We have at the depot fire station the old engine which was built in 1779 and was the first one in Fitzwilliam. This engine is in first class condition and was exhibited at the Firemen's Muster last summer in Winchendon, Mass. It is very interesting to look over and it may be seen at the Depot fire station at any time. At the same time you may see the old Eagle Hand Engine that also is stationed there.

We recommend a new supply of rubber coats and a sectional ladder at least 30 ft. long to be carried on the truck for the depot company.

For the Village more 2½ in. hose is needed.

The equipment of both companies is in first class condition.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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To the School Board and Citizens of Fitzwilliam :

I herein submit my seventh annual report as superintendent of schools.

Education today faces a crisis in history and civilization. If we are to maintain the ideals of democracy, we must not forget the boys and girls in our public schools who are soon to be the men and women that have to carry on in a changed world. They will have to cope against far reaching questions any pay enormous debts. Therefore, it is fitting that we scrutinize carefully our objectives and clarify our methods of procedure. Indeed, in our final analysis we must regard our boys and girls in the public schools as our first and last line of defense.

All isms and philosophies that are poisonous to democracy and the American Way of life must be banished from public schools and colleges.

We believe our methods of procedure must follow along three lines of thought, viz. (1) An invigorated drill and practice in fundamentals, the efficiency of the "Three R's" can not be overlooked, the purity of the English language must be maintained, the intellectual activity and vision of life extended. (2) The pupils must be imbued with a deeper feeling for sense of appreciation of and a higher respect for the home, the school and the community. (3) Every child must be brought into contact with some situation of life that may give him control of himself, give him the power of decision between right and wrong. The boys and girls of today are looking not only onward but also upward. Let our training be such that they will see more above them than airplanes but will grasp the fundamental ideas of a Divinity that rules the Universe.

With the coordination and correlation of the above mentioned lines of thought, we may be able to reach our objective, viz. the true Christian American citizen, to whom we may delegate with safety the welfare of the American Way of life, the Constitution and the highest ideals of democracy.

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### REPORT OF THE SUPERVISOR OF MUSIC

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I am happy to report that the past year has shown progress in the Music Department of the Fitzwilliam Schools. Progress is not to be measured only by what is seen and heard in public. Routine, theoretical work must go on. However I wish to mention some activities aside from routine.

All grades from four through Junior High school (including Grade IX) have listened to the N. B. C. Music Appreciation concerts, using the work sheets prescribed for the courses.

Again Fitzwilliam Junior High school,—or rather it's Ninth Grade, corresponding to Freshman Class of High school, was represented in the New Hampshire High School Music Festival held in Laconia, May 16, 17 and 18, 1940. Lois Bemis was a member of the All-State Chorus of 200 voices. Fitzwilliam, Troy and Jaffrey singers engaged in weekly rehearsals with their Supervisor and on Festival week presented to the School Board, Junior High, High School pupils and some parents of the three towns represented, the entire chorus program from memory.

Pupils of the Grades have been prepared for participation in special Christmas, Memorial Day and other exercises.

For the first time in many years, if ever, the Junior High has a Mixed Glee Club.

It is with gratitude that I write this report,—for the co-operation of Superintendent, School Board and Teachers.
