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

## WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon,  
qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in  
said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten  
o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.
- 6th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars, for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to issue Bonds under the provisions of the "Municipal Bond Act" of 1895, to cover the floating indebtedness of the town incurred in consequence of the building of the iron bridge over the Connecticut river at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

8th. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to unite with the town of Hartford, in the state of Vermont, or with the Selectmen of said Hartford, and other parties interested, in the construction and support of a free bridge across the Connecticut river, between the towns of Lebanon and Hartford, at Olcott, and contract with them as to the proportion of expense to be borne by each party in such construction and support, the expense to the town of Lebanon for construction not to exceed the sum of three thousand dollars, or act thereon.

9th. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to visit and make a new appraisal of all the real estate in the town, or act thereon.

10th. To see if the town will vote to require the proprietors of the Boston & Maine Railroad to station a flagman at the crossing near Shaw's mill.

11th. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to secure a division of the Eldridge property, owned by the town and the Unitarian Society, either by agreement with said society, or by process of law, or act thereon.

THE BOARD OF HEALTH.**

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The number of contagious diseases reported the past year is as follows:

Measles, epidemic.	
Diphtheria,	I
Typhoid fever,	II

The single case of Diphtheria proved fatal. It was in a family which came from Canada, where the other children had had the disease.

Of the cases of Typhoid Fever none were fatal.

Two deaths resulted from the consequences of Measles. More deaths are said to result from this disease than from Scarlet Fever, but it does not prove to be so in this locality.

The number of births was 99; the number of deaths, 79. The ages of the decedents seems very remarkable and worthy of notice—between 70 and 80, 12; 80 and 90, 11; over 90, 6; oldest, 95.

A sewer constructed along Abbott street and connecting with the sewer on Spring street has relieved the locality in a great measure of the filth which had collected in a ravine.

Many reports of sink-spouts, privies, etc., have received attention. Houses where contagious diseases have prevailed have been fumigated and otherwise purified.

This cemetery should have quite a little more money expended in putting it in good order. The fence around the cemetery near Deacon Cole's, should be repaired and painted.

If a public supply of water should be introduced in West Lebanon, a pipe should be laid to the cemetery.


