TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and will not be closed before four o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration Expenses, Municipal Court Expenses, Expenses of Town Hall and other Town Buildings, Insurance, Police Department, Fire Department and Vital Statistics, for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will fix and determine the compensation to be paid each of the town officers.

Article 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to give a discount on all property taxes paid on or before such date as they may designate.

Article 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the town of Lisbon.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. J. Field to Hotel Lookoff, from the Baptist Church through Lovers' Lane to the Franconia town line, from the former location of the Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of James Dudley; Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight, and from 5 a.m. until daylight, excepting the lights from the Bowles Cottage to the Hotel Lookoff for six months of the year; all the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$965.37 for the same.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil such roads in the town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of repairing Sugar Hill sidewalks.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of advertising the town of Lisbon.

Article 18. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

Article 19. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize

the selectmen to purchase a new fire truck at a cost not to exceed Ten Thousand dollars (\$10,000), the same to be paid for over a term of three years in the following manner: by using in 1952, \$3,000.00 of the existing surplus and by borrowing the balance by the issuance of notes payable in equal amounts in 1953 and 1954 respectively.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to use up to \$1,500. from the 1951 surplus for the purpose of buying two used snowplows and two new Sand Spreaders.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purpose of helping maintain the Sugar Hill Fire Dept. in the town of Lisbon.

Article 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
