## Town Warrant

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*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:* [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one Selectman for the term of three (3) years.
2. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Town Clerk.
3. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Town Treasurer.
4. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Tax Collector.
5. To choose by ballot and plurality vote three (3) members of the Library Committee for the term of three (3) years.
6. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Robinson Fund for the term of seven (7) years.
7. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds held by the Town of Exeter for the term of three (3) years.
8. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Swasey Parkway for the term of three (3) years.
9. To choose all other necessary Town officers, auditors or committees for the ensuing year.
10. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote pertaining thereto.
11. To see if the Town will vote to establish the annual salary of each Selectman in the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00).

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen and pursuant to RSA 33:7 to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of 1970 taxes and to issue therefor notes of the Town payable within one year after their date, and to pay or renew the same by the issue of new notes, payable within one year after the date of the original obligation.
13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collectors' deed as the result of tax sales at public auction.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be paid into the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund.
15. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund to finance the construction of a new Public Works garage and to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) to be paid thereinto.
16. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and ten others to see if the Town will vote to repeal the Zoning Ordinance of the Town as adopted at the Special Town Meeting of May 24, 1966, and as subsequently amended.
17. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and ten others to see if the Town will vote to revoke the creation of the Planning Board as heretofore created at the annual Town Meeting of March 9, 1965.
18. On petition of Paul A. Keefe and ten others to see if the Town will vote to adopt subdivision control, reference Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 36, Article 19.

36:19 **Grant of Power to Regulate.** A municipality may by ordinance or resolution authorize and empower the planning board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, plats showing streets, or the widening thereof, of parks, and the ordinance or resolution thus empowering the planning board shall make it the duty of the city clerk, town clerk, clerk of district commissioners, or other appropriate recording official to file with the register of deeds of the county in which the said



municipality is situated a certificate or notice showing that the said planning board has been so authorized, giving the date of such authorization.

19. On petition of H. Auldin Wellman and 154 others to see if the Town will vote to increase the Board of Selectmen to five (5) members as provided in New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 41-8B. The two additional selectmen to be elected at Town Meeting, 1971; one (1) for a term of three (3) years and, one (1) for a term of two (2) years. Each Selectman thereafter to be elected for a normal term of three (3) years.
20. On petition of Frederick J. Pitchforth and ten others to see if the Town will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system for the election of Town officers.
21. On petition of Frederick J. Pitchforth and ten others to see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law.
22. On petition of Frederick J. Pitchforth and ten others to see if the Town will vote to adopt a budget committee consisting of nine (9) members at large to be elected at the annual Town Meeting.
23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) for the reconstruction of Front Street from Water Street to the Exeter Inn.
24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to appoint a deputy treasurer, pursuant to RSA 41:29-a. Said deputy shall be sworn, shall have the powers of the treasurer, may be removed at the pleasure of the treasurer, and shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, give bond as provided in section 6 of this chapter.
25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000.00) to be used for the purchase of a self-propelled four (4) cubic yard street sweeper.



26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fourteen thousand two hundred and twenty-four dollars (\$14,224.00) for the purpose of purchasing eight automatic voting machines. Such sum to be raised by the issuance of serial notes or bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. (N.H. RSA 33) and any amendments thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes or bonds, the discretion of fixing the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and of providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Selectmen as shall be in the best interest of the Town, and to pass any vote relating thereto.
27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract for the preparation of tax maps of the entire Town of Exeter, said contract to be completed within two (2) years, and for this purpose to raise a sum not exceeding \$38,500.00.
28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) for the purpose of conducting a study of the lagoon treatment system.
29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a code study committee and for this purpose raise and appropriate one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and convey, for the sum of One Dollar, to Exeter and Hampton Electric Company, an Easement for the transmission of electric energy, power, and current, by appropriate means, over and across a strip of land one hundred (100) feet in width, bounded Westerly by land of the Boston and Maine Railroad, Northerly by the Exeter By-Pass Highway, a distance of approximately one thousand (1,000) feet, Easterly by the Squamscott River and Southerly by land of the Town of Exeter, being a portion of the premises acquired by the Town of Exeter from Paul E. and Anne S. Molloy.

31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute a confirmatory deed to Willie E. Bisson and James C. Tucker to replace a lost deed previously executed by the Board of Selectmen on March 26th, 1962, pursuant to vote of the Town conveying a parcel known as "Mill Property, Pick-pocket Road," which said Bisson and Tucker purchased at the Selectmen's auction of land taken for non-payment of taxes on March 9, 1962.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) to be paid to the Portsmouth Mental Health Clinic.

33. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend the zoning map to enlarge the industrial district located southeasterly of the Kingston Road so that it will encompass the entire area southeasterly of the Kingston Road, northwesterly of the railroad tracks, and 500 feet northeasterly of and parallel to the Exeter River up to the boundary of the present existing industrial area on the Kingston Road.

34. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend the zoning map by adding a new industrial district described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Epping Road and Beech Hill Road; thence running easterly along the Epping Road and Exeter by-pass to a point 1,000 feet westerly of the northwest corner of the intersection of the Newfields Road and the Exeter by-pass; thence running northerly a distance of 2,400 feet along a line parallel to and 1,000 feet distant from said Newfields Road to a point; thence running westerly along a line parallel to and distant 2,400 feet from the Exeter by-pass and Epping Road to the Beech Hill Road; thence running southerly along the Beech Hill Road to the intersection of the Epping Road at the point begun at.

35. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 1, PURPOSE:** by adding the words "zoning map" after the first word so that it will read as follows:

**ARTICLE 1, PURPOSE:** The zoning map and regulations as herein set forth have been made for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, and general welfare of the community under the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated.

36. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 4 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Paragraph A. (3) by striking the words "Parks and playgrounds" and substituting the following:

(3) Parks, playgrounds, and other public athletic areas.

37. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 5 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Paragraph A. (4) by striking the words "Schools and other institutional structures" and substituting the following:

(4) Schools, hospitals, and any non-profit institutional building serving the public.

38. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 6 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Paragraph A: by adding thereto a new clause (5) to read as follows:

(5) Professional offices occupying not more than 25 per cent of a dwelling.

39. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 7 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Paragraph A: by adding a new paragraph (6) to read as follows:

(6) Apartment houses and multiple dwellings by special exception to be granted by the Board of Adjustment which may consist of separate but connected units of up to 48 units which will meet the following criteria:

- a. No building shall be in excess of three (3) stories in height.
- b. Every lot shall have a minimum frontage upon a public street or a private way of 90 feet for the first dwelling unit with an added 10 feet for the second dwelling unit and an additional 5 feet for each additional dwelling unit in the apartment complex. Private ways shall meet the Town's requirements for public streets.
- c. Each building shall have a setback of not less than the adjacent building or 25 feet; a side yard allowance of 10 feet and a rear yard allowance of 15 feet.
- d. There shall be available one and one-half (1½) off-street parking spaces for each dwelling unit.
- e. There shall be connection into town water and town sewerage.
- f. There shall be no unreasonable danger or hazard, from increased traffic; preference is to be given to self-contained access routes to main thoroughfares rather than access through existing residential streets.
- g. There shall be no unreasonable disruption of property values in the area.
- h. There shall be available 400 square feet of additional area for recreational purposes for each dwelling unit.

40. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 8 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Subsection C. Area Requirements: paragraph (1) (a) by striking the subparagraph "The minimum lot area shall be 9,000 square feet, with an added lot area of 3,000 square feet for each additional dwelling unit," and substituting the following:

(a) The minimum lot area shall be 9,000 square feet, with an added lot area of 2,000 square feet for the second dwelling unit and 1,000 square feet for each additional dwelling unit.

41. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 9 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 1, Residential District:** Sub-section C. Area Requirements: paragraph (1) (b) by striking the subparagraph "Every lot shall have a minimum frontage upon a public or private way of 100 feet, with an additional 10 feet for each additional dwelling unit," and substituting the following:

(b) Every lot shall have a minimum frontage upon a public street or a private way of 90 feet for the first dwelling unit with an added 10 feet for the second dwelling unit and an additional 5 feet for each additional dwelling unit. Private ways shall meet the Town's requirements for public streets.

42. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 10 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 2, Rural-Residential District:** Paragraph B. Area Requirement: by striking the sentence "Minimum of one acre lots, with 200-foot frontage along a public or private way," and substituting the following:

B. Area Requirements:

(1) In areas serviced by a public sewer system and where the buildings are tied into said system, then the area and yard requirements shall be the same as the requirements in the residential district.

43. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 11 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 2, Rural-Residential District:** Paragraph B. Area Requirement: by striking the sentence "Minimum of one acre lots, with 200-foot frontage along a public or private way," and substituting the following:

(2) In areas not serviced by a public sewer system, the minimum lot area shall be 20,000 square feet with an additional 5,000 square feet for each additional dwelling unit provided the lot area will meet the equivalent of the minimum percolation requirements for the F.H.A. or V.A. for government loan guarantees. If not, the minimum lot area shall be of sufficient increased size to meet such sanitary percolation requirements. Each building shall have a minimum frontage along a public or private way of 150 feet. Private ways shall meet the Town's requirements for public streets.

44. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 12 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** Sub-section A. Permitted Uses: Paragraph (2): by striking the words "Retail Establishment" and substituting the following:

(2) Wholesale and retail establishments.

45. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 13 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** Sub-section A: by adding a new paragraph (5) to read as follows:

(5) Hotels, motels, nursing homes and any service industry, providing there is a connection to town sewer and water systems.

46. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 14 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** Sub-section A: by adding a new paragraph (6) which reads as follows:

- (6) Apartment houses and multiple dwellings by special exception to be granted by the Board of Adjustment of up to 48 units which meet the same criteria as described in the requirements for multiple dwellings in the residential districts.

47. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 15 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** Sub-section A: adding paragraph (7) which reads as follows:

- (7) No building shall exceed three (3) stories in height.

48. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 16 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** Sub-section B: by striking the paragraph "Yard Requirements: No structure shall be erected or extended within 10 feet of any lot line."

49. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 17 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 3, Commercial District:** by adding a new subsection:

B. Off-Street Parking Requirements:

- (1) Motels and Hotels: Four (4) parking spaces for each five rentable rooms.  
(2) Restaurants and Eating Places: Parking spaces equal to 20 per cent of capacity.  
(3) Retail stores, professional offices and wholesale establishments: One (1) parking space for each 150 square feet of usable space.

50. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 18 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 4, Industrial District:** by striking the sentence "Only manufacturing, warehousing, and wholesale uses will be permitted," and substituting the following:

**Section 4, Industrial District**

A. Permitted Uses:

- (1) Manufacturing, assembling, warehousing, and wholesale uses.  
(2) Any use specifically permitted in the commercial and rural residential districts and excepting uses specifically permitted in the residential district.

51. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 19 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 4, Industrial District:** Sub-section A: by adding paragraph (3) to read as follows:

- (3) Manufacturing and warehouse buildings shall occupy no more than 50 per cent of the area of any



lot; no building shall exceed three (3) stories in height and shall have front, side, and rear yards, of at least 20 feet with sufficient off-street parking space for employees.

52. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 20 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend **ARTICLE 3, Section 5, General District:** by striking the sentence "Only mobile homes and trailers will be permitted," and substituting the following:

**Section 5, General District:** Mobile Homes and Trailers only, will be permitted in this district.

53. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 21 as proposed by the planning board for the town zoning ordinance as follows?

Amend the zoning ordinance by adding:

**ARTICLE 9, DEFINITION:** For purposes of this ordinance, a mobile home and/or trailer shall not be considered a building or a dwelling unit, and therefore shall be restricted to the General District.

54. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the Town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the Town, for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the Town.

55. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Submitted herewith is the Audit Report of the Town of Exeter, for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969.

## **Scope of Audit**

All departments of the Town Government were audited, including: The Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, District Court, Swasey Parkway, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water and Sewer Departments.

## **Financial Statements**

Exhibit A-1 is a Comparative Balance Sheet, fiscal years December 31, 1968, and December 31, 1969. The net debt at the close of 1969 was \$80,258.34. At the end of December 31, 1968, \$1,262,319.02. A decrease of \$1,182,060.68 sewer indebtedness was transferred. The net decrease was \$104,060.68.

Exhibit A-2 shows appropriations, expenditures, and balances unexpended and overdrafts. The 1969 budget showed a net unexpended balance of \$122,465.86.

Exhibit A-3 shows estimated and actual revenues received. The excess of estimates over actual was \$98,325.27. This against the unexpended balances of appropriations shows a net budget surplus of \$24,140.59 for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969.

## **Departments**

Exhibits B-1 through J shows activities in all Town departments, showing receipts, expenditures, and proof of balances with depository banks. All monies were accounted for by reconciling with depository banks.

Verification notices were sent out on all delinquent taxes for the current year, 1969.

### General Comments

The new controlling system of bookkeeping was in splendid order. The Selectmen and Town Manager received a detailed list of expenditures, balances unexpended, and overdrafts at the close of each month.

The better control of spending resulted in a net budget surplus of \$24,140.59, the first budget black ink year since 1966. May the good management continue into the future.

During the year the former Tax Collector resigned and a new one was appointed. A complete audit was conducted and new warrants were given to the new collector.

All the records were in excellent condition. The audit program was much easier this year and I wish to congratulate and thank all Town officials for assisting me during the course of audit.

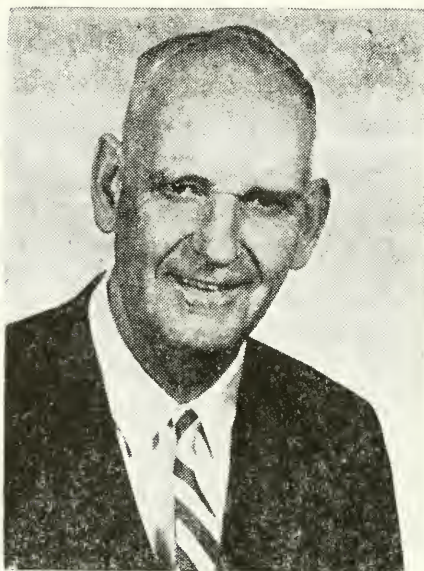

## Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association

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In the past year the Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association has extended and expanded in many areas its program of services for patient care in the home. The Agency now includes 10 towns and has reached optimum size for efficient service.

Each town is represented on the Board of the Agency by members appointed by the selectmen of the respective towns. Meetings of the board and staff are held on the first Monday of each month at the Agency office at 10 Front Street, Exeter. In addition to this regular monthly meeting, a Medical Advisory Committee meets each month to recommend and review policies which involve medical and nursing consideration. The committee includes three members of the board, the senior nurse, Dr. Charles DeLuccia, and Mrs. J. R. Hollingsworth, director of nurses at the Exeter Hospital.

The Agency is staffed by four registered nurses working full time — Mrs. Edward Castle (senior nurse), Mrs. Pauline Conklin, Mrs. Dorothy Zimmerman and Mrs. James Colcord, and two part-time — Mrs. Robert Chamberlain and Mrs. Charles DeStefano. Mrs. Kenneth Haley continue as physical therapist. Mrs. Thomas Cronshaw serves as secretary-bookkeeper. Our staff is continually working to upgrade itself by attending professional meetings and conferences. Our senior nurse is presently taking courses toward a degree in Public Health Nursing.

Nurses work under orders from each patient's own physician. Nursing care includes such services as bed baths, changes of dressings, injections, colostomy care, help with newborn babies. Physical therapy includes exercising, massage, application of hot packs, gait training. Calls for assistance may be placed from 8 a.m. to

4:30 p.m. on Mondays through Fridays by dialing 772-2981.

The record collection has proven to be a success. We hope to enlarge it in 1970 and have more of a variety.

The beautiful Andrew Wyeth book of his paintings was given to the library by Mr. Edwin Cotton in memory of his wife. This may be seen by asking permission at the main desk. It is too valuable to circulate.

Mrs. David Merrill presented to us the "Merrill Notes" which she recently compiled. They will be a fine addition to our genealogical room. 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## Report of Conservation Commission

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The Commission has gone forward with its tree nursery project on the town owned property west of the sewer lagoons. Last May a variety of 430 hard wood seedlings were set out, ranging in height from one foot to five feet. Some of these seedlings should be ready for street planting in 1971. Seedlings set out were red maple, sugar maple, red oak, scarlet oak, white oak, black gum, sycamore, and white birch. In the spring of 1970, more hardwood seedlings will be set out to provide the town with a continuous supply of trees for transplanting. Roger Sloan and Wilfred Moreau as Commission members are supervising the development of the town owned nursery.

Last May the Commission supervised the setting out of 20 maple trees along town streets. It is planned to set out 25-30 more next spring.

The Powder House roof has been reshingled, a new iron grated door installed, and the outside area cleaned up. Once the town formally acquires the Powder House Point, the Commission will complete the project by putting in steps, erecting an historical marker, and landscaping. It is of historical interest to note that Charles C. Russell shingled the roof last in 1941 and left a copy of the 1941 Town Report and some EXETER NEWS-LETTERS under the eaves. We likewise left a copy of the 1968 Town Report, some 1969 NEWS-LETTERS, and a letter to posterity.

The Commission has received, with the approval of the Selectmen, an easement or right-of-way to the 13 acres of woodland west of the railroad overpass on the Newmarket Road. It is hoped that this property will be the beginning of a wildlife refuge with limited recreational use for Exeter residents.



Some 400 children attended the showing of films on conservation last March in the Exeter Elementary School. The film rental and other necessary arrangements were made by the Commission.

The Commission wishes to thank the citizens of Exeter for providing funds to support its projects. Suggestions as to how it should best proceed to conserve and improve upon our natural resources are welcomed. Meetings are held monthly and are open to the public. Since the Commission is empowered to hold land in the name of the town, gifts of land that can be kept for scenic use or as a wildlife sanctuary would be well received.

## Report of the Planning Board

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The Planning Board had an attrition rate of over 50 per cent during 1969 necessitating the appointment of four new members including the chairman.

This fact and the ramifications of it, such as the time involved and familiarizing all new members with the state statutes and prior planning done by veteran board members, has limited the time available for new planning.

This valuable time lost should be prevented in the future since we have now instituted the procedure of selecting new board members from a list kept by the selectmen. The person on the list the longest will be invited to sit in on all board meetings as a non-voting member. This will allow him to be updated sufficiently on Planning Board matters upon his appointment with no loss of time or efforts by the entire board.

Even with the aforementioned problem, we have reviewed the existing ordinance and will be able to present some definite improvements to it for voter consideration and hopeful approval at the Annual Town Meeting, March, 1970. These recommendations are the results of some of the following: the town's recent water and sewerage extensions, problems brought out at variance hearings held by the Exeter Board of Adjustment, and review of state statutes and federal requirements.

On behalf of the Planning Board, I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen for their continued sup-

port and especially Town Manager Paul Keefe for his guidance, active participation, objective recommendations, and demonstrated leadership.

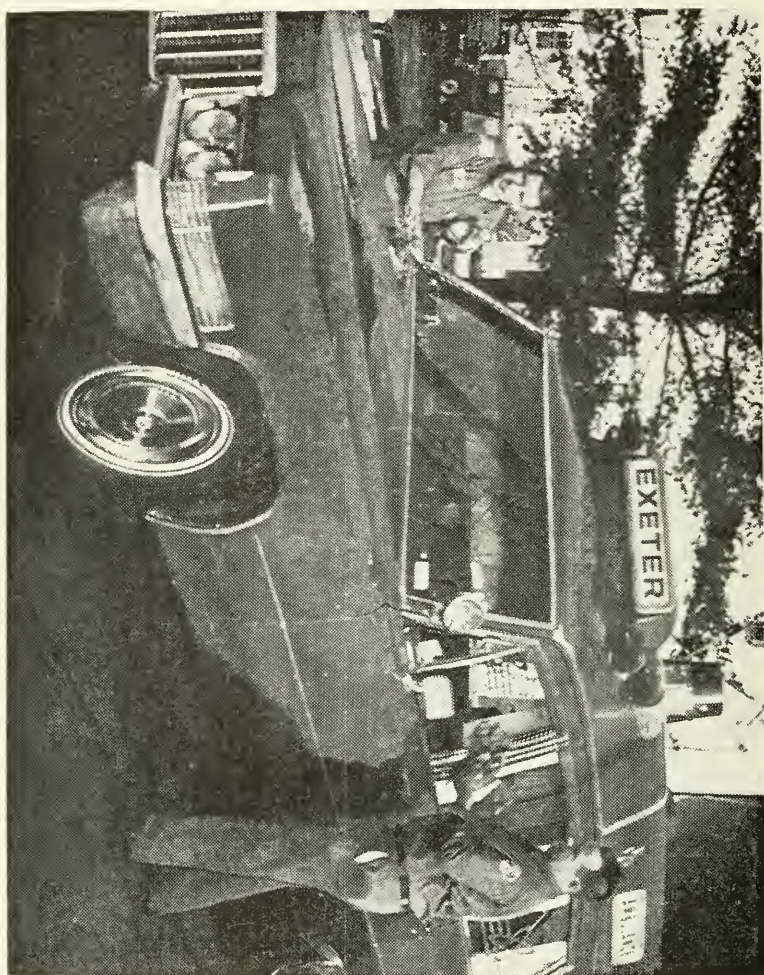
