

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday the tenth day of March at twelve of the clock noon, to act on the following subjects. Polls will be open from twelve of the clock noon until six P.M. Regular business meeting will be held at seven P.M.

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$34,190.00 from:

To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$34,000.00 for the summer maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish \$8,484.85 as Class V allotment and \$10,964.92 as highway subsidy. The Town to raise the balance.

Article 4.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for the winter maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 5.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$555.56 and apply for Class V assistance, TRA, so called. The State of New Hampshire to furnish \$3,703.70.

Article 6.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against appropriations on the amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,722.00 for the Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Assoc.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for repairs to the covered bridges.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for capital expenses for emergency medical equipment.

Article 11.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for capital expenses for fire department equipment.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of fire equipment.

Article 13.

To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of highway equipment.

Article 14.

To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in spending by the State or any city, town or other governmental unit of the State to five percent.

Article 15.

To see if the Town will vote to change the term of the position of fence viewer from the current one year term to a three year term. Said change, if so voted, to become effective in 1982.

(Above article No. 15 inserted by request.)

Article 16

To see if the Town will vote to hold future Town Meetings in the daytime.

(Above article No. 16 inserted by request.)

Article 17.

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 72 ;70 for a property tax exemption on real property equipped with a wood heating system.

(Above article No. 17 inserted by request.)

Article 18.

To see if the Town will vote to create a regional refuse disposal committee to work with the NH/VT Solid Waste Project to find a solution for our solid waste disposal problem and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$249.50 for the expenses of the project and instruct the moderator to appoint the committee within ten days of this meeting.

Article 19.

To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of cemetery lots.

Article 20.

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 21.

To see if Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 22.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 23.

To allow accounts.

REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF

We started off 1980 with a patient pinned under a truck, and ended it, on Christmas Day, at -250, working on a garage fire in Alstead. All told this past year, we responded to the call a total of 30 times. This is one more than last year and all of the fire dept. personnel know that we got off very lucky this year. Here is a summary of the nature of these calls.

10 Structure fires

- 10 Structure fires
- 7 E.M.T. calls (and, or car accidents)
- 6 Chimney fires
- 3 Brush or grass fires
- 2 Smoke investigations
- 1 Lawn mower fire
- 1 False alarm

I would like to give you a break down on these calls to further inform you, as to our operations.

We called upon mutual aid two times and responded to 11 mutual aid calls in 4 towns. One of these in town mutual aid calls was for equipment we don't carry on our trucks, and the other was a call for additional apparatus for a reported house fire on Holden Hill, which turned out to be a chimney fire. The out of town fires included Saxonville Lumber, a trailer fire, several house fires, Jacobs Machine Shop, and a garage fire. Most surrounding towns have to respond to mutual aid calls more than they call upon mutual aid. This is because each large fire involves several towns being called. Each and every town wants to uphold its end of the bargain in the mutual aid system. It is very comforting for the officer in charge to know that he has all the power and equipment of the mutual aid system at his beck and call.

Our medical emergency calls stayed about the same this year, in number. However, some certainly seemed to be of a more serious nature than last year. We now have three more trained personnel to cope with these situations. Lucien Beam, Wendell Holbrook and yours truly recently completed our 52 hour course on advanced first aid. This, coupled with the new equipment purchased this year, is another shot in the arm for Langdon Fire and Rescue.

I think this is a good time and place to offer our thanks to Delinda Campbell, Warren Campbell, and Doug Bayes. They are E.M.T.'s who run on Langdon calls, even though they live in Alstead. They are already radio equipped by virtue of their affiliation with the Alstead Fire Department. This is a big help to us, and it brings our medical emergency personnel to the count of nine. Help is no further away than a call to 352-1100, mutual aid headquarters.

Another thanks is in order to Joan Beach and Ivy Lane for their donation of warm blankets to the department. These are very useful in treating for shock.

Last but certainly not least, on the subject of medical calls, is an offer of thanks to Robert (Bobby) Davis. He is a top-notch E.M.T. who taught our advanced first aid course, and belongs to the department also. Bob is currently enrolled in training to become a para-medic. One very knowledgeable fellow as you can see, is Bob Davis.

Chimney fires were up by 50% this year. This is due to the increased interest and the use of wood-burning stoves. That is a polite way of saying we are all trying to keep as many of our dollars as possible away from the oil interests, that are currently gouging the country to death. We on the fire department understand this, and realize we are going to be called to more chimney fires. If you call us as soon as possible (352-1100) there is very little to worry about with a fire in a decent chimney.

Our two smoke investigations were due to smoke in residences, and the occupants did the right thing by calling 352-1100 immediately. This brings trained personnel to the scene, and after all, this is why we dedicate ourselves to this job. It is the culmination of hundreds of hours of formal training under the supervision of some of the most respected instructors in the business. YOUR Langdon firemen know their stuff. And if there is a subject we don't have enough knowledge about, we will find a course available to us to correct the situation. It may sound like I am kind of high on the fire department. This is because I am. Every passing year has seen improvements in personnel, and due to the generosity OF YOU, the townspeople, we are able to add to our equipment each year.

I have just reviewed our roster, which shows each time a fireman comes to the station for a call, drill, or meeting. There are 863 check marks. For 16 regular firemen and 3 additional medical personnel this is quite impressive. If each man averages two miles to the station, this is about 3,452 miles between home and fire department. At \$1.40 a gallon for gas, this is another impressive figure. These figures don't reflect our training courses, which are taken in Fitzwilliam, N. H., and Laconia, N. H. I'm not trying to prove any specific point by manipulating statistics. I am just pointing out the dedication displayed by our Langdon Fire and Rescue Department. These men pay their own expenses, and don't receive one dime of compensation. How many other municipal organizations display this kind of devotion to duty? Here I would like to list these men, for YOUR information.

We had two drills this year that were large in scope. The Fall Mountain Regional High School drill involved (6) towns and the Hubbard Farms drill involved (5) towns. Both were necessary and required many planning hours for good coverage. We sucked Great Brook dry on the Hubbard Farms drill and maintained 700 gallons per minute.

Our money raising and social events this year included, cutting cordwood, for sale to Langdon homes, a Mothers Day pancake breakfast, running the kiddie rides in Alstead at the 4th of July celebration, and a dance. Joe Holmes donated the standing cordwood to us and then bought back 6 cords of it! Our thanks to Joe and to Clifford Holmes for his help also. I wonder how much wood we could cut in a weekend with the townspeople pitching in too? Also do we have anyone who would donate the standing wood for this kind of an organized effort? If you want to volunteer either labor or wood, speak up after town meeting please; or any time that is convenient.

This year completed our purchasing program on turn-out gear and portable pagers. THANKS to you! It's hard to describe the pride we feel in having this equipment. Last year I mentioned that when we were done with the personal gear program, we should purchase a new pumper-tanker combination truck. I still feel this is important, and hope to have a proposal in the town warrant regarding this. It is a hard subject to broach because of the amount of money needed; however, trucks are going up about 15% per year, and the longer we put it off the worse it is going to hurt. It is very possible that we could find a project like this over the course of several years through the Farmers Home Administration. I will know more of what to say to you by town meeting time.

I could go on forever with this report, but I realize that you would like to finish reading it by town meeting time.

I think that for the \$13,360.00 you pledged to the department last year, you deserve to know as much as possible about our activities. Here's hoping this is a satisfactory explanation. Remember the number for the fire, medical, or rescue type emergencies is **352-1100**, mutual aid 24 hour dispatch center. We have phone stickers available with this number if you don't have one.

Annual Report to the Town of Langdon for 1980

In 1980 the VNA provided a total of 96 units of services to 35 Langdon residents, 8.2% of the population on which the VNA's tax appropriation was based:

Skilled Nursing Home Visits	50
Home Health Aide Visits	4
Clinic Attendance	42

Tax appropriations account for approximately 30% of the VNA's costs for service. Income is received from Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, small special grants and private contributions.

The community has available the full range of home health services when they are needed. In addition, clinics for blood pressure control were conducted in Langdon, or made available to Langdon residents in neighboring communities, two or three times a month throughout the year. Other clinics for multiphasic screening for diabetes, liver and kidney disorders, bowel cancer and anemia were also conducted a number of times. For much of the clinic work the agency located private funding.

REPORT OF ZONING ADMINISTRATOR

During 1980 the Planning Board was unusually busy. The first phase of the Master Plan was completed.

Questionnaires were distributed, collected and tabulated by members of the Board. Response was good and formed the basis of our Master Plan.

It was evident that growth and the control of growth was paramount in everyone's mind. Four areas were established as being of greatest concern. They were (1) land use, (2) highways, bridges and fire protection, (3) Government on the town level and (4) schools. A great majority of the answers reflected the awareness of the existing ordinances and the positive impact they have had.

Four committees were formed and charged with making recommendations to the Planning Board. The committees paralleled the areas of greatest needs as assessed from the survey, i.e. Land Use, Highway and Bridges, Town Government and Schools.

The first three committees have had meetings and forwarded recommendations. The fourth committee on schools has not been formed but will be this year.

It is obvious that in a town the size of Langdon, the number of people who are available and willing to participate is somewhat limited.

The Committee on land use will need at least six to nine months to make a substantial recommendation.

All parts of the Master Plan will be used to substantiate our present Codes.

The Planning Board also has been presented with a plan for a development on the old Winch Farm. The Proposal is to subdivide the area in house lots from two to thirty-five in number at the present time.

The Board of Adjustment has met twice and given recommendations to the Building Inspector.
