article 14 in the Warrant.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Article 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$65,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining a complete revaluation of the taxable property in the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. MACGREGOR. I move that we indefinitely postpone this article.

MR. LOW. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. He has made a motion to indefinitely postpone the article. And at this point I don't think it has had adequate discussion so for the time being if you would just hold it up so that we could discuss it.

MR. MACGREGOR. All right.

(After considerable discussion the following ensued:)

(Article No. 14 was reread by the Moderator and the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved and we are voting on whether you want to adopt this article or not. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Well, that is very close. Do you want to have a hand count? All right. I think the best way to do it would be actually to put your hand up, those in favor, and keep them up and we will have counters. Those in opposition will do the same thing.

(Tellers appointed and hand count takes place.)

THE MODERATOR. According to the Town Clerk's count, 100 voted "Yes" and 117 voted "No." The "Nos" have it and I so declare.

(After further discussion of the line item budget the following ensued:)

MR. HOWARD. To get it clear, I make a motion we increase the Police Department salaries by \$2,700.00. Now, this will be approximately 7 and a half per cent total and this will get it on the floor in a motion and we can vote on it.

MRS. DiMARZIO. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. There has been a motion to increase the appropriation to the Police Department by \$2,700.00 for salaries. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It appears the "Nos" have it.

FROM THE FLOOR. I call for a hand vote.

THE MODERATOR. A call has been made for a hand vote. And just to save time the same counters will count.

(Tellers take hand count.)

THE MODERATOR. The tally by the Town Clerk shows those voting "Yes" were 94 and those opposed, 104. The "Nos" have it.

1 have had the stenographer check his notes and he went back to that item, that \$65,000.00 item. Apparently there was no motion on the floor. So I am returning to that item and without any discussion, you know what it was about. I would like to have a motion entertained by Mr. Macgregor at this point since he made

the original motion to lay it on the table. Is that correct, Mr. Macgregor?

MR. MACGREGOR. That is correct.

THE MODERATOR. This is on the \$65,000.00 item for revaluation. Do I hear a second?

MR. LOW. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Low seconds that. And since it was a hand count, all those in favor of the motion now to lay this on the table, that is, by laying it on the table if it passes it is dead. All those in favor of that motion will raise your hand and the same counters will please count. Now, those that are opposed to laying it on the table or opposed to killing this raise your hand until you are counted.

(Tellers take hand count.)

THE MODERATOR. The vote on killing that particular item, "Yes" 130, "No," 99.

MR. CARBONE. Mr. Moderator, 1 voted with the majority and 1 would like to have that particular warrant article reconsidered.

THE MODERATOR. You voted with the majority and you want it reconsidered. Do I hear a second by someone who voted with the majority? What is your name?

MR. NUNGER. Nunger.

THE MODERATOR. We are on the question of reconsideration. There will be no further discussion and again we will have a revote. All those again in favor, the same counters, same places, now we are going back to the same question under reconsideration by somebody that voted in favor. Raise your right hand. All those in favor of the motion to lay it on the table, that is to kill the \$65,000.00, raise your right hand. If we vote "No" then we are voting not to reconsider. If we vote "Yes" we are voting to reconsider. Now, those opposed raise your hand and keep your hand up until you are counted.

(Tellers take hand count.)

THE MODERATOR. Ladies and gentlemen, the vote shows that by the Town Clerk's records, those voting in favor or reconsideration 96, those opposed, 132. The article is lost.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. CASTEN. I move that we take up Article 9.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved by Mrs. DiMarzio and seconded by Mr. Hobsch. All those in favor of taking up this Article say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. We are now on Article 9.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purpose of paying the same to the Greater Salem Mental Health Association, which serves the Derry area and pass any vote relating thereto.

We are now on Article 9 and I will entertain any motion on that article before we discuss it.

MRS. CASTEN. I move that this article be defeated.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made by Mrs. Casten to defeat this Article. Do I hear a second?

(no response.)

THE MODERATOR. No seconder. We can't take the Article up.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. TOMPKINS. I move that we pass Article 9.

MRS. LAGREE. Seconded.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. Do I hear a second on it.

MS. FRYE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MRS. DiMARZIO. I move to take up Article 13.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion made by Mrs. Dimarzio and seconded by Mr. Garland to take up Article 13 at this time. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It is a vote and I so declare. Article 13 reads as follows:

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Sewer Equipment Fund and expend said sum for the purchase of a truck for the Sewer Department, and pass any vote relating thereto.

MRS, DIMARZIO, I so move.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made that we adopt this article as read by Mrs. Dimarzio.

MR. HOWARD. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Seconded by Mr. Howard.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved by Mr. Hobsch, seconded by Mr. Howard. All those in favor of adopting Article 13 as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MS. FRYE. I move to increase street lighting by three thousand dollars. With a recommendation to the Selectmen that they use it for new street lights where they see fit.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on that?

MR. HOBSCH. 1 second that.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Lyons has moved the question, Mr. Hayward seconds the motion and we have moved the question on the increase of three thousand dollars. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move that we take up Article 18, that covers this particular item.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. A motion has been made and seconded that we move to Article 18, that covers this particular item. Is there any discussion on the motion. If not, we will put it to a vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare. We will take up Article 18.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$1,800.00 from the Capital Reserve Parking Lot Fund and expend the same for the purpose of developing and paving parking lots at Veterans Hall and Adams Memorial Hall, and pass any vote relating thereto.

MRS. DIMARZIO. I so move.

THE MODERATOR. It has been moved that we accept the Article as printed.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Seconded by Mr. Garland.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further question on this item? If there is no further discussion we will put this to a vote. All those in favor of adopting article 18 as printed will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MR. McDERMOTT. I would like to make a motion that the

employees of the Water Department get paid time and a half after 48 hours.

MR. BRUNO. I second that.

MR. BOYCE. I have nothing against the time and a half proposal. I would like to at this time make an amendment to it, if they do get time and a half I would like to have their pay readjusted down to the Highway Department because they were getting a higher pay schedule per man last year.

THE MODERATOR. Now, you made a motion to amend that.

Do I hear a second to Mr. Boyce's amendment.

MR. SMALL. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. There being no further discussion, all those in favor of the amendment will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." You know what the motion is, to amend by Selectmen Boyce's motion, to amend that if they get time and a half after 48 hours that their pay scale be adjusted, since it is higher than the Highway Department, that it be adjusted to that of the Highway Department. There is no further discussion. We are on the vote. All those in favor of the motion to amend say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Now we are back to the original motion. The gentleman's motion upstairs is that they get paid time and a half after 48 hours.

Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. McDERMOTT. Would someone explain what the Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission is.

THE MODERATOR. This is Article 24 in your Warrant, if you want to take it up at this time.

MRS. DIMARZIO. I so move.

MR. HOBSCH. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Dimarzio that we take up Article 24 in the warrant, seconded by Mr. Hobsch. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Article 24 reads as follows:

By petition: Warrant Article – To see if the Town of Derry will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission now organized and named the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission. This commission will have membership of at least two municipalities and will have durisdiction over planning region 13 delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the commission will be to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide concensus on regional problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects within and which extend beyond the boundaries of a particular town. The Commission will have only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36: Section 45-53, RSA 1955, as amended, and will be an advisory commission to local governments in the region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State law. Three representatives will be appointed from Derry.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote the appropriate sum of \$4,099.20 (.35 per capita) as the Town's share for the operation of the regional planning commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes. A vote on this article is contingent Town Meeting approval of the prior article.

What is your wish under this particular item? Anybody want to make a motion to take up Article 1?

MR. TOMPKINS. So moved.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made and seconded that we take up Article 1 under Item 24, to adopt Article 1 under Item 24 before we take up two, right, before we vote that. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

I will entertain a motion to adopt under Article 2. Mr. Tompkins makes the motion and Mr. Boyce seconded it.

FROM THE FLOOR. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. GARLAND. I move we take up Article 12.

MRS. NICHOLS. Seconded.

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,550.00 for the Derry Head Start Program, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this item?

MR. LYONS. Mr. Moderator, I move that this Article be passed as read.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made and seconded that we pass this article as printed. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following insued:)

MRS. CASTEN. Mr. Moderator, point of order. We never voted to take up Article 12.

THE MODERATOR. We never took a vote. All right. I am going to take a vote on it. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it and I so order. We are on Article 12 and we are discussing it. Now what is your question, Mrs. Casten?

MRS. CASTEN. Point of order. Is the Lyons motion still on the floor or is there no motion on the floor.

The next item that was questioned was Sewer. The motion has been made by Marge Nichols and seconded by Warren Garland that we move to Article 15. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. And I will read Article 15.

Article 15: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Sewer Maintenance Fund and expend said sum for the inspection and repair of the Horne Brook and Ross Pond Sewer Interceptor, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this particular item? And I may add that I have gone up there and I represent an abutting owner here and the three basins that are supposed to be serving this are under water caused by the diverting of the brook, I assume. There must be thousands of gallons of water going into our sewer system right now. What is your pleasure on this item. Mr. Tompkins?

MR. TOMPKINS. I move the Article be adopted.

JUDGE GRINNELL. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion on this item?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. We will put it to a vote. All those in favor of adopting article 15 as printed and read will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

A motion has been made by Marge Nichols that we move to Article 17 and seconded by Mrs. Millie Dimarzio. All those in favor of taking up this Article will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. And Article 17 reads as follows:

Article 17: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$35,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Replacement of Water Main Fund and expend said sum for the purpose of replacing water mains on North High Street, and pass any vote relating thereto.

MRS. CASTEN. I move we pass the Article.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Casten to adopt this Article as printed. Do I hear a second.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

FROM THE FLOOR. The question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor of adopting this article will say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

The next item that was questioned was the water works study of \$50,000.00.

MR. BOYCE. I move that we go to Article 16.

MR. GARLAND. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Boyce moved that we move to Article 16, seconded by Warren Garland. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, and we will move to Article 16 which reads as follows:

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining a comprehensive study of the Town's water supply, storage and distribution system, and pass any vote relating thereto. This was submitted without recommendation by the Budget Committee.

What is your pleasure on this item?

MR. TOMPKINS. I move the Article be adopted as read.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Tompkins moves that we adopt this article as read and printed.

JUDGE GRINNELL. I second that.

THE MODERATOR. Seconded by Judge Grinnell. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. There will be no further discussion on this. All those in favor of adopting Article 16 as printed will say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, It is a vote and I so declare.

Sidewalk construction was the next item questioned.

MRS. FRYE. I move to increase the amount under sidewalks to four thousand dollars.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made to increase this item an additional two thousand dollars and make it a total sum of four thousand dollars by Mrs. Frye. Do I hear a second on that.

MR, METTS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Metts seconds that. Any discussion on the amendment to increase.

(After discussion the following takes place.)

MRS. DIMARZIO. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved to amend that Item by \$2,000.00 and make it a total sum of \$4,000.00. Everybody understand the question? All those in favor of the amendment will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. The amendment is to increase it to \$4,000.00. I hope we vote the whole item when we get to it. (After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. A motion has been made that we take up Article 19 by Millie Dimarzio and seconded by Mr. Garland. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. We will take up Article 19 which reads as follows:

Article 19: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of establishing and funding a capital reserve fund, in accordance with Chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, or any amendments thereto, for the financing of improvements to existing municipal buildings or for the acquisition and construction of future municipal sites and buildings, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this item?

MR. CARBONE. I make a motion we adopt it. I move we pass Warrant Article 19 as printed.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made by Mr. Carbone that we adopt the Article as printed, seconded by Mr. Boyce. Any discussion?

(No response.)

THE MODERATOR. If not we will put it to a vote, All those in favor of adopting this Article say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

At this point somebody should make a motion that we adopt the items that we have gone over at this point with the amendments and that we appropriate the sum of \$1,600,317.15.

MR. GARLAND. So moved.

MRS, DIMARZIO. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Dimarzio that we adopt the budget as printed and that we appropriate the sum of \$1,600,317.15 and seconded by Warren Garland.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare.

Now we have to go to the revenue items and adopt that, is that correct?

MR. GARLAND. I move a motion that we approve the revenue items as printed with the exception of that amount to be raised by property taxes will now be \$461,247.15.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. GAY. Mr. Moderator, as the hour is getting late and it is storming real heavy out, I move at this time we take up two articles, items 25 and 26 on page six up at the present time.

THE MODERATOR. All right. You want to take up Articles 25 and 26. Do I hear a second to that?

MR, HOBSCH, I will second that.

THE MODERATOR. It has been seconded by Mr. Hobsch. All those in favor of taking these Articles up next will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. And we will take up those articles at this time.

Article 25. By petition: Warrant Article — To see if the Town will vote to change the present form of an appointed budget committee that is elected by the registered voters of Derry as

permitted in Chapter 32:2 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this? I am going to relinquish the Chairmanship to Bill Howard because I feel — Will you take over as moderator on this Article.

MR. HOWARD. I will entertain a motion now on Article 25.

MR. WINKLEMAN. I move that we accept Article 25, as written.

MR. MACDONALD. Seconded.

MR. HOWARD. It has been moved and seconded that we accept Article 25. All those in favor say "Aye." All those Opposed "No." (After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. HOWARD. Anymore discussion? Shall we move the question?

FROM THE FLOOR. Move the question.

MR. HOWARD. Do I hear a second on that?

FROM THE FLOOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Everyone is familiar with the Article. All those in favor of the Article as printed say "Aye." Those opposed "No." I am going to call for a hand vote.

(Hand count taken by appointed Tellers.)

MR. HOWARD. The vote is as follows: "Yes" 65, opposed 94. The Article is defeated.

THE MODERATOR. Thank you. We will now take up Article 26.

Article 26. By petition: To see if the Town will vote to require the Selectmen to require an examination of all applicants for the job of police officer for the Town of Derry and after appointment the newly appointed officer will be required to serve a probationary period of six (6) months plus an additional six (6) months at the discretion of the Selectmen upon recommendation of the Chief of Police. At the satisfactory completion of the probationary period the appointee will become a permanent member of the Derry Police Department, dismissal to be made for just cause only and only after a hearing has been granted.

All promotions within the Police Department shall be made by competitive examination only. These examinations to be conducted by the State of New Hampshire Personnel Department, after qualifying requirements have been established by the Selectmen and the Chief of Police.

All regular police officers who have served six (6) months on the police department prior to the 1972 Town Meeting shall not be affected by the six (6) months probationary requirements.

What is your pleasure as to this Article?

MR. GAY. Mr. Moderator, I move that Article 26 be accepted as printed, and I will explain after duly seconding.

MR. BOYCE. Seconded.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

MR. R. GORHAM. I would like to move to amend paragraph two to read: All promotions shall be made from within the ranks of the Derry Police Department.

THE MODERATOR. Bob Gorham made the motion that we amend the second paragraph to read that "All promotions be within the Derry Police Department. Do I hear a second on that.

MR. BUCKLIN. George Bucklin, seconded. (After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion on the amendment at this time or the article? The question has been moved and this is on the amendment: That the promotions be kept within the Derry Police Department. All those in favor on the amendment will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos"

have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Now we are back under the

article as originally printed, and there is a motion on the floor to adopt it as printed.

MR. HAYWARD. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. You understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. CARBONE. Mr. Moderator, I make a motion we go to Warrant Article 28.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made that we go to Article 28 by Mr. Carbone. Do I hear it seconded?

MR. LOW. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Low seconded that particular motion and I will read it off.

MR. BOYCE. Mr. Moderator, why are we jumping Article 27. I make a motion we go back to Article 27.

THE MODERATOR. There is a motion on the floor and it is seconded. Any discussion? If not we put the article to a vote.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of taking up, to take up the Article at this time, all those in favor say "Aye." Those Opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare and we are on Article 28.

Article 28. By petition: To see if the town shall vote to authorize the selectmen to make the West Side School available for development as a Community Center operated by the Derry Recreation & Parks Commission and if not utilized for same to revert back to the Selectmen for their disposition.

THE MODERATOR. What is your pleasure. There is nothing on the floor at this point.

MR. CARBONE. I make a motion we accept Article 28 as printed.

MR. LOW, Seconded.

JUDGE GRINNELL. I was going to move that that be indefinitely postponed. You didn't recognize me.

THE MODERATOR. If you were making a motion vote against it. It is the same thing.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The question has been moved on the adoption of Article 28 as printed. Everybody understand the question? We will put it to a vote. All those in favor of adopting Article 28 say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Mr. Boyce, you want to say something on Article 27?
MR. BOYCE. I move that we take up Article 27 at this time.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Do you understand the question? All those in favor, this is a vote on taking up Article 27 at this time. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed? The "Ayes" have it, It is a vote and I so declare.

Now I will read off Article 27.

Article 27. By petition: To see whether the voters of Derry will authorize the Selectmen of the Town of Derry to sign a ninety-nine (99) years lease at One (\$1.00) Dollar per year, leasing the West Side School to the Greater Derry Boys' Club, Inc.

What is your pleasure under this Article?

MR. BOYCE. I wish to make an amendment to the Article.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. Let's go back. Reiterate your motion to accept the article as read. Reiterate it.

MR. BOYCE. I reiterate my motion.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mr. Boyce and

seconded by Mrs. Dimarzio to act on the article as printed. Now, your amendment.

MR. BOYCE. To read: Leasing the East Derry Town hall socalled and at the time of the conclusion of said lease the building be returned to the Town of Derry.

THE MODERATOR. And Mrs. Dimarzio seconded the amendment.

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The article reads as follows: By petition: To see whether the voters of Derry will authorize the Selectmen of the Town of Derry to sign a 99 years lease at \$1.00 per year, leasing the West Side School to the Greater Derry Boys' Club, Inc.

MR. BOYCE. My amendment to read as follows: Leasing East Derry Town Hall so-called, and at the time of the conclusion of said lease the building be returned to the Town.

THE MODERATOR. All right. Now you know what the amendment is and that is what you are voting on. All those in favor of adopting the amendment as made will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Now we go to the article as amended. What is your pleasure on adopting this Article?

MR. BOYCE, I make a motion we accept this Article.

MR. UICKER. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion.

JUDGE GRINNELL. I move to amend that motion so that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate a lease to the Boys Club with proper safeguard enough for the Town for repairs of the building, and that the lease be for a term of five years and that it can be renewed at each five year period until such time as the Town needs the building.

MR. HOBSCH, Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Hobsch seconded that motion. Any discussion on the motion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved on Judge Grinnell's amendment. Do you understand the amendment? All those in favor of the amendment say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

There will now have to be a motion to adopt the Article as amended.

MRS. CASTEN. So moved.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Casten moves that we adopt this Article as amended. Do I hear a second.

MR. UICKER. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare.

Those in favor of the Article as amended will raise their right hand. Those opposed?

(Hand count taken by appointed tellers.)

THE MODERATOR. The result of your vote is 94 in favor and 28 against, and the "Ayes" have it.

FROM THE FLOOR. I move we take up Article 29.

FROM THE FLOOR. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made and seconded that we take up Article 29. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 29: By petition: Warrant Article — To see if the Town will recommend to the Selectmen that they adopt the following safety ordinances regulating residential swimming pools.

A. A swimming pool is considered a body of water contained in an artificial or semi-artificial receptacale whether in or above the ground, or created by artificial means from a natural water course, and all appurtenances, equipment, appliances and other facilities for its operation, maintenance or use, used or intended to be used for swimming, wading or recreational bathing, but not including portable pools incapable of containing a depth of water exceeding twenty-four (24) inches at any point.

B. A residential swimming pool is a swimming pool used or intended to be used solely by the owner or tenant thereof and his family, and by friends invited to use it without payment of any fee.

C. Every outdoor residential swimming pool shall be completely surrounded at all times, whether or not the same be filled with water, by a fence or wall not less than five (5) feet in height. Each such fence or wall shall be so constructed as not to have openings, holes or gaps larger than four inches in any dimension except for picket fences in which case, however, the gaps between the pickets shall not exceed four inches, and except for door or gates which can have no openings, holes or gaps. A building may be used as a part of such enclosure.

D. All gates or doors opening through such enclosures shall be of not less than the same height as the fence or wall and shall be equipped with a self-closing and self-latching device located not more than one foot below the top of the fence or wall for keeping the gate or door securely closed at all times when not in actual use except that the door of any dwelling which forms a part of the enclosure need not be so equipped. Each such gate or door shall be kept locked at all times when the swimming pool enclosure is not in use.

E. The provisions of these regulations shall not become applicable to residential swimming pools in existence on the date of enactment of said regulations until the date four months subsequent to such date, or 1 June 1972, whichever comes first.

What is your pleasure on this Article? Mrs. Dimarzio.

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move that this Article be denied as printed. THE MODERATOR. All right, Defeated as printed.

MR. WEAVER, I second it.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Dimarzio moves to defeat the article, lets put it that way there, and Mr. Weaver seconds the motion. Now, any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. Any further discussion? If not, we are on the motion to defeat this measure. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MR. CONRAD QUIMBY. May 1 introduce a motion now along the lines of just indicating or is this under new business?

THE MODERATOR. I will go along at this point since we are discussing this.

MR. QUIMBY. I move that it is the concensus of this meeting that the Selectmen draft a swimming pool ordinance in conformance with neighboring communities at their most expedient discretion.

THE MODERATOR. You have heard the motion made.

MRS. CASTEN. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. And seconded. The motion is to the effect that the selectmen be instructed to draw up an ordinance, swimming pool ordinance, conforming to neighboring communities forthwith. Any discussion?

(After discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of adopting the motion made by Conrad Quimby will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

MRS. FRYE. I move we take up Article No. 7.

MRS, DIMARZIO, Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Motion has been made by Mrs. Frye that we take up Article 7, Mrs. Dimarzio seconded it. All those in favor of taking up Article 7 next say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. Article 7 reads as follows:

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, providing that in the case of tax deeded real estate the previous owner, or his or her heirs, if known, or its successors or assigns in the case of a corporation, shall have first opportunity to purchase the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article.

MR. HOWARD. I move the article be adopted as printed.

MRS. FRYE. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Howard moves to accept the article as printed seconded by Mrs. Frye. Any discussion? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it, it is a vote and I so declare.

We will entertain a motion to take up Article 20.

MRS. AUDETTE. So moved.

MR. KEN DAVIS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Audette made the motion to take up Article 20 and Ben Davis seconded that. Article 20 reads as follows:

Article 20: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take such action as, in their discretion, may be necessary, including the execution of any documents, to grant access over a certain proposed roadway leading Northeasterly from North Shore Road at Beaver Lake, as shown on plan of land as subdivided for Harold P. Davis, February 1953, (Said roadway having been acquired by the Town for nonpayment of taxes) to the owners of land abutting said roadway, and pass any vote relating thereto.

(After considerable discussion the following ensued:)

MR. HOBSCH. I move that we adopt Article 20 as read.

MR. HOWARD. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor of Article 20 will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Mrs. Frye has made a motion to move to Article 8. Why don't we just go right down. That would have been the next one.

MR. GARLAND. I move we accept Article 8 as printed.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR, Let's take up 8.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the minicipal year in which debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article?

MR. BOYCE. I make a motion that we pass it as read.

MR. TOMPKINS. Seconded.

THE MODERATOR. Mr. Boyce has made a motion to adopt this Article and seconded by Mr. Tompkins.

MR. HOWARD. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed? The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to provide for the prepayment of taxes, and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayment of taxes, as provided in Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 80, Section 52-a; and to further allow the Collector of Taxes to discount taxes according to the following schedule or such other schedule as the meeting may determine, fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend the following schedule and discount: 2% discount on installments of not less than \$100.00 prior to July 1, 1972, 1½% discount on installment payments of \$10.00 or more until tax rate is determined and announced by Selectmen, and a 1% discount from the time that the tax bills are issued until 30 days after the date of invoice.

THE MODERATOR. What is your pleasure on this article?

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move that we adopt this Article as printed. MR. WERNER. Seconded.

MR. HOWARD. Move the question.

THE MODERATOR. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." It is a vote and I so order.

Article 21: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to give a deed to the owners of the property on Crystal Avenue now or formerly occupied by the Standard Sash & Door Company, in which deed the Town would release its easement or ownership to a very few square feet of land adjacent to Crystal Avenue upon which part of the building of said Standard Sash & Door Company sits, and pass any vote relating thereto.

What is your pleasure on this Article?

MR. HOWARD. I move the Article be passed as read.

MR. MACGREGOR. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting Article 21 as read will say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 22: By petition: Warrant Article — In the event that the Town Manager Plan is adopted by the voters, to see if the Town will vote to set the salary and expenses for the Town Manager at a figure not exceeding \$15,000.00 for salary and a figure not exceeding \$1,000.00 for expenses, and vote to raise and appropriate such proportion of said salary and expenses as the Town may determine is needed for the year 1972, and pass any vote relating thereto. (Disapproved by the Budget Committee.)

MRS. DIMARZIO. I move that we deny this Article.

THE MODERATOR. Well, the Town Manager wasn't voted in. MRS. DIMARZIO. There is a recount Thursday.

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made to defeat the article by Mrs. Dimarzio.

MR. HOWARD. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. Seconded by Mr. Howard. Do you understand the question? All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." Let's vote on it again. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 23: By Petition: Warrant Article — To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$4,500.00 for the purpose of a "Management Study including organization and methods, administrative review, and a classification and compensation study," and pass any vote relating thereto.

This was disapproved by the Budget Committee, same thing as the Article before. No matter whether you vote it or not there is no money for it.

MRS. DIMARZIO. Move it be denied.

MR. GARLAND. Second the motion.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Dimarzio has moved it be disapproved and Mr. Garland seconds the motion. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Article 30: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Are there any reports of agents, auditors or committees? If not, we will pass on to Article 31.

Article 31: To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

Any action on that? No action?

Article 32: To transact any other business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

MRS. FRYE. I move that the Moderator require the Town to have the required ——

THE MODERATOR. The way you feel you should make it the selectmen.

MRS. FRYE. Will you direct the Selectmen or the Selectmen direct you, the Town Direct the Selectmen to get the required number of ballot boxes for each election and to have more than one booth per every 125 voters when the Moderator feels it is necessary.

THE MODERATOR. Mrs. Winkelman seconded that.

MR. BOYCE. The Board of Selectmen will not have to be directed to do anything of this nature. We are ordered by law to do this. We were supposed to have five ballot boxes. It is very unfortunate. The oversight will not happen again I can assure you.

THE MODERATOR. All right. The question has been moved. You have heard the question. All those in favor say "Aye." All those opposed "No." The "Ayes" have it. It is a vote and I so declare.

Any other business to come before the meeting.

MRS. FRYE. I move the checklist be used at all future annual meetings as you come in the door. A separate place used for non voters.

THE MODERATOR. A checklist be used to check of anybody's name as they come into a Town Meeting. At all Town Meetings, we can't vote a school meeting or for district, just a Town Meeting. Make that motion and directed toward the Supervisors of the Checklist, that the Supervisors of the Checklist henceforth be required to have a checklist to make a check at all meetings.

MRS. FRYE. You would be in charge of us meeting, right?

THE MODERATOR. Yes. I would be in charge. You have to direct them to do it.

MRS. FRYE. To bring the checklist and too, that the voters be admitted by checklist.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

MRS. FRYE. I move that at each subsequent Annual Town Meeting the voters of the Town be admitted by checklist and a separate place be designated for non voters.

THE MODERATOR. Do I hear a second on that?

MRS, WINKELMAN, I second that.

(After further discussion the following ensued:)

THE MODERATOR. The motion has been made and seconded. Do you understand the question? Let's go to a vote. All those in favor say "Aye." Those opposed "No." The "Nos" have it. It is a vote and I so declare. All those in favor of adjourning will rise.

(Whereupon at 1:45 a.m. on March 15, 1972, the Annual Town Meeting for the Town of Derry was adjourned.)

REPORT FROM THE WATER DEPARTMENT 1972

This year the Town started installing outside reading meters to coincide with a planned maintenance program for replacing and rebuilding meters. No meter will remain in a home longer than seven years without being recalibrated.

We have set up a program for replacing old services and old and undersized mains. This in conjunction with our meter program has cut down on lost revenue.

In 1971 we pumped 282,444,800 gallons of water and realized revenues of \$90,156.51. In 1972 we pumped 231,814,000 gallons and realized revenues of \$125,643.24, proving that our programs are working.

In July, 1972 we lost one of the Londonderry wells because the screen became plugged with foreign material. It took two weeks to get it back in operation.

The water study was awarded to Camp, Dresser and McKee, Inc. in the late spring. We have not yet received the final results.

In June, 1972 we imposed a water ban which lasted until late fall.

REPORT FROM THE SEWER DEPARTMENT

With the addition of the Aerators the Town now has a capacity of 12,000 population equivalency in the lagoons.

On June 15, 1972 an explosion of unknown origin demolished the main pump station on Fordway. A new facility is presently under design by our engineers Camp, Dresser & McKee Inc. of Boston, Mass.

We turned on the chlorinator in November and discharged on effluent for the first time in almost two years.

The Town has added a full time operator who is licensed by the State of New Hampshire to operate a Sewage Treatment Plant.

The Town has rebuilt the Franklin Street Pump Station and installed larger pumps to handle the heavy load on the line.

Hadco Inc. is in the process of installing two reverse osmosis units to pretreat their waste to eliminate all of their toxic wastes.

The Town presently has a calculated population equivilency of 8600 on the sewer system.

The Town has received a report back from Camp, Dresser and McKee Inc. on the Sewer Study and they propose that we build a new treatment facility which would handle 34,000 population equivalency.

POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT

Chief Kenneth M. Bisbee, who served our community faithfully and loyally as the Chief of Police, retired on June 1, 1972. In 1972, prior to his retirement, he established two very valuable federally-funded projects; i.e., a Juvenile Officer Program and a Highway Safety Program. He saw the Juvenile Officer Program become a working part of his department, but the Highway Safety Program did not take full effect until after his retirement.

Lt. Ernest Gaines and Sgt. Horace Densmore who both served long and well for the Town of Derry retired November 1 and 28, respectively.

The department has added five new officers to fill the vacancies caused by retirements and other separations from the service.

Derry police officers received varied training during 1972. The Juvenile Officer completed a ten-week training course at the University of Southern California, the major topic being juvenile delinquency and related problems. A Sergeant attended a three-week training course in management of personnel at Babson Institute which was sponsored by the New England Chiefs of Police Association. The Sergeant also attended a one-week management conference sponsored by the New Hampshire Police Standards Training Council at Concord. Two patrolmen completed a six-week recruit training program, another patrol officer completed a one-week forensic science seminar, and several patrolmen attended one-day seminars on such topics as recent Supreme Court decisions, narcotics and dangerous drugs, alcohol problems, and juvenile delinquency.

Because training is a vital life line to professional police service, in 1973 we plan to elevate the performance level of your police officers by a continuing educational process. Some of the training will include recruit training, supervisory training, roll call training, and special day-long seminars on pertinent topics.

We have made several changes during 1972 with regard to

records keeping, plant facilities, uniforms, radio equipment, cruiser equipment, and policy and procedures.

During 1972, the Derry Police Department investigated 101 burglaries, 78 larcenies, and since June 1, 1972, have answered 3,989 calls for police service. We have presented 648 cases to the Derry District Court.

REPORT OF THE ASSESSOR 1972

Transfers of property for the year ending March 31, 1972 exceeded all previous records with 690 properties changing ownership. About 10% of these transfers were then resubdivided from two to one hundred smaller lots. The average assessment of these transfers is approximately 65% of market value, showing a real need for revaluation in the Town of Derry.

Assessments were made on 364 new structures including, gas stations, homes, industrial plants, swimming pools, mobile homes, etc. Also approximately 400 mobile homes were reviewed and revaluated with an average of 10% depreciation. In all catagories 1,890 tax cards were reviewed with a total gain in assessed value of seven million, five hundred and fifty eight thousand, three hundred and fifty dollars (\$7,558,350.00) which resulted in a reduction in the tax rate for Derry of \$2.63 and East Derry of \$3.25.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative Statetown program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

ANNUAL REPORT

HIGHWAY SAFETY COMMITTEE

Members are: Edward B. Garone, Chairman; Messrs. George Blanchard, William Boyce, Harold DiPietro, Ernest Gaines, William Howard, and Frederick Tompkins.

During 1972, the Highway Safety Committee acquired, through Federal funds, a Stevenson Breathalyzer, Model 900A. This is used to determine the blood/alcohol content in suspected Driving While Intoxicated offenders. This is a very valuable tool for law enforcement, primarily because one could have the appearance of intoxication, but be actually physically ill. This equipment will readily detect this and enable the police to provide the individual with proper medical care.

The Highway Safety Committee was also instrumental in acquiring, through the State Highway Safety Agency, a partially funded police cruiser with associated emergency equipment; i.e., radio, emergency lights, etc.

The members of the Highway Safety Committee have discussed and made several changes relative to the traffic patterns at the intersection of Broadway, Crystal Avenue, and Birch Street.

CIVIL DEFENSE ACTIVITIES FOR 1972

This year two (2) seminars for New Hampshire school teachers were held at the Derry EOC by the State Department of Education.

A simulated emergency conducted in the field included auxiliary personnel, hospital personnel and town departments and several interested persons.

There were several meetings held at the EOC, drawing up the Town of Derry Emergency Plan with assistance from the University of New Hampshire. This plan was drawn up, approved by the Selectmen and delivered to all town departments and interested personnel with the request that they draw up their own emergency plan to be included in the Derry Master Emergency Operations Plan.

Civil Defense personnel installed a ventilating system in the EOC to increase the number of personnel allowed in the emergency operations center during an emergency. Radio communications and EOC have been updated with the addition of two (2) meter radio equipment. Several ham operators are now training and will be training for the next few months in the EOC.

The outdoor warning system was tested twelve (12) times this

year. The telephone relay system was tested four (4) times this year. There were fifty-two (52) meetings and drills conducted at EOC involving approximately 1200 manhours.

Civil Defense will be known officially in the future as the Defense Civil Preparedness Agency. Under this agency, the personnel will be trained in the following types of emergencies

Bomb threats, Chemical accidents, Earthquakes, Enemy attacks, Floods, Forest and Wild land fires, Hurricanes, Major structural fires, Public demonstrations and Civil disturbances, Radiological accidents, Search and rescue, Tornadoes, Transportation accidents and Winter storms.

The Director would like to extend a cordial invitation to any citizen that would like to know about or be trained in any of these services.

DERRY CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission spent the first year finding out its duties and responsibilities.

A soil map was obtained from the Soil Conservation Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, a list of town owned land was compiled and several wet lands and marshes were viewed by the committee.

The Conservation Commission is proposing to the voters that Stark, Bowers, Mill, Frost, Cole and Cross roads be designated "scenic roads." This designation preserves the shade trees and stone walls along these roads while the town continues to be eligible for state road aid. The roads may be improved and surfaced but the trees and stone walls cannot be removed unless a public hearing is held by the Planning Board. The purpose of this is to preserve the rural atmosphere on these short stretches of road.

ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT REPORT

Having taken office as the Town Engineer on December 4, 1972, I have no report for 1972. However, it is felt appropriate here to mention my place in the Town government. Instead of being a "Superintendent of Public Works", it will be my general function to provide engineering planning, design and construction control services. I have been directed to supervise renovations and maintenance work in Town owned buildings and will be responsible for future planning for additional building space. The Engineer will report to the Selectmen but his services are available to all other Town officials, Boards and Commissions upon request to the Selectmen. Hopefully, these Town groups will take full advantage of the available services in the most efficient manner.

According to current commitments, I will consult with the Road Agent to determine the best methods and design for road reconstruction and repair and to outline programs for future work. I will assist the Superintendent of Sewer and Water on all engineering problems and ultimately assume responsibility for conducting this planning and design. For the Planning Board, I will review all plans for subdividions, new streets and utilities and submit my recommendations for their consideration. The Building Inspector and the Recreation Department will be given engineering assistance as their needs arise.

- 2. Payroll our nurses are paid \$3.10/hour. This is .40 less than other R.N.'s in Derry and the State. Our Head Nurse receives considerably less than the State average for her position and training.

We have asked for \$14,000.00 which is the actual cost of this last year's service to Derry, and we intend to increase the volume and the type of service at a time when our cost will be greater.

The effect of not receiving this money will be that the comprehensive coverage that is aimed for will not be attained, since our aim is to add another full time Registered Nurse to the staff to carry the extra work load.

DERRY PLANNING BOARD

During the year 1972 the Planning Board continued to hold bimonthly meetings, approving about seventy plans while denying only one, with several plans still under investigation.

The Board this year voted on many amendments and additions to the "Land Subdivision Control Regulations" of the Town.

The Board also this year had the distinct privilege of being the first Planning Board of Derry to nominate representatives to the Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Board members have met with the other various Boards and Department Heads in Town in an attempt to co-ordinate an orderly growth of the Town. Our members have also attended State, Local and other planning meetings this year.

This year for the first time the Planning Board has recorded approved plans in Exeter with the Register of Deeds. We have kept a complete file of same plans on mylar and collect fees from the subdivider to pay for the recordings.

By the time the Annual Town Meeting is held, we will have had two Public Hearings on the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. These amendments presented by petitions and by the Board will appear in the Town Warrant for a vote of the people.

1972 ANNUAL REPORT

Recreation has finally "come of age" in Derry as we begin our tenth year as a town department. No longer do the citizens think of recreation as a frill or excess baggage. . . more and more people recognize recreation as one of their basic human needs and as such, have supported it with their hard earned tax dollars as well as, their leisure time which is just as precious. With the growing increase of leisure the public has demanded and received increased activity and facilities to suit their needs through the Recreation & Parks Department. Tax payer approval, of an expanded budget, allowed for the construction of two new tennis courts at the Veterans' Memorial Field on Railroad Avenue. The vote at town meeting also turned over to the Recreation & Parks Department, the old West Side School at 39 West Broadway which will be used as a community center when it has been renovated. Surplus Food is already being distributed from it. The D.Y.O. and Derry Junior Womens' Club have also used the building for fund raising activities. Pinkerton Academy's winter track team practices in one of the upstairs rooms and other town departments are using some of the space for cold storage. We use the building ourselves when ever fesable for our maintenance activities.

Donations towards the cost of renovation are coming from various individuals and groups. Until we get enough to repair the roof and install a heating system we won't be able to occupy the building. With the help of those who feel strongly about the value of this type of facility, we hope to move our base of operations in there during 1973. There is an active advisory board made up of people from the different groups who have come forward to promote this project. It includes men, women and children of both sexes and from all walks of life. They have done much to help the West Side Community Center, so far, but a great deal remains to be done yet. Its a challange worthy of everyones effort and ideas. . .from auctions and rummage sales to recycling waste paper for funds, there is something for each one of us to do.

Volunteers are the backbone of our programs and without them, the cost of providing the same activities would certainly be prohibitive. To mention each one individually would take too much space and I could possibly miss someone which would be unfortunate. What most people do not realize is the fact that our full time employees Diane LaPlante and Don Ball donate much of their own time toward various programs. I mention it only because they are often taken for granted and should be recognized for their devotion and loyalty above and beyond their regular paid hours.

Some of our part time help was provided by the Neighborhood Youth Corps with headquarters in Portsmouth. We also participated in a Work-Study program with U.N.H. who provided the bulk of the salary of a student to work with us during the summer. Those individuals who participated this past summer included Craig Staples, Bruce Preston, Patty Catanzaro, Donna Lloyd, Curt Neland, Joe Melcher, John Corvo, Brian Cassel, Ernie Black and Cris Menento.

Our staff paid by the town included Dave Cino, Greg Monty, Denis Warner and Mike Fayle on the maintenance detail for the ball fields. James Tagalakis joined us as a supervisor for the N.Y.C. program. At Alexander-Carr Playground Ken McCann, Bryan Lister and Kathy Collins all new staffers provided the leadership with many new activities for the newcomers participating at that relatively new area. At Hood Park we had 100% return of staff members for a most successful season. With Don Ball in charge of the area, Miss Mary Sullivan as playground leader and Mrs. Dorothy Hines as arts and crafts specialist. Claudia Ketchum as head of the swim instruction aided by Susan Putnam and Mary Putnam. Peter Brassard was our chief life guard. Others teaching in private pools and lakes were Carol Madden, Sandy Crocker and Melinda Nicholson. They taught Mother & Tots, Adult and, with the help of volunteer teenage water aides, a class for handicapped children. This year we hope to add a group of synchronized swimmers.

Each year we like to thank those folks who provided us with facilities so we may carry on some special programs. This year our sincere thanks to Mr. & Mrs. Ralph Skillin and Mr. & Mrs. Crocker.

The town is most fortunate to have the facilities and programs it enjoys. . . compared to surrounding communities, as well as, towns throughout New England we can be proud of our Recreation & Parks Department. Along this line, our cost for providing all this is moderate. In 1972 we expended \$55,051.18 (4% over our recommended budget) in tax funds. In non-tax funds the trustees of trust funds turned over \$1,532.29 for MacGregor pioneer Park and \$6,809.79 for Alexander-Carr Playground. Other income, amounting to \$2,346.55 in user fees, concessions and misc. was also realized at Alexander-Carr Playground. This means the total expenditure, for all Recreation & Parks costs, of \$66,016.46 for our town estimated to be approximately 14,000 population. Thus the per capita cost to each person in town was \$4.72 (.50 more than the previous year). Yet the tax portion of this amount is between 2-3% of the tax dollar. Many people tell us, they feel they get more for their

tax money with recreation, than any other department. This ratio is below the national average, as well as under the state average for per capita costs for Recreation & Parks.

The Derry Recreation & Parks Commission is a group of five citizens appointed by the Selectmen to administer the department. This group meets monthly in an open meeting to which the public is invited. They welcome constructive criticism and are open to suggestions at all times. The Recreation Office hours were 9-12 noon and 1-4 p.m. . . . Monday through Friday as a regular basis. Although, we have heard at times, that some people are unable to contact us during those hours. We ask your patience at such times, as we are busy and may be out of the office or away from the telephone for a short period of time.

Our regular scheduled activities, including time and place, may be found in any of the four weekly publications distributed in town or in the three daily papers which are circulated locally. We are proud to be able to offer activities for all age groups from pre-schoolers to Senior Citizens and both sexes although the girls are still on the short end. Our aim in the future will be to provide as much support toward "life time" sports as we do for team games and activities. Changes in this area included: gymnastics for girls and more use of the Veterans' Memorial Building including teen-age, womans and girls basketball.

Our interaction with other town departments involves an increase in cooperation between us all. The Fire Department and the men at our sanitary land fill have been especially helpful, as well as, the Highway, Water and Sewer, and Police Departments. Continued cooperation can only result in a better working of all departments toward an improved community for everyone.

Plans for the near future encompasses: Folk-Reation (a social recreation activity for Senior Citizens) continuation of Crafts-Reation also for Senior Citizens; lighting tennis courts at Hood Park, color sealer for the new tennis courts and fence for the courts, as well as the softball field at Veterans Field; landscaping to make Derry Village Smith Field playable for little league play; hard surface the road going into the Alexander-Carr Ski Area and begin construction of a battery of eight tennis courts at Birch Street frontage of Alexander-Carr. If special articles are passed at Town Meeting we also will be able to do the roof and heating system for the West Side Community Center and lighting of Veterans' Field for which we may apply for Federal Funds (50%).

In the final analysis, not everything is perfect. We have success and failure. Our continuing failure to provide an outdoor shooting range may be brightened if an indoor range is included in the W.S.C.C. Folks are still upset over some of the users of MacGregor Pioneer Park, but the situation, where citizens are afraid to use public property is becoming less critical. Among the program failures; ice hockey still has a long way to go, archery never got started due to lack of leadership, and junior marksmanship was offered by the V.F.W., so we did not compete.

We have never been a group to banter numbers about, because it is too easy to confuse matters that way. But, one fact pertaining to participation and attendance is so outstanding we have decided to report it at this time. For the first time in this departments' short history the level of involvement reached 100,000 plus. This includes every person each time they participated in an activity or was involved as a spectator in any of the

activities or if they used any of the facilities such as picnic areas, ice rinks, and park property informally.

As we move ahead, we are greatful to the citizens of Derry who make our operation what it is today. With the backing of the townspeople and adequate financial compensation, we will continue to give all that's humanly possible to make this the best Recreation & Parks Department we can. As long as, we are allowed to progress and keep up, in some ways, with the expanding community's needs and demands, we will stay to serve the public as they deserve.
