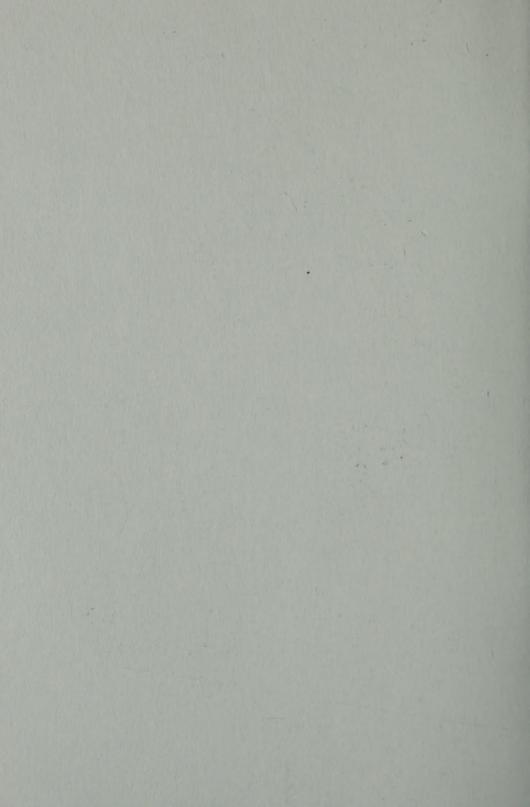

TOWN OF NEW DURHAM TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the New Durham Fire Station on Tuesday, the twelfth (12th) day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following: (Polls will close no earlier than 6:00 p.m.)

ARTICLE 1. a. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

b. To choose all necessary school district officers for the year ensuing.

c. To vote on proposed amendment to the Zoning and Land Use Ordinance.

And you are hereby further notified to meet at the New Durham School on Wednesday, the thirteenth (13th) day of March, next at seven (7:00) o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend in the name of the town, such advances, grants, or other funds which may be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies during the coming year. This article requires the Selectmen to hold a prior public hearing on the action to be taken. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$4,212.00 from the Shirley Timber Trust Fund for the Rural District Health Council (Visiting Nurse). BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Conservation Commission to retain the unexpended portion of its 1985 appropriation, said funds to be placed in a special Conservation Fund in accordance with RSA 36-A:5. BY CONSERVATION COMMISSION

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$15,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund established for a town revaluation and authorize the withdrawal of \$15,000.00 from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as a setoff against this appropriation. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$8,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund established for Fire Department equipment and authorize the withdrawal of \$8,000.00 from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as a set-off against this appropriation. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$27,800.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund established for Highway Department equipment. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$7,200.00 for a road sander for the Highway Department. BY ROAD AGENT

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to establish a Maintenance and Safety Committee for town owned dams. This Committee to study the proper management and operation of said dams and to make recommendations to the Selectmen. Said Committee to consist of one member of the Board of Selectmen, the Civil Defense Director, and one member to be chosen by the preceeding two. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, that portion of the Libby Road, including the bridge, from the junction of Ten Rod Road past the Cardinal homestead to the present closed Class VI road, a distance of approximately 375 feet. Per authority of RSA 231:43. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to convey to Mrs. Samuel Cardinal that portion of the Libby Road, including the bridge, referred to in the previous article, so that she will have title to the land. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 to repair Devils Den Road to the point where it is passable for emergency equipment as authorized by RSA 224:10-a. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$12,100.00 to purchase new radios for the Highway, Police and Fire Departments with 50% of this sum to be reimbursed by the Federal Emergency Management Assistance Program. Breakdown as follows:

Highway - \$9,800.00; Police - \$1,140.00; Fire - \$1,160.00 Total \$12,100.00. BY SELECTMEN ARTICLE 15. To see if the town will vote to grant the Planning Board site plan review authority over the development of tracts of land for multifamily dwelling units pursuant to RSA 674:43. Further, that the Town Clerk shall record a certificate of notice in the Strafford County Registry of Deeds showing that the Planning Board has been so authorized. BY PLANNING BOARD

ARTICLE 16. To see if the town will vote to accept the conclusions and adopt the recommendations of the Library Study Committee as stated in the Committee Report dated February 1985. BY LIBRARY STUDY COMMITTEE

ARTICLE 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 to the Library Building Trust Fund, to be matched by a donation of \$3,000.00. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$7,100.00 to purchase hose and miscellaneous small equipment for the Fire Department. BY FIRE CHIEF (NOT RECOMMENDED BY BUDGET COMMITTEE)

ARTICLE 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$12,500.00 to construct a ramp and install new front doors at the town hall to comply with Federal Revenue Sharing Regulations regarding accessibility for the handicapped. BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 20. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following resolution: "BE IT RESOLVED: that the Town of New Durham will elect to approve of the inclusion of its officers and employees in the New Hampshire Retirement System of the State of New Hampshire, which system is provided for by RSA 100-A (Supp), for the employees of the Town of New Durham in accordance with Chapter 134, to be effective July 1, 1985." BY SELECTMEN

ARTICLE 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of town government.

ARTICLE 22. To hear reports of any standing committees.

NEW DURHAM PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

The Library Trustees have had many meetings with the Selectmen and the Library Study Group this year. It was unanimously agreed the Town Officers need more office space and the Library must make plans to move. The question is — where?

Various sources have been researched by the Library Study Group for available funds with the possibilities of a grant using matching funds in conjunction with the Library Trust Funds. Tentative plans were drawn up for planning purposes. There are many basics we must comply with to meet Federal and State requirements.

To this end a contract was signed with a Library Consultant, Mr. James Kennedy of St. Anselm College Library. He is to research, advise and help us to prepare requests for funds. The Library Trustees Improvement Fund (monies earned by the Trustees) was used for this purpose with expectations of receiving a Feasibility Grant from the State Library. This has been applied for.

STRAFFORD COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

The Strafford County SWMD, composed of five communities; Farmington, Middleton, Milton, New Durham and Strafford was formed to collaborate in meeting the requirements of RSA Chapter 149-M (The New State Solid Waste Law) which became effective May 22, 1982. Under the law, each town continues to be responsible for providing or arranging access to approved solid waste and septage disposal facilities for its residents. Each town is also responsible for on-going solid waste management planning within its boundaries, and must consider the environmental, economic, and regional impact of its actions.

The District Committee has concentrated on meeting the planning and reporting requirements set forth in the statute, and has met these requirements on schedule. Current annual tonnage, disposal methods, and types and amounts of solid wastes have been estimated, and future annual tonnage projected for each community. A Ten Year Disposal Plan and a Fifteen Year Process for Filing the Plan have been submitted.

Work with the Strafford Regional Planning Commission has resulted in a survey of present septage disposal methods plus pros and cons of options for the future. The District is also a member of the New Hampshire Resource Recovery Association which emphasizes recycling and waste-to-energy efforts in solid waste disposal.

Membership of the District Committee is as follows: Chairman, John Nolan, Milton; Vice-Chairman, James Meyer, New Durham; Secretary-Treasurer, Willis Berry, Farmington; Thomas Davis, Strafford; and Marshall Nash, Middleton. William Cooper, Administrative Assistant, Farmington has provided invaluable assistance to the Committee.

REPORT OF PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

To the members of the Parks and Recreation Commission and the citizens of New Durham, I respectfully submit my Annual Report.

During the past year the New Durham Recreation Department continued to offer a wide variety of activities for all members of the community. It is estimated that forty-four percent of the towns population was directly involved in Recreation directed of sponsored activities during 1984.

A list of the major activities of 1984 along with the numbers of participants and the names of the volunteers who gave generously of their time and skill to enhance the program is available to the public at the Selectmen's Office. Our gratitude to these dedicated volunteers exceeds our ability to acknowledge them.

However, it should be noted that there has been a significant decline in the overall number of volunteers this past year. This has had an adverse effect on a number of programs for all age groups. The Department has, therefore, directed its energies towards maintaining the current level of programming and the improvement of facilities. This has occured at the expense of critically needed program expansion.

Some of the facility improvements and recent accomplishments include:

- -Construction of a seven station project adventure ropes course behind the elementary school.
- -Purchase of a new scoreboard and bleachers to seat 50 spectators for the ballfield.
- -Implementation of a new maintenance program for the long-term care of the ballfield.
- -Installation of new soccer goals on the school field.
- -Purchase of trophy case to display our teams many trophies and awards.
- -Re-establishment of the New Durham Boosters Club which provided refreshments at all basketball games and dances, chaperones for field trips, volunteers for tournaments and special activities and donated in excess of \$450.00 towards awards and trophies.
- -Introduction of a successful soccer and rock climbing program.
- -Continuation of the popular summer recreational/swim program.
- -Introduction of the New Durham Invitational Adult Softball Tournament.
- -Sponsorship of the local Monopoly Tournament, The State Monopoly Champion from New Durham was sent to compete in the National Finals in Beverly Hills, CA.
- -Recognition of the New Durham Physical Fitness Program as "The Best In The State of New Hampshire", by the Presidents Council on Physical Fitness.

This year it is planned that all these activities and events will continue to be available to the residents of New Durham. It is further hoped that with increased volunteers for coaching, umpires and general assistance the scope of recreation opportunities will expand. Installation of sanitary facilities at the ballfield and a regularly scheduled movie program are now in the planning stages for 1985.

New Durham citizens should be proud of their Recreation Program and feel free to offer suggestions, initiate new programs, volunteer assistance, or schedule activities at the gym or ballfield.
