



I am sure that those who have received the care and treatment at the hospital, which this fund made possible, appreciate what has been done for them, but it seems to me that all the people of Fitzwilliam should realize what the fund means to the town.

Of the house fires 4 were very serious but with the exception of one all were covered by insurance and are now rebuilt.

The brush fires were all in slash lots and there was no damage.

We have at the depot fire station the old engine which was built in 1779 and was the first one in Fitzwilliam. This engine is in first class condition and was exhibited at the Firemen's Muster last summer in Winchendon, Mass. It is very interesting to look over and it may be seen at the Depot fire station at any time. At the same time you may see the old Eagle Hand Engine that also is stationed there.

We recommend a new supply of rubber coats and a sectional ladder at least 30 ft. long to be carried on the truck for the depot company.

For the Village more $2\frac{1}{2}$ in. hose is needed.

The equipment of both companies is in first class condition.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Fitzwilliam:

I herein submit my seventh annual report as superintendent of schools.

Education today faces a crisis in history and civilization. If we are to maintain the ideals of democracy, we must not forget the boys and girls in our public schools who are soon to be the men and women that have to carry on in a changed world. They will have to cope against far reaching questions any pay enormous debts. Therefore, it is fitting that we scrutinize carefully our objectives and clarify our methods of procedure. Indeed, in our final analysis we must regard our boys and girls in the public schools as our first and last line of defense.

All isms and philosophies that are poisonous to democracy and the American Way of life must be banished from public schools and colleges.

We believe our methods of procedure must follow along three lines of thought, viz. (1) An invigorated drill and practice in fundamentals, the efficiency of the "Three R's" can not be overlooked, the purity of the English language must be maintained, the intellectual activity and vision of life extended. (2) The pupils must be imbued with a deeper feeling for. sense of appreciation of and a higher respect for the home, the school and the community. (3) Every child must be brought into contact with some situation of life that may give him control of himself, give him the power of decision between right and wrong. The boys and girls of today are looking not only onward but also upward. Let our training be such that they will see more above them than airplanes but will grasp the fundamental ideas of a Divinity that rules the Universe.

With the coordination and correlation of the above mentioned lines of thought, we may be able to reach our objective. viz. the true Christian American citizen, to whom we may delegate with safety the welfare of the American Way of life, the Constitution and the highest ideals of democracy.

signed at the Columbian school, the following teachers were elected to the respective positions: Mr. Thomas Passios, a graduate of Fitchburg State Teachers College, was elected as teacher of village school, and Miss Mary Sophia Nano, a graduate of the Keene Teachers College, was elected as teacher of Columbian school, grades IV-VI.

At time of writing, the schools are well organized, the attendance good, the teaching modern, the progress normal and the cooperation of pupils, teachers and parents wholesome. These conditions give promise for a successful year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the school board, teachers and parents for their cooperation and support.

Pupils of the Grades have been prepared for participation in special Christmas, Memorial Day and other exercises.

For the first time in many years, if ever, the Junior High has a Mixed Glee Club.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Fitzwilliam, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fitzwilliam on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To hear and act upon reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen,
 - Art. 2. To allow accounts against the Town.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint a Highway Agent for the ensuing year; or take any action thereon.
- Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town officers for the ensuing year; to choose one Trustee to have charge of the Trust fund.
- Art. 5. To select Trustees for the Town Library or take any action thereon.
 - Art. 6. To elect one Selectman for three years.
- Art. 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- Art. 9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to lighting the streets, and raise and appropriate money therefor.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800 for oiling Town roads.
- Art. 11. To raise and appropriate money for repairs of Town Highways and bridges and determine the amount.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of T. R. A. roads and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$690.87, the State to give \$2,763.49.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for a living Christmas tree, to be placed on the Common, same to be cared for by the Village District Commissioners.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to help maintain a District Nurse for the ensuing year, the same to be expended under the direction of the Fitzwilliam District Nursing Association, or take any action thereon.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for general care of the Fitzwilliam Cemeteries and determine the amount.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and maintenance of the Fitzwilliam Town Library and determine the amount.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 in excess of the amount required by law for the purchase of books for the Fitzwilliam Town Library.

- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the use of Fitzwilliam Village Precinet, in care of the Common and sidewalks.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for general care and maintenance of the Depot Park, the same to be expended under the direction of the Depot Park Commission.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00. (1-100th of one percent of the assessed valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns in the Monadnock Region.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used for the observance of Memorial Day, the same to be expended under the direction of the Patriotic bodies.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used for destroying Gypsy and brown tail moths.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Town Hall Agent the sum of \$300.00 per year.
- Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to publish in the annual town report, an abstract of business transacted in the previous meeting and any special Town meeting, since the last annual report.
- Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit smoking in the hallways, stairways and main hall in the Town Hall and provide a penalty for any violation thereof.

- Art. 26. To see if the Town will restrict the use of the Town Dump to residents or tax payers of the town or take any action relative thereto.
- Art. 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
